
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
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
South Africa - Weather


The main winter wheat areas will be mostly dry during the coming week. Winter wheat conditions will remain favorable in Western Cape due to the adequate amount of moisture. Irrigated wheat in Free State and Northern Cape will also see favorable winter wheat prospects. Dryland wheat in Free State is otherwise in need of significant rain to improve the outlook. South Africa will be mostly dry during the coming week

- o However, a frontal boundary will bring light rain to portions of Western Cape, Eastern Cape, and neighboring areas this weekend
- Resulting rainfall will generally be too light to counter evaporation
- Drier than normal weather will persist in most locations August 11 17
 Southern South Africa will again have opportunities for light rain









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United States of America - Weather

| U.S. MIDWEST: Rain advertised for the upper Midwest this weekend into early next week will slow the drying bias that is expected in many other western Corn Belt locations. Areas outside of Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin and northwestern Illinois will experience net drying o As long as timely rain falls during the second half of the month and heat does not return for an extended period, production potentials should remain high outside of the drought-stricken areas in the far northwestern Corn and Soybean Belt o The eastern Dakotas to western Minnesota and northwestern lowa should see continued crop moisture stress and declines in yield potentials may continue. In the meantime, rain last weekend in eastern Nebraska, southeastern South Dakota and southwestern Iowa was sufficient to carry crops for a while in the absence of rain. U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST. After some additional rain from the far southern Delta to northern Florida to southeastern Virginia today and additional rain from northern Florida to southeastern Virginia Wednesday into Friday, a restricted rainfall pattern will occur through Aug. 17 and the Delta and a large part of the Southeast will dry down significantly. | TODAY'S FORECAST 40 10 20 10 10 20 10 10 10 10 10 10 10 10 10 10 10 10 10 |
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork will be most common through the next two weeks in Paraguay and Brazil with regular rounds of showers in some northeastern areas and ar increase in light showers in the south Monday through Aug. 12.


o Most of the rain in the south will be too light to cause more than temporary interruptions to fieldwork with little impact on soil moisture expected as well.


ARGENTINA: Most days will be dry during the next two weeks and fieldwork should advance well around one round of rain occurring Sunday into next Tuesday that will favor eastern areas. O Some rain will fall on winter wheat in the west, but rain there should be too light to significantly increase soil moisture and the region will remain in need of rain to increase soil moisture before the crop comes out of its semi-dormant state, few northern Buenos Aires locations will see rain Saturday before rain increases Sunday into next Tuesday with southern Entre Rios and northern Buenos Aires wettest where most areas will receive 0.30-1.30° and locally more.

• Lighter rain will surround the region and will extend into Corrientes, southern Buenos Aires, and eastern Cordoba.









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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: A wetter trend will return over northern and central this coming week. Concern over crop quality declines will return to areas of the U.K. as well as eastern France through Germany and southern Scandinavia. Rounds of scattered heavy rain will occur from northern Italy, Switzerland and southern Germany through southeastern Poland today through the weekend.


AUSTRALIA: A favorable mix of precipitation and sunshine will occur over most of winter wheat, canola and barley production areas during the coming ten days to two weeks. Rounds of moisture will prevail over Western Australia as well as the southeastern corner of the nation this week, but precipitation will not be as frequent as last week.

O Most locations in the aforementioned areas will receive rain at one time or another.









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
