South Africa - Weather

Very little rain is slated for South Africa's winter wheat areas during the coming week. Western Cape will have opportunities for light rain, though resulting rainfall will be too light to impact long-term soil conditions. Wheat development conditions will remain good in Western Cape due to periods of rain in recent weeks. Irrigated areas in Free State and Northern Cape will also see a mostly good environment for the crops. Dryland wheat in Free State will otherwise develop poorly or unevenly. • Western Cape and western Northern Cape will only have a few opportunities for light rain during the coming week




B Portions of southern Western Cape will receive 0.10-0.50" of rain with locally greater amounts by next Tuesday morning


B Most other areas will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation

June 27 - July 3, 2021







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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will receive multiple rounds of rain through this weekend and the moisture will be important, especially in the west, as a period of warmer and drier weather is expected July 19-26. Rain through this weekend will be well distributed outside of northeastern South Dakota, eastern North Dakota, and west-central and northwestern Minnesota where little rain is expected and temperature will warm up Sunday into next week. Stress to crops will steadily increase during the next two weeks in the drier areas of the far northwestern Corn Belt and yields should steadily decline with crops in northeastern South Dakota and nearby Minnesota that received rain during the weekend likely seeing some benefit from the moisture for at least a part of this

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Today's forecast is wetter for the Delta and the Southeast during the next two weeks and isolated to scattered showers most days and periods of wet weather Sunday into Wednesday of next week will ensure favorable soil conditions in nearly all of the region during the next two weeks.










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




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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: The most important weather in Europe over the next ten days will be the arrival of some much needed rain in the western Balkan Countries where it has been dry and very warm to hot the past couple of weeks. The moisture expected will bring needed change to the region's crops by replenishing topsoil moisture and reducing crop stress. Other areas in the continent will continue plenty wet especially from the heart of France to Poland, Slovakia and western Ukraine. Net drying is expected in far western France, the U.K., Scandinavia and from Portugal and Spain to southern Italy and Greece.

AUSTRALIA: Rain last week improved topsoil moisture for southeastern Queensland, eastern New South Wales, Victoria and Western Australia where winter crops likely became better established because of the moisture. South Australia, northwestern Victoria and parts of the westernmost crop areas in both Queensland and New South Wales still need greater moisture to induce the best establishment and some of that rain may fell latest this proof.









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
