South Africa - Weather

Frequent rainfall will persist for eastern South Africa through the middle of next week. Rainfall will be enough to keep soil moisture at adequate to excessive levels. The environment will remain mostly favorable for aggressive grain, oilseed, and other crop development. However, a few fields may be too wet at times for ideal developmental conditions. Central South Africa will have a few opportunities for light rain through the middle of next week while western South Africa is mostly dry. The ground will gradually firm despite periods of light rain. The drying trend will be welcome in areas that are still excessively wet. Crop development conditions will either improve or remain favorable in most production areas.

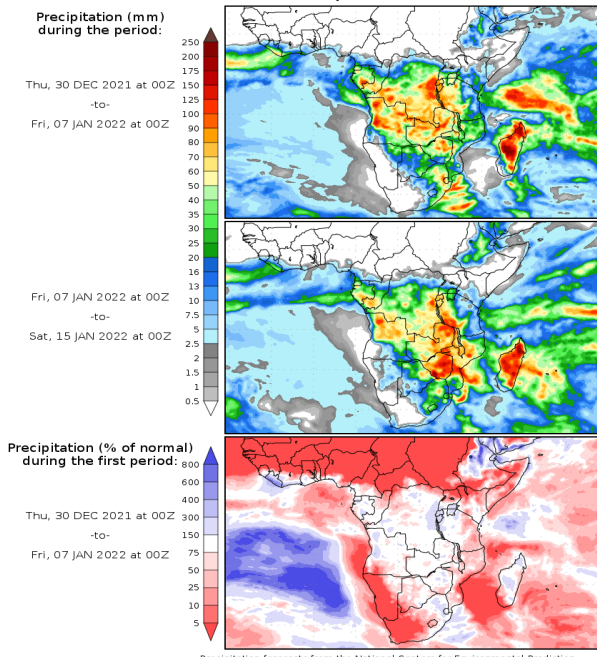


SOUTH AFRICA

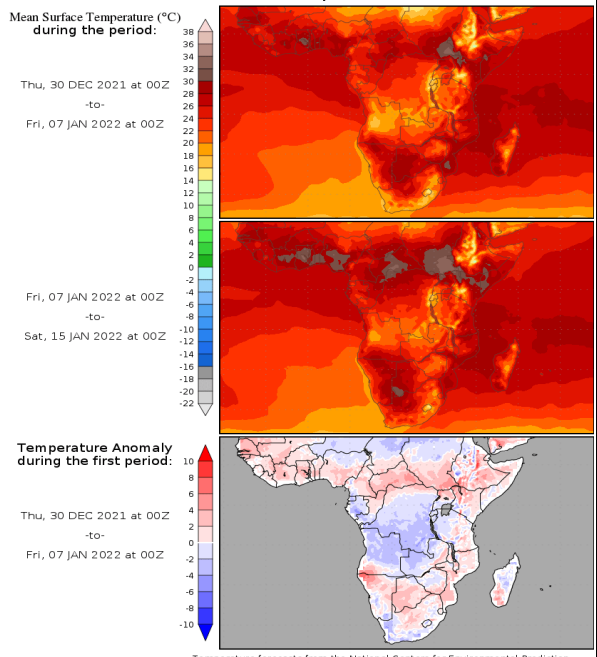
Precipitation Forecasts

Forecast Initialization Time: 00Z30DEC2021

