# South Africa - Weather

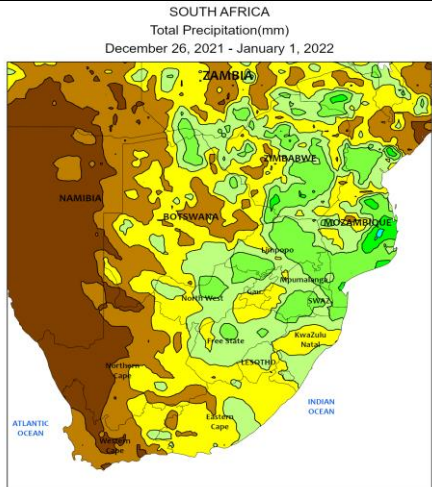
The main coarse grain, oilseed, cotton, and other crop areas in South Africa will see several waves of rain during the coming week. Soil moisture will remain at adequate to excessive levels and flash flooding will be a concern in eastern South Africa. No significant crop damage is expected, though portions of eastern South Africa may be too dry for ideal development. The outlook is still good for the country. However, eastern South Africa may benefit from drier weather later this month. South Africa will see several waves of rain during the coming week. A series of disturbances will generate scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms on a near daily basis for the main production areas

Moisture totals by next Thursday morning will range from 1.50-5.00" and locally greater amounts in eastern South Africa

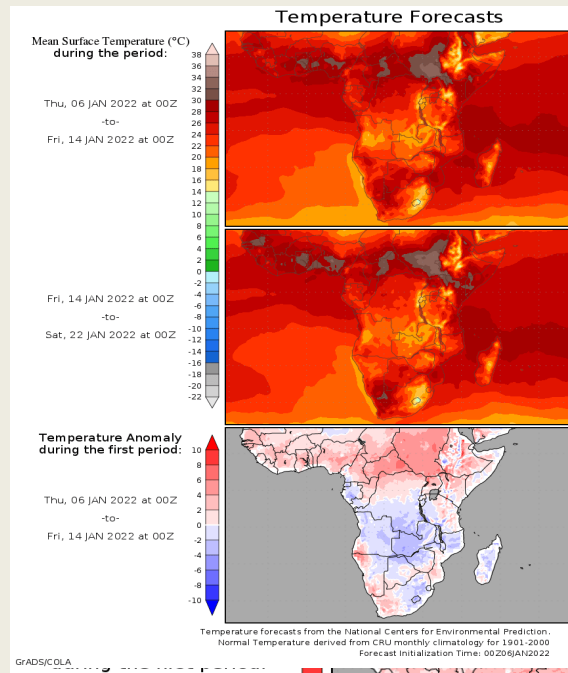
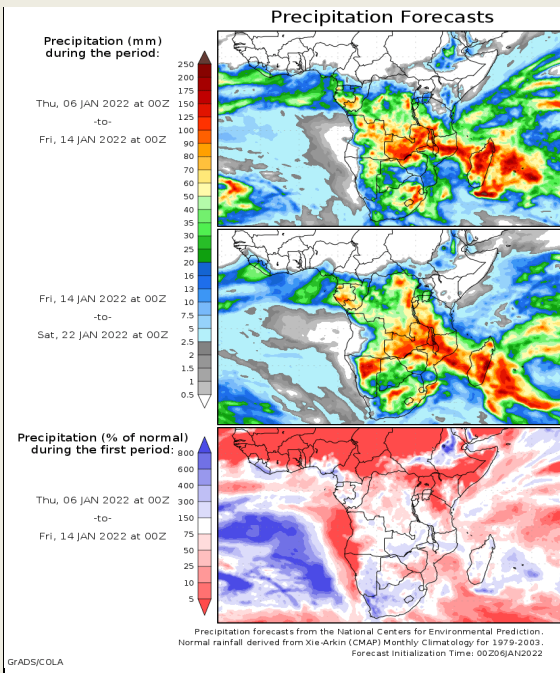
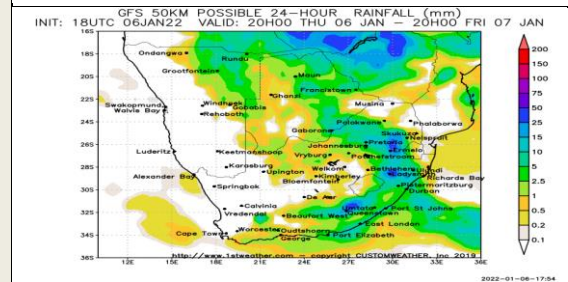
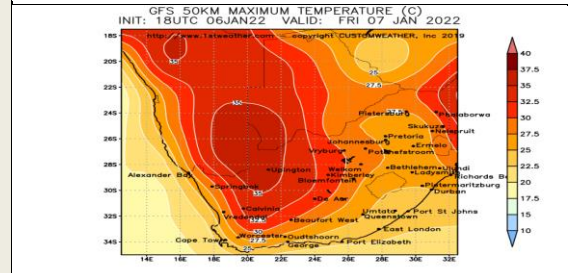
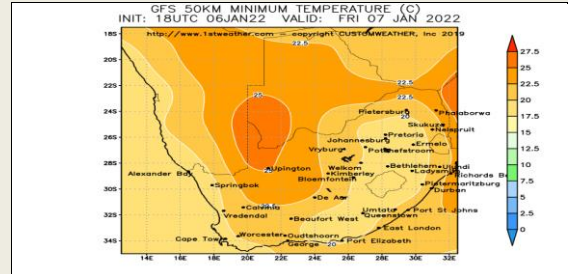
However, northern Limpopo will only receive 0.50-2.00" of rain

