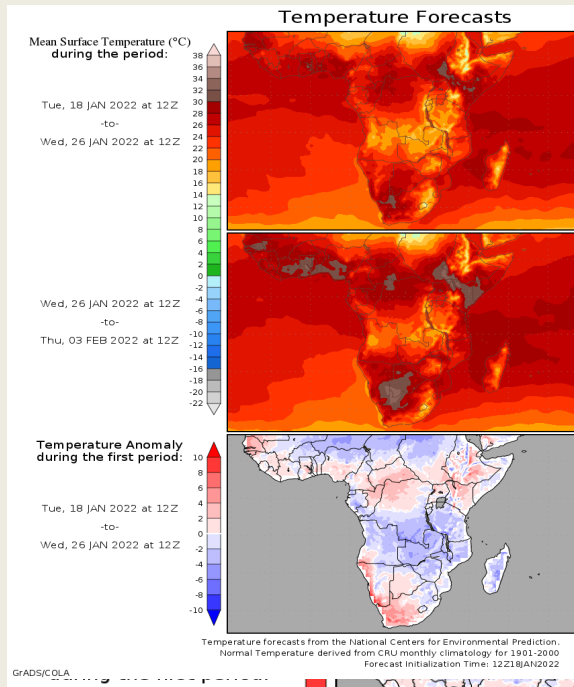
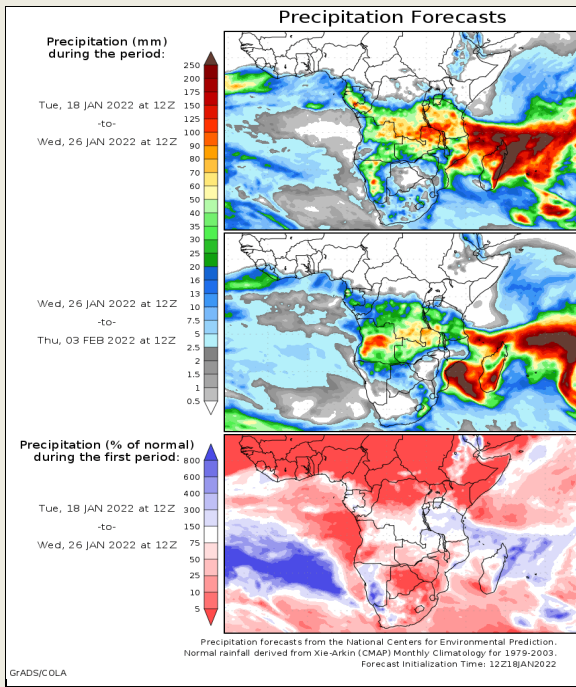
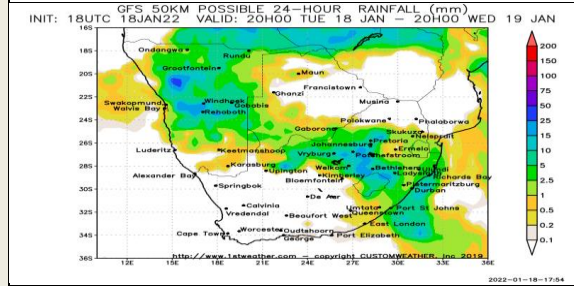
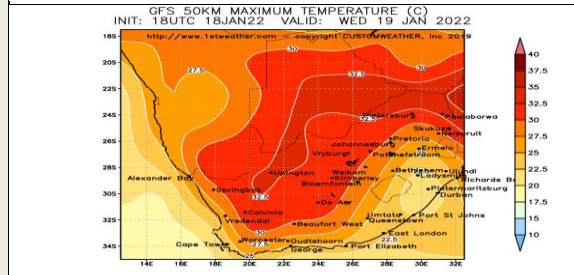
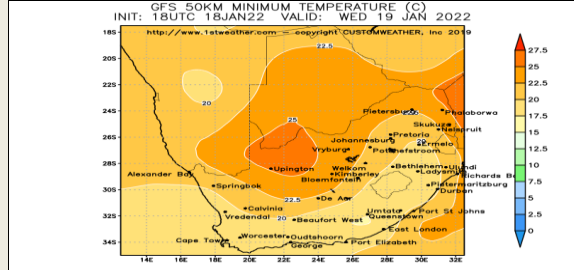
South Africa - Weather

