

# Weather Report 03 August 2021



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
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
#### **South Africa - Weather**


Western Cape will receive light rain this weekend that will help keep soil moisture rated adequately Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable across the region. Northern Cape and Free State will otherwise remain seasonally dry. Irrigated winter wheat prospects will remain favorable as well while dryland wheat in Free State is in need of timely rain. South Africa will be mostly dry through the end of the work week


- o A few areas in the south and east will occasionally receive light rain, though resulting precipitation will be lost to evaporation
- o A frontal boundary will then bring light rain to Western Cape and neighboring areas this weekend

  Pockets will receive 0.50-1.00" of rain by next Monday morning, though most areas will not receive
  enough rain to significantly impact long-term soil conditions
- The remaining portions of South Africa will remain dry this weekend
- Drier than normal weather will persist in most locations August 10 16
- o However, Western Cape and neighboring areas may again see periods of light rain









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#### **United States of America - Weather**

U.S. MIDWEST: Rain will be infrequent enough during the next two weeks that much of the Midwest will be significantly drier by Aug. 13 than today, but outside of the eastern Dakotas into Minnesota and northern lowa where subsoil moisture is short and stress to crops will increase, a combination of mostly mild temperatures next week and adequate subsoil moisture should keep conditions for crops favorable. As long as timely rain returns near the middle of August and heat does not return for an extended period, production potentials should remain high outside of the drought-stricken areas in the northwest. The eastern Dakotas to Wisconsin and central and northern Illinois into central and northern Indiana will be driest during the next week.
U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Two more weeks of favorable conditions for crop development will continue in much of the Delta and the Southeast as regular rounds of rain will occur Sunday through Tuesday with additional rain in parts of the Southeast Wednesday into Thursday before drier weather Aug. 6-13 raises the need for rain near the middle of the month. 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#### **South America - Weather**


BRAZIL: Additional frost and freezes will occur in southern Brazil Saturday causing some further damage to late-planted second season corn, winter wheat, and sugarcane. Dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork will be most common through the next two weeks in Paraguay and Brazil with some light shower activity in the south and northeast.


ARGENTINA: Most days will be dry during the next two weeks and fieldwork should advance well while winter wheat in the west will remain in need of rain.


O while rain may not have much of an impact on wheat right now as the crop is in a semi-dormant state, an increase in soil moisture is needed so the crop can grow once seasonal warming occurs.

July 18 - 24, 2021







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
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
# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: A wetter trend will return over northern and central this coming week. Concern over crop quality declines will return to areas of the U.K. as well as eastern France through Germany and southern Scandinavia. Rounds of scattered heavy rain will occur from northern Italy, Switzerland and southern Germany through southeastern Poland today through the weekend.


AUSTRALIA: Rounds of frequent light rain will continue over southern portions of the nation the next ten days to two weeks maintaining moist conditions over Western Australia, Victoria into southern New South

AUSTRALIA: Rounds of frequent light rain will continue over southern portions of the nation the next ten days to two weeks maintaining moist conditions over Western Australia, Victoria into southern New South Wales as well as coastal South Australia. In the meantime, restricted precipitation will occur over interior South Australia, northwestern New South Wales and into southern Queensland this week and greater rainfall will be needed especially in Queensland where long-term dryness remains most prominent.









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
