

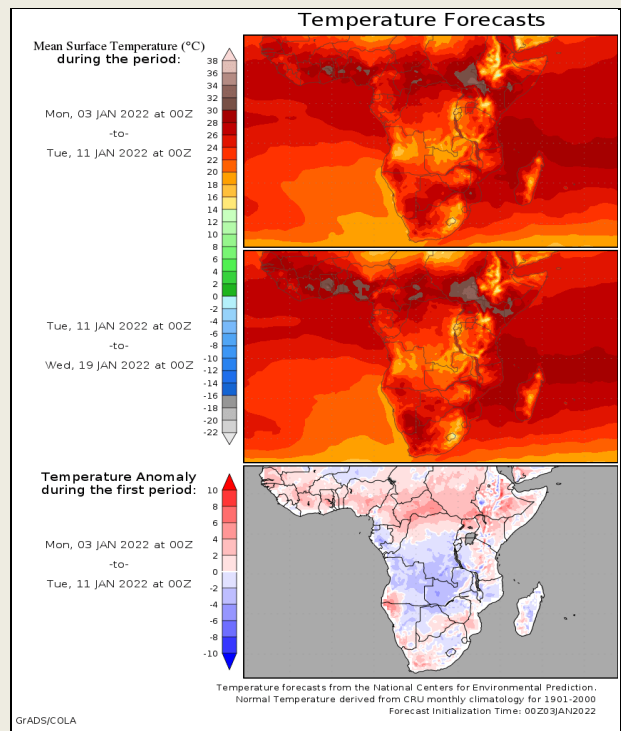
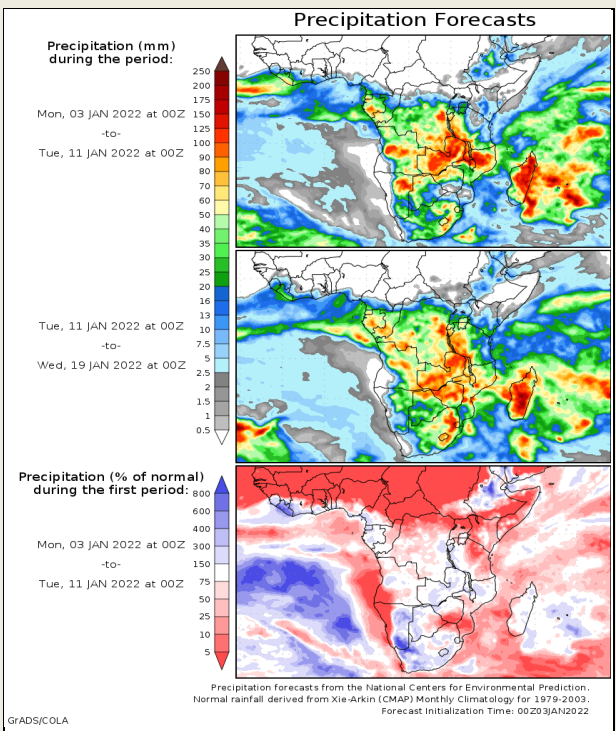
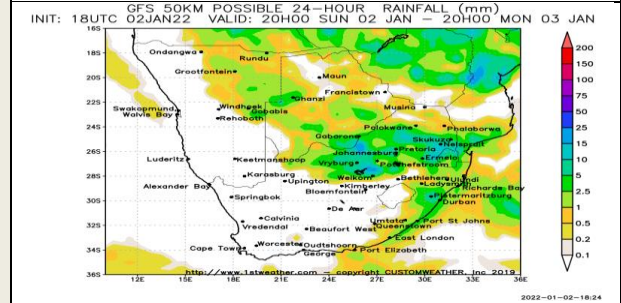
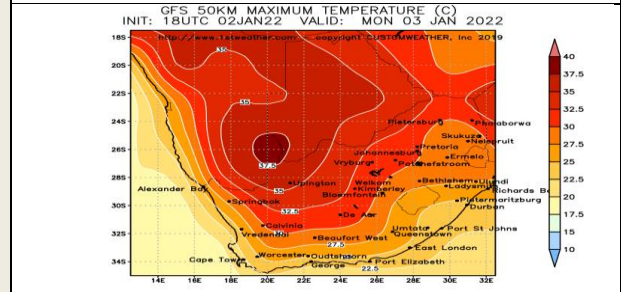
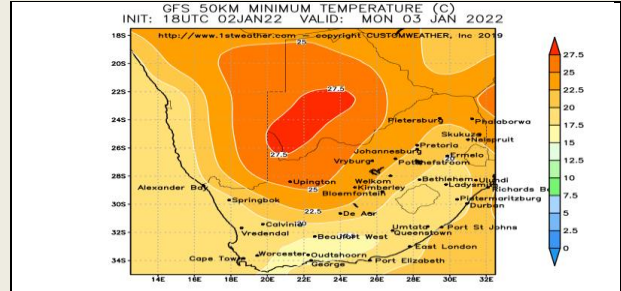
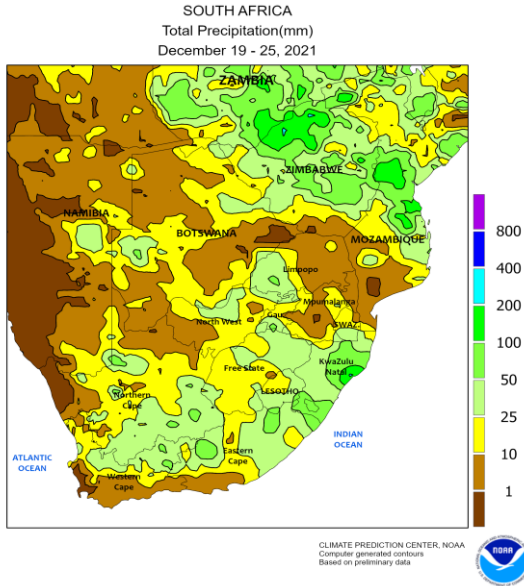