The main production areas in South Africa will see a mix of erratic rain and sunshine during the coming week. Many areas will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation, most notably in Free State and Natal. There will still be plenty of moisture to maintain aggressive growth despite many areas drying down. Fields that were previously struggling with abundant moisture will welcome the drying trend. • South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week
 o Scattered showers will initially evolve in the main production areas through Friday
 o Spotty rainfall will persist in pockets of eastern South Africa this weekend and early next week, though a large section of crop country will be dry
 o Moisture levels by next Tuesday morning will range from 0.25-1.50" and locally greater amounts in North West
 • Many areas in Free State and Natal will also receive little to no rain
 • Eastern and central South Africa will again have opportunities for rain January 26 – February 1
 o Western South Africa will receive little to no precipitation

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United States of America - Weather

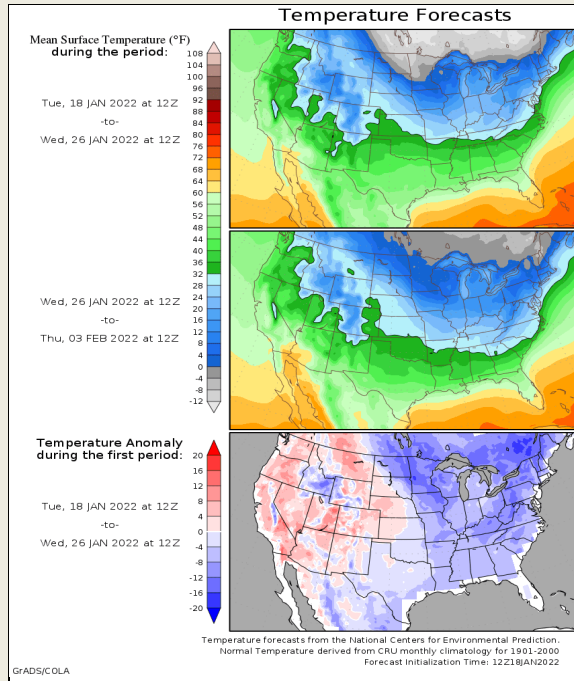
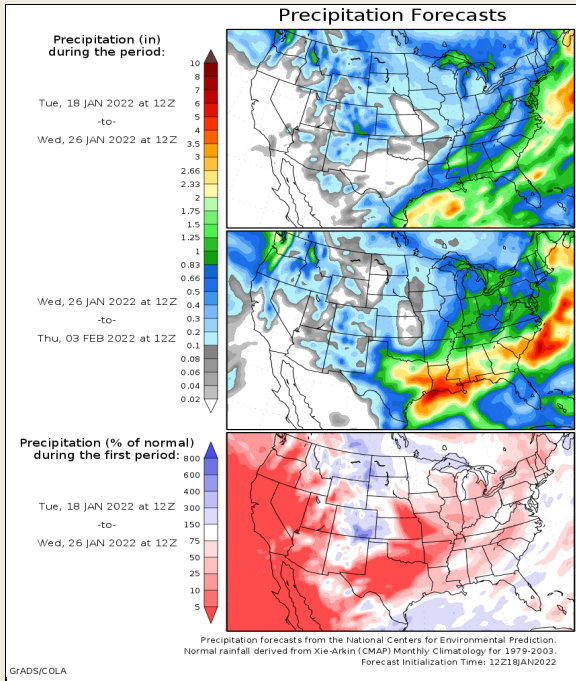
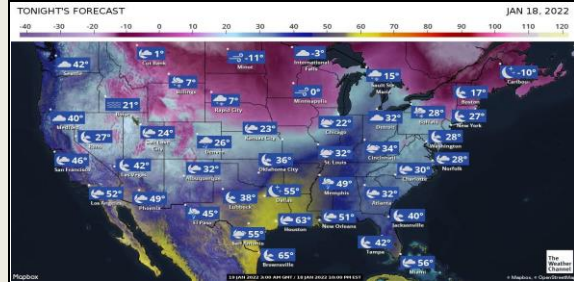
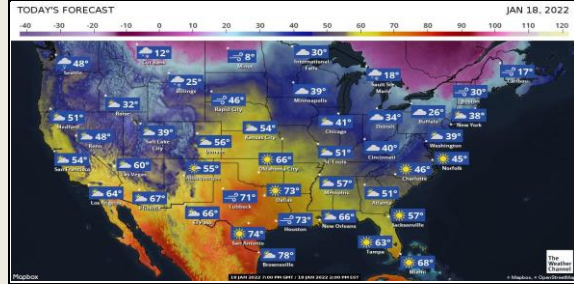
U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see a quiet weather pattern through most of the next two weeks with an impressive, but short-lived shot of cold air expected Thursday into Friday. After much warmer than normal temperatures occur today cooling will occur and temperatures will be colder than usual most often through the middle of next week.

