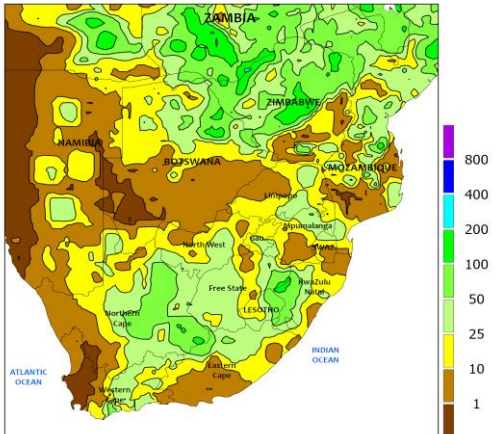

South Africa - Weather

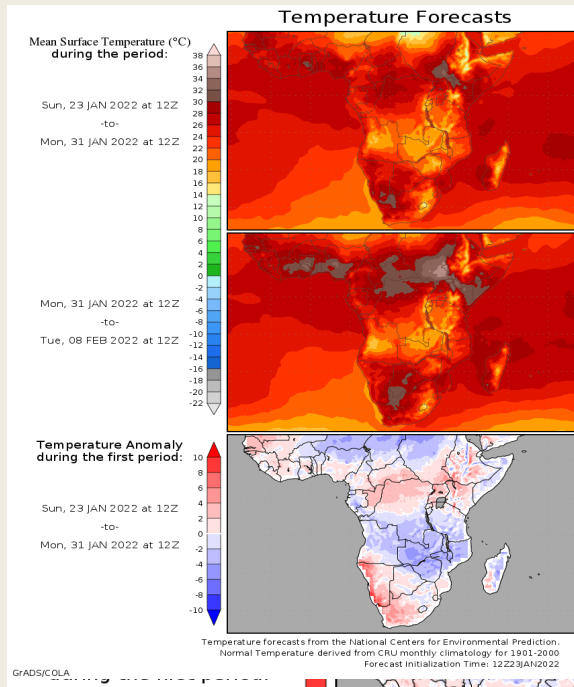
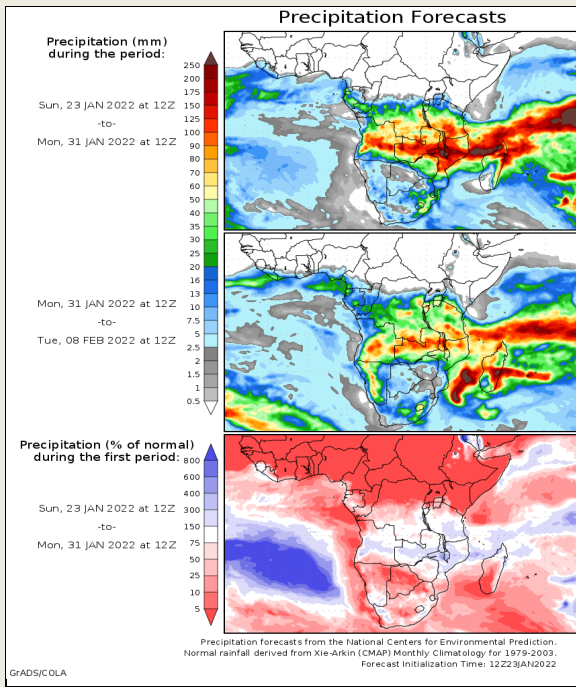
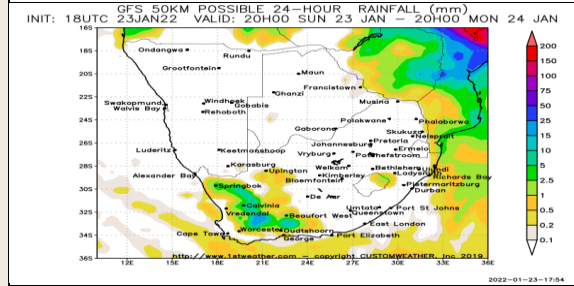
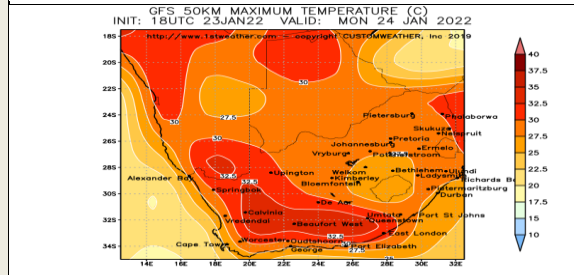
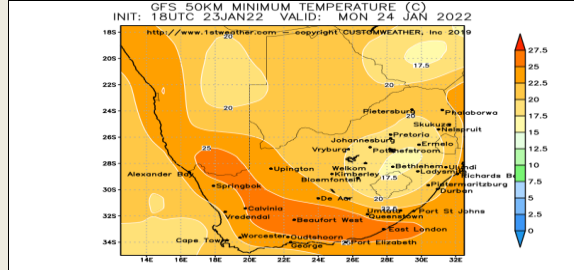
Much of South Africa's crop production areas will be drier biased through the end of next week. The drying trend will be beneficial for areas in Natal and Free State that experienced flooding in recent days. There will still be plenty of moisture through the end of next week to maintain a good environment for the crops. Corn production may be a little lower than previously expected due to flooding. However, yields are still expected to be good for much of the country. South Africa will generally be drier biased through the end of next week