Weather Report

03 January 2022

South Africa - Weather

Frequent rainfall will persist for eastern South Africa through the end of next week. Soil moisture will remain at adequate to excessive levels. Flash flooding will be a concern in the wetter areas, though crop damage will be minimal. The environment will remain mostly good for aggressive crop development outside the locations that are abundantly wet. Central South Africa will also have opportunities for erratic rainfall through the end of next week. Rain totals will be enough to keep soil moisture near current levels. The environment will remain generally favorable for coarse grain, oilseed, and cotton development.

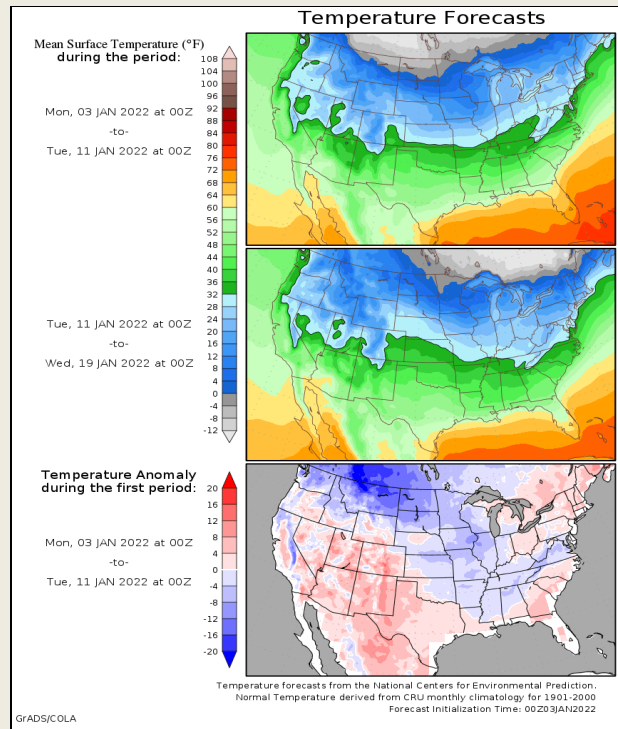
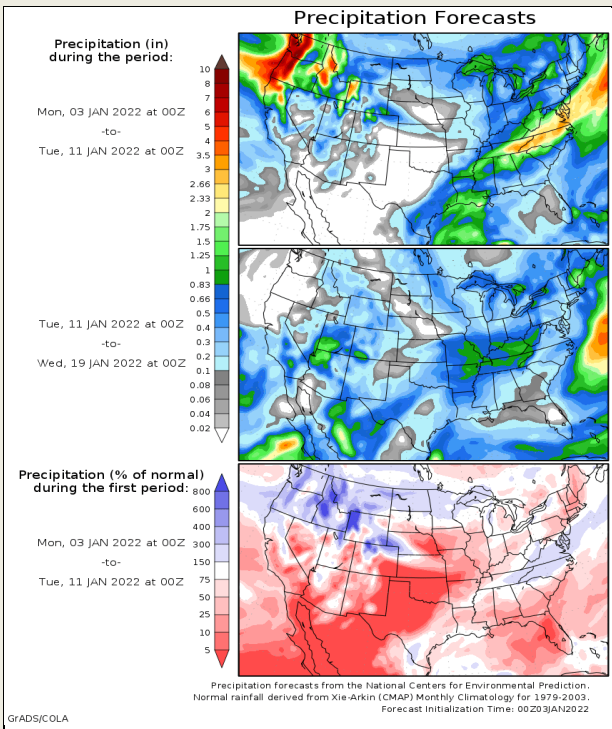
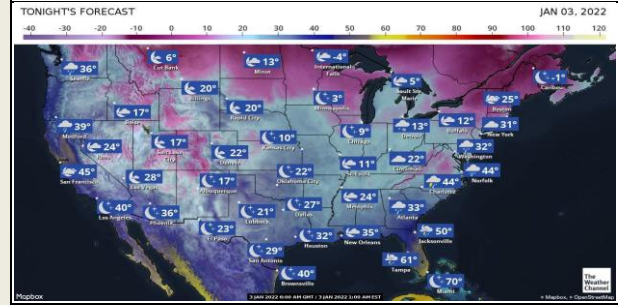
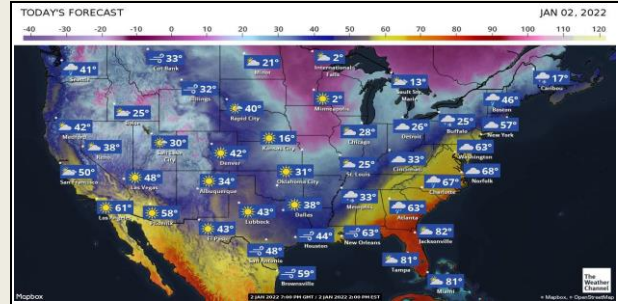


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see a quiet weather pattern through most of the next two weeks with two rounds of organized precipitation expected. The Ohio River Basin will be wettest with each precipitation event and river and stream flows will increase leaving the region prone to flooding if another round of significant precipitation occurs soon. A band of significant snow and travel delays are expected tonight into Saturday from northeastern Kansas and to east-central Nebraska through Michigan.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: An area of rain occurred from just south of east-central Mississippi to northern into interior southern Georgia to central into eastern South Carolina Thursday while most other areas were dry. Two rounds of nearly widespread precipitation will affect the Delta and the Southeast during the next two weeks with fieldwork likely to advance between the rounds of precipitation.