o Thursday will be coldest with highs in the single digits occur as far south as most of Iowa and some nearby areas.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Mostly dry weather will occur today before widespread precipitation falls Wednesday into Friday.

o Most of the precipitation will be rain with the southern Delta into the Southeast seeing totals of 0.50-1.65" and locally more while totals are lighter in the northern Delta.

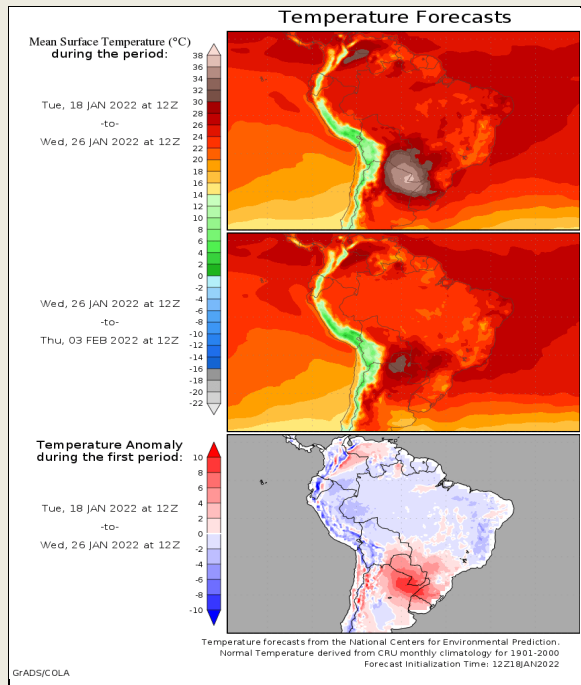
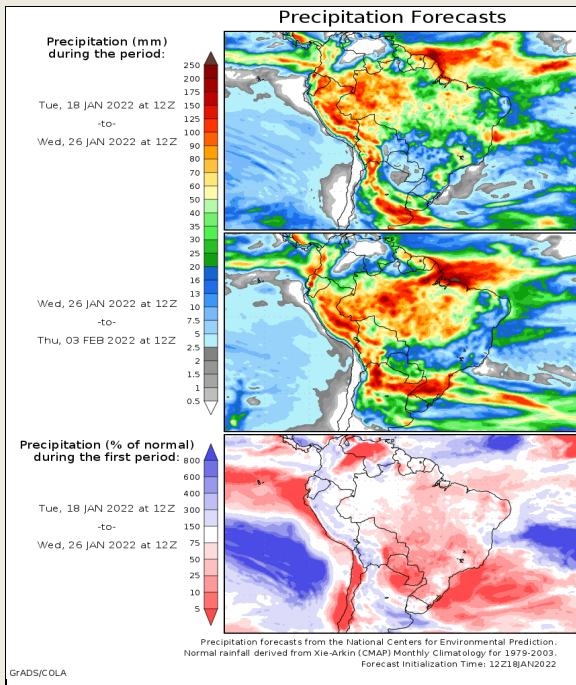
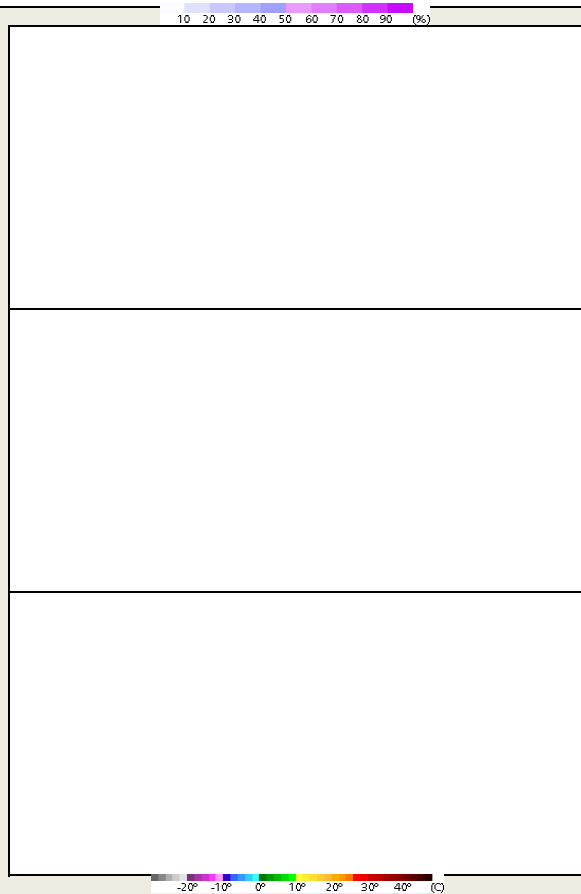
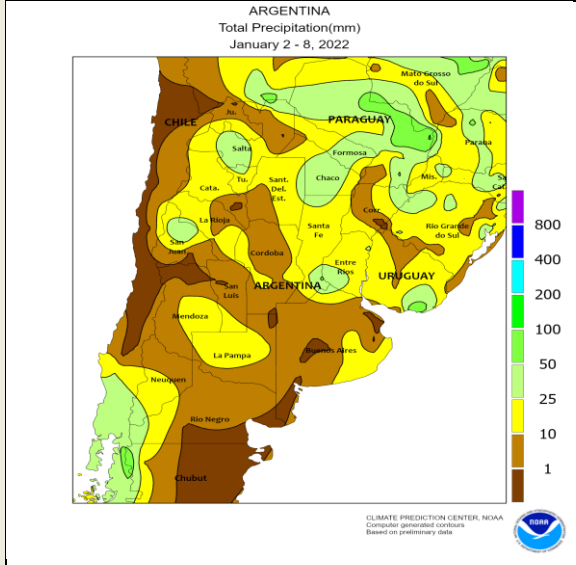
o Some snow will fall Thursday into Friday from central Georgia to southern Virginia where some 1 to 4 inch totals and locally more will occur in North Carolina and southern Virginia.



