



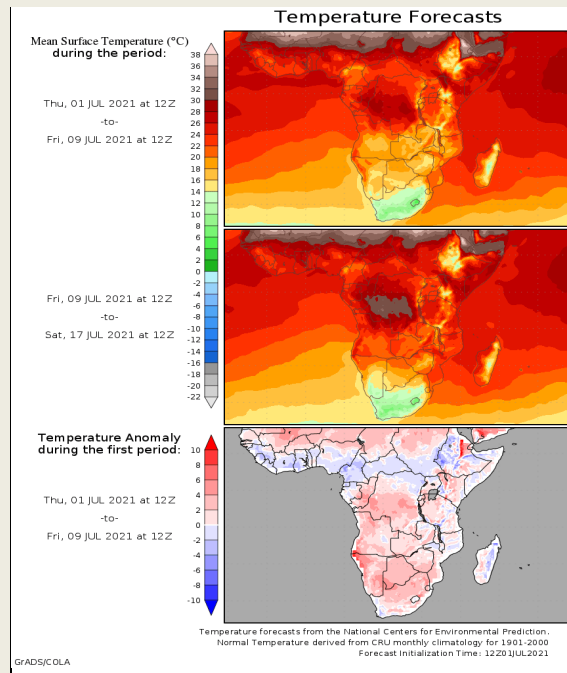
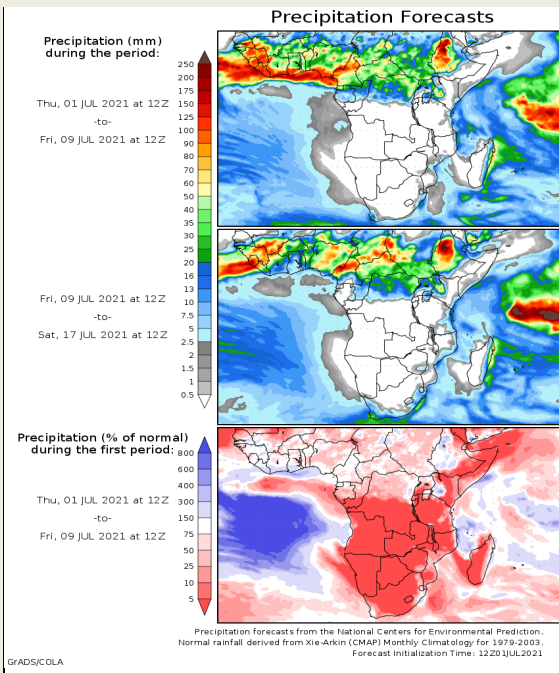
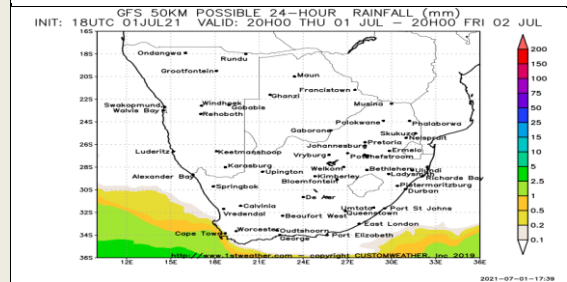
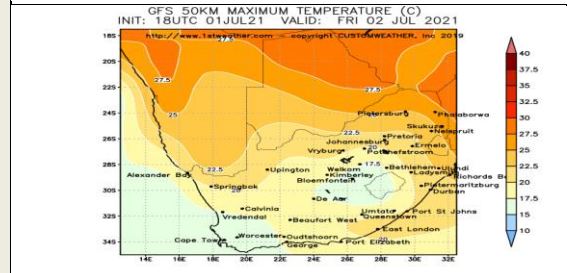
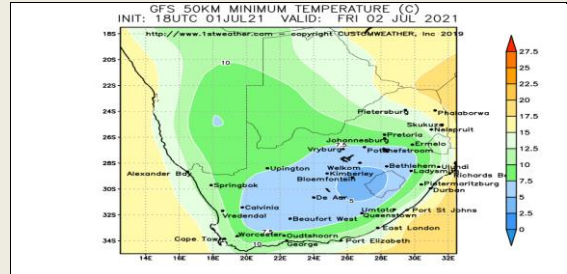
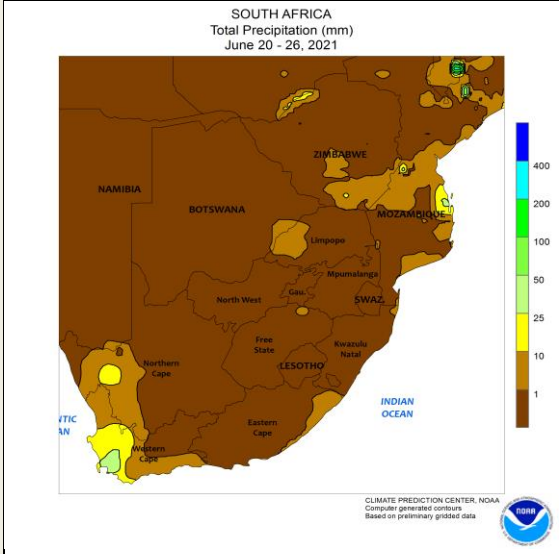
Weather Report

