South Africa - Weather

Frequent rainfall is slated for eastern and central South Africa during the coming week. The rain will help bolster soil moisture in much of the main summer grain, oilseed, and cotton areas. Establishment and growth prospects will either improve or remain favorable. However, planting and general fieldwork may be sluggish in the wettest areas.

Northern Cape and Western Cape will generally be drier biased during the coming week. The lack of rain will promote aggressive fieldwork. Cotton prospects in Northern Cape will also remain favorable despite the lack of rain. Eastern and central South Africa will often see several waves of rain during the coming week.

- o A series of disturbances tracking across the country will promote scattered showers and thunderstorms on a near daily basis
- o Moisture totals by next Tuesday morning will range from 1.50-5.00" and local amounts of 7.00" or more in Natal, Mpumalanga, and Limpopo
- o Western Cape and Northern Cape will be drier biased during the coming week
- o Any rain that does occur will generally be lost to evaporation



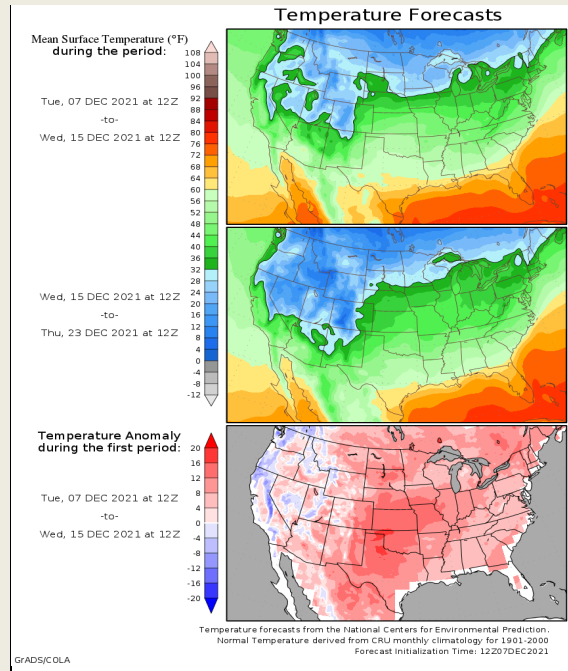
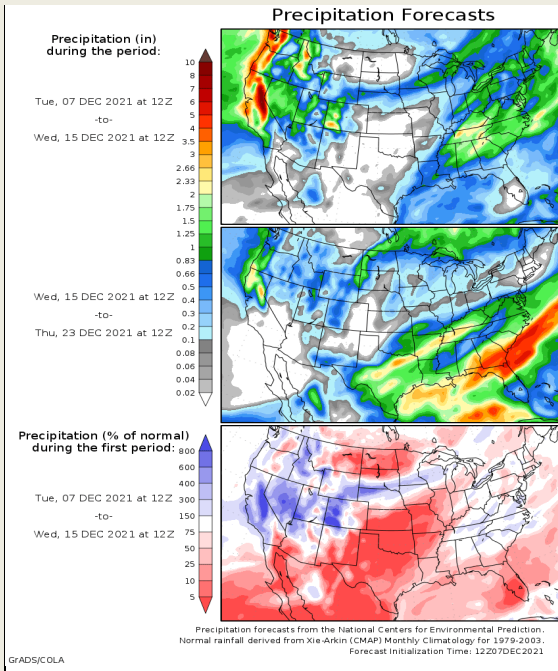
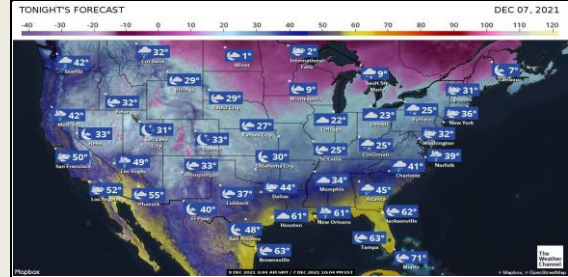
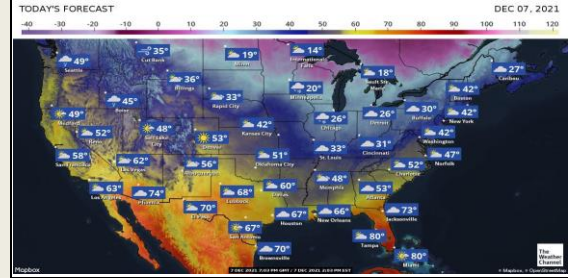
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Today's forecast is wetter for Dec. 15-20, but overall, fieldwork should advance well during the next two weeks as the precipitation expected should not be heavy enough to cause excessively muddy conditions and fieldwork should occur between precipitation events. The few remaining unharvested soybeans in the east may not dry out fast enough for harvesting to occur for extended periods, but there should be enough breaks between precipitation events for late harvesting to continue. A significant storm system will impact the region will Friday into Saturday with confidence for the details of this event still low and early indications suggesting heavy snow may fall from east-central South Dakota and east-central Nebraska to Wisconsin.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a wet weather pattern through early Sunday and late harvesting will be slowed while some unharvested cotton should be discolored.

o Sunday afternoon through Dec. 18 will be drier and fieldwork will increase while some cotton should be bleached white.



