



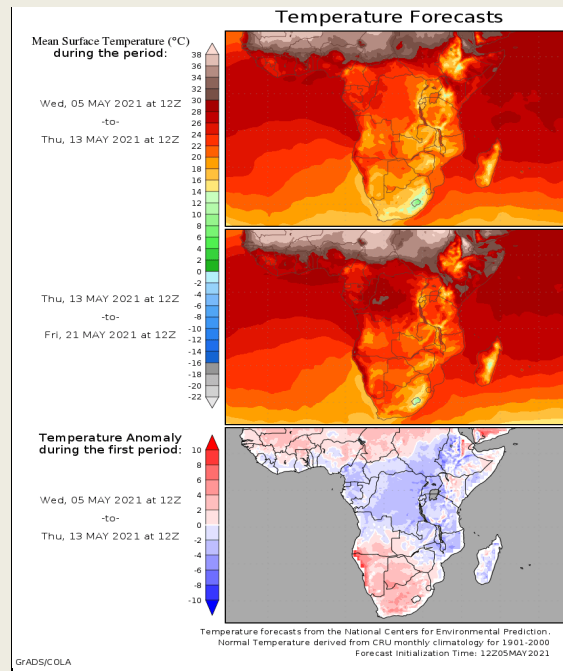
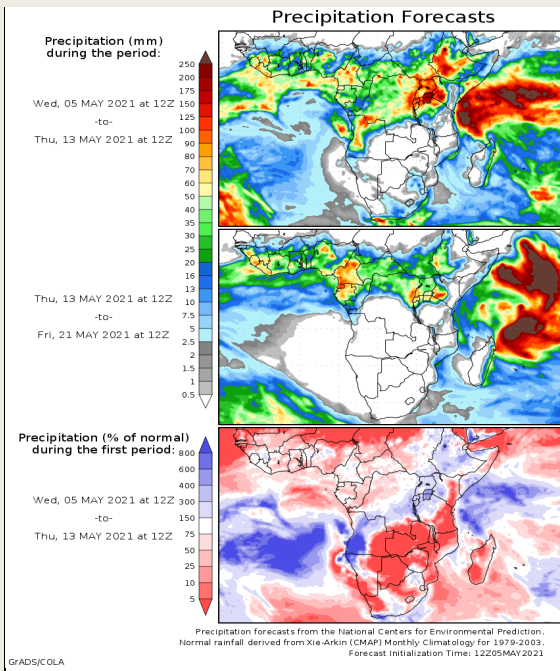
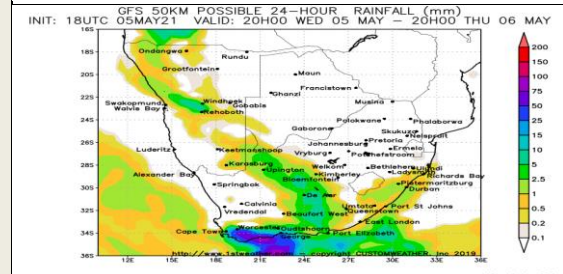
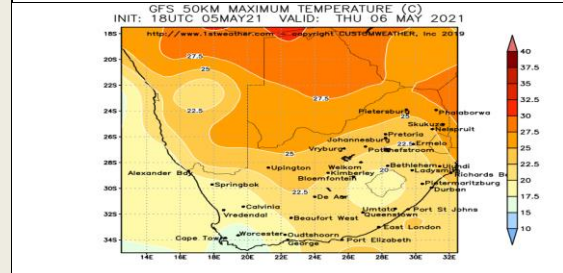
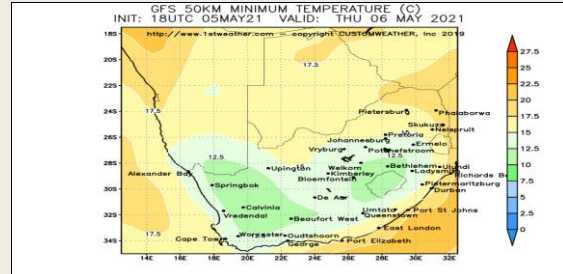
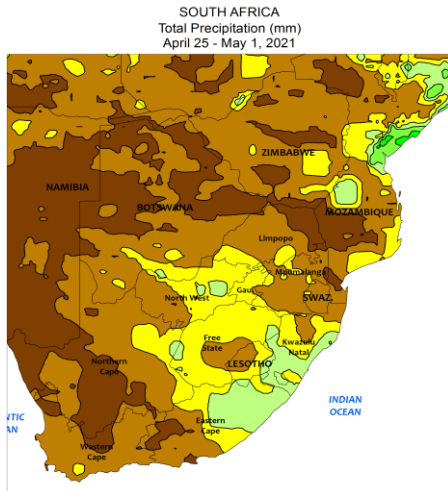
Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

