# South Africa - Weather

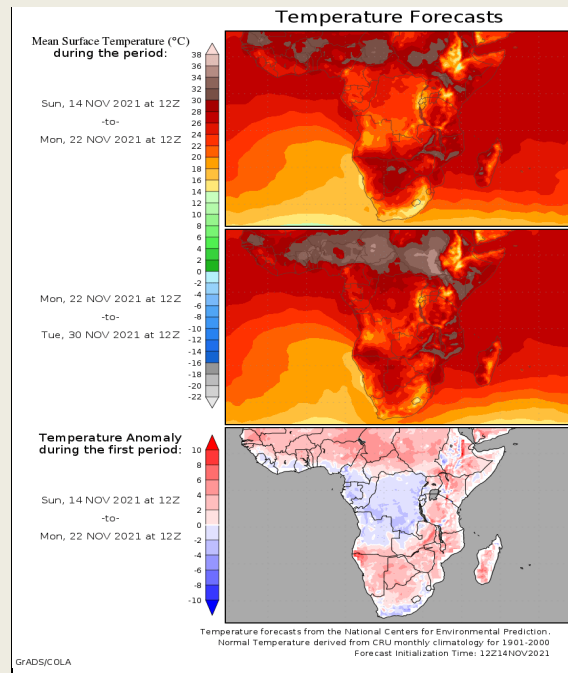
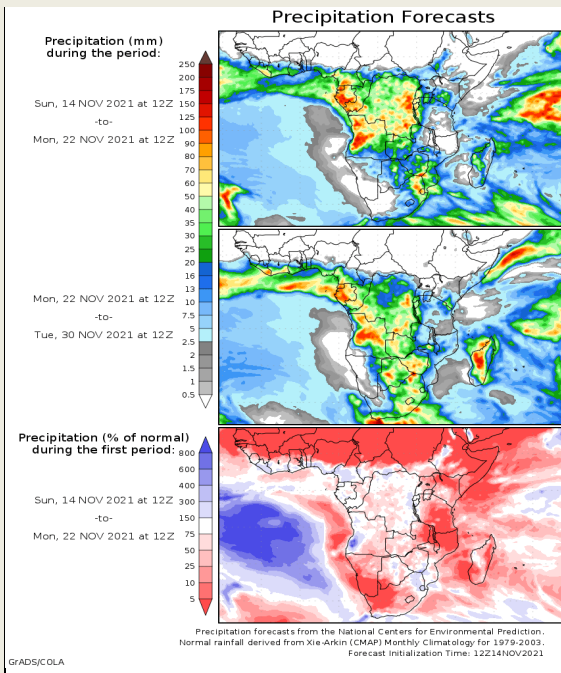
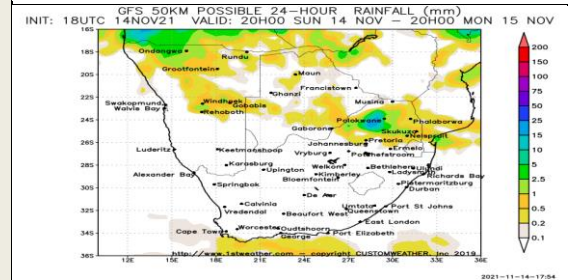
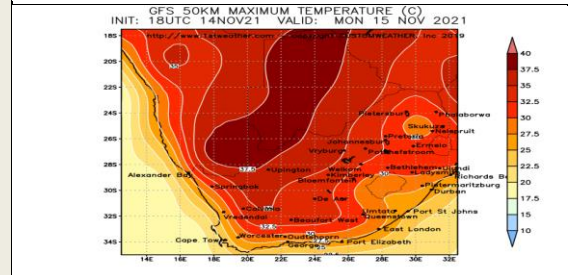
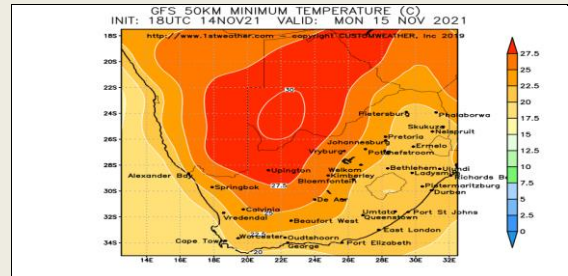
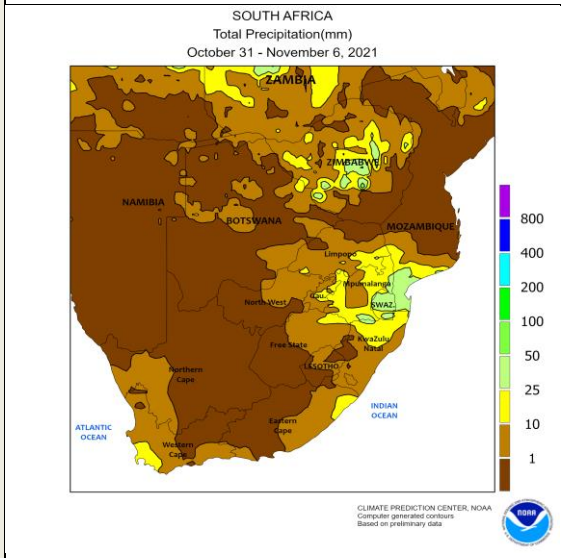
Summer crop planting will continue a little sluggish in many areas through the first half of next week because of low soil moisture. The forecast for greater rainfall in the second week, however, could provide some stimulus for greater field progress. Greater rain will still be desired throughout the nation, but interior eastern crop areas may get enough moisture in the second half of next week to improve field working conditions.

