



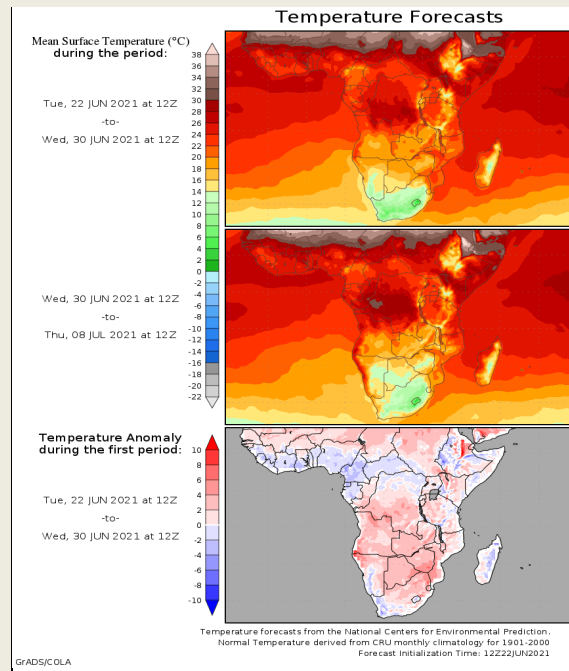
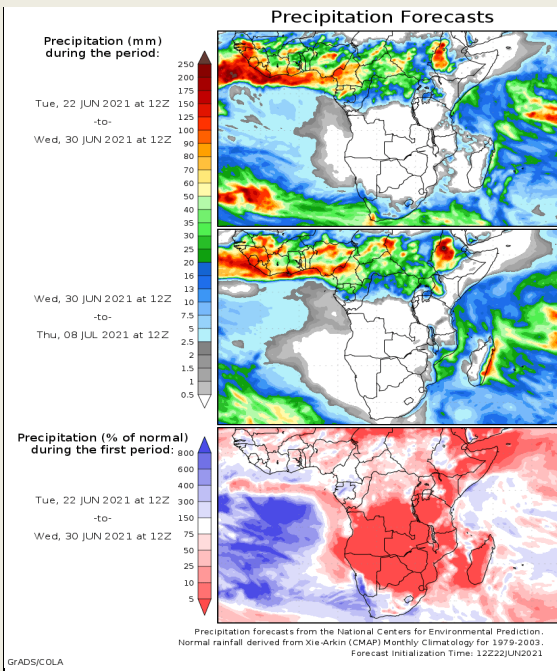
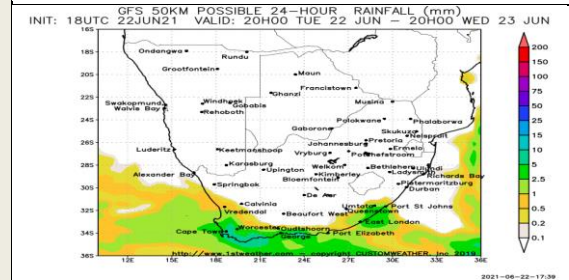
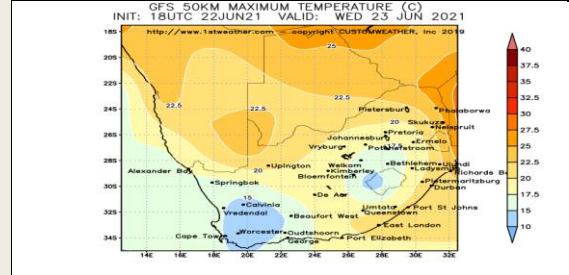
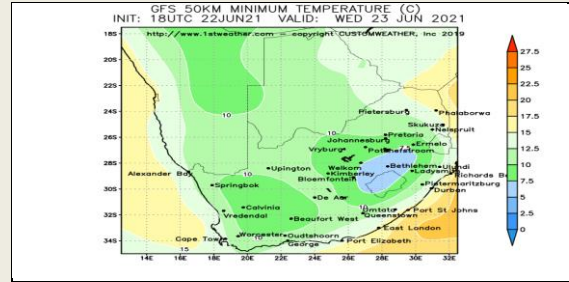
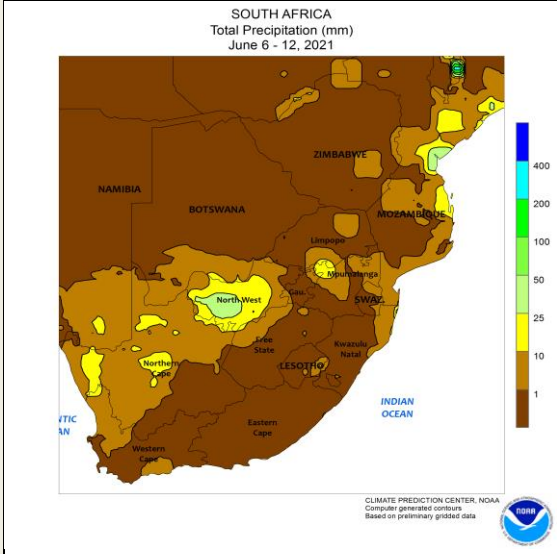
Weather Report

