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
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
#### **South Africa - Weather**


Western Cape and Northern Cape will continue to see a mix of erratic rain and sunshine through the middle of next week. Rainfall in Western Cape will be enough to bolster soil moisture and maintain a generally favorable environment for aggressive winter wheat development. Prospects for the wheat will remain favorable. Winter wheat conditions in Northern Cape will also remain mostly favorable due to irrigation.


Dry or mostly dry weather will persist for Free State during the coming week. Irrigated winter wheat will continue to grow under mostly good conditions despite the lack of rain. Dryland wheat will otherwise see poor conditions persist. • Western South Africa will have several opportunities for erratic rain through the middle of next week o The most widespread rain will evolve Monday and Tuesday as a strong frontal boundary tracks

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
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
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
#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: Rain is still expected to fall in most of the Midwest during the coming week to ten days. Sufficient rain will fall to support crop development, although moisture deficits that have bee greatest in the northwestern Corn Belt are unlikely to be fully relieved. Crop moisture stress will be quick to return in northwestern crop areas when warming resumes briefly during mid-week this week and more persistently during the early days of July. Concern over possible hail and flood damage will be on the rise because of the intense thunderstorm activity that is expected Thursday through Sunday from lowa and Missouri to Indiana. Follow up rain later in the forecast period will further raise the potential for flooding.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: A favorable mix of rain and sunshine is still expected in the Delta and southeastern states through the next seven days. Some pockets of dryness will be possible, especially in the southeastern states where today's forecast is a little drier; however, most areas will likely have enough rain to support crop needs.









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
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
#### **South America - Weather**


BRAZIL: No change in the general theme of weather occurred overnight and no changes were expected this week. That leaves most northern Safrinha corn and cotton areas dry as well as northeastern Brazil. Rain is still expected periodically in the far south of the nation with some local looding possible that may lead to a threat to winter wheat conditions and production. Safrinha corr filling, maturation and harvest will advance without much change in overall production or quality. Wheat conditions will remain better than usual.


ARGENTINA: Good late season harvest weather and winter crop planting conditions are expected through the next two weeks. • Rain today will vary from 0.50 to 2.00 inches with a few amounts of 2.00 to 4.00 inches from Uruguay through northern and eastern Entre Rios and central and southern Corrientes to southern Chaco and northeastern Santa Fe

- Mostly dry Thursday
- Showers will return in Formosa, northeastern Chaco and northern Corrientes Friday and Saturday with rainfall to 0.65 inch and locally more in northeastern Corrientes
  o A few showers may also occur in Salta while all other crop areas are mostly dry
- Mostly dry Sunday and Monday, although a few showers will pop up in the far northeast briefly









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
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
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
# **Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather**


EUROPE: Conditions will continue to trend wetter throughout Europe this week. Favorable conditions will occur throughout most of the Continent as long as rain occurs as expected. The only exception will be areas from southern Italy into Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Albania, Greece and into parts of northern Serbia and Hungary where restricted precipitation and some areas of crop stress may occur from a lack of moisture

AUSTRALIA: A good mix of precipitation and sunshine will occur throughout most of Australia's major winter wheat, barley and canola production areas the next ten days to two weeks and mostly favorable conditions should prevail in well-established wheat, barley and canola production areas. With that said, there will still be a need for greater rain in parts of southeastern South Australia, northwestern Victoria and Queensland where conditions have been driest.









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