Wheat harvesting will continue to advance well around the precipitation especially in this first five days of the outlook when rainfall is most limited. • Rain through Tuesday will be confined to the eastern one-third of the nation

o Northeastern Mpumalanga to southeastern and south-central Limpopo will receive 0.30 to 1.00 inch of rain with a few greater amounts

o Most other areas from eastern North West and eastern Free State into Natal and the remaining eastern parts of the nation will vary from 0.10 to 0.75 inch with a few amounts near 1.00 inch. o Any showers that occur elsewhere will fail to produce significant rain

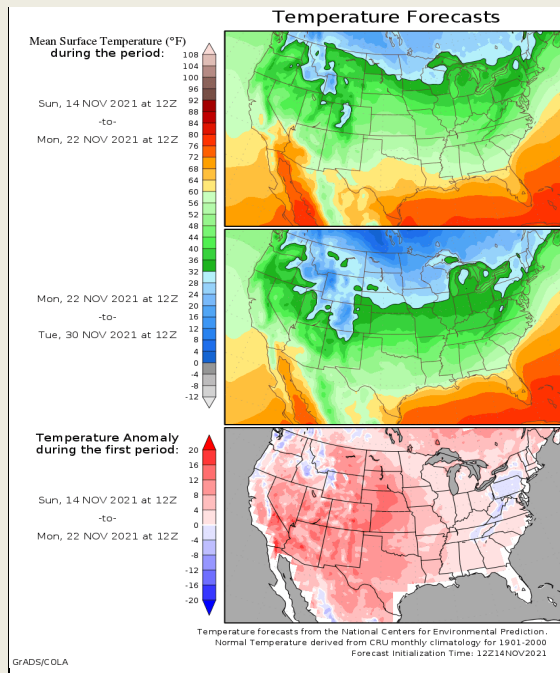
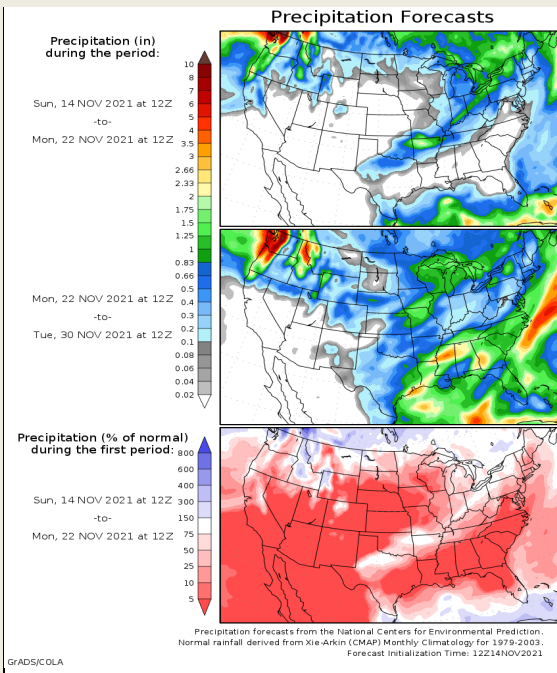
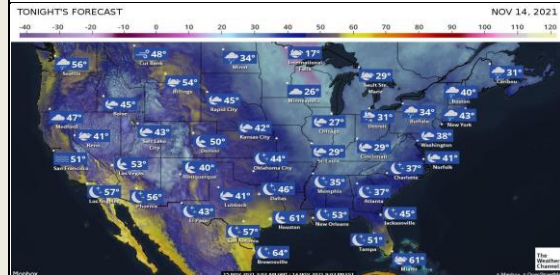
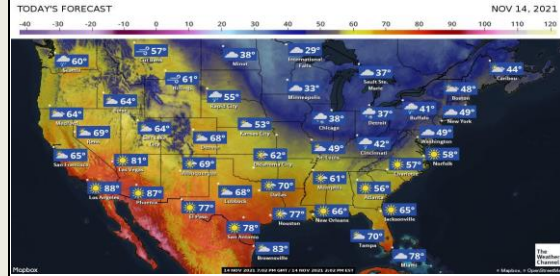
• Showers and thunderstorms will increase Wednesday into Saturday of next week across many summer crop areas