- o Light rain will occur at times this weekend and next week, most notably in eastern, southern, and western South Africa
- o Portions of Natal and Eastern Cape will receive 0.40-1.50" of rain with locally greater amounts by next Friday morning
- o Most other locations will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation or impact long-term soil conditions
- Eastern and central South Africa will have opportunities for rain January 29 – February 4
- o Western South Africa will receive little to no precipitation

Based on preliminary data



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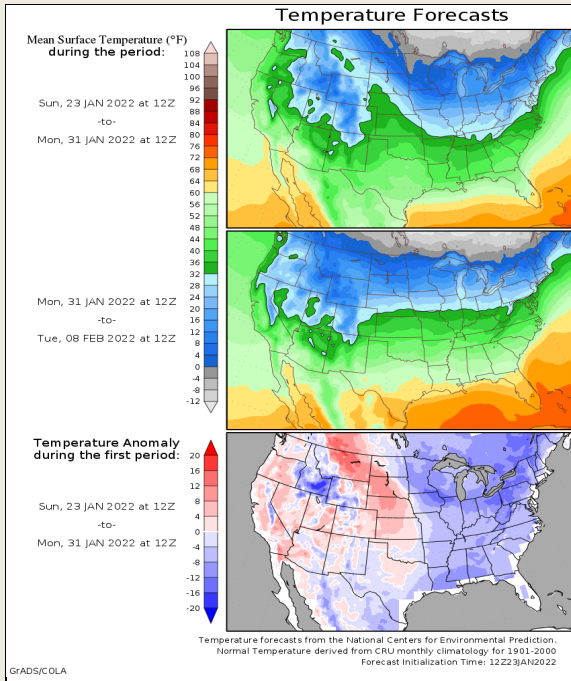
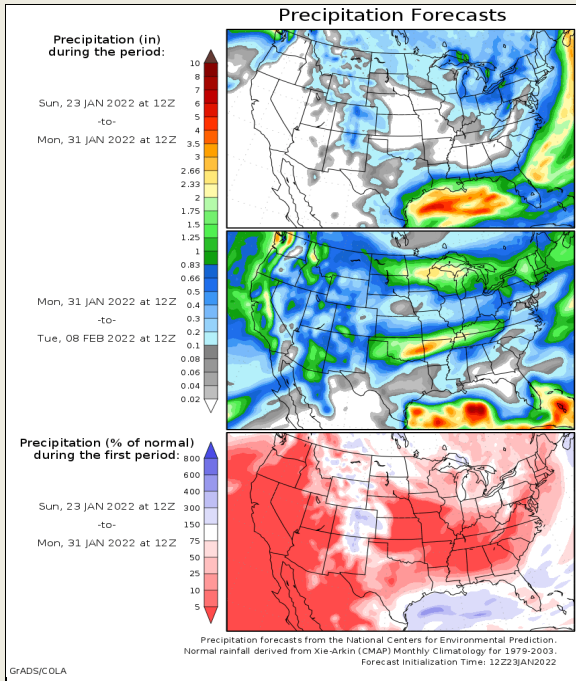
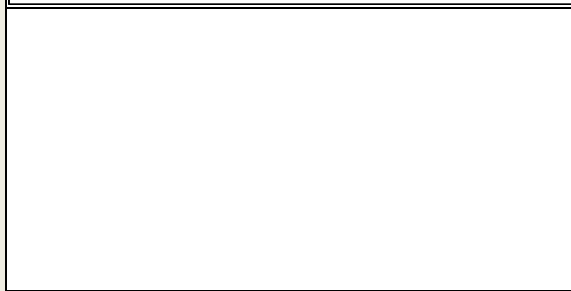
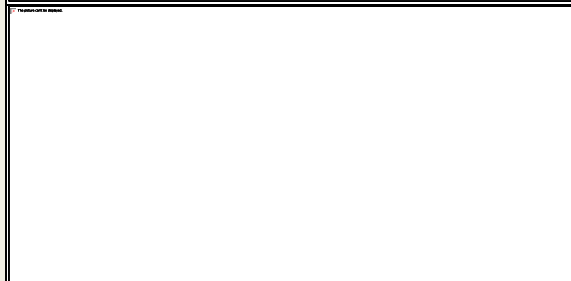
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see a quiet weather pattern through most of the next two weeks with an impressive, but short-lived shot of cold air expected Thursday into Friday. After much warmer than normal temperatures occur today cooling will occur and temperatures will be colder than usual most often through the middle of next week.

