
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
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
### **South Africa - Weather**


Eastern and central South Africa will see a good mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week. Rainfall will help bolster soil moisture in most locations with exceptions for western fringes of Free State and North West. Planting and establishment conditions will either improve or remain favorable in the main summer coarse grain, oilseed, and cotton areas. However, much of Free State, North West, and Limpopo will need additional rain to support ideal crop prospects. Harvesting of winter wheat may be sluggish at times in Free State.

Western Cape will also receive enough rain at times to potentially slow or delay winter wheat harvesting during the coming week. Producers will still have opportunities to get into the fields between rain events. No significant quality impacts are expected. Harvesting in Northern Cape will otherwise advance swiftly.









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
### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: The Delta and the Southeast will have good opportunities for harvesting during the next two weeks with a couple rounds of precipitation from Wednesday evening into Sunday expected to cause brief interruptions to fieldwork.


o A more significant precipitation event should occur Nov. 24-26, but the ground should be dry enough that prolonged delays to harvesting do not result.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will have good opportunities for harvesting during the next two weeks with a period of wetter weather Wednesday evening into Nov 21 expected to cause minor interruptions to fieldwork.







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### **South America - Weather**


BRAZIL: Far southern Brazil and southern Paraguay to Sao Paulo and southern Minas Gerais will see a timely increase in rain today into Thursday with follow up rain Nov. 23-26 that will ensure favorable soil through late this month. o The region is not expected to see much heavy rain and good planting progress should occur around the rain events.


 Most of the remainder of Brazil and Paraguay will see regular rounds of rain through the next two weeks and increases in soil moisture are likely in many areas. o Mato Grosso and Goias will be vettest while Bahia is driest.


ARGENTINA: The bottom line to the two-week outlook remains favorable for planting and development of crops in much of the country, although southern and some central areas will dry down significantly and will need rain soon.


Much of the country has enough soil moisture to support crops through the next two weeks, but by late this month topsoil moisture should be short in some southern and a few central areas and a

o Planting should advance well overall during the next two weeks with interruptions from rain not likely to cause more than brief delays to fieldwork









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
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
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
# **Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather**


EUROPE: A low-pressure system will develop over the Mediterranean Sea this weekend and the storm system will become stronger early next week and heavy rain will develop over southern Italy and is expected to eventually meander over Greece late next week. Flash flooding will occur with the torrential rainfall.

AUSTRALIA: Rain will return Thursday into Sunday from west to east across southern Australia and follow up moisture will return to interior New South Wales into southeastern Queensland Monday into Wednesday. The moisture will be beneficial for summer crop planting and crop establishment, but concern over crop quality in unharvested crops will return to southeastern Australia with delays in fieldwork.









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
