

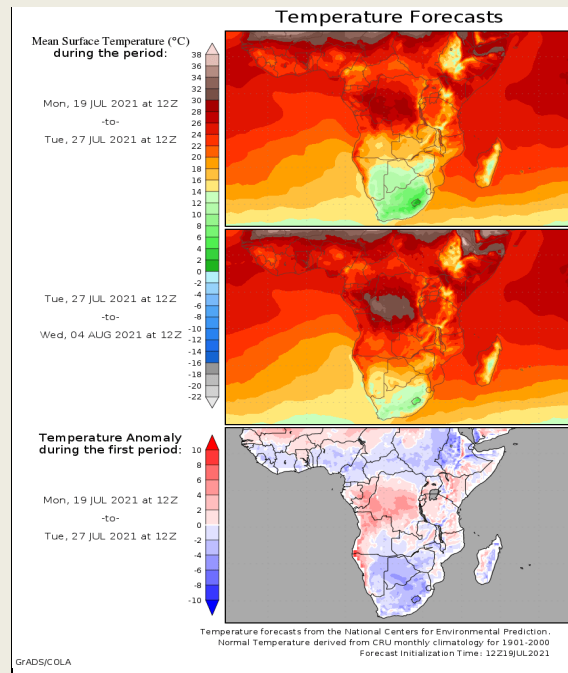
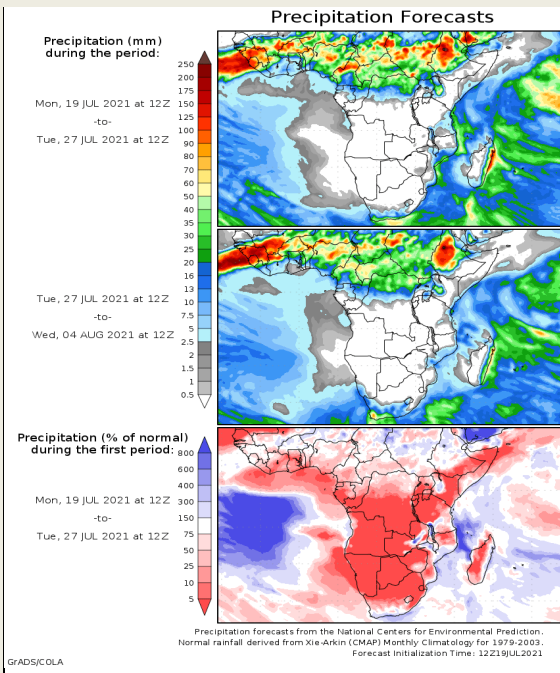
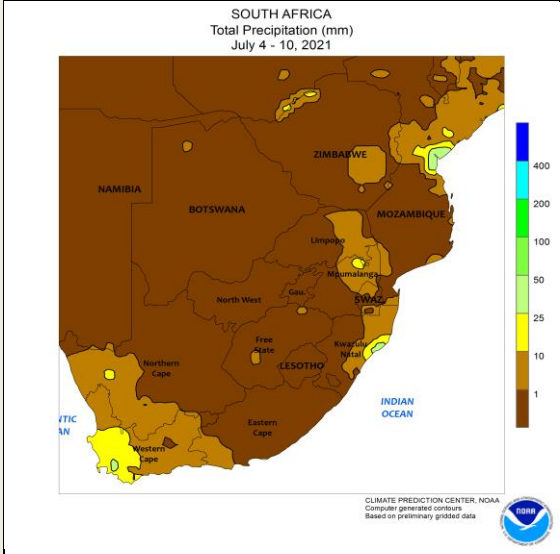
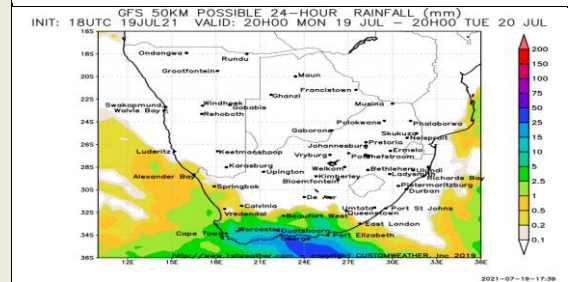
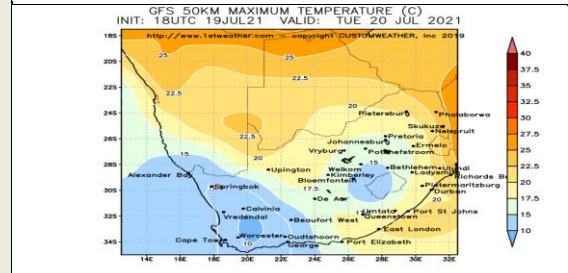
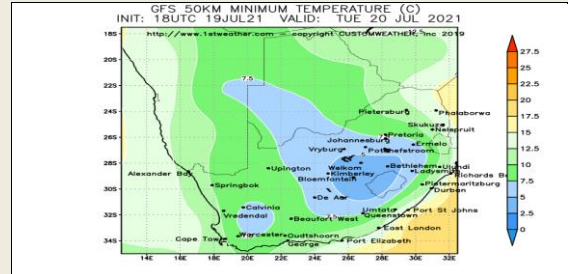


