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
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
## South Africa - Weather


Winter wheat areas in Western Cape will continue to see a mix of rain and sunshine through the middle of next week. Recent rainfall combined with additional precipitation will support generally favorable conditions for much of the wheat.


Free State and Northern Cape will continue to see dry weather through the middle of next week. 
Irrigated winter wheat will continue to develop under generally favorable conditions despite the lack 
of rain. Rain-fed wheat will otherwise grow unevenly or poorly until rain potentials increase. •

Western South Africa will have several opportunities for erratic rain during the coming week o The 
most significant rain will occur today @ Light rain will also occur Thursday and again late Friday into 
his weekend @ Western sections of Western Cape will receive 0.75-3.00° of rain with local amounts 
over 4.00° by next Wednesday morning @ Other areas in Western Cape and western and southern 
Northern Cape will receive 0.10-0.75° of rain with locally greater amounts • The remaining portions 
of South Africa will remain mostly dry through the middle of next week o Any rain that does occur 
will be lost to evaporation • Drier blased conditions are slated for much of South Africa July 8 – 14









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
#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will see favorable conditions for crop development through the next two weeks with exceptions in the driest areas from eastern Dakotas into Minnesota as well as portions of eastern Nebraska and lowa that missed out on significant rain during the weekend. Most of the Midwest will see mild temperatures through this weekend and highs will generally be in the upper 70s and 80s with some lower 90s in the Ohio River Basin through Wednesday and some lower to middle 90s in the northwest starting Thursday. Warming will occur early next week and by the middle of next week some western areas may warm to the middle and upper 90s. U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see periods of rain and sunshine through the next two weeks and although some areas will dry down overall. soil moisture in place





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#### **South America - Weather**

BRAZIL: Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks in Brazil and Paraguay and fieldwork should advance well.


A few light showers will occur on occasion in coastal areas of the south while occasional rounds of showers occur from eastern Bahia to Espirito Santo.


ARGENTINA: • Argentina will see dry weather most often during the next two weeks and good harvest progress should be made while western Argentina will remain in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat.


o Most days will be dry with a few showers on occasion.


o The best organized rain will occur Tuesday into Friday of next week when scattered showers occur in southern Argentina.

Some rain may fall on southern Cordoba with the rain not likely great enough to have much of an impact on soil conditions.









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
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
## **Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather**


EUROPE: Conditions will continue to trend wetter throughout Europe this week. Favorable conditions will occur throughout most of the Continent. However, southern areas from Portugal and Spain as well as southern Italy into the eastern Adriatic Sea Nations into parts of Hungary, Serbia and Greece will remain mostly dry and crop stress will continue.


AUSTRALIA: Scattered showers and thunderstorms will increase over New South Wales and southern Queensland today into Friday and may linger over the eastern coast into the weekend helping bolster topsoil moisture conditions in portions of southeastern Queensland at least temporarily. Otherwise, restricted precipitation will return to eastern Australia this weekend into the middle of next week.

o Rain totals will vary from 0.20 to 0.90 inch and local totals varying up to 2.00 inches in central and northeastern New South Wales into southeastern Queensland.









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