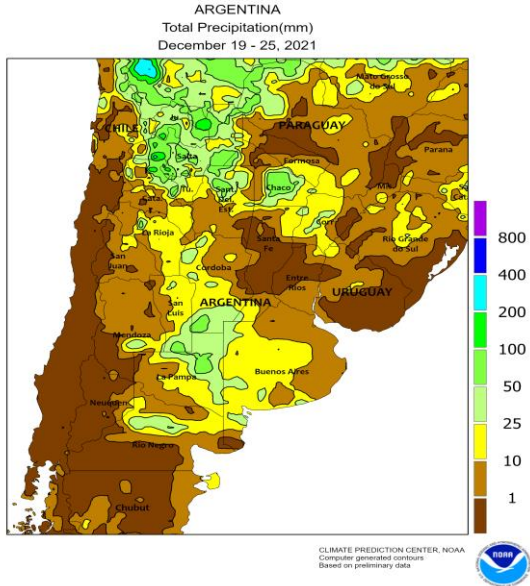


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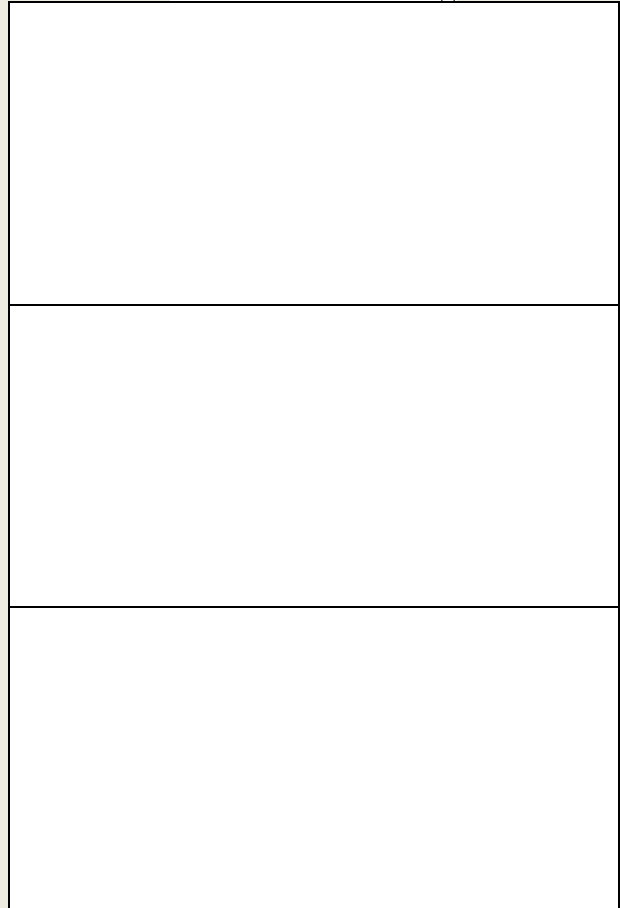
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Beneficial, but mostly light, rain fell on portions of Mato Grosso and Parana Thursday with much of Paraguay and western into central Rio Grande do Sul hot and dry while rain also fell on much of northern Brazil outside of Bahia and northcentral and northeastern Minas Gerais into Espirito Santo. Crop stress and declines in yield potentials are likely into this weekend from Paraguay to southern Parana and the remainder of southern Brazil where temperatures will be hot and most of the moisture from the few showers expected today will quickly be lost to evaporation.

