
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
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
South Africa - Weather


Eastern South Africa will see a mix of light rain and sunshine through the end of next week. Although rainfall will be too light to significantly impact long-term soil conditions, soil moisture will remain at adequate levels. Crop development will remain good. Early season maturation conditions will also be favorable despite the periods of light rain.

Free State, North West, and Northern Cape will remain in a dry weather bias through the end of next week. The ground will continue to firm in most locations. Free State and North West will have enough moisture in the subsoil to maintain aggressive growth. Irrigated areas in Northern Cape will also see favorable crop development conditions. Dryland areas in Northern Cape will otherwise see development conditions slowly deteriorate, though no significant crop impacts are expected. Early season maturation conditions will otherwise be favorable.









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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will be dry through Monday before two storm systems bring precipitation to nearly all of the region Tuesday through next Friday.


o Some heavy rain is likely and local flooding may occur with northeastern Missouri to northern Ohic and southern Michigan favored for the heaviest rain.


U.S. DELITA AND SOUTHEAST: Much of the Delta and the Southeast will see little to no precipitation of significance into next Friday allowing for fieldwork to steadily increase and soon become aggressive in many areas.


o Rain will increase next Friday into Mar. 15, but with drier weather expected to follow fieldwork should quickly resume.











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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Mato Grosso to southern Minas Gerais to Sao Paulo will see frequent rain during the next ten days while most other areas see a good mix of rain and sunshine that should allow for fieldwork to advance while rain should be great enough to support developing crops. Some fieldwork should advance around the rain in the wetter areas, but the rain will slow harvesting of soybeans and planting of second season corn as well as threatening some soybeans with quality declines while the moisture is supportive of developing crops.


ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is wetter for portions of southern Argentina and enough rain may fall next week in that region to prevent serious crop stress during the next two weeks


 Central Argentina is still disfavored for significant rain during the period and if today's forecast verifies parts of the region will see serious crop stress.

o Increases in crop stress should steadily increase from eastern Cordoba to Entre Rios where little rain is expected and temperatures will be hot for most of the next week.









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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: A restricted precipitation pattern will occur over a large portion of the European Continent through Tuesday. Showers that do occur will be brief and erratic. Drying will continue, but soil moisture should support any crop needs. Any moisture that occurs will be light and erratic and totals will be no more than 0.30 inch most often.


o However, rain showers and thunderstorms will increase over southern Spain, southern France into central Italy and into Bosnia, Montenegro, Albania and surrounding areas today into Tuesday.


AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation and net drying will occur over east-central and southeastern Australia through the weekend. Conditions will not be completely dry and showers will continue in far northeastern New South Wales and southeastern Queensland within 150 miles of the coast today into Thursday and increase over interior locations this weekend.


o Moisture totals will vary up to 0.40 inch most often and locally greater amounts.

• Scattered showers will increase Monday through next workweek over southeastern Queensland into New South Wales









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