02 July 2021

South Africa - Weather

Western Cape will continue to have a few opportunities for light rain during the coming week. Rainfall will be too light to significantly impact long-term soil conditions in most locations. However, the additional precipitation and recent rainfall will continue to promote a mostly good environment for the winter wheat. Free State and Northern Cape will remain mostly dry during the coming week. Irrigated winter wheat areas will still see generally favorable conditions despite the lack of rain. The dryland fields will otherwise remain too dry for aggressive establishment and growth. Western South Africa will see a mix of light rain and sunshine during the coming week

• Much of the precipitation will occur through the end of the weekend • Southwestern Western Cape will receive 0.25-1.00" of rain and locally greater amounts by next Thursday morning • Most other areas in western South Africa will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation • The remaining portions of South Africa will remain mostly dry during the coming week • Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation • Drier biased conditions are slated for much of South Africa July 9 – 15 • However, southwestern Western Cape and neighboring areas will still have opportunities for rain



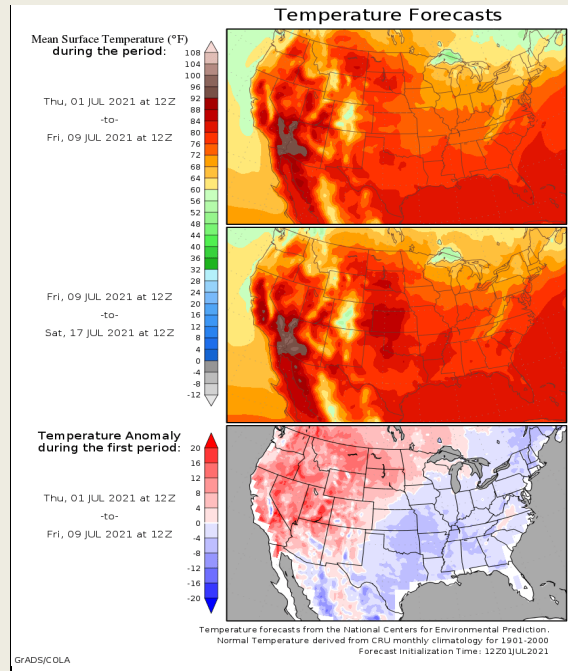
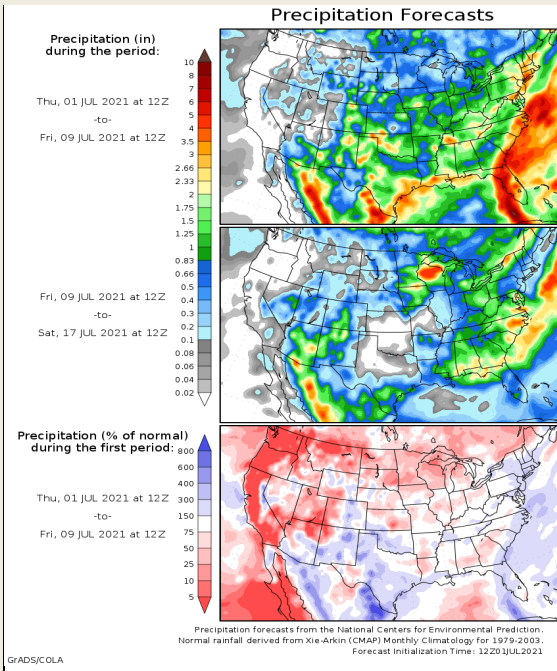
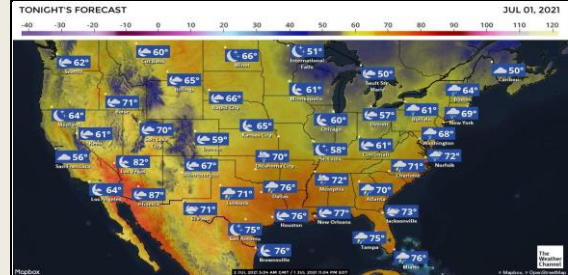
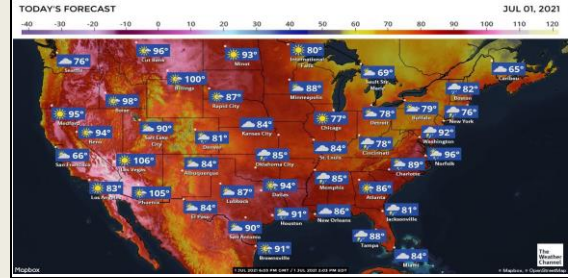
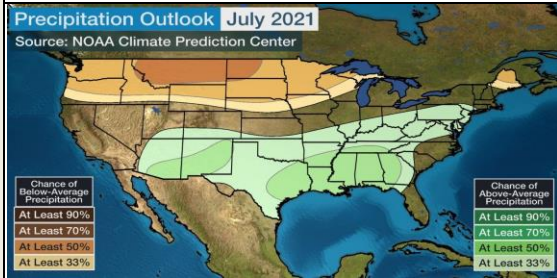
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will see favorable conditions for crop development through the next two weeks with exceptions in the driest areas from eastern Dakotas into Minnesota as well as portions of eastern Nebraska and Iowa that missed out on significant rain during the weekend. Outside of the northwestern Corn Belt a drier weather pattern will occur Friday through the middle of the month, but a few rounds of timely rain will occur and with favorable soil conditions in place corn pollination and development of other crops should occur favorably.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see periods of rain and sunshine through the next two weeks and although some areas will dry down overall, soil moisture in place today should keep conditions for crop development favorable.