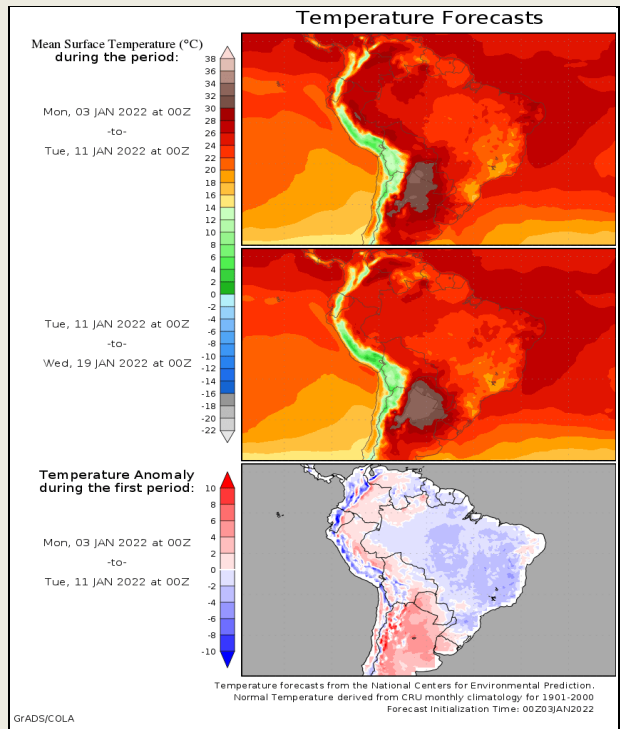
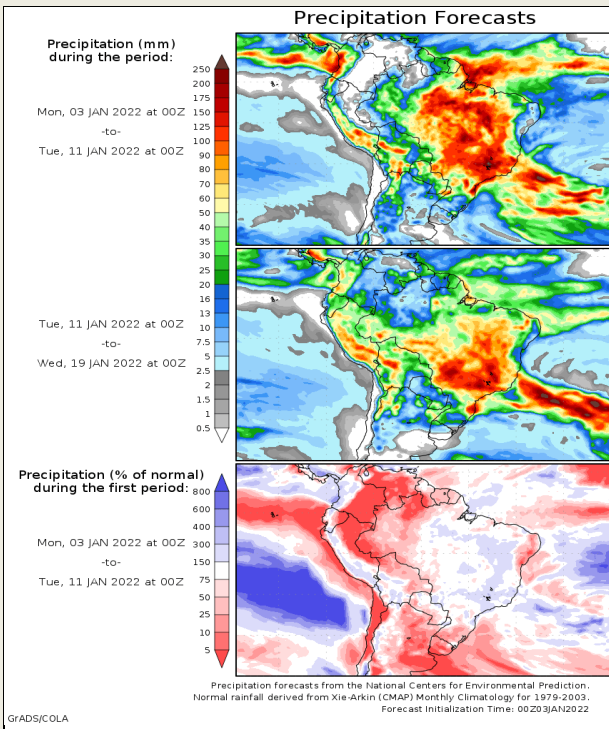
ARGENTINA: Hot, dry, and stressful conditions for crops occurred in northern and much of central Argentina Thursday with a part of west-central Santiago del Estero reaching 109 Fahrenheit while most of southern Argentina was not as warm and some areas received light rain. Beneficial rain is expected in much of the country Sunday into Tuesday, but hot temperatures will cause the moisture to quickly be lost to evaporation and stress to crops should quickly increase again in central and northern Argentina when drier weather returns to most areas Wednesday through Jan. 14.

