

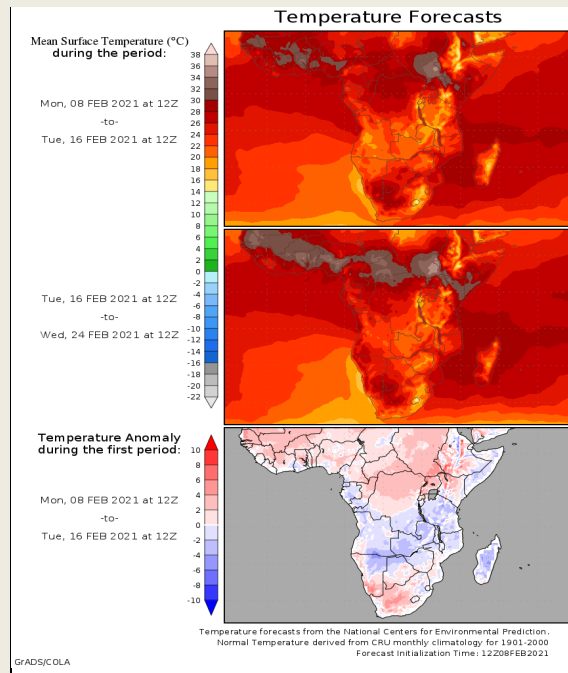
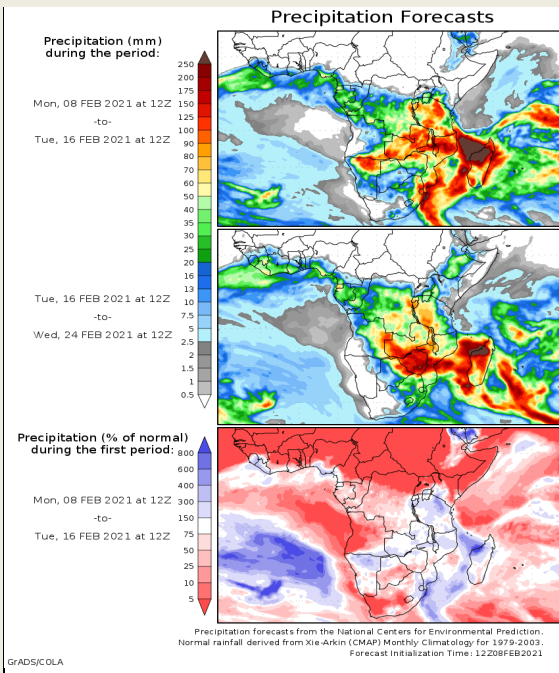
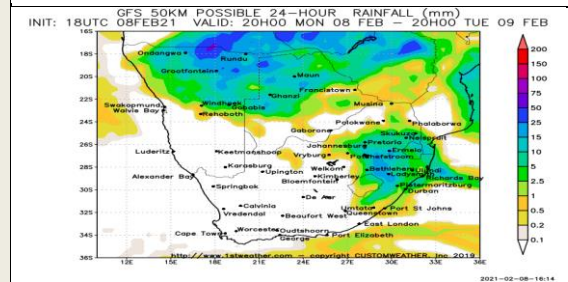
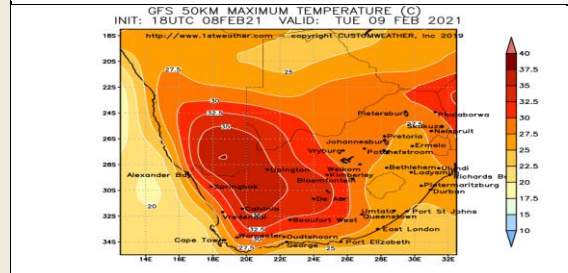
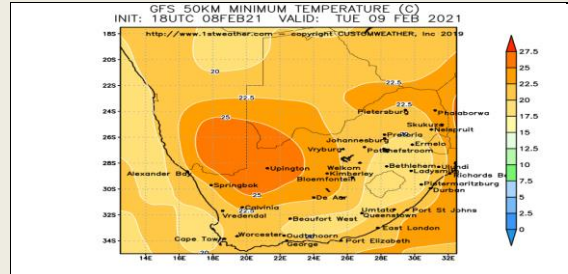
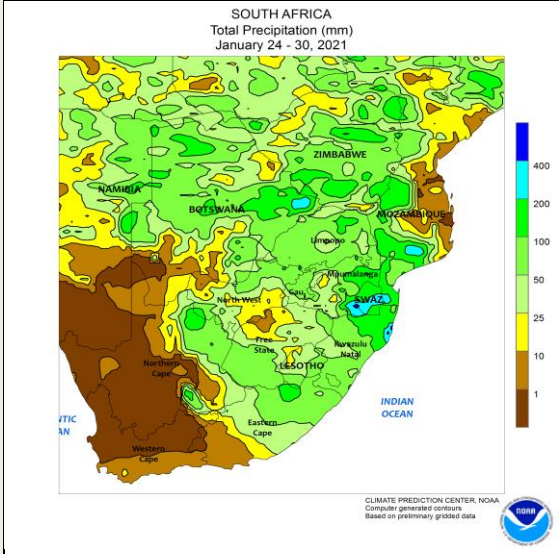