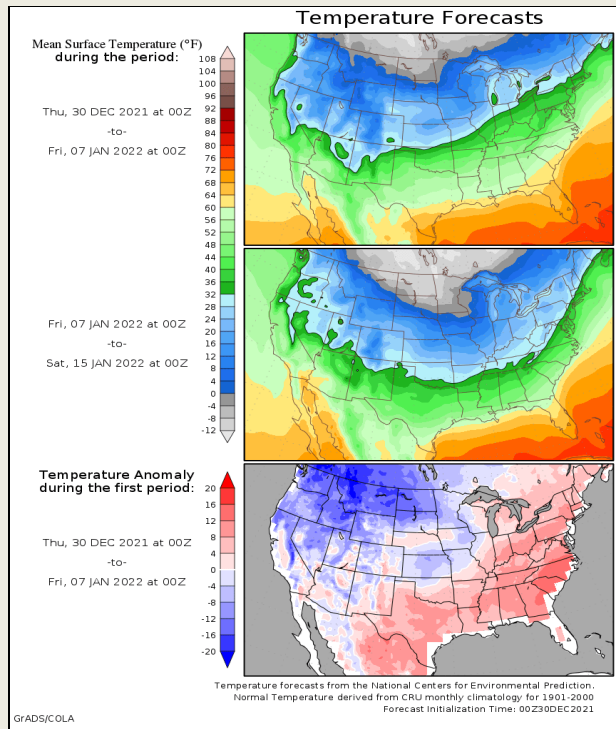
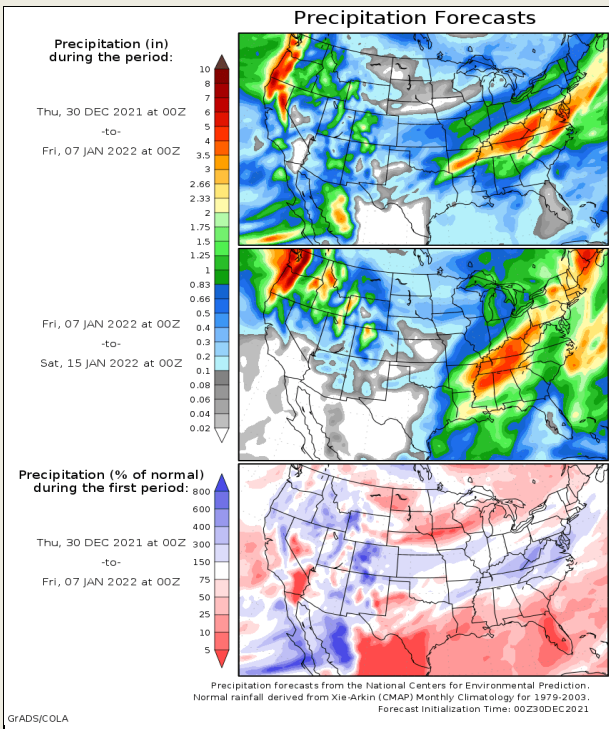
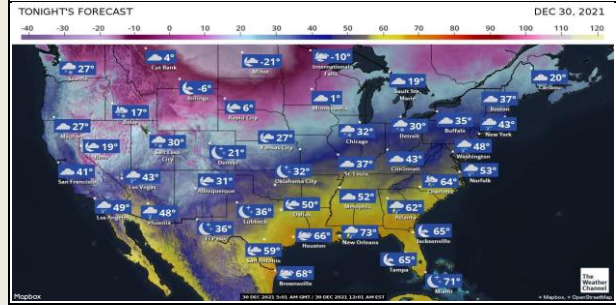
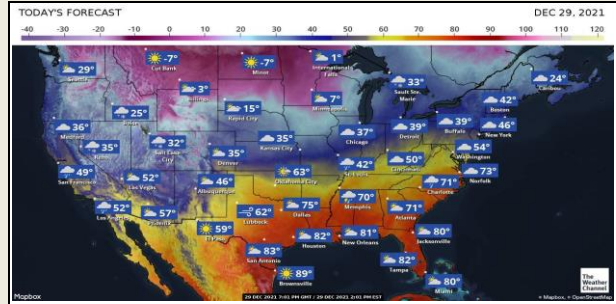
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Rain fell on much of the southern Midwest Tuesday while snow fell on many northern and some central areas with mostly dry conditions from much of eastern South Dakota to central and western Iowa and portions of northeastern Kansas. The Midwest will see two rounds of organized precipitation through Saturday before a quiet weather pattern occurs Sunday through Jan. 11

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast were unseasonably warm again Tuesday with rain in parts of the region from the Delta to northern Alabama. The Delta and the Southeast will see frequent rain and interruptions to fieldwork through Sunday before a more tranquil weather pattern occurs Monday through Jan. 12.



