South Africa - Weather

South Africa's main coarse grain and oilseed areas will only have a few opportunities for light and erratic rainfall this week. The rain is not expected to significantly impact harvest conditions or crop quality. Producers will have several opportunities to get into the fields and harvest aggressively. • South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine this week

o After a period of mostly dry weather today and Tuesday, a disturbance tracking near the region will bring rain to portions of South Africa Wednesday into this weekend




Southern West Cape will receive 2.00-5.00" of rain with locally greater amounts by next Monday morning


The main coarse grain and oilseed areas will only receive 0.10-0.50" of rain with many areas trending mostly dry



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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The southwestern to the eastern Corn Belt will see regular rounds of rain and slow planting progress through the next ten days while planting should advance well further to the north in the western Corn Belt where rain will be lighter and less frequent. The eastern Dakotas to east-central Nebraska to west-central and northern lowa, Minnesota, and central and northern Wisconsin will receive some beneficial rain, but the rain should not be great enough to prevent net drying and most areas will be left in need of significant rain.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Rain and interruptions to planting will be widespread in the Delta into Tuesday and in the Southeast into Wednesday before a mix of sunshine and rain follows and occurs through May 17 allowing planting to resume and soon become aggressive. Rain will be lighter in the Carolinas and southern Virginia and a large part of this region will need an increase in rain soon to ensure crops have adequate soil moisture.









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South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Dry and favorable conditions for fieldwork will be most common in much of Brazil and Paraguay through the next two weeks with exceptions in Paraguay and southern Brazil where rain is expected Tuesday through Thursday and May 12-13.


o Generalized increases in stress to the second season corn crop are likely during the next two weeks as the soil has become short of moisture in many areas and most of the region will see little to no rain of significance through the next two weeks.


ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is wetter for May 10-12 than what was advertised late last week, but with only two rounds of rain expected during the next two weeks harvesting should advance around each round of rain with the moisture supportive of the few cross that are still immature.



o Cotton in northeastern Argentina should be discolored by each round of rain, but with the drier weather expected to follow each event the cotton fibers should bleach back to white.









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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Recent drying has occurred over France and the U.K. into Germany and Scandinavia allowing for improvements in planting and crop development in France with warming flate last week into the weekend and will continue throughout this week. Warming will aske expand into Germany during the middle of this week and froes and freezes will diminish late this week into the weekend.


AUSTRALIA: Rounds of showers and thunderstorms will immack twestern bustarials early this week. Scattered showers will linger into late this week. The moisture will be welcome for winter wheat, barley and canola


AUSTRALIA: Rounds of showers and thunderstorms will impact Western Australia early this week. Scattered showers will linger into late this week. The moisture will be welcome for winter wheat, barley and canola planting, but follow up moisture will be needed.


o Nearly all locations will receive moisture at one time or another and amounts will vary from 0.50 to 1.50 inches most often and local totals in excess of 2.00 inches.

Mostly dry weather will return Friday through the remainder of the coming ten days to two weeks.









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