Central and western South Africa will receive 0.50-2.00" of rain with local amounts of 3.00" or slightly more in North West and Northern Cape

Eastern and central South Africa will again have several opportunities for rain January 14 – 20. Western South Africa will also receive light rain

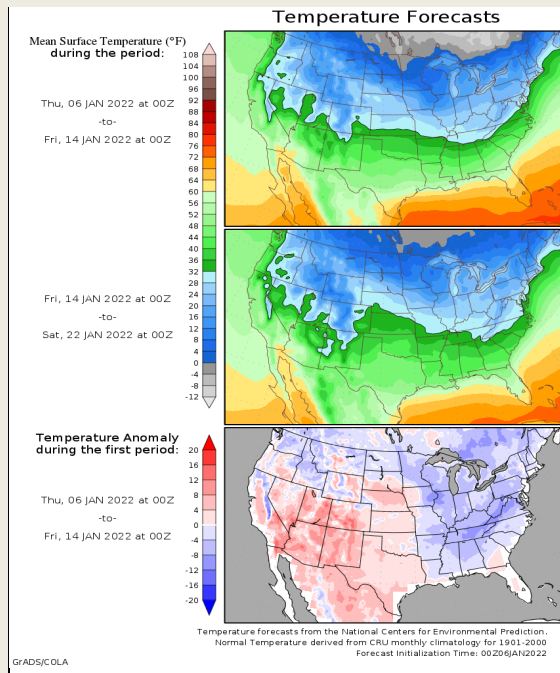
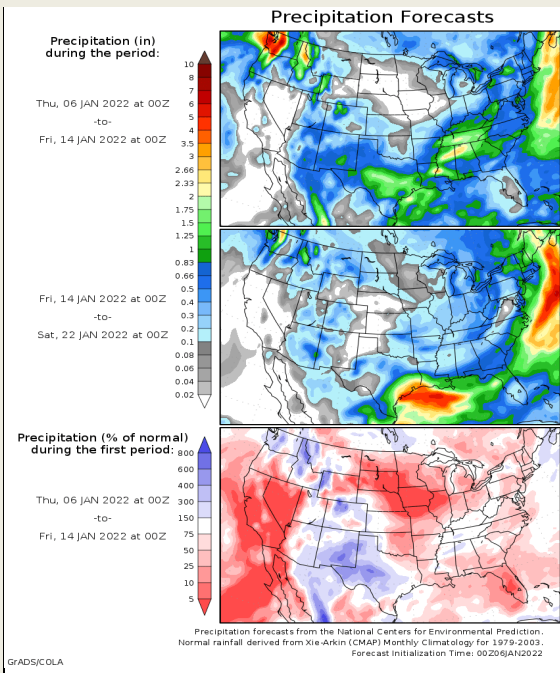
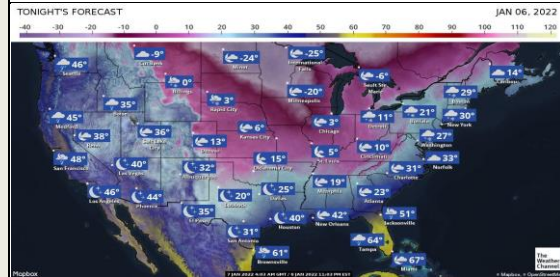
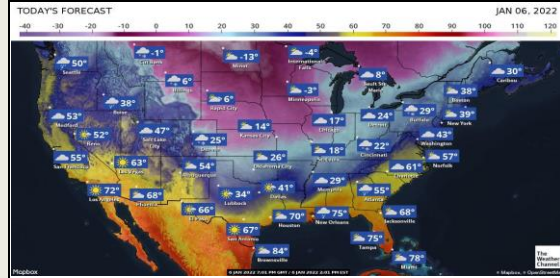