Weather Report

The main coarse grain and oilseed areas in eastern and central South Africa will see a mix of erratic rainfall and sunshine this week. The rain will help keep soil moisture near current levels in most locations, though some drying is expected in Free State and Northern Cape. There will be plenty of moisture to maintain aggressive growth in most locations.



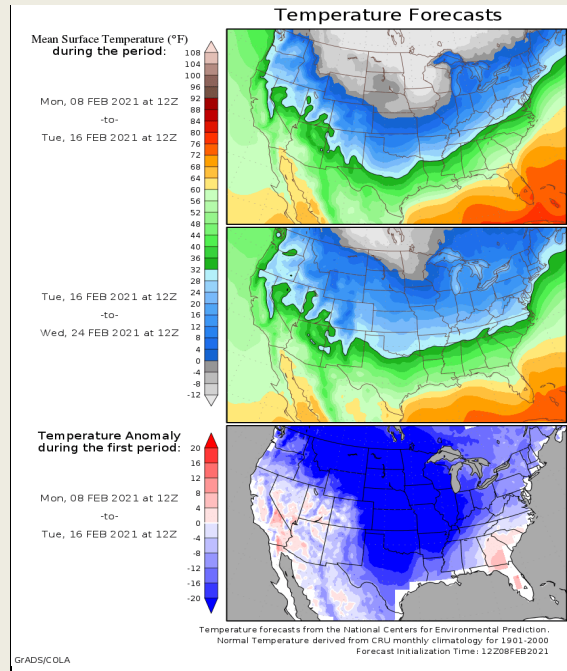
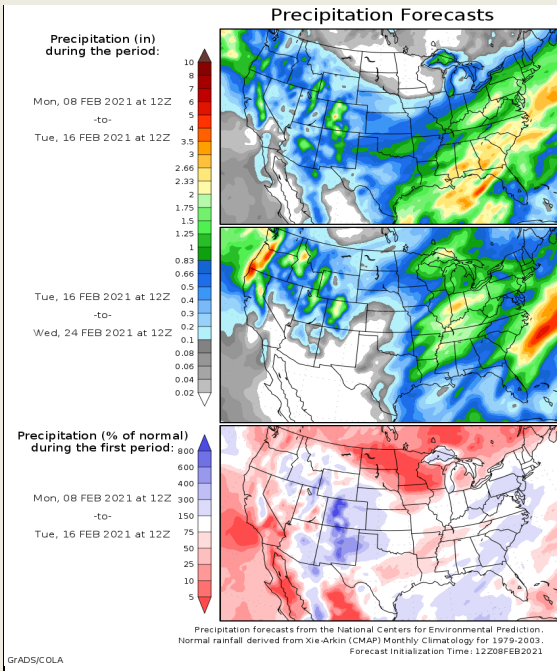
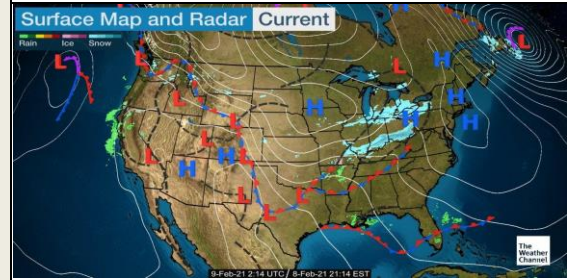
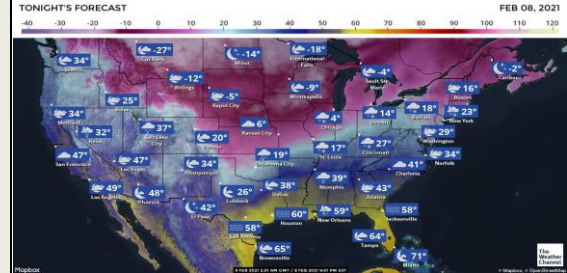
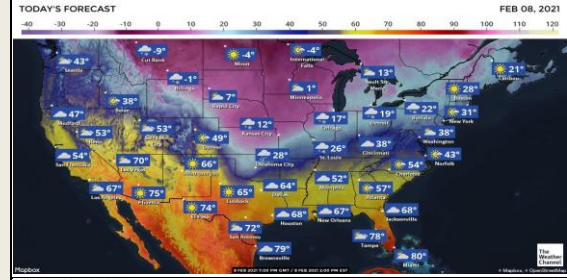
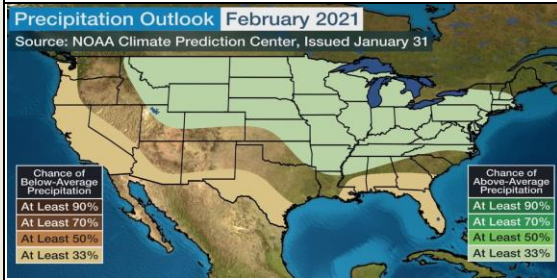