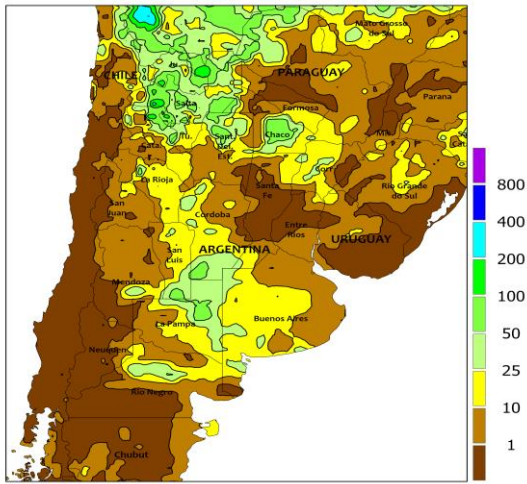
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Another day of hot and mostly dry weather and increasing crop stress occurred from Paraguay to western Rio Grande do Sul and western into northern Parana Tuesday while rain fell on some northern and a few other Brazil locations. Crop stress and declines in yield potentials are likely through this weekend from Paraguay to Parana and the remainder of southern Brazil where temperatures will be hot and most of the moisture from showers through Friday will quickly be lost to evaporation.

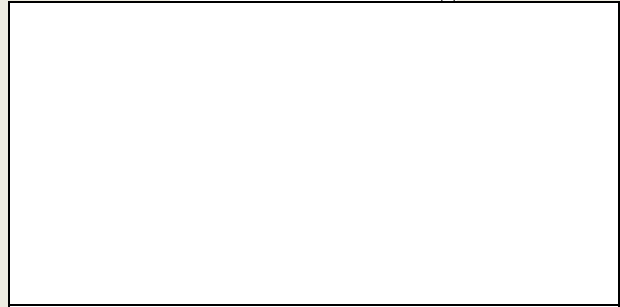
ARGENTINA: Much of Argentina remained hot and dry Tuesday and crop stress increased in many central and northern areas while light rain fell on a few western locations. Warm to hot temperatures during the next week will negate much of the benefit from showers expected in many areas and stress to crops should rise and expand in central and northern areas while soil moisture in key crop areas in the south should be high enough to support crops for a while longer.

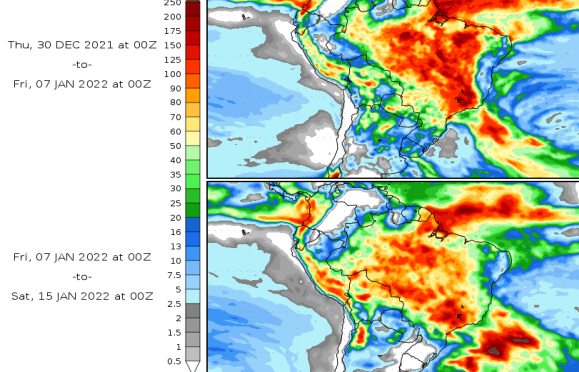

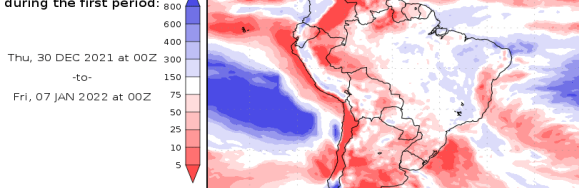

Precipitation (% of normal) during the first period:

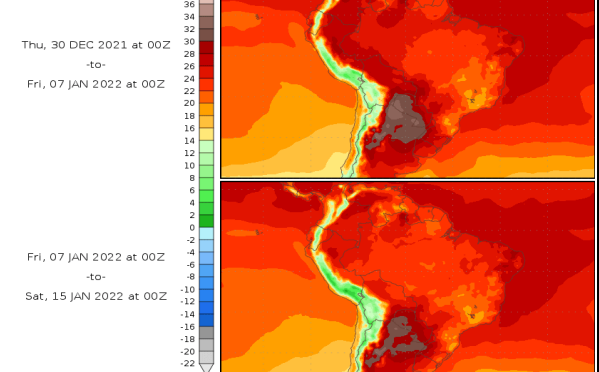

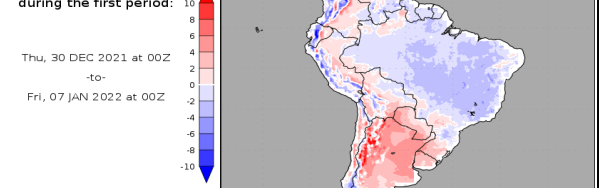

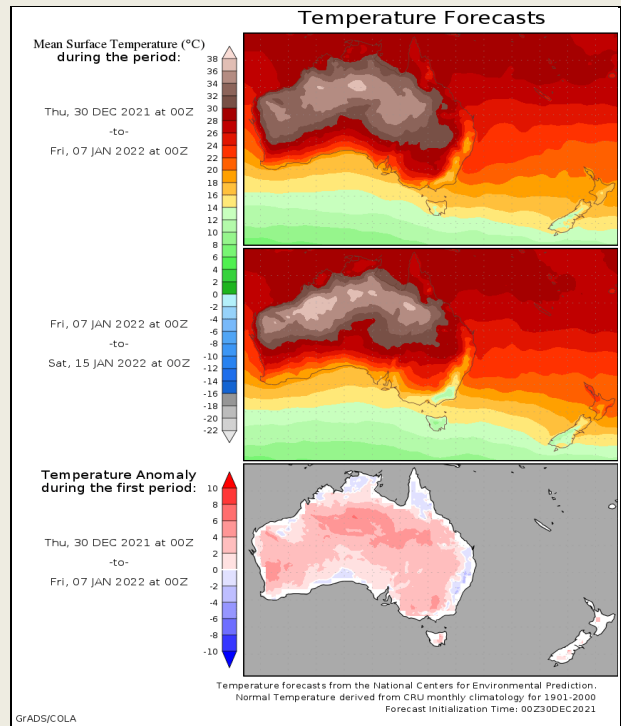
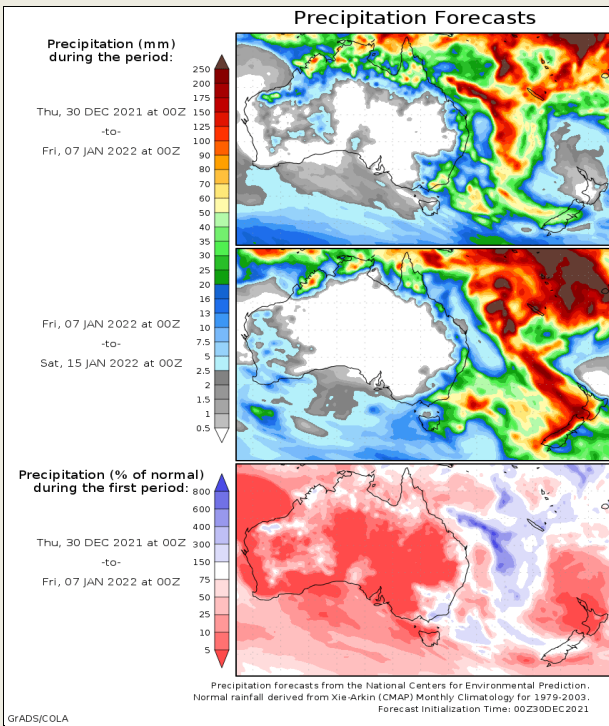
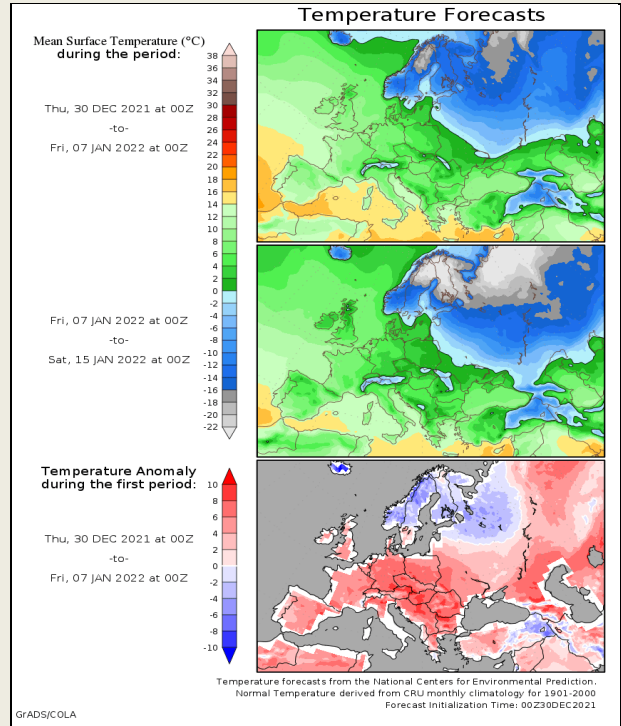
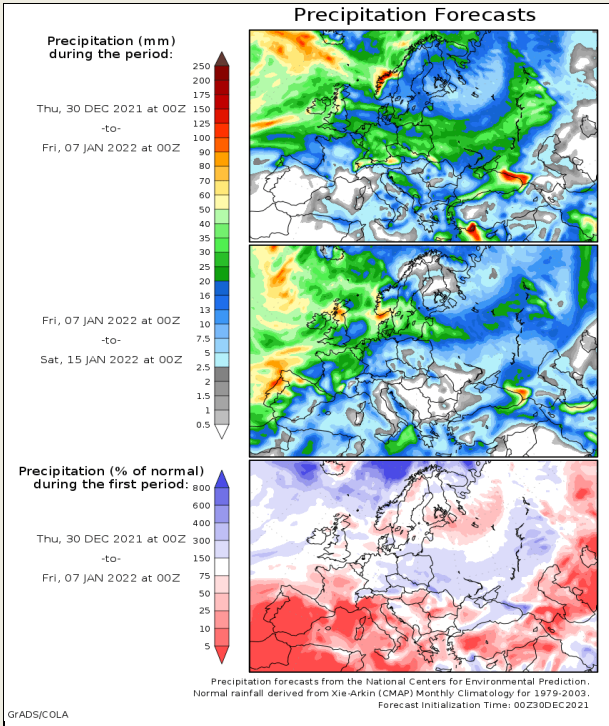
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will continue to maintain moist conditions throughout northern and central Europe this week. Nearly all locations from the U.K. and France through Germany, southern Scandinavia and into Poland, the Czech Republic, Austria and Slovakia will remain moist this week. Moisture will begin to shift into southeastern France and into Germany today with additional moisture returning to the U.K., France and into Germany and southern Scandinavia during the middle to latter portions of this workweek and into northeastern Europe this weekend.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted rainfall is expected in many of Australia's grain and cotton production areas during the next week to ten days. A tropical cyclone expected evolve southeast of the Cape York Peninsula Thursday will move southeast staying off the east coast of Australia; however the system will restrict rainfall in Queensland and New South Wales crop areas through the weekend.



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