South Africa will see a mix of erratic rain and sunshine through the middle of next week. The main coarse grain and oilseed areas will not receive enough rain to significantly slow or delay the harvest. No quality impacts are expected as well. Southern Western Cape will otherwise receive significant rain that will help improve early season winter wheat planting. Free State and most other areas in Western Cape will be too dry to support ideal winter wheat planting. • South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine through the middle of next week

- o A slow-moving frontal boundary will initially promote erratic rainfall today and Thursday for the western half of the country
- o Rain will shift into portions of central and eastern South Africa Friday and this weekend before mostly dry weather evolves during the first part of next week
- o Moisture totals by next Wednesday morning will range from 0.10-0.50" with local amounts over 0.75"
- o Portions of southern Western Cape will also receive 1.00-3.00" of rain with local amounts over 4.00" in the southwest



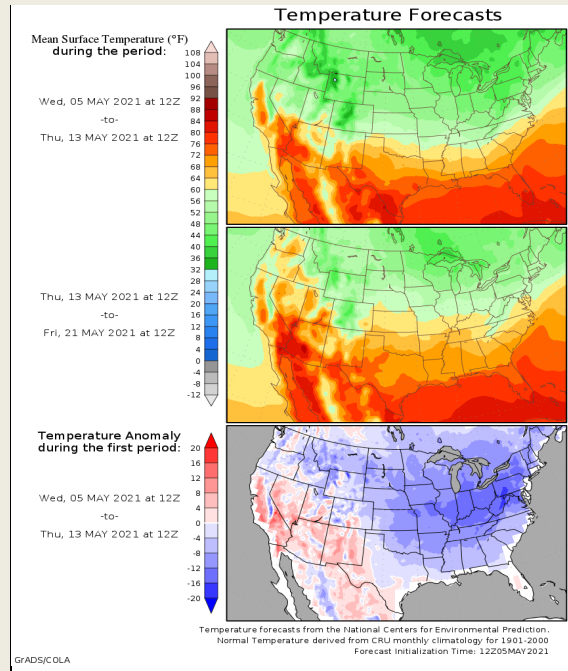
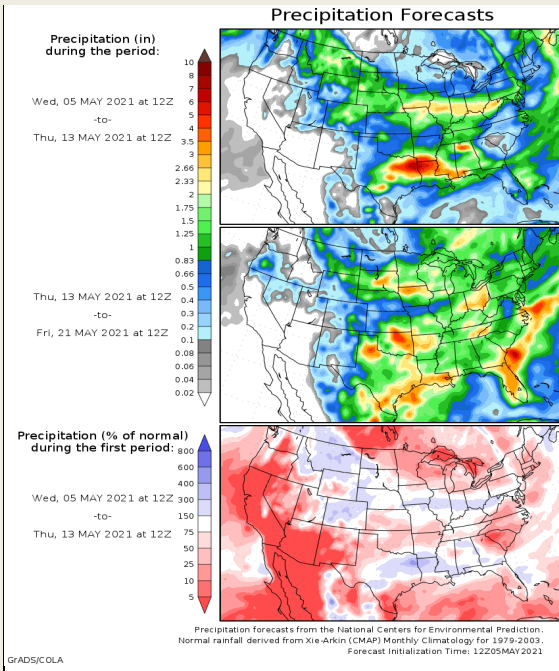
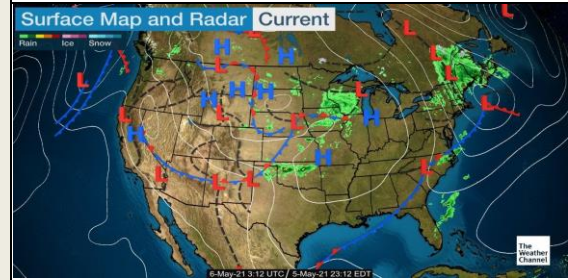
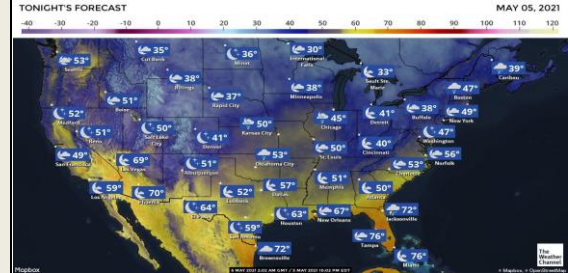