# **Weather Report**

## **20 July 2021**

# South Africa - Weather

Western Cape will see a good mix of rain and sunshine this week. Soil moisture will remain at adequate levels in most winter wheat areas and the outlook will remain favorable. Free State and Northern Cape's winter wheat areas will otherwise remain mostly dry this week. Irrigated crop conditions will remain favorable while dryland wheat prospects remain poor. • Western Cape, western and southern Northern Cape, and Eastern Cape will see a mix of rain and sunshine this week  
 ☐ Much of the rain will occur today through Thursday as a frontal boundary tracks over the region  
 ☐ Western Cape and southern Eastern Cape will receive 0.50-2.00" of rain with many areas near and along the coast receiving more than 3.00" of rain by next Monday morning  
 ☐ Other areas will receive 0.25-1.00" of rain and locally greater amounts  
 • The remaining portions of South Africa will be mostly dry this week  
 • Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation  
 • Drier than normal weather is slated for most locations July 27 – August 2  
 • However, light rain will be possible in southern and eastern South Africa

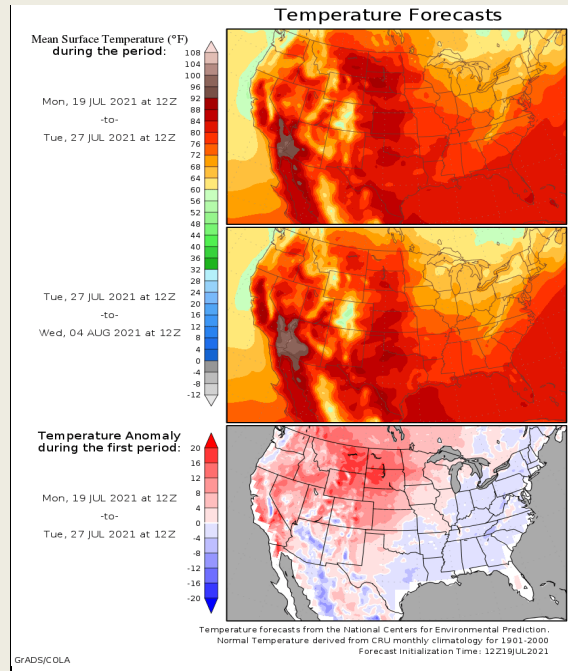
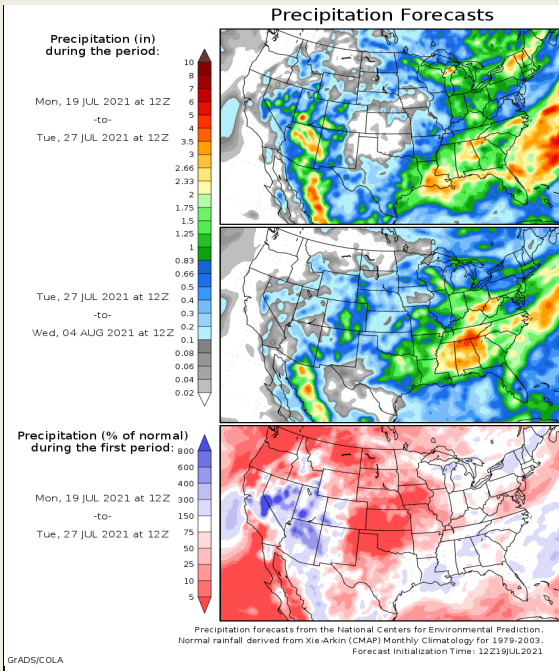
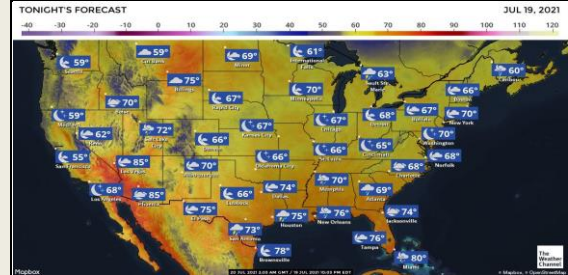