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# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** The Midwest will see a quiet weather pattern through most of the next two weeks with a few rounds of mostly light precipitation.  
 o Precipitation will be greatest near and south of the Ohio River this weekend and additional increases in river and stream flows will result leaving the region prone to a quick increase in flooding if a heavy precipitation event were to occur soon.

**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** A mostly tranquil weather pattern will be in place during the next two weeks in the Delta and the Southeast outside of some light precipitation today, widespread rain Saturday into Sunday, and some light precipitation Jan. 13-14.  
 o Some of the driest areas from southeastern Georgia and nearby Florida to central and eastern South Carolina will benefit the precipitation, but much of the rain will be light and greater rain is needed to fully restore soil moisture.



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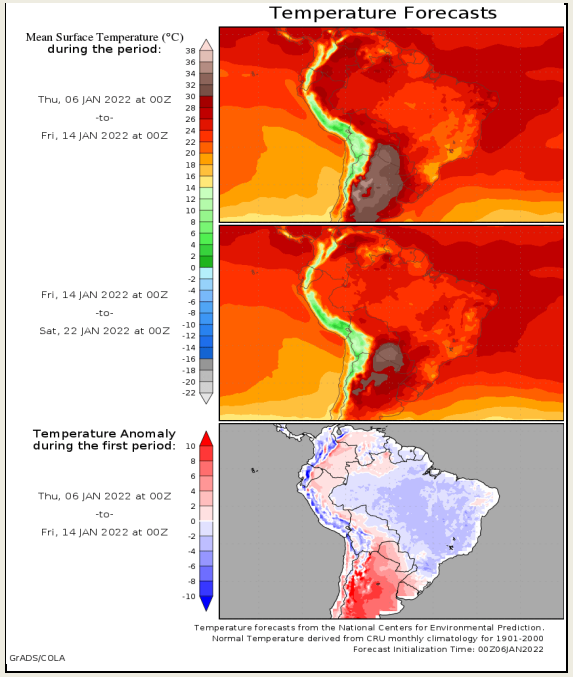
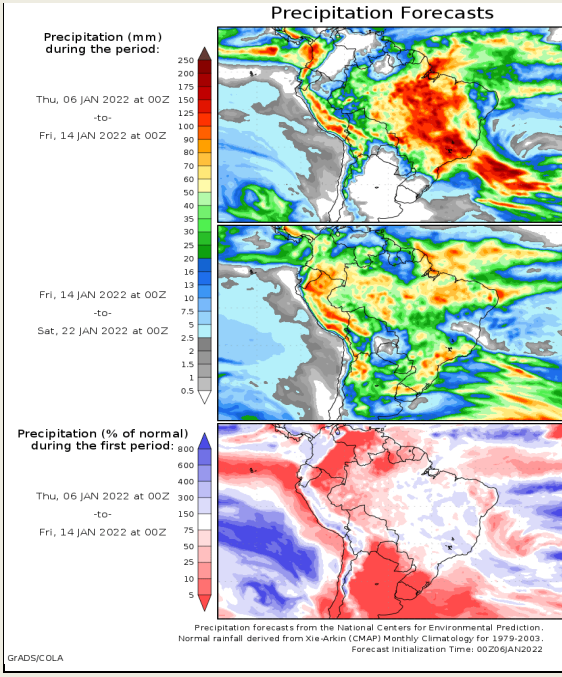
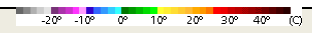
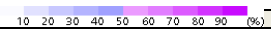
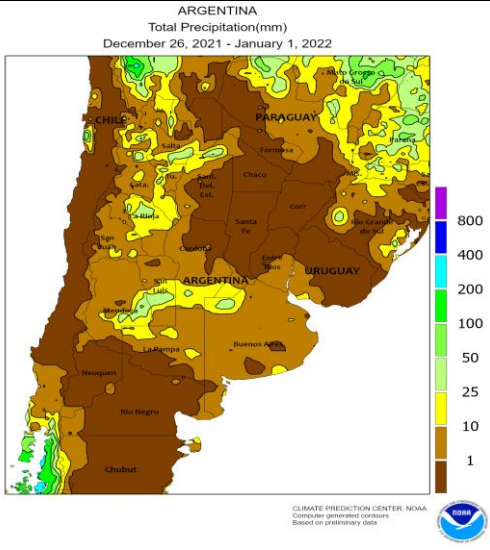
# South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Today's forecast is drier for Paraguay and southern Brazil than what was advertised earlier this week and with little to no rain of significance expected through at least the next ten days and warmer temperatures returning next week, the region will see steady increases in crop stress and declining yield potentials.

