



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
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
South Africa - Weather

A good mix of rain and sunshine will prevail over the next two weeks supporting normal summer crop development and favorable late season planting. Far western summer crop areas would benefit from a boost in rainfall. Dry weather in the west will be good for wheat harvesting. • Alternating periods of rain and sunshine will occur through the next ten days o Daily rainfall will vary up to 0.75 inch most often with a few amounts of 1.00 to 2.00 inches The precipitation will occur often enough to support most crop development needs Far western portions of summer crop country will have the poorest distribution of rain, but that region is also more frequently irrigated than areas to the east









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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Fieldwork should advance well overall during the next two weeks as the precipitation expected should not be heavy enough to cause excessively muddy conditions and fieldwork should occur between precipitation events.


o Good opportunities for harvest the few remaining soybeans in the east will occur Saturday afternoon into next Wednesday when mostly dry weather is expected.


o A significant storm system will impact the region will Friday into early Saturday with heavy snow


Ikkely fall from southeastern South Dakota and northeastern Nebraska to a large part of Wisconsin.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Much of the Delta and the Southeast will receive rain Friday into
Saturday causing interruptions to fieldwork and discoloring some unharvested cotton before drier
weather Sunday into Wednesday allows fieldwork to resume and cotton to be bleached white. O The
Southeast will see a few more days of mostly dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork
while the Delta sees another round of rain Dec. 16-18. O Another round of precipitation will occur
Dec. 19-21.

o The precipitation expected through the next two weeks will be good for winter crops.







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
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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Rio Grande do Sul will see a restricted rainfall pattern through the next two weeks and some newly planted crops may see rising levels of crops stress as the topsoil dries out while subsoil moisture should be high enough to support crops with developed root systems for a while longer. Subsoil moisture may become short beyond the middle of the month and stress to crops should steadily increase until rain returns. Areas from Paraguay and Mato Grosso do Sul to Santa Catarina, Parana, and Sao Paulo will receive significant and beneficial rain Saturday through Monday. ARGENTINA: West-central into southern Argentina will see favorable conditions for planting and development of crops during the next two weeks while rain in northern, central, and east-central areas will not be great enough to prevent rising levels of crop stress in some areas. o The best conditions for crops will occur in west-central and southwestern Argentina where significant rain is advertised for into Thursday and follow-up showers will occur Friday into Sunday.

O Most of the remainder of Argentina will see rain Friday through Sunday before dry weather is most common Monday through Dec. 22 and good planting progress occurs.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Regular rounds of precipitation will continue throughout Europe this week. The most frequent moisture will impact the northern coast of Spain, France into portions of Germany and the Alps as well as Italy into Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Montenegro into Hungary and Slovakia today through the Monday. Moisture will increase over the U.K. and into France Tuesday into Wednesday as well as southeastern portions of

AUSTRALIA: Harvest of winter crops and fieldwork will improve over Australia this week, especially areas that have been wettest over New South Wales and southeastern Queensland in November and the first days of December. The lack of rain will allow crop maturation and harvest to occur uninterrupted in many locations and rain that does occur will be brief and erratic and slow fieldwork briefly. The greatest shower and thunderstorm activity will impact the central coast of Queensland today into Saturday and return to southeastern Australia near the coast Tuesday into Wednesday. Totals will vary from 0.05 to 0.80 inch and local totals up to 2.50 inches.









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