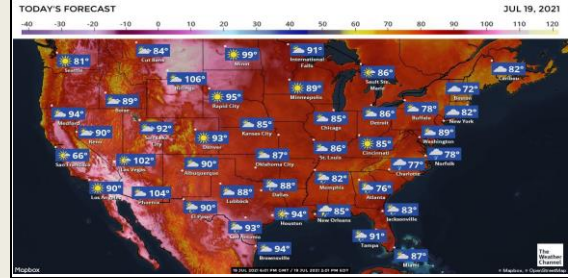
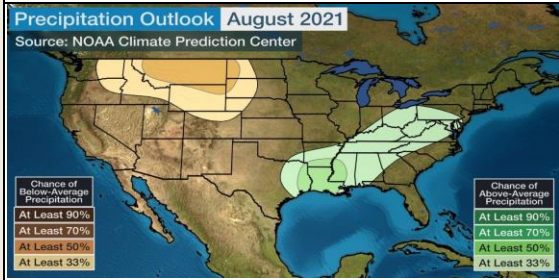


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# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** warmer and drier biased weather pattern will occur during the next two weeks across the Midwest and stress to crops will increase and potential yields will decline in the northwest while subsoil moisture should be high enough to support the needs of crops in most other areas. o Temperatures should not become hot enough through at least the next week to cause serious crop stress outside of the drier areas in the northwest.  
o Two rounds of organized rain are advertised during the next two weeks with the first Friday through Sunday when Wisconsin into Michigan and Ohio is wettest and the second July 29-31 when the central and southern Midwest is wettest.

**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** The Delta and the Southeast will see two more weeks of mostly favorable crop conditions. Temperatures will be mostly seasonable and the lack of excessive heat expected will help to conserve soil moisture.  
o Shower activity July 28-Aug. 2 will be erratic enough that some areas will dry down significantly and will need an increase in rain in soon to ensure favorable conditions for crops continue.