- o Rio Grande do Sul will be driest and with soil moisture already short crop yields may quickly decline.
- o Light showers will bring mostly inconsequential rain to parts the region Jan. 14-16 before rain increases Jan. 17-18.

**ARGENTINA:** The outlook was made hotter and drier again through the next week and outside of a few showers in the south, dry weather will be most common through the next week to ten days and a steady increase and expansion of crop stress is likely as moisture from recent rain is lost to evaporation.

- o Today through Friday will be not be as hot as last week and stress to crops should slowly increase before temperatures become hot again this weekend into next week and crop stress and declines in yield potential accelerate.

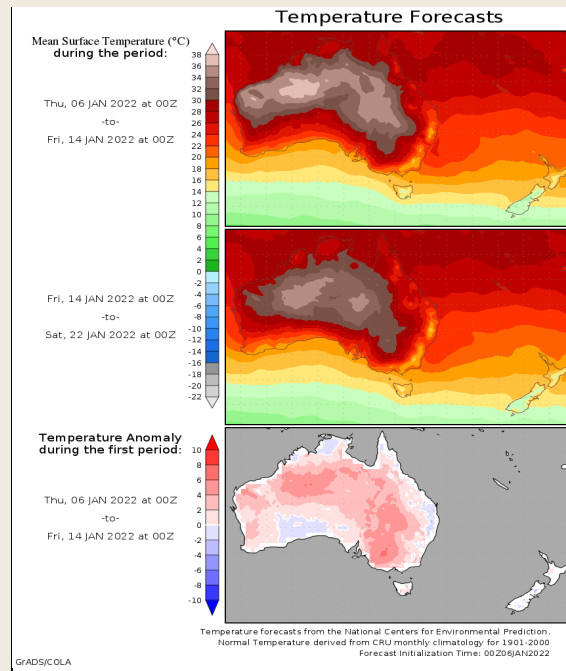
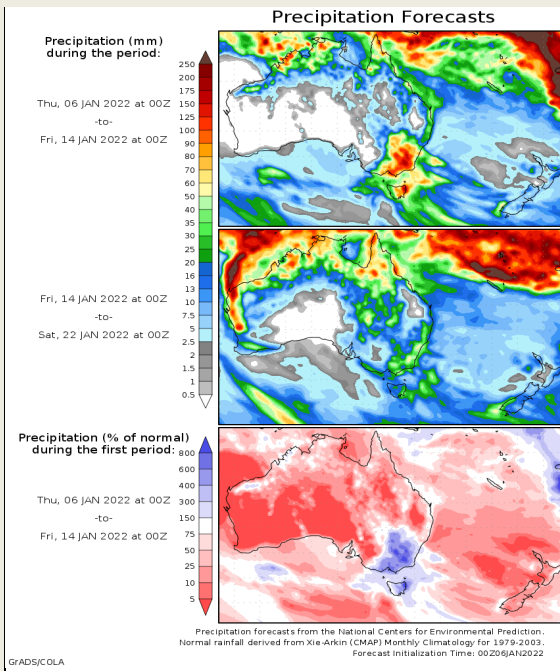
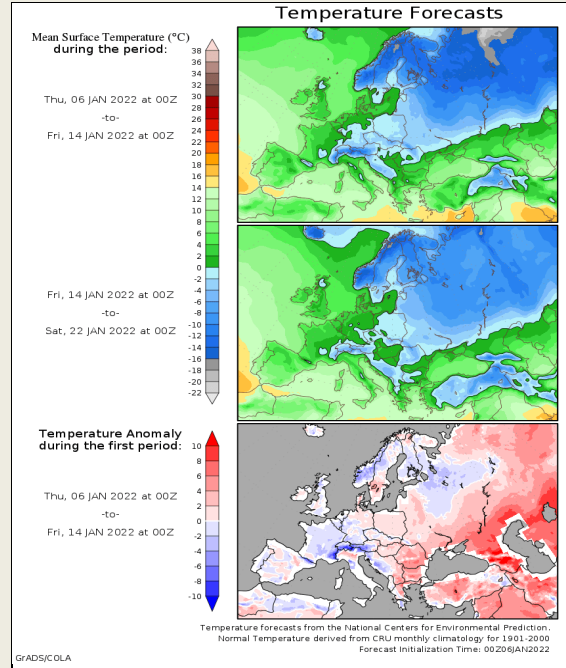
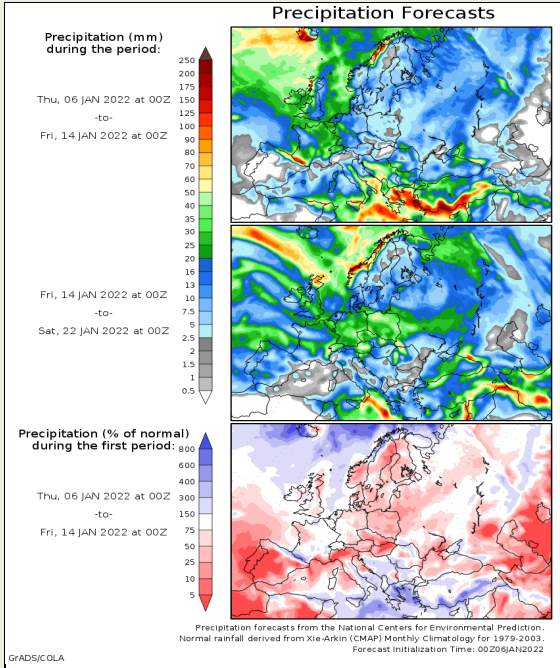


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# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

**EUROPE:** Rounds of precipitation will continue to maintain moist conditions throughout the North Sea Region into France, Germany, Switzerland and northeastern Italy as well as southern Scandinavia this week. Moisture will reach into the northwestern Balkan Nations Thursday into early next week and may expand into portions of the southeastern Balkan Nations early next week.

**AUSTRALIA:** Rain will increase over southeastern portions of the continent today into Friday limiting fieldwork and raising concern over unharvested winter grains. Scattered showers will linger over central and northern New South Wales into southern Queensland this weekend and return to southeastern South Australia, Victoria and into New South Wales Monday into next Friday. The additional moisture will continue to hinder crop maturation and harvest and some concern over winter crops will prevail in the wettest locations, but precipitation should be scattered enough that some progress will occur in breaks in the moisture.



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