- o Thursday will be coldest with highs in the single digits occur as far south as most of Iowa and some nearby areas.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Mostly dry weather will occur today before widespread precipitation falls Wednesday into Friday.

- o Most of the precipitation will be rain with the southern Delta into the Southeast seeing totals of 0.50-1.65" and locally more while totals are lighter in the northern Delta.
- o Some snow will fall Thursday into Friday from central Georgia to southern Virginia where some 1 to 4 inch totals and locally more will occur in North Carolina and southern Virginia.



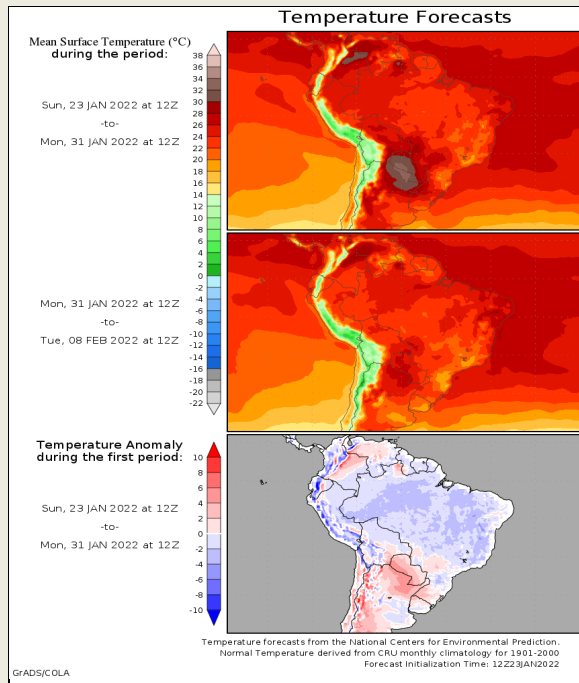
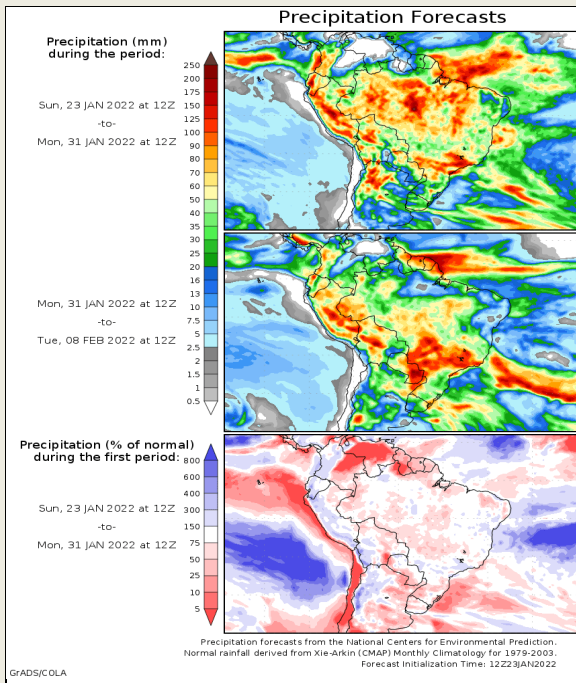
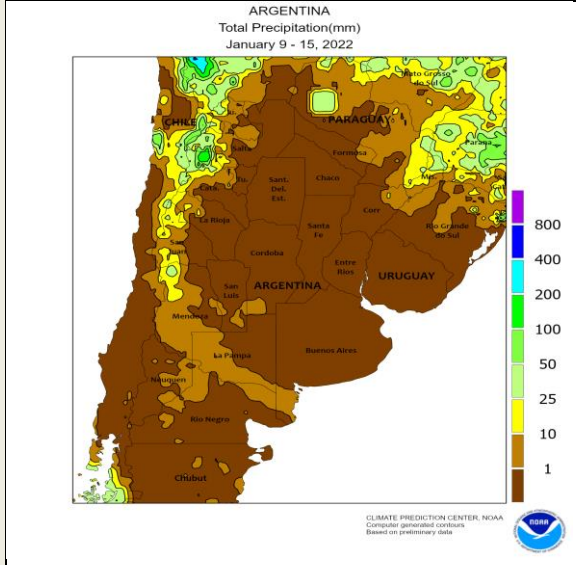
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Paraguay and far southern Brazil will see little to no rain of significance and hot temperatures through Saturday and crop stress will return as moisture from recent rain is lost to evaporation while areas that missed out on rain see further declines in yields. Additional rain will fall Jan. 29-Feb. 4 in Paraguay while far southern Brazil dries down again with crop stress likely to increase in early February if rain does not return soon.