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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Paraguay and far southern Brazil will see little to no rain of significance and hot temperatures through Saturday and crop stress will return as moisture from recent rain is lost to evaporation while areas that missed out on rain see further declines in yields.
 o Showers will increase in Rio Grande do Sul Sunday into Monday while Paraguay and the remainder of far southern Brazil see an increase in rain Jan. 25-28. Most of the remainder of Brazil will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the next two weeks that will be supportive of crop development while breaks between rounds of rain should allow fieldwork to advance.
ARGENTINA: Frequent rain will fall through the next ten days inducing further improvements in crop and soil conditions in much of the country, but excessive heat will continue for at least another week in the north and with Chaco and Corrientes missing much of the rain through Monday crop conditions there will continue to deteriorate. Central and southern Argentina will see mild temperatures during the next week and with rain expected crop conditions should improve dramatically where crops are still viable.



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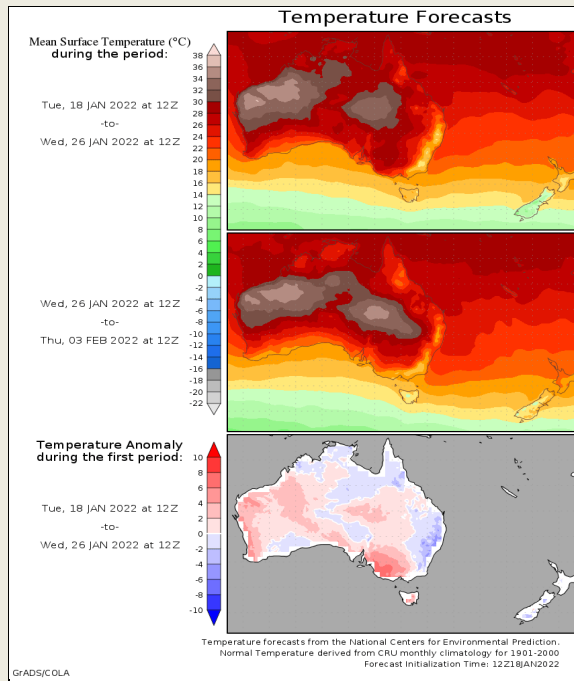
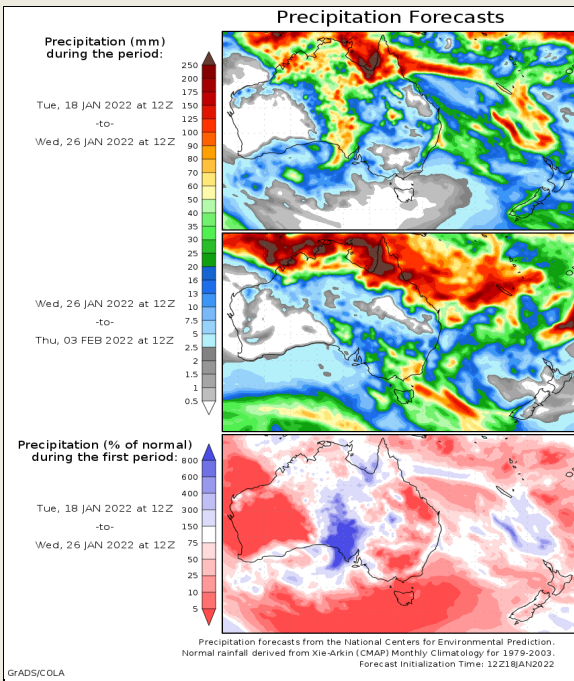
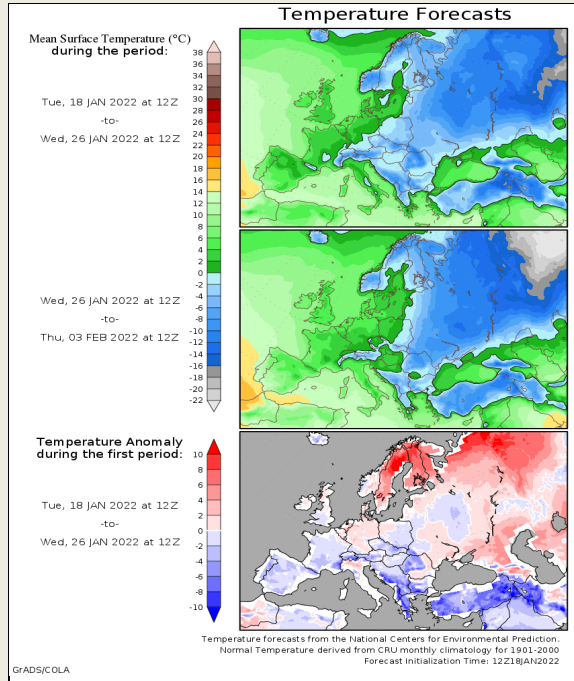
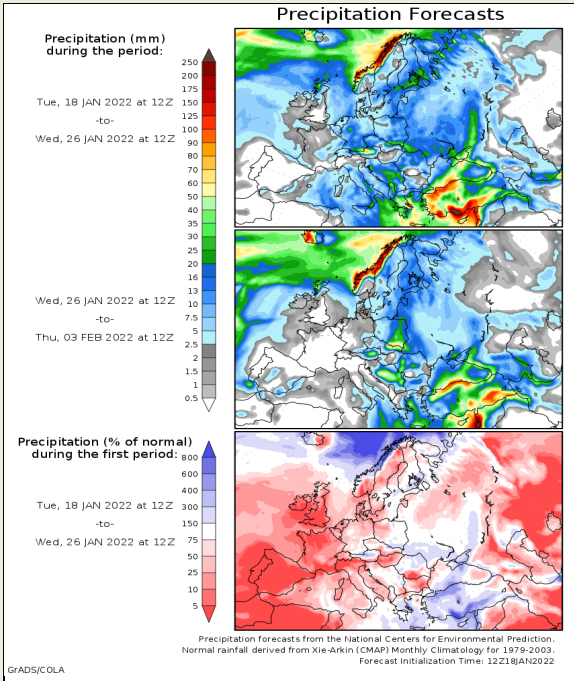
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will continue to maintain moist conditions throughout the North Sea Region into France, Germany, Switzerland and northeastern Italy as well as southern Scandinavia this week.

Moisture will reach into the northwestern Balkan Nations Thursday into early next week and may expand into portions of the southeastern Balkan Nations early next week.

AUSTRALIA: Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue over southeastern Queensland and northern New South Wales today and Wednesday.

Daily moisture totals will vary from 0.20 to 0.80 inch and local totals in excess of 1.00 inch. A few pockets of heavy rain will occur in southern Queensland and rain totals may vary from 1.00 to 3.00 inches.



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