23 June 2021

South Africa - Weather

Western Cape and western Northern Cape will have several opportunities for rain during the coming week. The rain will be enough to bolster soil moisture in many winter wheat locations. The environment will either improve or remain favorable for aggressive growth in most locations. Free State and Northern Cape's winter wheat areas will otherwise be mostly dry during the coming week. Irrigated crops will continue develop under generally favorable conditions. Rain-fed areas will otherwise remain too dry for aggressive establishment and growth. Western South Africa will see a mix of erratic rain and sunshine during the coming week as a series of disturbances track near or into the region

- o Some of the most widespread rain will occur later this weekend and early next week
- o Western sections of Western Cape and Northern Cape will receive 0.50-1.50" of rain and locally greater amounts by next Tuesday morning
- o Other areas in Western Cape and Northern Cape will receive 0.10-0.50" of rain with drier pockets
- o The remaining portions of South Africa will be mostly dry during the coming week
- o Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation
- o Drier biased conditions are slated for much of South Africa June 30 - July 6

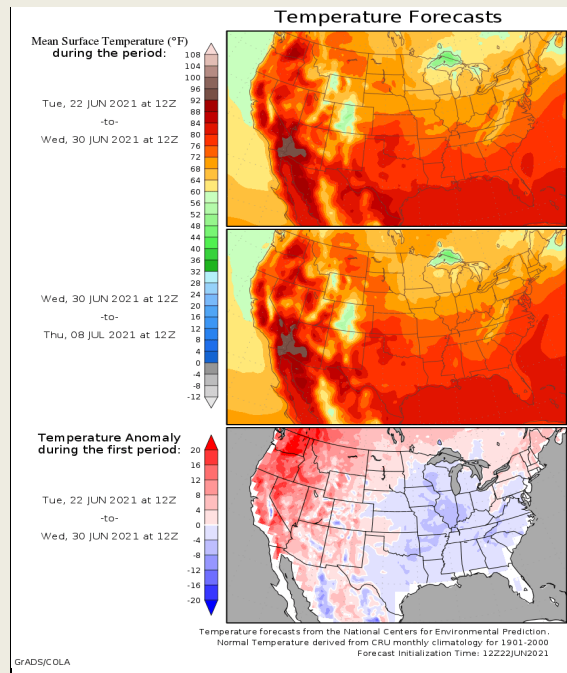
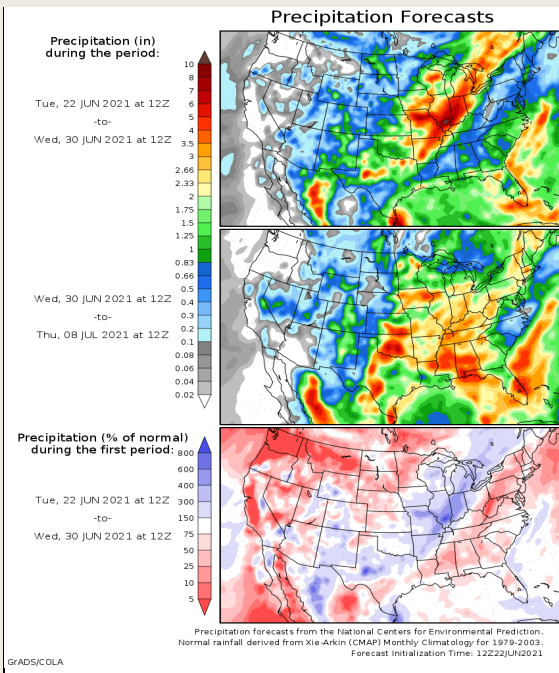
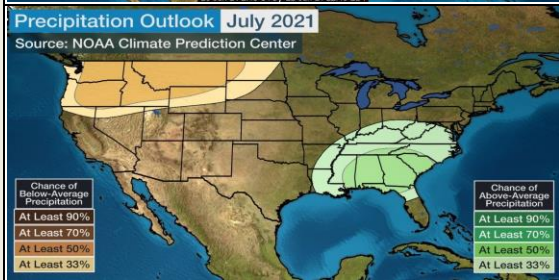