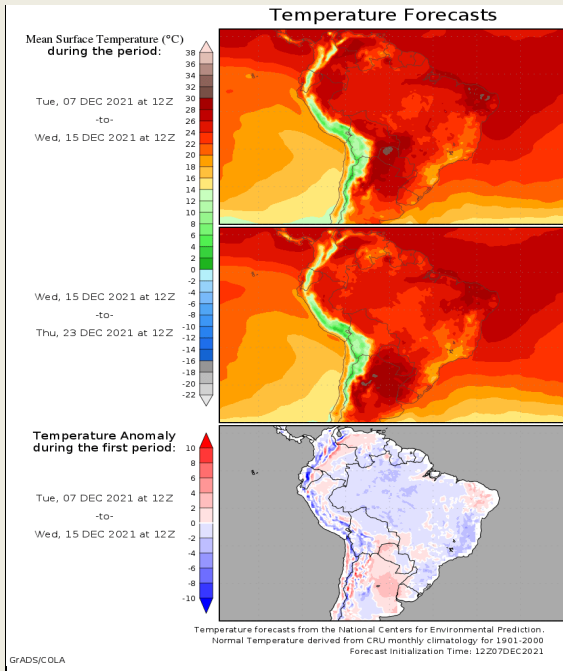
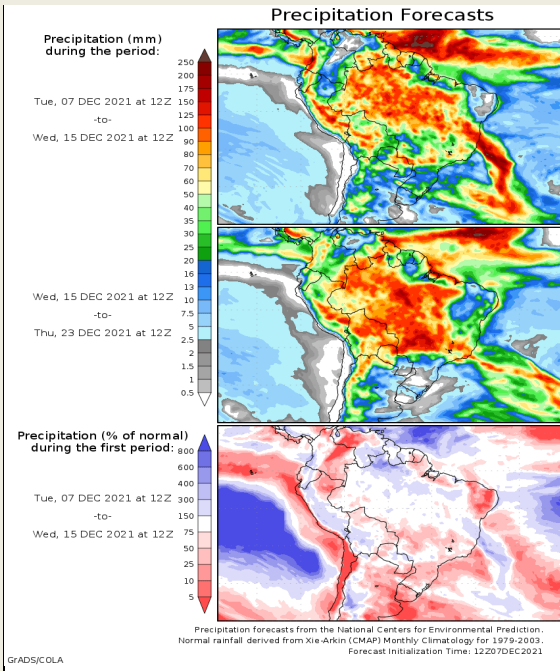
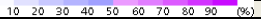
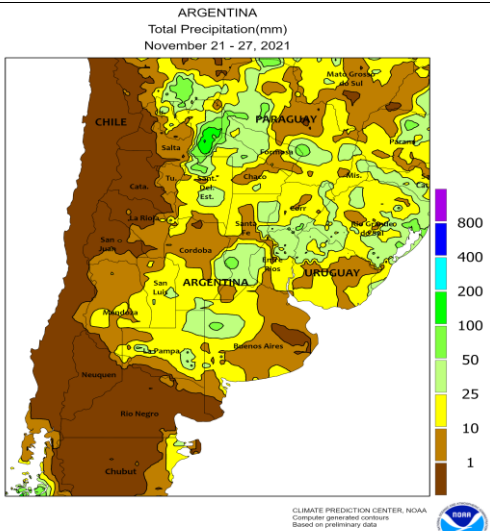
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rio Grande do Sul will see a restricted rainfall pattern through the next two weeks and some newly planted crops may see rising levels of crops stress as the topsoil dries out while subsoil moisture should be high enough to support crops with developed root systems for a while longer. Subsoil moisture may become short beyond the middle of the month and stress to crops should steadily increase until rain returns. Areas from Paraguay and Mato Grosso do Sul to Santa Catarina, Parana, and Sao Paulo will receive significant and beneficial rain Saturday through Monday.

ARGENTINA: Much of Argentina will see favorable conditions for planting and development of crops during the next two weeks, but some areas will dry down significantly and will need rain soon with some crop stress possible beyond the middle of the month in some northern and eastern areas. The best conditions for crops will occur in southwestern Argentina where significant rain is advertised for Tuesday into Thursday.

o Most of the remainder of western and portions of central Argentina will see rain Friday through Sunday.

