

United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see warm to hot temperatures and dry weather most often through the next two weeks and by the fourth week of the month much of the region will significantly drier than today and stress to crops should have expanded outward from the eastern Dakotas and western Minnesota to eastern Nebraska, Iowa, Wisconsin, and Michigan. Most of the Midwest will see much warmer than normal temperatures through Monday with warmer than usual conditions continuing in the west Tuesday into Thursday when some eastern areas see near to below normal temperatures.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms through Sunday and enough rain should fall to keep the planting pace slow in the wetter areas while the rain will be beneficial in the drier areas from Georgia to southern Virginia. The southern Delta to southern Mississippi will see the least rain and some planting should occur around the precipitation.

 Shower activity will decline next week and planting should increase around the few showers that occur while the drying will induce a growing need of rain from northern Florida and Georgia to southern Virginia.











Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Favorable soil moisture conditions will continue to be supported by periodic rain the next seven to ten days. Rounds of scattered rain will return to Europe during the middle of next week and replenish topsoil moisture throughout central portions of the continent. In the meantime, rounds of rainfall will be greatest in eastern portions of the continent from Poland and western Ukraine into Romania and Bulgaria. AUSTRALIA: A period of drying will return to eastern Australia through most of Tuesday. The break in moisture will allow for fieldwork and to increase in areas that have been wetter during the first 10 days of June, but some greater rainfall is still needed over interior South Australia, northwestern Victoria as well as Queensland to restore soil moisture conditions. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will linger over eastern Victoria and southeastern New South Wales from the coast back into the Great Dividing Range into the weekend. Minimal to no rain will occur over areas west of the Great Dividing Range.