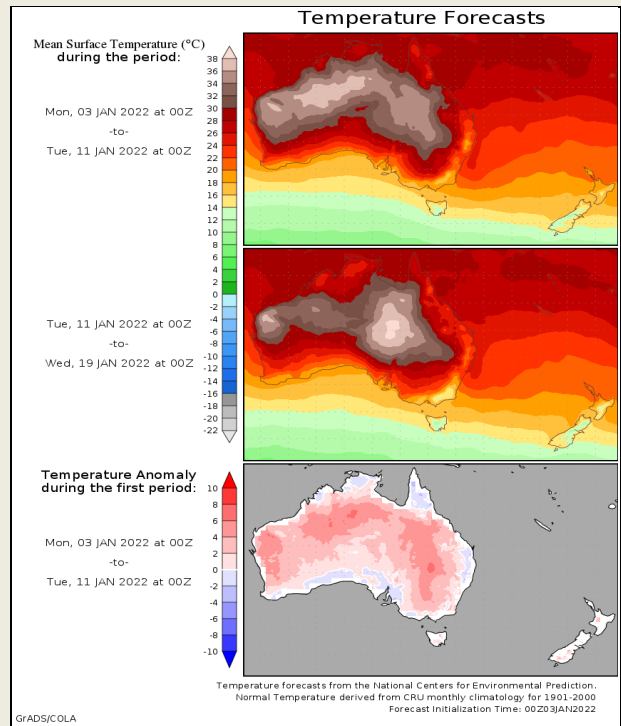
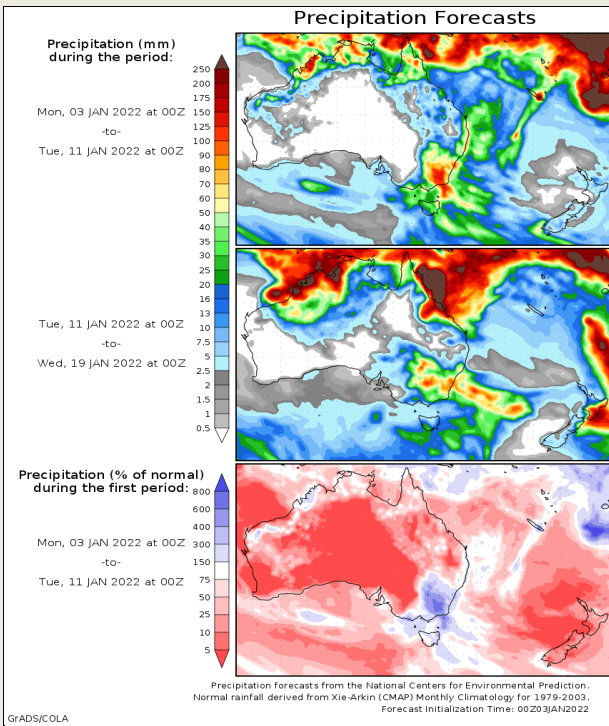
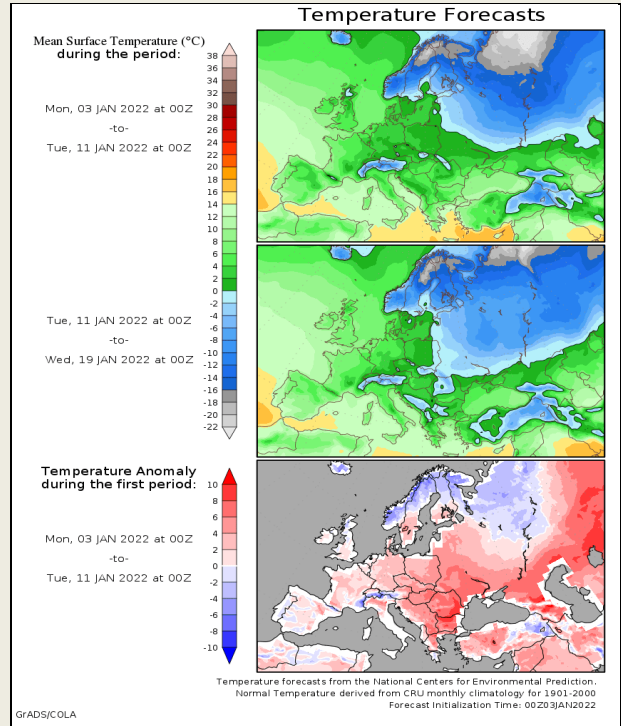
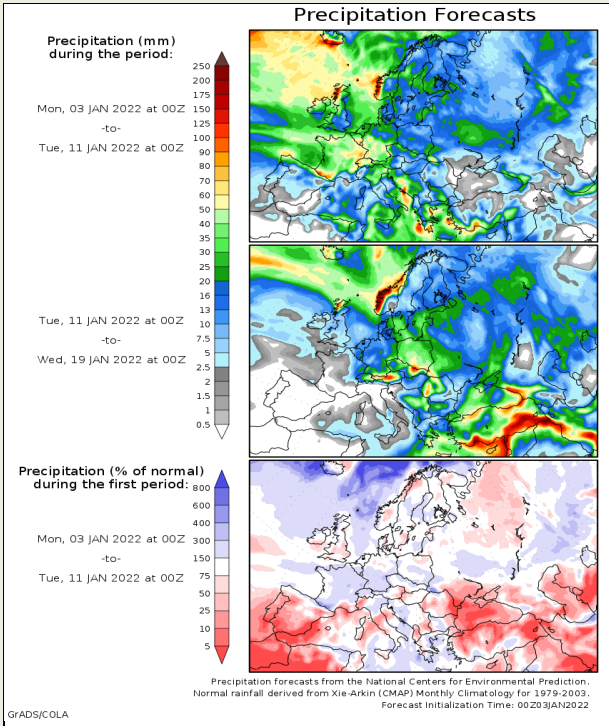


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Weather over the next couple of weeks will be mostly good for the continent. Most all crop areas will get precipitation at one time or another maintaining abundant soil moisture for use in the spring. There is still some need for greater precipitation in parts of the Iberian Peninsula and some is expected over the forecast period. A few areas in Romania and neighboring areas would also benefit from precipitation. No part of Europe is too dry and snow cover in the northeast will protect winter crops against any harsh weather that evolves.

AUSTRALIA: An unusual weather pattern continues over eastern Australia and off the east coast that will restrict rainfall in summer grain and cotton production areas for a while. Forecasts have not been verifying very well recently because of this pattern which includes a split jet stream with cutoff low pressure systems, a ridge of high pressure over western parts of the continent and couple of tropical cyclones in the southwestern Pacific Ocean not far from the east coast. The combined influence of all this disfavors rainfall, which was supposed to be greater than usual this summer because of La Nina. Confidence in the forecast beyond this first week of the outlook is low because of the complicated upper air wind flow pattern.



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
