




United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Rain expanded eastward Thursday and fell on most areas from eastern Kansas to the eastern Corn Belt and eastern Iowa into south-central Wisconsin with parts of north-central Illinois and south-central into east-central Ohio mostly dry. An active weather pattern will continue through Wednesday from the south-central into most of the eastern Midwest and most of the region will be left with wet soils and poor conditions for early-season fieldwork. U.S. DEI TA AND SOLITIFAST: Heavy rain fell on some areas from central and northern Alabama to

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Heavy rain fell on some areas from central and northern Alabama to northern Georgia to southwestern North Carolina Thursday and some local flooding occurred while lighter rain fell on most surrounding areas and extended from

the northern Delta into most of Mississippi and west-central and southwestern Alabama. The Delta and a large part of the Southeast will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through Wednesday and fieldwork will be minimal in many areas and will be sluggish to resume initially when drier weather occurs Thursday through April 9.








South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Another day of dry and favorable conditions for fieldwork in much of Brazil and Paraguay Thursday with some exceptions in southern Brazil while a part of central Mato Grosso received 1.30 inches of unwelcome rain. Continued improvements in conditions for fieldwork will occur during the next two weeks in and near Mato Grosso and soybean harvesting and planting of second season corn should soon be completed in most of the region with some exceptions in west-central and northwestern to north-central Mato Grosso where rain will be frequent through most of the period. ARGENTINA: Rain expanded Thursday and fell on much of Argentina outside of some southern and a few northern areas. o Areas of mostly dry weather extended from central and southern La Pampa to areas just west of central and south-central Buenos Aires as well as from central Chaco to central and northern Corrientes. Moderate to heavy rain will continue in portions of northern and southern Argentina into Saturday and with the rain that fell earlier this week nearly all areas of the country will be left with notable increases in soil moisture and favorable conditions for crop development. A mix of sunshine and some rain will occur Sunday through April 9 and most areas will dry down overall, but soil moisture and timely rain advertised for Apr. 3-5 should favorably support the needs of crops.



Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Rounds of showers will impact northern Europe through the weekend and into the middle of next week. o Showers will expand throughout the U.K., northern and eastern France through Poland and Scandinavia Friday into the middle of next week. An increase in shower activity will occur from the Iberian Peninsula and southern and central France through Poland, Slovakia and into Serbia and Romania April 2-8 AUSTRALIA: Light rain fell over southeastern South Australia and Victoria into southern New South Wales Wednesday into this morning. Restricted precipitation will return to eastern Australia for at least the coming ten days. Historic flooding in coastal areas will subside. The drier weather will be beneficial for summer crop maturation and cotton quality and some early winter crop fieldwork.