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Rain is still expected to fall in most of the Midwest during the coming week to ten days. Sufficient rain will fall to support crop development, although moisture deficits that have been greatest in the northwestern Corn Belt are unlikely to be fully relieved. Crop moisture stress will be quick to return in northwestern crop areas when warming resumes briefly during mid-week this week and more persistently during the Sunday through Wednesday period next week. The best crop conditions will be in the central and eastern Midwest. Some drying and warming is expected July 3-5.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: A favorable mix of rain and sunshine is expected in the Delta and southeastern states through much of the next ten days to two weeks. A few pockets of dryness will be possible, but the majority of crop areas in these areas will have sufficient moisture to support most crop needs. Crop development will continue to advance well and production potentials for most crops will remain very good. In the meantime, Tropical depression Claudette failed to produce much damage to cotton, corn, soybeans or peanuts, despite some pockets of local flooding.



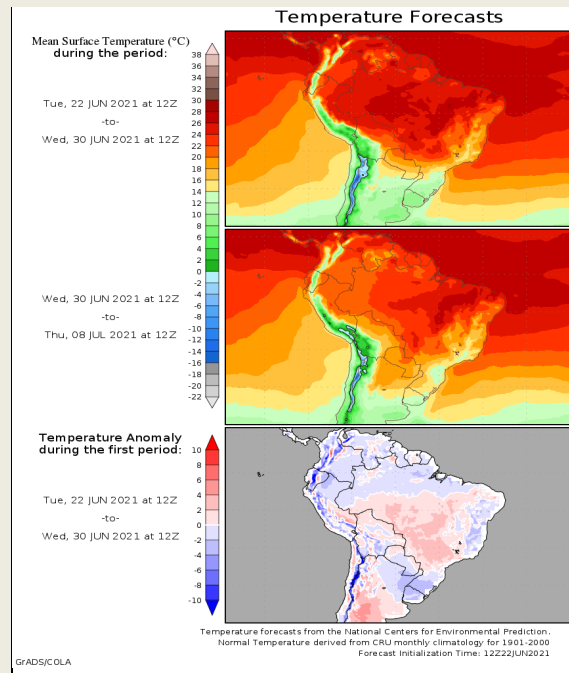
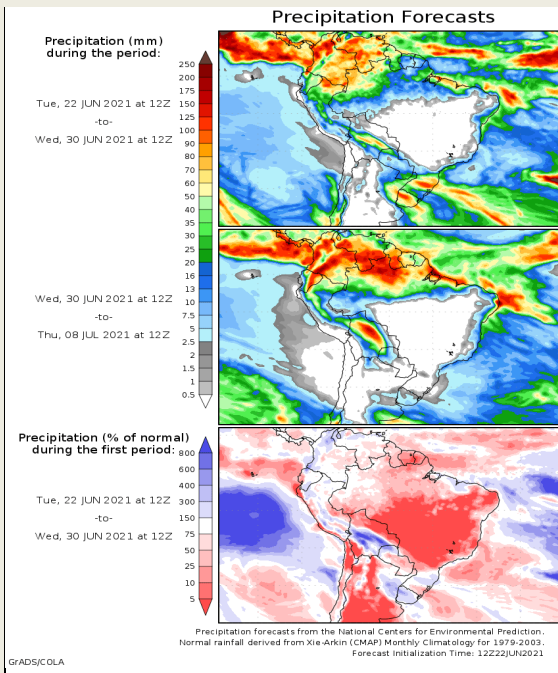
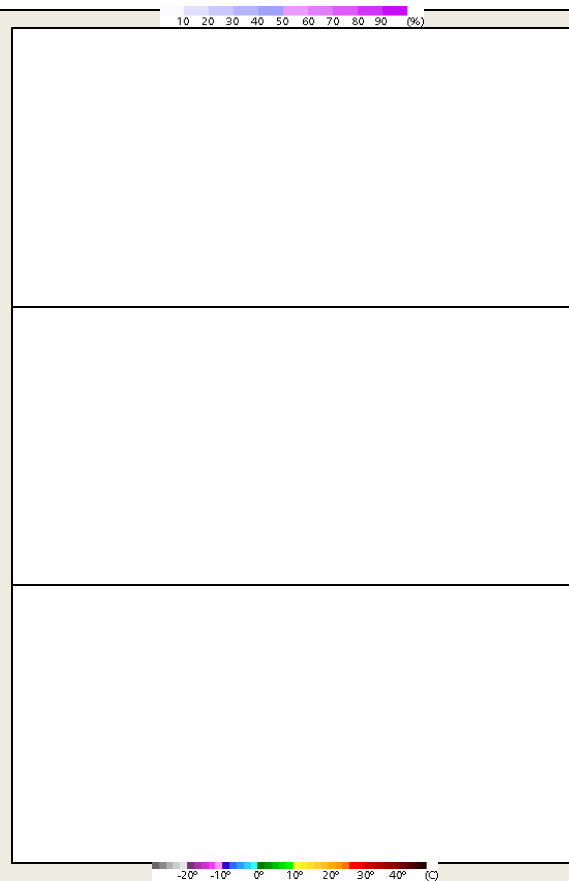
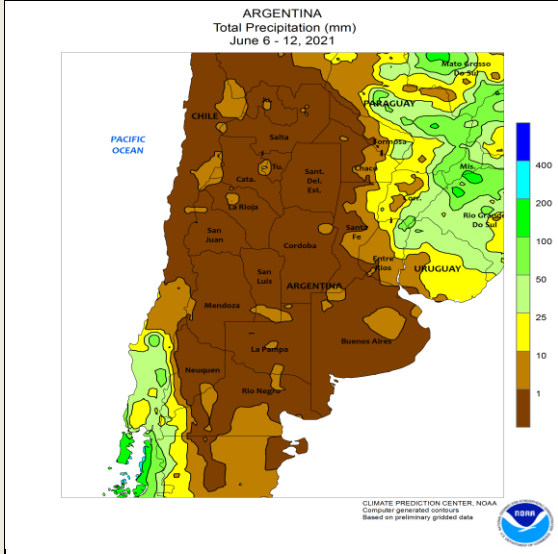
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: No change in the general theme of weather occurred during the weekend and no changes were expected this week. That leaves most northern Safrinha corn and cotton areas dry as well as northeastern Brazil. Rain is still expected periodically in the far south of the nation with just enough rain to keep wheat developing well. Safrinha corn filling, maturation and harvest will advance without much change in overall production or quality. Wheat conditions will remain better than usual.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will see dry weather most often during the next two weeks and good harvest progress should be made around a few rounds of mostly light showers while western Argentina will remain in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat.