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Regular rounds of precipitation will occur through Feb. 13 in the Delta and the Southeast with most of the precipitation not likely to be heavy enough to cause significant delays to early-season fieldwork when drier weather resumes Feb. 14-19.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: mix of rain and sunshine will impact the Delta and the Southeast through the next two weeks with most of the rain not likely to be heavy enough to cause significant delays to early-season fieldwork.

o Nearly all of the Delta and the Southeast will receive rain today into Saturday with southern Mississippi to Georgia, northern Florida, and South Carolina to eastern North Carolina seeing 0.50-1.30" of rain and locally more with other areas seeing 0.05-0.50" and locally more.

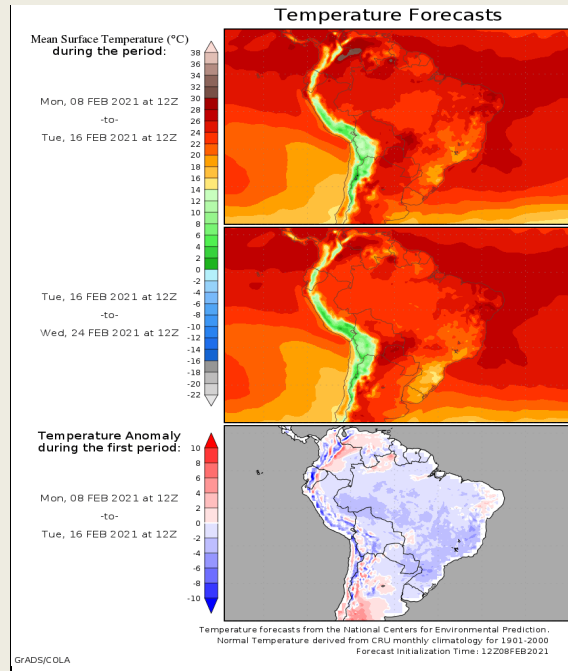
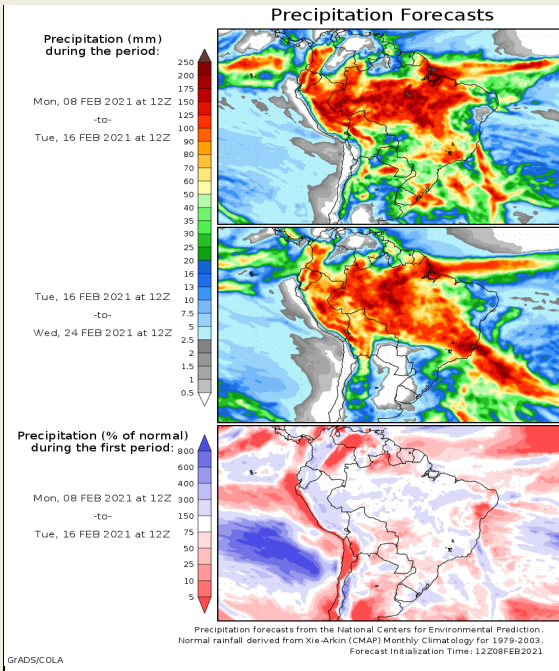
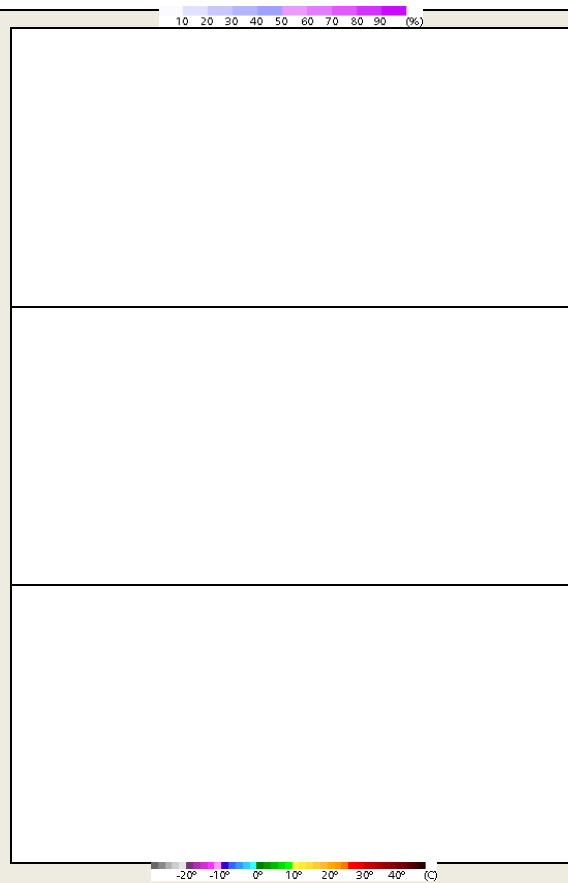
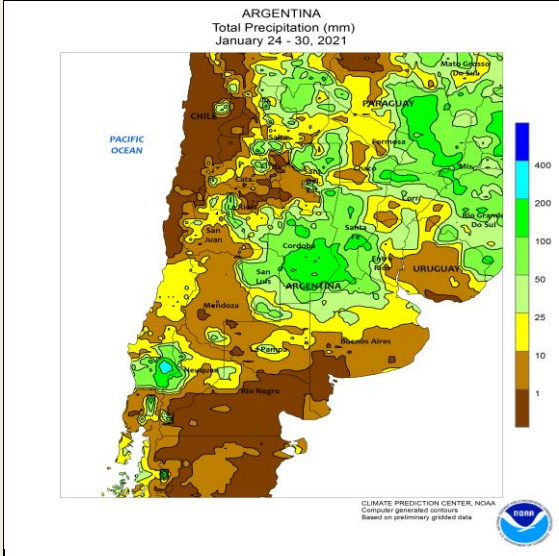