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# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** The Midwest will see cooler and wetter weather pattern through the next ten days that will slow fieldwork in the few remaining areas that have yet to be harvested.  
 o There will be breaks between rounds of precipitation and some harvesting should advance during the dry days.  
 o Some snow will accumulate through Sunday with eastern North Dakota to Michigan seeing several inches.  
**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** The Delta and the Southeast will have good opportunities for harvesting during the next two weeks with a period of wetter weather Wednesday evening into Nov. 21 expected to cause minor interruptions to fieldwork.



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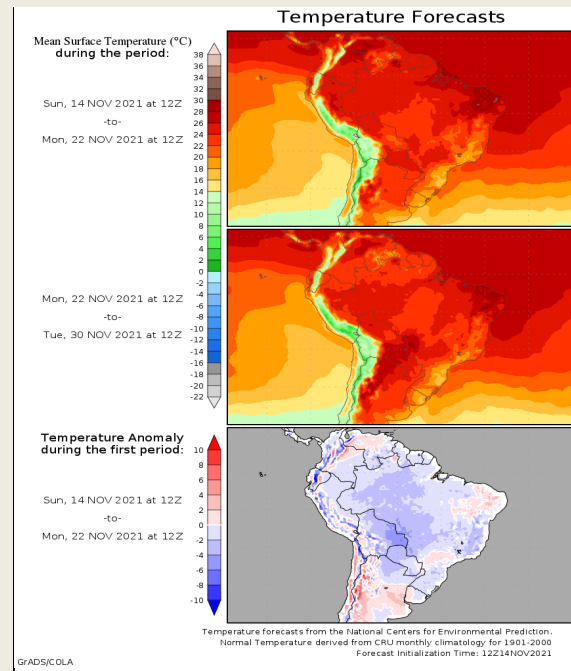
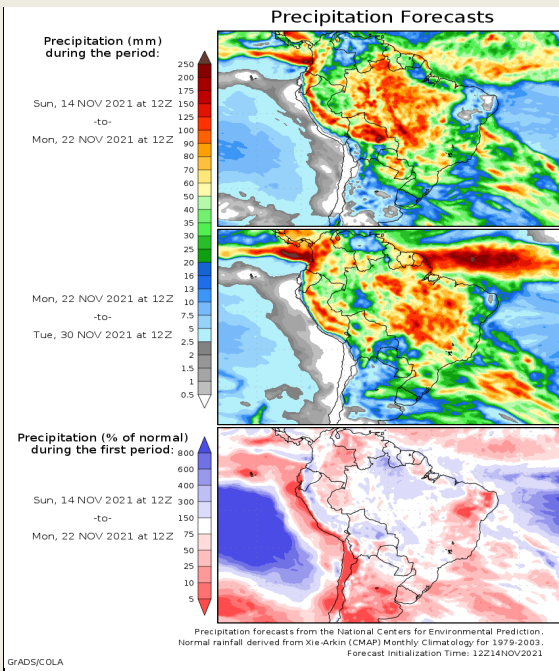
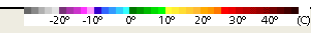
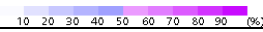
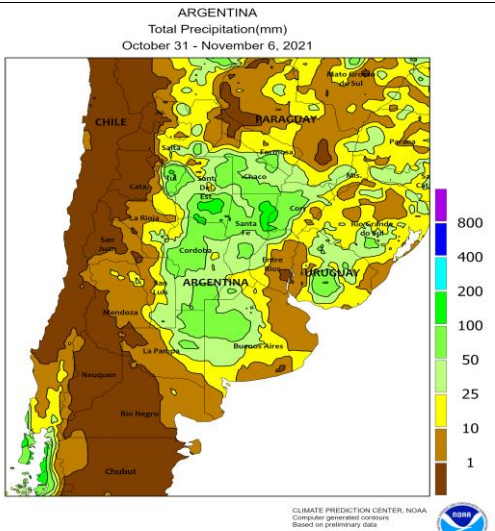
# South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Several more days of little to no rain will occur from southern Paraguay and Rio Grande do Sul through Sao Paulo before a timely increase in rain occurs Tuesday through Thursday. Most of the remainder of Brazil and Paraguay will see regular rounds of rain through the next two weeks and increases in soil moisture are likely in many areas.