o The northern Delta has dried down recently and will benefit from an increase in rain Thursday into Friday. **o There is an increasing likelihood** that a tropical cyclone will develop in and then move from the Caribbean Sea into the Gulf of Mexico next week with the storm possibly in the northern Gulf near July 7-8.

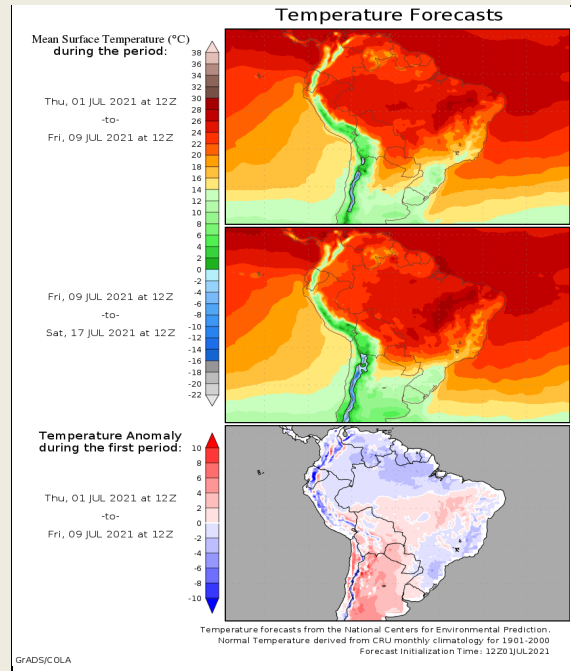
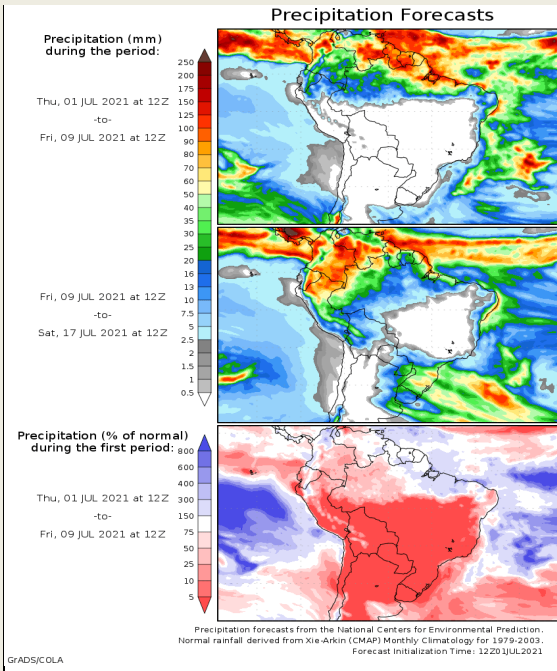
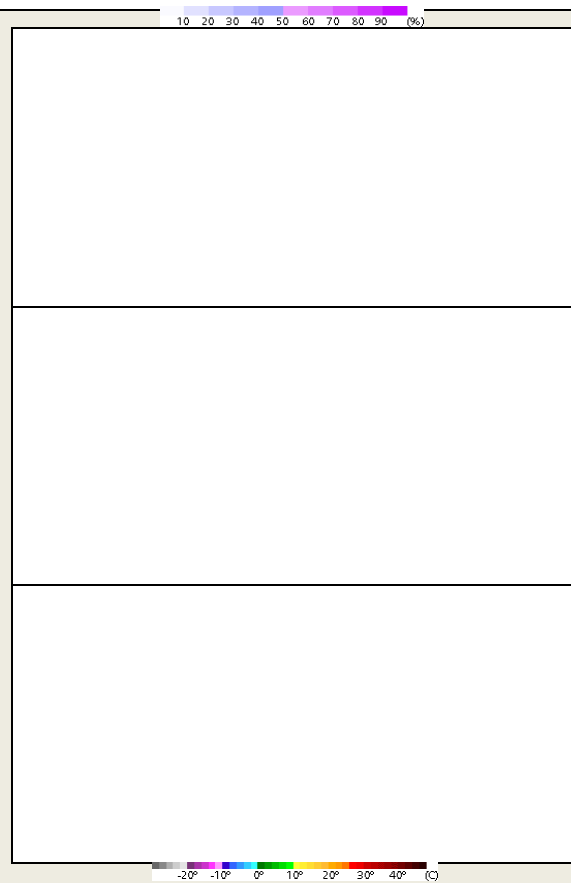
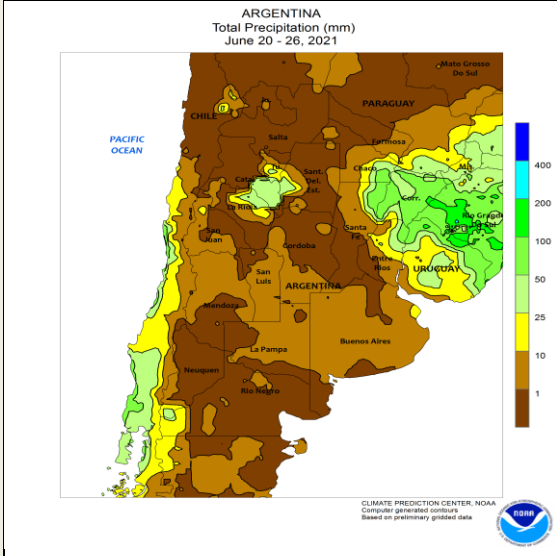


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks in Brazil and Paraguay and fieldwork should advance well.
 o A few light showers will occur on occasion in coastal areas of the south while occasional rounds of showers occur from eastern Bahia to Espirito Santo.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will see dry weather most often during the next two weeks and good harvest progress should be made while western Argentina will remain in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat.
 o Most days will be dry with a few showers on occasion.
 o The best organized rain will occur Tuesday into Friday of next week when scattered showers occur in southern Argentina.
 o Some rain may fall on southern Cordoba with the rain not likely great enough to have much of an impact on soil conditions.