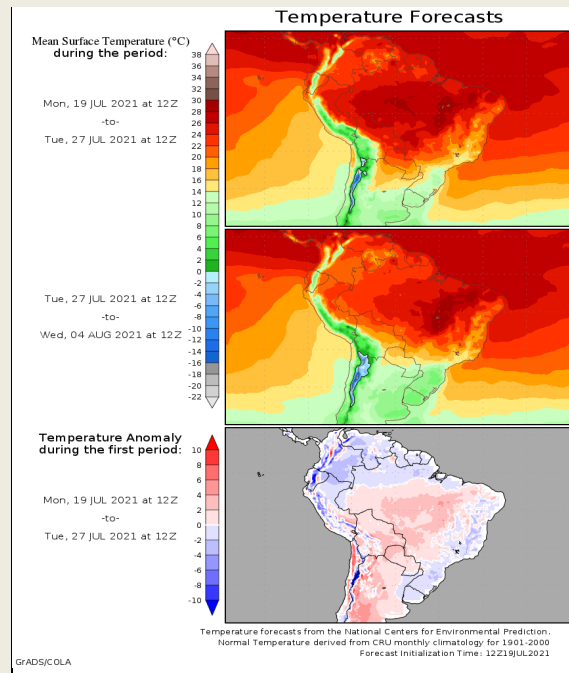
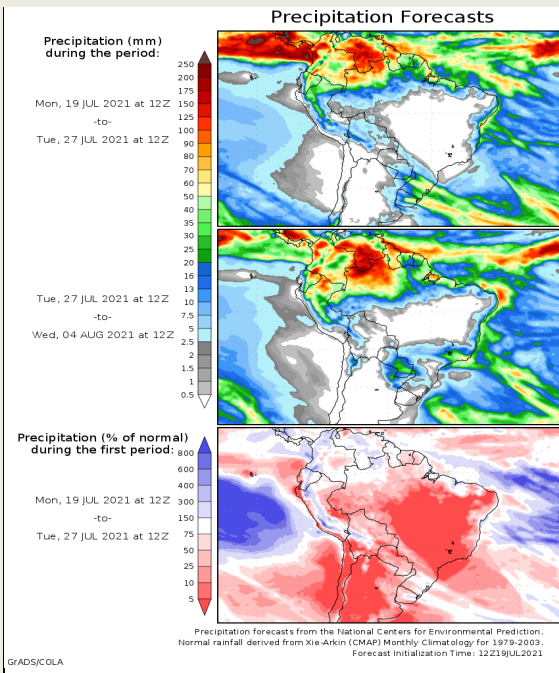
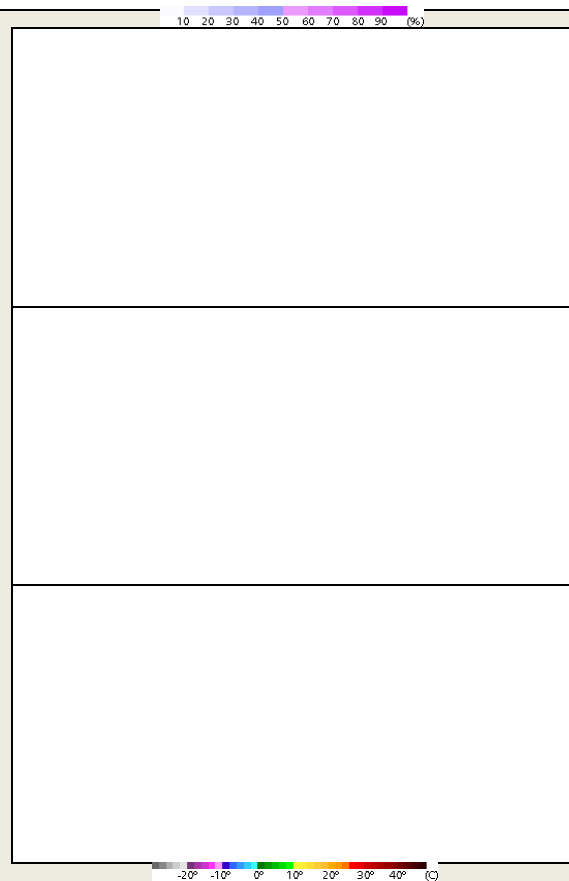
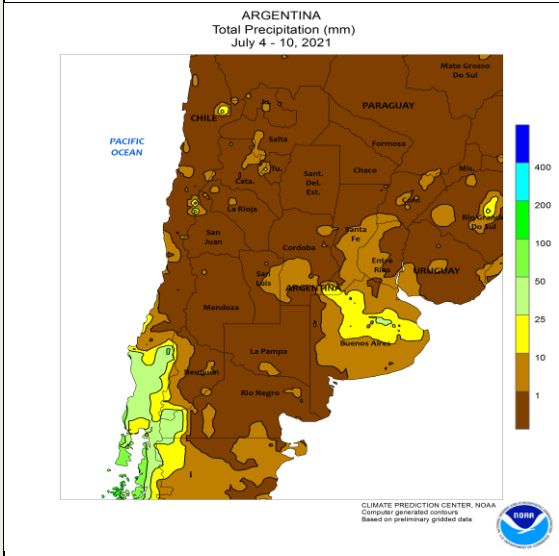