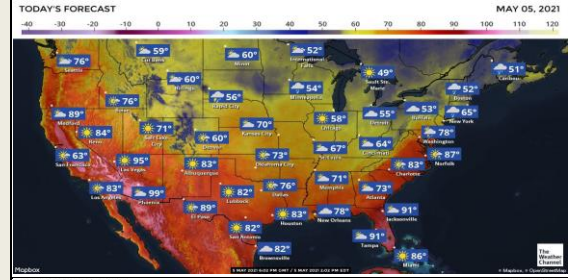
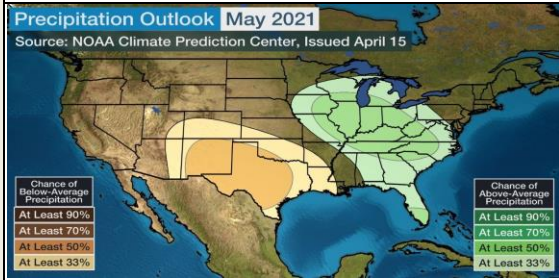
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Planting should advance well in many areas into Tuesday before a period of wetter weather occurs Tuesday night through May 19 when fieldwork should become sluggish while the driest areas from the eastern Dakotas to east-central Nebraska to Wisconsin receive beneficial rain and see at least temporary improvements in soil moisture. The increase in rain starting Tuesday night will be important in the drier areas of the western Corn Belt and although soakings of rain may not occur with each event, enough rain should fall to induce significant improvements in conditions for germination and establishment.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Much of the Delta and a large part of the Southeast will be dry through Saturday and planting should gradually increase and may become aggressive in the drier areas while some of the wetter areas remain too wet for fieldwork before rain increases Sunday.

- Rain Sunday through Thursday of next week will slow fieldwork throughout the region while the moisture will be important for crops in the Carolinas and southern Virginia.

