
South Africa - Weather


South Africa's winter wheat areas will be mostly dry this week. Crop prospects remain favorable in Western Cape and the irrigated areas in Northern Cape and Free State, Dryland wheat in Free State needs significant rain to improve the outlook for most crops. • Natal, eastern Free State, and neighboring areas will have a few opportunities for rain this week


o Pockets will receive 0.25-0.75" of rain by next Monday morning, though much of the rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation


- The remaining portions of South Africa will be mostly dry this week

- The remaining portions of South Africa will be mostly dry















United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Outside of rain today and Tuesday in the Midwest, precipitation during the balance of the next ten days to two weeks will not be great enough to seriously moisten the soil. Net drying will expedite summer crop maturation and harvest progress. Some winter crop areas will become a little too dry especially in the southwestern part of the Midwest and those areas will need rain soon. U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Much needed drying will impact the Delta and southeastern states after the first part of this week. Any showers that occur in the following tend days will be brief and light enough to allow the ground to firm up and speed up crop maturation and harvest progress. Late season crops will have plenty of subsoil moisture to develop with.






South America - Weather


BRAZIL: The development of sporadic showers and thunderstorms in center west and center south crop areas this coming weekend through next week will help to induce some pockets of improved topsoil moisture which is needed prior to the start of early soybean and corn planting in center west crop areas. Interior southern Brazil already has favorable soil moisture to support wheat development and some early planting of corn and soybeans.

ARGENTINA: The distribution of rain in Argentina during the next two weeks may not favor a big improvement for the driest areas of western and northern Argentina, but showers elsewhere will be good for wheat development and for future early corn and sunseed planting and emergence. Rain is needed in many areas prior to aggressive spring planting.






Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: A good mixture of weather will occur throughout most of Europe this week. Although delays in fieldwork and harvest may occur at times due to rainfall in some northeastern as well as southwestern production areas. O Rounds of rainfall will be greatest over the lberian Peninsula into southern France and northern Italy as well as Scandinavia into portions of Poland, the Baltic States and Belarus this week and conditions will herome too welf for fieldwork to advance (avorable at times.

AUSTRALIA: Little change has occurred in the outlook since last week. Mostly dry weather will prevail in Queensland this week and needs to be relieved soon to induce good spring planting conditions. Dryness has already cut into dryland wheat and barley yields in Queensland and will continue to negatively impact the crop until sufficient rain returns.