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# South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Paraguay into portions of central and southern Brazil will see regular rounds of showers through Sunday and fieldwork will be slowed by the rain, but much of the rain should be light and some fieldwork should advance round the precipitation.  
o A period of drier weather will follow and fieldwork should increase before showers return to portions of southern Paraguay and southern Brazil July 24-29.

**ARGENTINA:** Outside of an increase in rain Sunday into Tuesday of next week, most days during the next two weeks will be dry and fieldwork should advance well while most winter wheat in the west will remain in need of rain.  
o Rain Sunday into Tuesday, July 27 will be greatest in the south and east an parts of Cordoba will see rain, but amounts there will be less than 0.25" most often and improvements in wheat conditions should be limited.  
o Eastern Buenos Aires to Entre Rios will be wettest and will receive 0.20-1.0" and locally more.



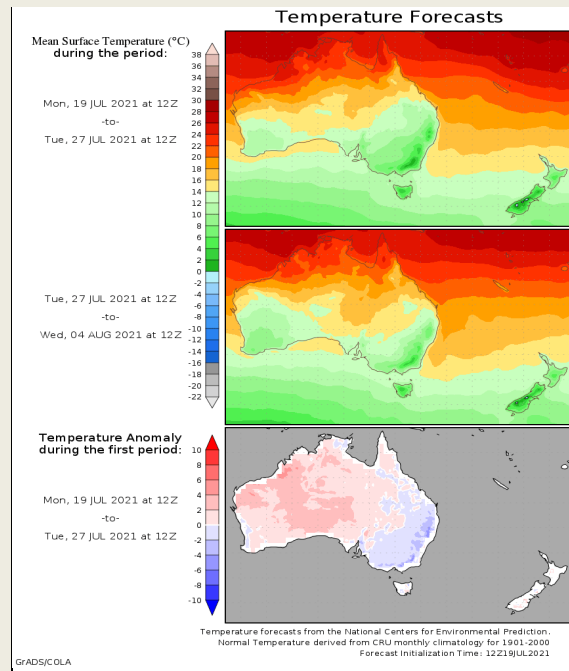
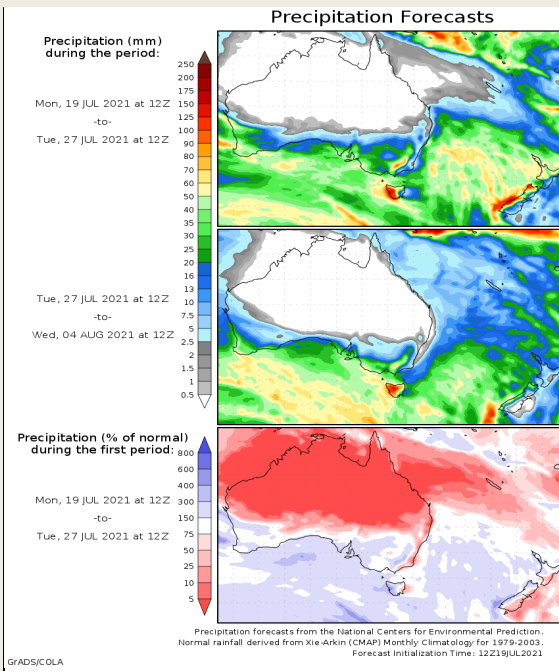
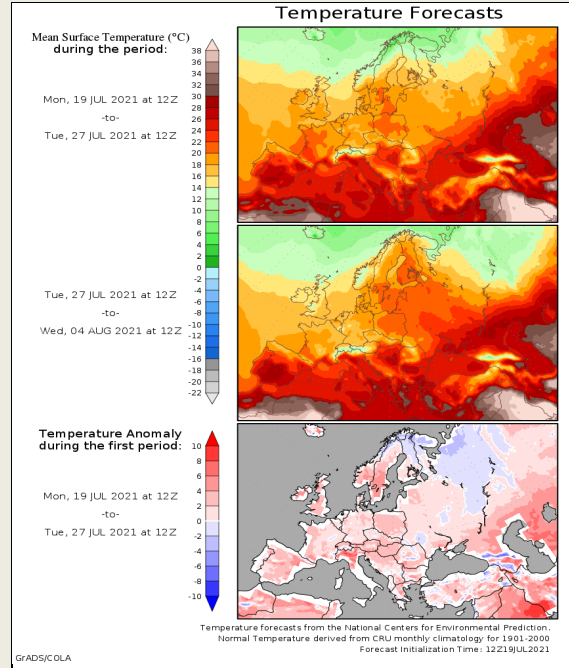
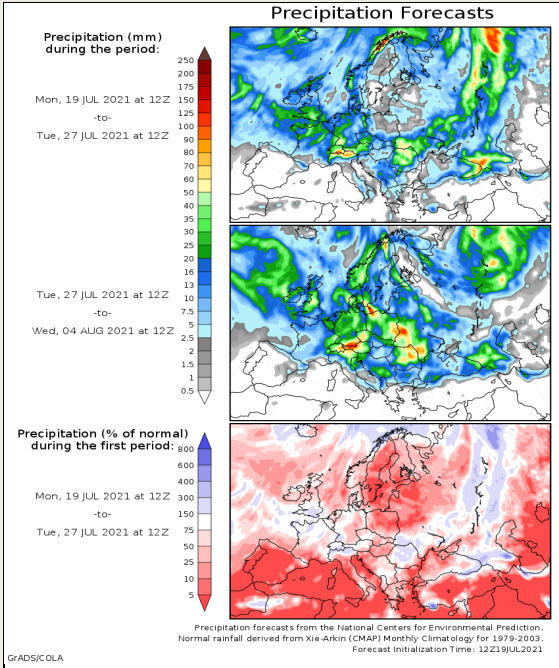
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# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

**EUROPE:** The most important weather in Europe over the next ten days will be the arrival of some much needed rain in the western Balkan Countries where it has been dry and very warm to hot the past couple of weeks. The moisture expected will bring needed change to the region's crops by replenishing topsoil moisture and reducing crop stress. Other areas in the continent will continue plenty wet especially from the heart of France to Poland, Slovakia and western Ukraine. Net drying is expected in far western France, the U.K., Scandinavia and from Portugal and Spain to southern Italy and Greece.

**AUSTRALIA:** Rounds of rain will continue to impact Western Australia as well as southeastern portions of Australia during the coming ten days to two weeks providing a mostly favorable environment for winter wheat, barley and canola establishment. A Rain will be greatest in Western Australia today into Tuesday and additional rainfall is expected to return early next week in Western Australia.

Moisture totals by this time next week will range from 0.30 to 1.00 inch and local totals in excess of 1.00 inch.



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