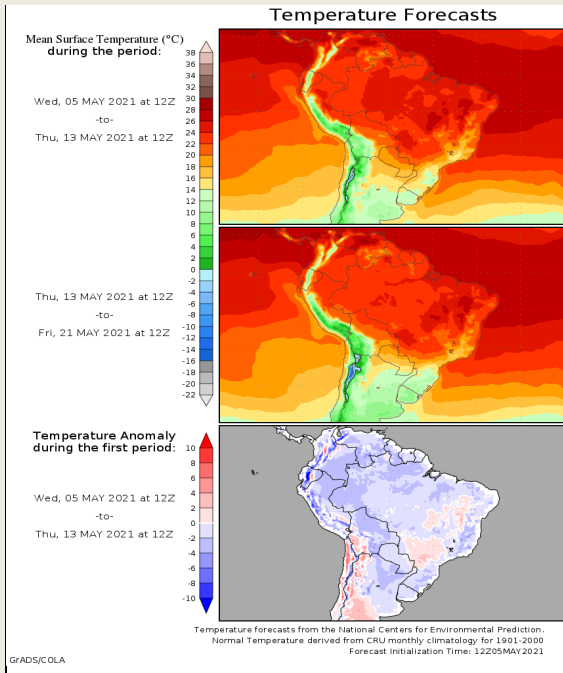
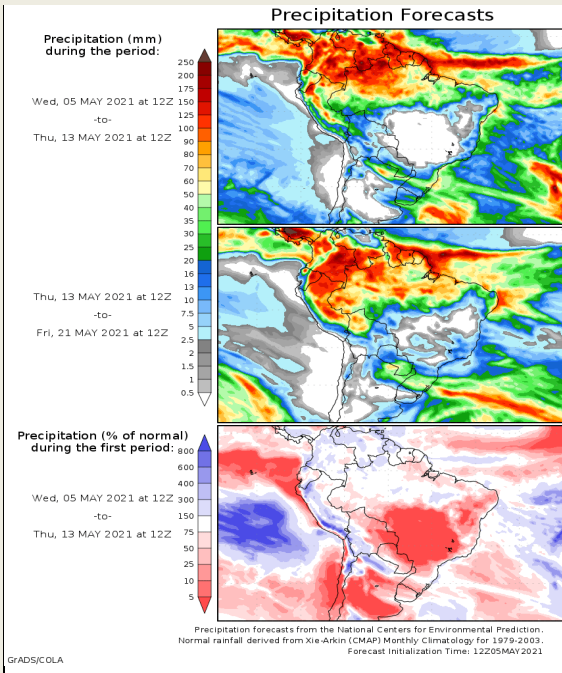
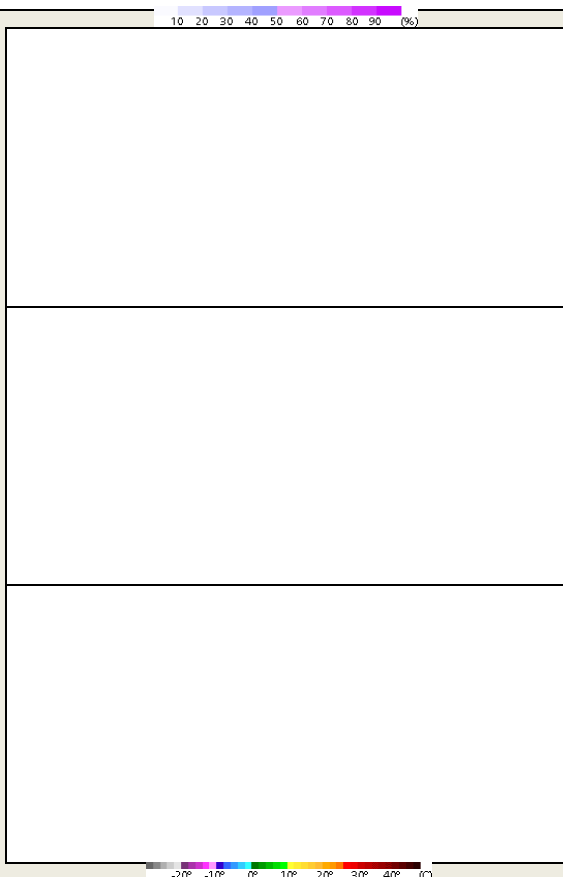
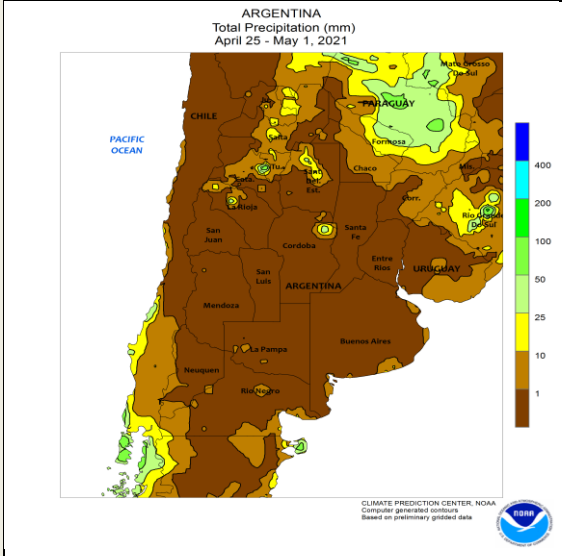


