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
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
South Africa - Weather


Western Cape will have a few opportunities for light rain through the end of next week. Winter wheat conditions will remain generally favorable due to recent rainfall and additional precipitation. Free State and Northern Cape will otherwise remain dry through the end of next week. The environment will remain favorable for irrigated winter wheat, though dryland wheat in Free State will continue to develop under poor conditions. Western South Africa will see a mix of light rain and sunshine through the end of next week


® The first round of rain will occur later today into this weekend with more rain occurring Wednesday and Thursday ® Southwestern Western Cape will receive 0.50-1.50" of rain and locally greater amounts by next Friday morning ® Most other areas in western South Africa will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation

- The remaining portions of South Africa will remain mostly dry during the coming week
 o Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation
- Drier biased conditions are slated for much of South Africa July 10 16
- o However, southwestern Western Cape and neighboring areas will still have opportunities for rain









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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will see two more weeks of favorable conditions for crop development with exceptions in the driest areas from eastern Dakotas into Minnesota as well as portions of eastern Nebraska and Iowa. Many areas will receive at least some rain next week, but mounts will be light enough that significant improvements in soil moisture or conditions for crops are not likely. Rain has been reduced for the region July 10-11 and little rain is now expected July 9-16. Outside of the northwestern Corn Belt, a few rounds of timely rain will occur during the next two weeks and with favorable soil conditions in place corn pollination and development of other crops should occur favorably.

 Most of the Corn Belt outside of some northwestern areas will see seasonable
U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see periods of rain and sunshine through the next two weeks and although many areas will dry down overall, soil moisture in place today and occasional rounds of rain in most areas should keep conditions for crop development favorable in most areas. o Hurricane Elsa is expected to move across portions of Cuba and into the southeastern Gulf of Mexico early next week before likely moving to the north towards Florida









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South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks in Brazil and Paraguay and fieldwork should advance well.


o A few light showers will occur on occasion in coastal areas of the south while occasional rounds of showers occur from eastern Bahia to Espirito Santo.


ARGENTINA: • Dry weather is still expected to be most common through the next two weeks and good harvest progress should continue with an increase in showers starting Tuesday and continuing into Sunday July 11.


o Some of the driest areas in western Argentina will receive at least some rain, but much of the rain will be light and wheat in Cordoba will likely be left in need of much more rain to induce meaningful increases in soil moisture.

Rain will increase Tuesday into Wednesday from northeastern La Pampa into Buenos Aires where
most areas will receive up to 0.50" of rain and locally more with a band of greater rain from a part of
northwestern to south-central Buenos Aires.









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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Conditions will continue to trend wetter throughout Europe this week. Favorable conditions will occur throughout most of the Continent. However, southern areas from Portugal and Spain as well as southern ltaly into the eastern Adriatic Sea Nations into parts of Hungary, Serbia and Greece will remain mostly dry and crop stress will continue.


AUSTRALIA: Rain will continue from southeastern to the east-central coast of Queensland today helping relieve dryness temporarily, but greater follow up rainfall will still be needed to restore soil moisture. Otherwise restricted precipitation will return New South Wales and Queensland through Wednesday.


o A few showers may linger along the east-central coast into the weekend.

o Additional rain totals will vary from 0.20 to 0.80 inch and local totals varying from 1.00 to near 2.00 inches of moisture.









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