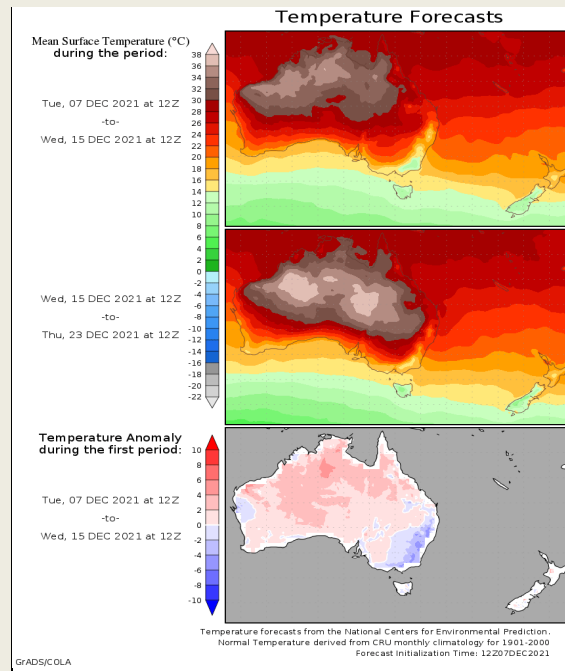
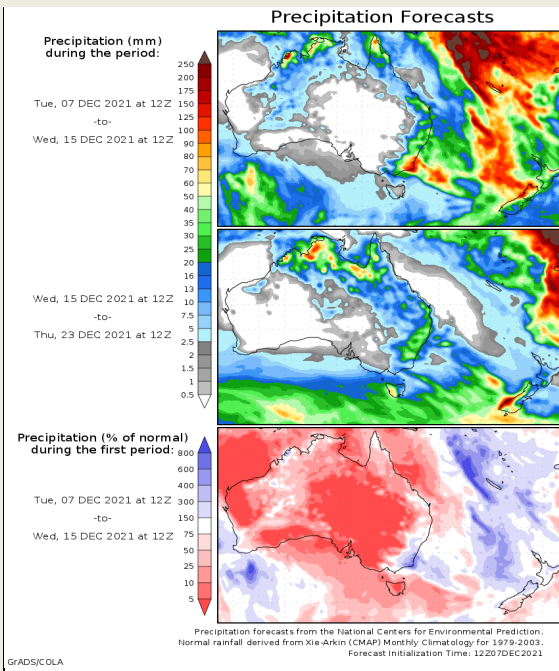
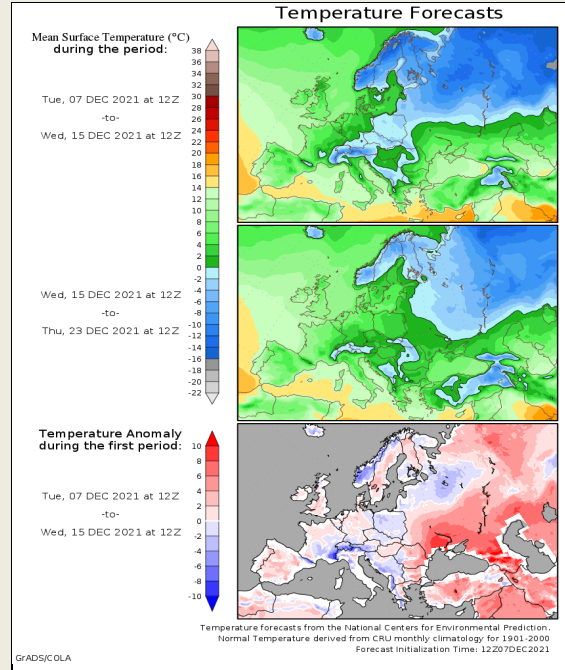
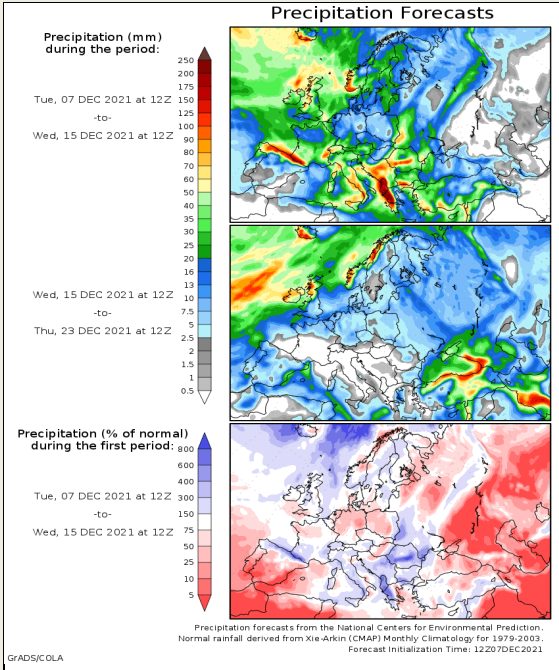


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Regular rounds of precipitation will continue throughout Europe this week. The most frequent moisture will impact the northern coast of Spain, France into portions of Germany and the Alps as well as Italy into Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Montenegro into Hungary and Slovakia today through the Monday. Moisture will increase over the U.K. and into France Tuesday into Wednesday as well as southeastern portions of the continent.

AUSTRALIA: A restricted precipitation pattern will occur through Sunday. Summer crop production potentials will remain good after recent rainfall, but the break in moisture will be welcome for unharvested winter crops and fieldwork. ☐ Conditions will not be completely dry ☐ Rounds of showers will linger over the eastern coast of New South Wales and southeastern Queensland back into the Great Dividing Range on a near daily basis. A few showers will linger over central Victoria and south-central New South Wales today.



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