- o Most days will be dry with a few light showers on occasion.
- o Light rain will increase from San Luis into Cordoba Wednesday into next Friday and many areas will receive up to 0.25" of rain and locally more.

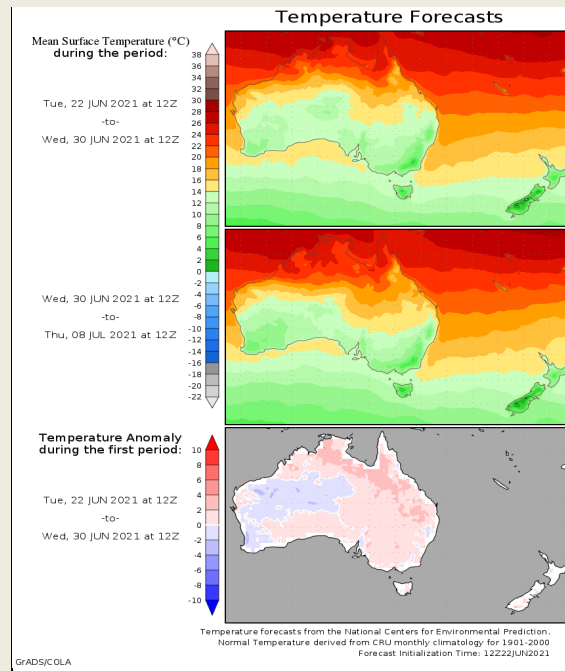
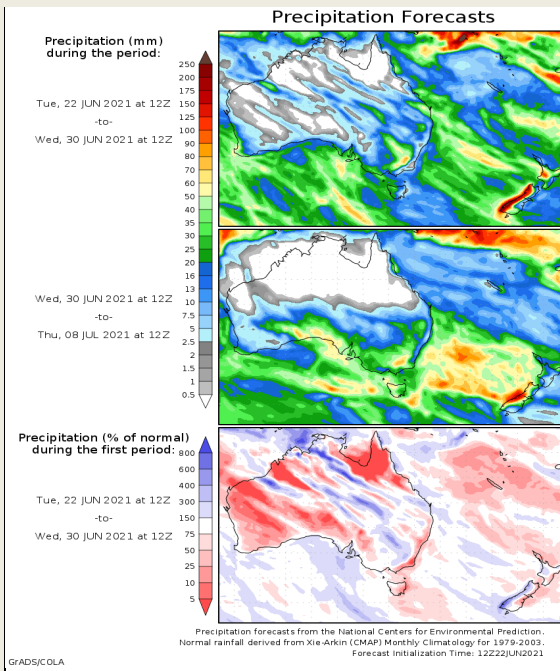
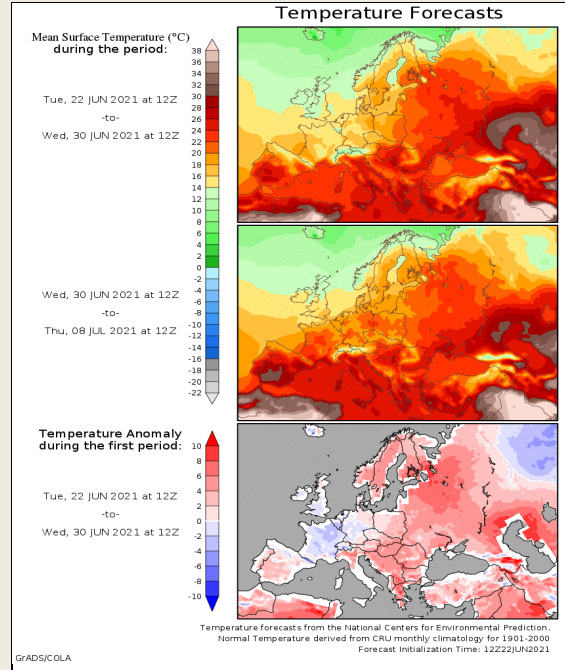
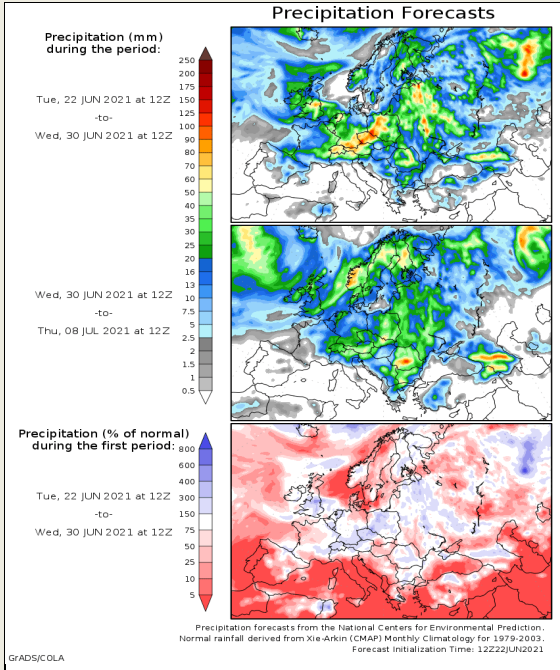


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Favorable soil moisture conditions will continue to be supported by periodic rain the next seven to ten days. Rounds of scattered rain will return to Europe during the middle of next week and replenish topsoil moisture throughout central portions of the continent. In the meantime, rounds of rainfall will be greatest in eastern portions of the continent from Poland and western Ukraine into Romania and Bulgaria.

AUSTRALIA: A good mixture of precipitation and sunshine will occur throughout most of Australia's major winter wheat, barley and canola production areas the next seven to ten days. With that said, a soaking of rain is needed in Queensland and interior northern New South Wales as well as interior southeastern South Australia to completely restore soil moisture, but any improvements will be welcome. Restricted precipitation will also occur in northern and interior production areas of Western Australia this week.



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