- o Mato Grosso and Goias will be wettest where regular rounds of heavy rain are likely and planting will be slowed at times with some local flooding as well.

**ARGENTINA:** Argentina will see a favorable environment for planting and crop development through most of the next two weeks with interruptions to fieldwork resulting from beneficial rain expected today into Tuesday.

- o Widespread and significant rain into Sunday and lighter rain Monday into Tuesday will leave soil conditions favorable for crops before drier weather beginning Wednesday will allow fieldwork to resume.
- o By late this month topsoil moisture may be short in some areas and a boost in rain will be needed soon.



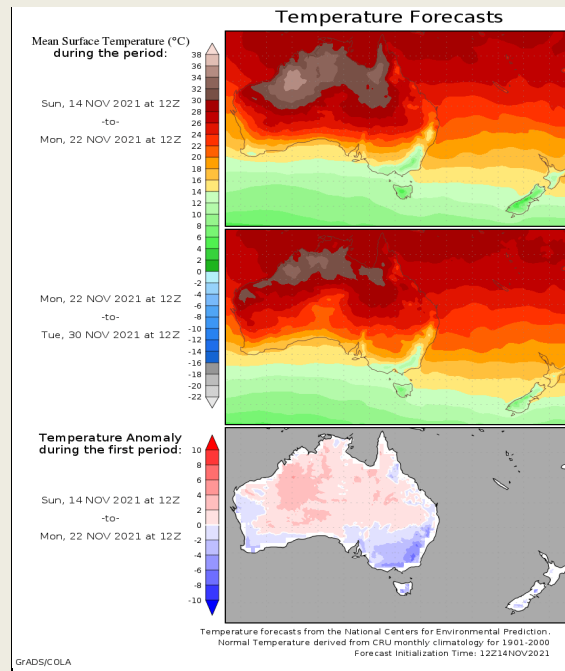
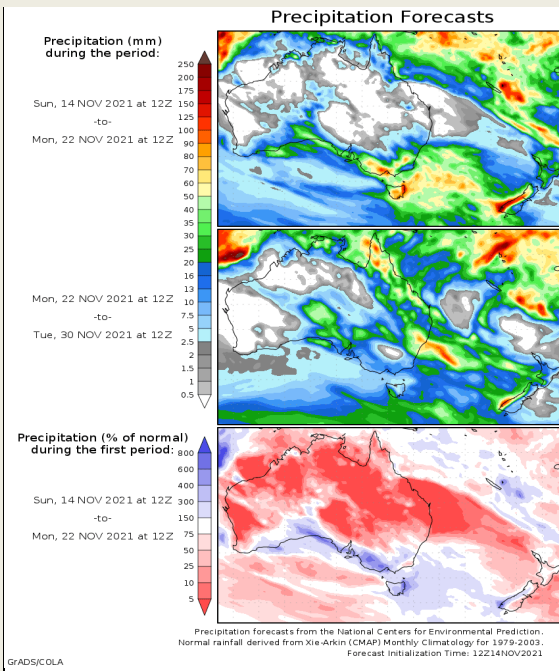
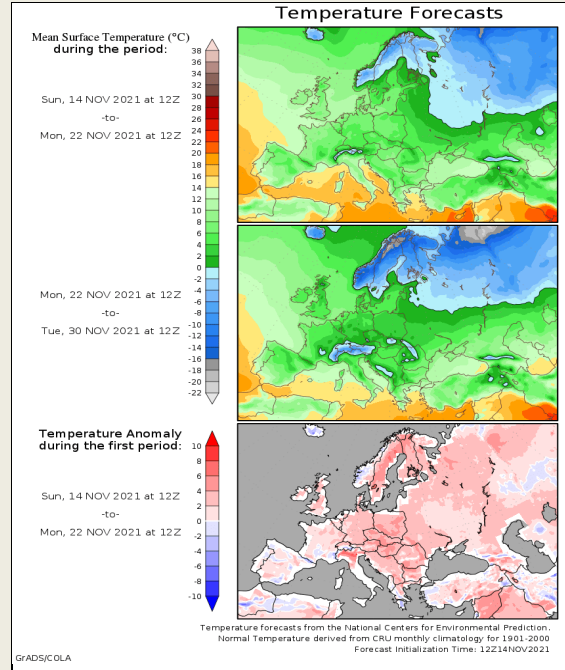
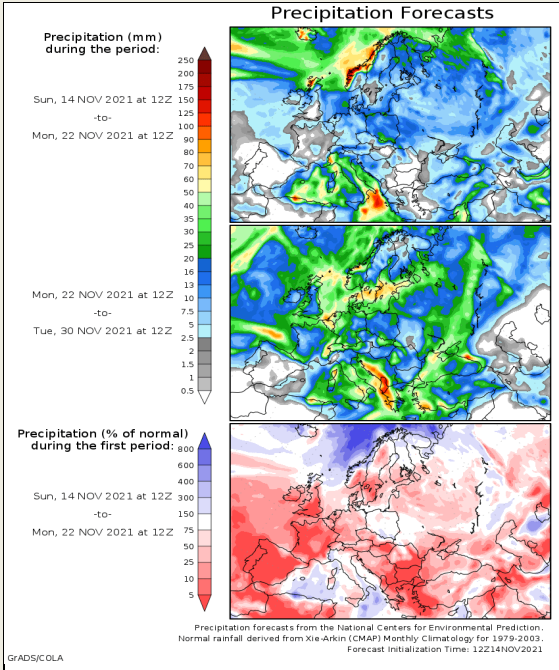
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# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

**EUROPE:** A low-pressure system will develop over the Mediterranean Sea this weekend and the storm system will become stronger early next week and heavy rain will develop over southern Italy and is expected to eventually meander over Greece late next week. Flash flooding will occur with the torrential rainfall.

**AUSTRALIA:** Restricted precipitation will evolve over eastern Australia this weekend into Thursday. The drier weather will follow recent rain which allow for improved winter crop maturation and harvest as well as fieldwork, planting and establishment of summer crops. o Conditions will not be completely dry

- Showers will linger over Victoria into southeastern New South Wales this weekend into Monday.
- Daily totals will be no more than 0.30 inch most often. Local totals in and around the southeastern Great Dividing Range to the southeastern coast will receive a few totals exceeding 0.75-inch Saturday into Sunday.



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