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: An increase in rain will begin today in the driest areas of northeastern Brazil as well as in most of Mato Grosso where regular rounds of rain through the next two weeks will slow fieldwork with northern into central and eastern Mato Grosso wettest while southwestern Mato Grosso sees drier conditions. Mato Grosso is not likely to see the drier-biased weather pattern needed during the next two and a half weeks to allow aggressive soybean harvesting or second season corn planted as desired, but some progress will be made around the greatest rainfall. Most crops in Paraguay and Brazil will receive enough rain through the next two weeks to maintain favorable conditions for crop development.

ARGENTINA: All of Argentina will receive rain at one time or another perpetuating favorable soil conditions in most areas while inducing some improvements in soil moisture in the driest areas of the south where some increases in crop stress will occur in advance of the rain.

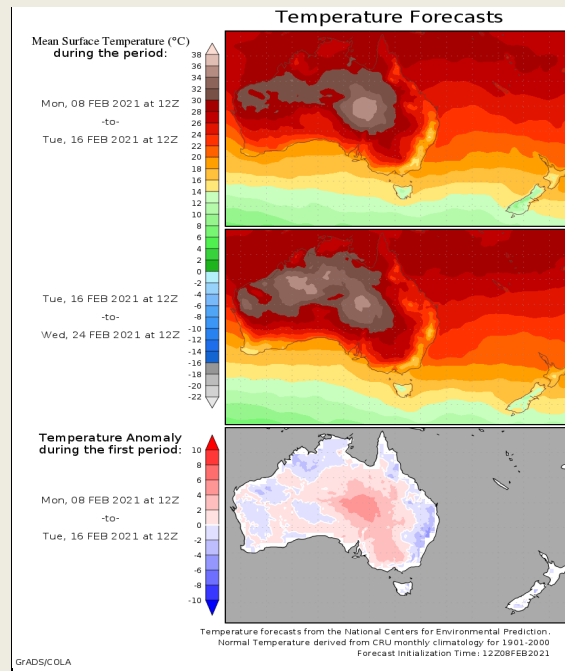
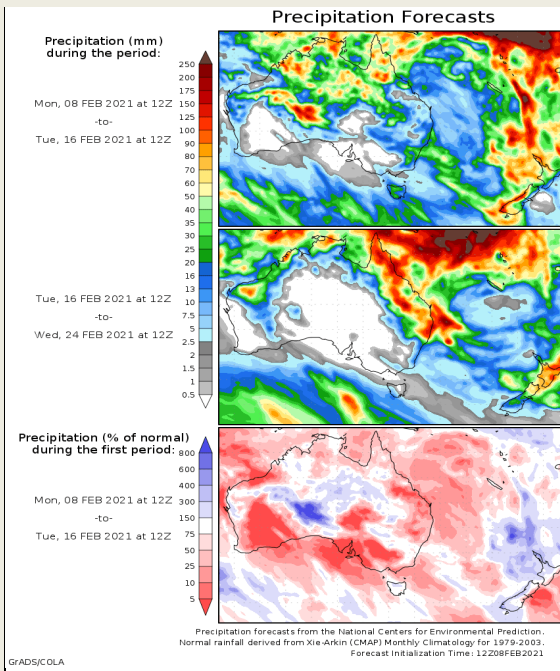
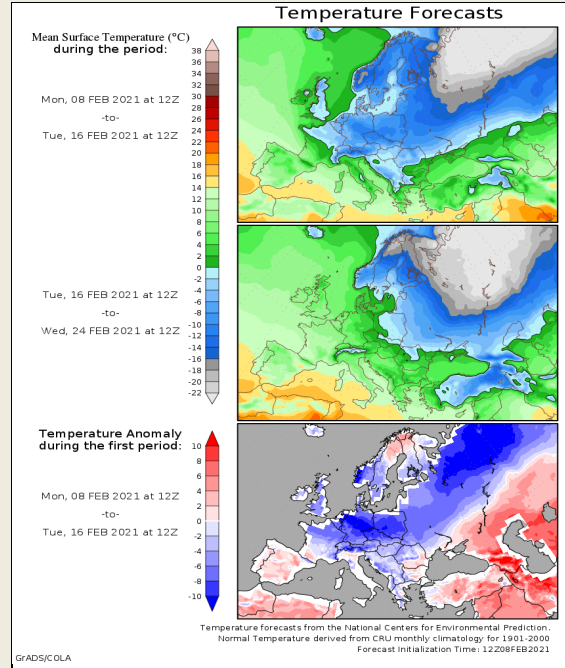
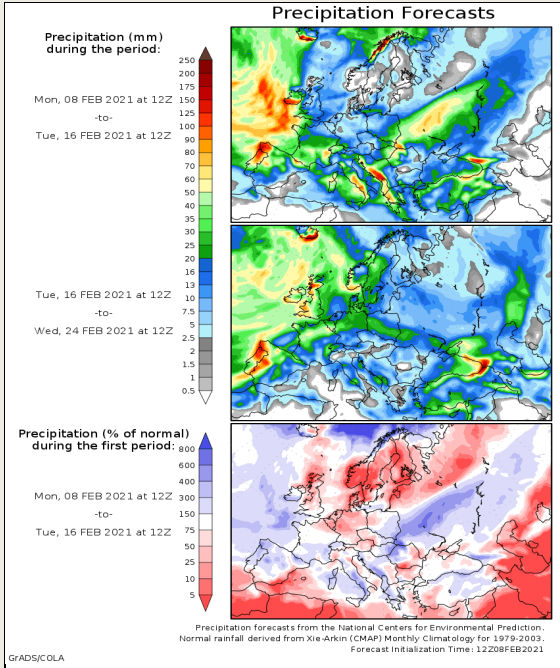

EUROPE: Wet conditions will continue across Western Europe and reach into Poland during the coming week. Rounds of moisture will expand into Eastern Europe including Italy, southern Germany and Austria through southern Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Hungary northwestern Romania into the eastern Adriatic Sea Nations Sunday through Wednesday. Frequent moisture will occur in Western Europe throughout the week. In contrast, Sweden, Norway and Finland as well as southern Serbia into Bulgaria and southeastern Romania will remain mostly dry.

AUSTRALIA: Rain will continue over south-central Queensland through central and eastern New South Wales and eastern Victoria today and linger over east-central and northeastern New South Wales into southeastern Queensland through the weekend.