ARGENTINA: Central and southern Argentina will see mild temperatures during the next week and with significant rain expected, crop conditions should improve dramatically where crops are still viable.

- o Late corn and soybean planting should increase as a result of the rain and some replanting may occur where newly planted withered and died.
- o Drier weather will return Jan. 28-Feb. 4 and fieldwork should increase while northern areas will need rain again soon to maintain improvements in soil moisture that result from next week's rain.



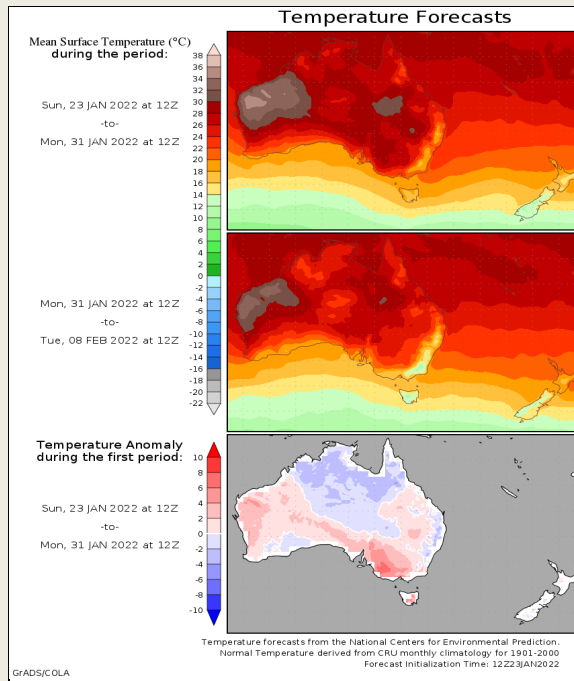
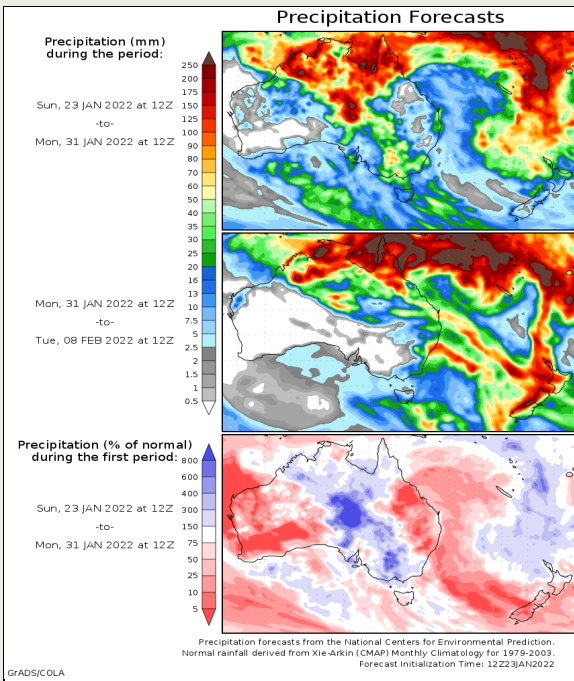
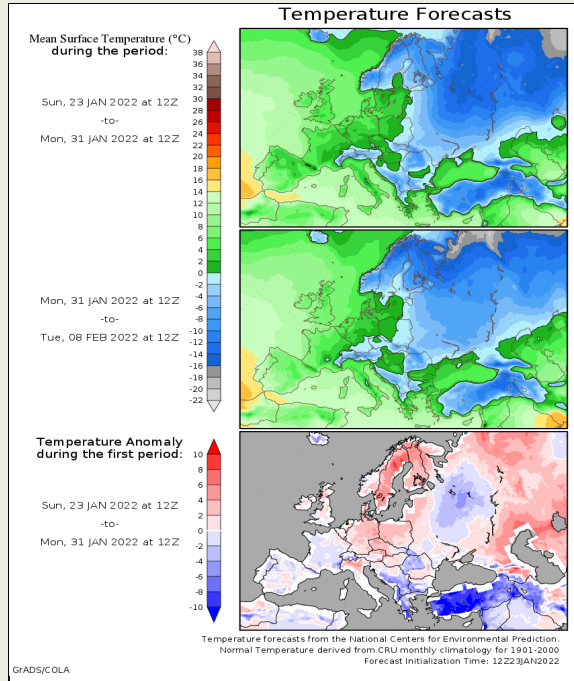
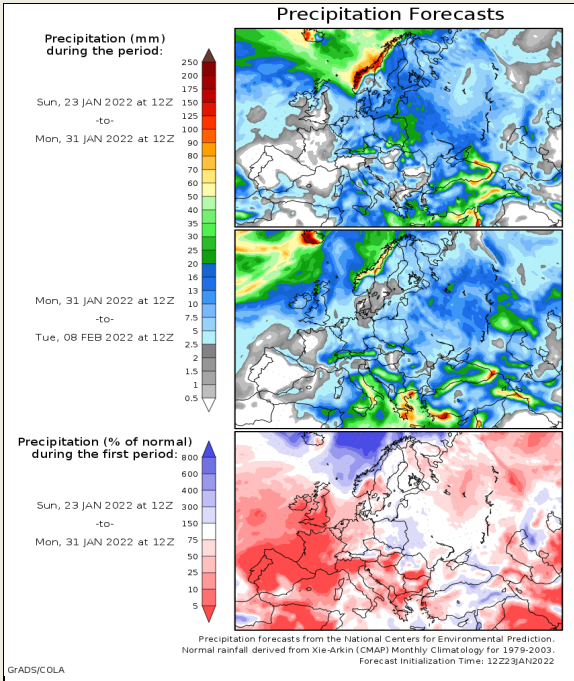
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will continue to maintain moist conditions throughout the North Sea Region into France, Germany, Switzerland and northeastern Italy as well as southern Scandinavia this week. Moisture will reach into the northwestern Balkan Nations Thursday into early next week and may expand into portions of the southeastern Balkan Nations early next week.

AUSTRALIA: Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue over southeastern Queensland and northern New South Wales today and Wednesday.

☺ Daily moisture totals will vary from 0.20 to 0.80 inch and local totals in excess of 1.00 inch. A few pockets of heavy rain will occur in southern Queensland and rain totals may vary from 1.00 to 3.00 inches.



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