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Dry and favorable conditions for fieldwork will be most common in much of Brazil and Paraguay through the next two weeks with exceptions in Paraguay and southern Brazil where rain is expected today through Thursday and again Tuesday into Thursday of next week.
 o Generalized increases in stress to the second season corn crop are likely during the next two weeks as the soil has become short to very short of moisture and most of the region will see little to no rain of significance through the next two weeks.

ARGENTINA: After rain comes to an end in northeastern Argentina today only one more round of rain is expected during the next two weeks and harvesting should advance well around the rain while the moisture is supportive of the few crops that are still immature.
 o Cotton in northeastern Argentina should be discolored by each round of rain, but with the drier weather expected to follow each event the cotton fibers should bleach back to white.



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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

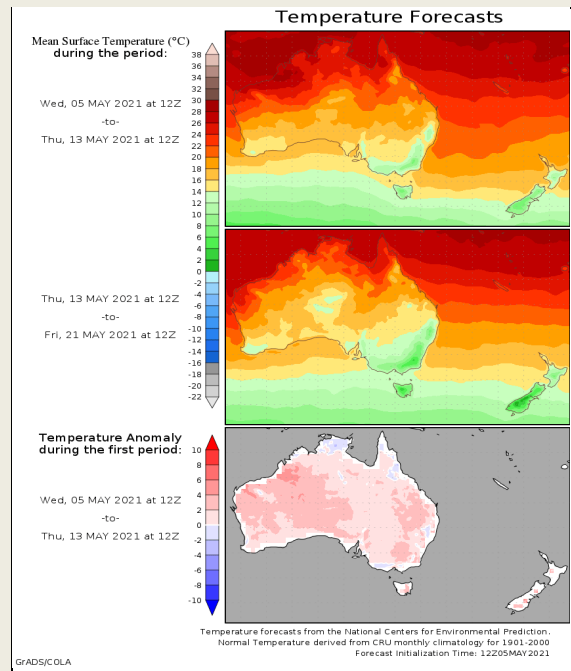
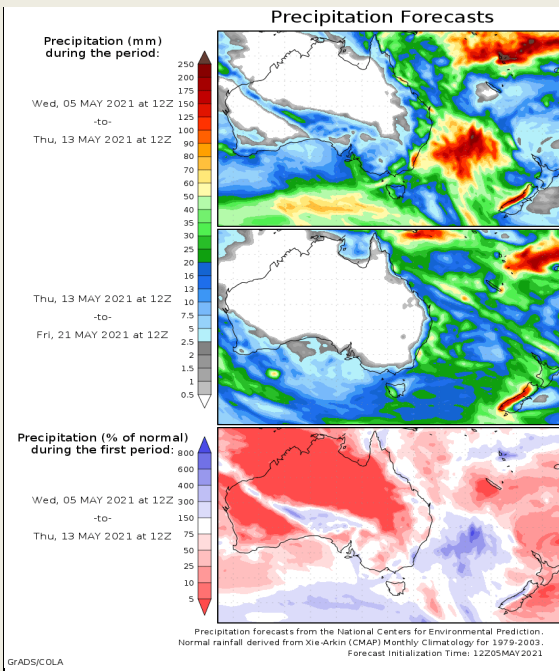
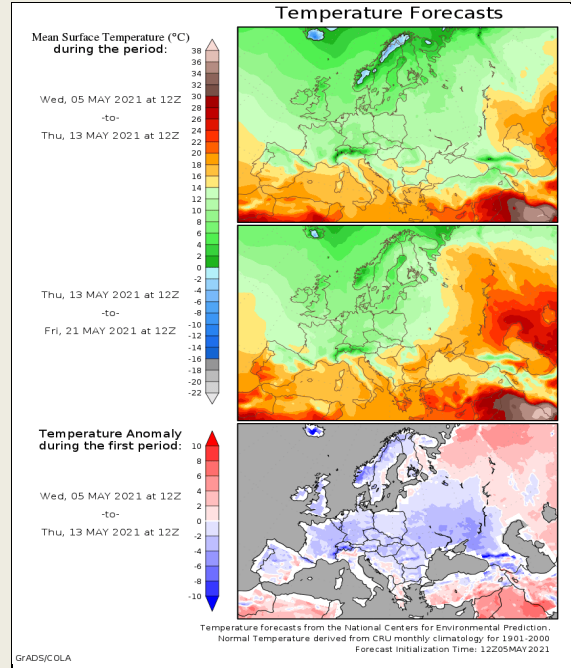