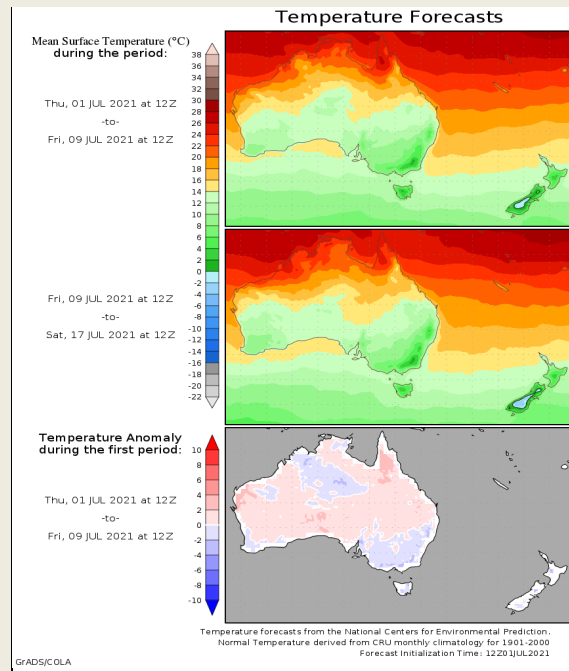
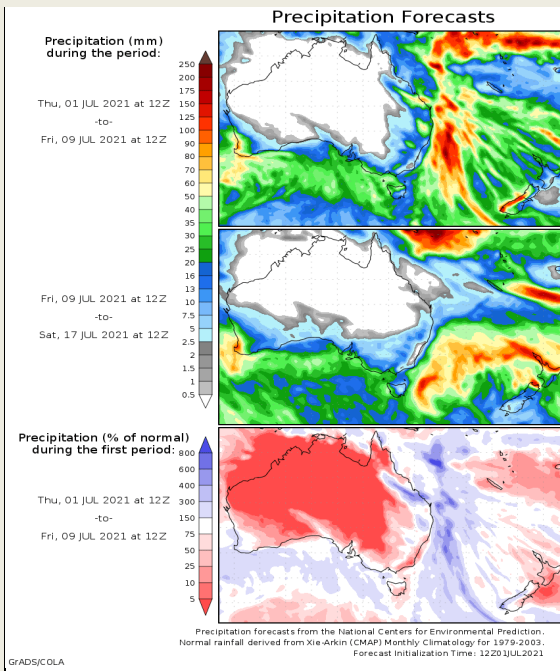
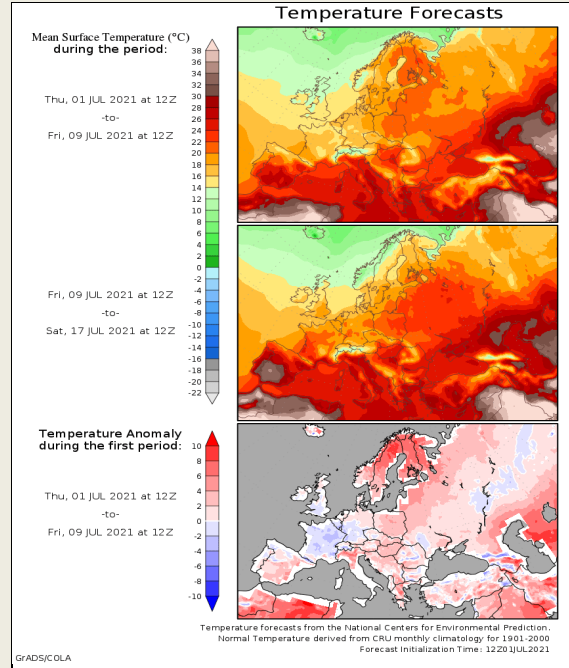
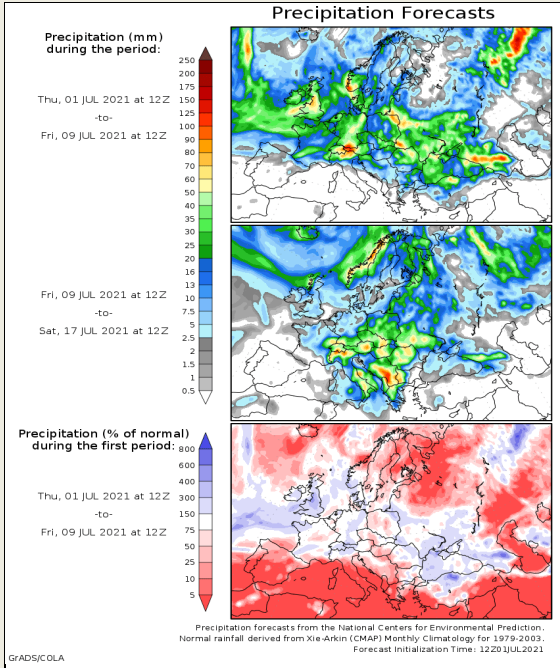
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Conditions will continue to trend wetter throughout Europe this week. Favorable conditions will occur throughout most of the Continent. However, southern areas from Portugal and Spain as well as southern Italy into the eastern Adriatic Sea Nations into parts of Hungary, Serbia and Greece will remain mostly dry and crop stress will continue.

AUSTRALIA: Scattered showers and thunderstorms will increase over New South Wales and southern Queensland today into Friday and may linger over the eastern coast into the weekend helping bolster topsoil moisture conditions in portions of southeastern Queensland at least temporarily. Otherwise, restricted precipitation will return to eastern Australia this weekend into the middle of next week.

o Rain totals will vary from 0.20 to 0.90 inch and local totals varying up to 2.00 inches in central and northeastern New South Wales into southeastern Queensland.



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