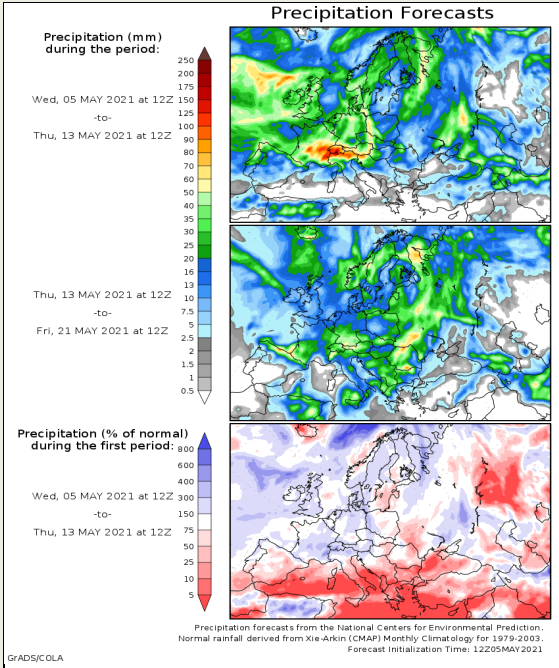
EUROPE: Rounds of frequent precipitation will increase over France, the U.K., and Scandinavia into western Germany Thursday through the middle of next workweek. Precipitation will increase over Scandinavia today into Wednesday as well while most other locations receive scattered showers. Conditions will become very wet during the coming ten days and fieldwork will be sluggish.

o Rain totals by this time next week will range from 0.50 to 2.00 inches and local totals varying up to 4.00 inches.

AUSTRALIA: Scattered showers and thunderstorms will occur over southern Australia this week. With that said, restricted precipitation and net drying will occur in many agricultural areas. Any moisture will be welcome for winter wheat, canola and barley, but greater moisture will be needed. The drying will benefit cotton and sorghum crop maturation and harvest.

o Scattered showers will linger over southwestern Australia as well as the southeastern to east-central coast today into Thursday.

o A few totals along the southeastern coast will exceed 1.00 inch, but totals west of the Great Dividing Range will be no more than 0.25 inch most often.



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
