





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
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
South Africa - Weather

Eastern and central South Africa will continue to see a mix of rain and sunshine during the comin veek. Precipitation will be greatest in North West. Free State, and neighboring locations, which could ignificantly slow or delay the harvest at times. Minor quality reductions will be possible as well Producers will still have opportunities to get into the fields, though the need for drier weather may increase later this month. Eastern and central South Africa will see scattered showers and hunderstorms this evening into Monday as a disturbance slowly passes over the country o Dry or nostly dry weather will occur Tuesday and Wednesday o Moisture totals by next Thursday morning vill range from 2.00-5.00" and locally greater amounts in North West, Free State, and neighboring areas in Northern Cape, Limpopo, and Mpumalanga o The remaining areas in eastern and central outh Africa will receive 0.50-2.00" of rain with drier pockets in northern Limpopo Western South Africa outside eastern Northern Cape will be drier biased during the coming week o Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation • Alternating periods of light rain and sunshine are lated for eastern and central South Africa April 15 – 21 Western South Africa will have a few opportunities for rain as well










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

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
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Cool weather has reduced soil temperatures pushing early season crop development behind normal in some areas. Warming will be most significant next week and the wet weather bias is expected to ease up additionally by that time as well.

Enough precipitation has already occurred in the past week to ten days and that expected to prevent dryness from becoming an issue with early season crop development. There is still some need for greater moisture in Romania. Some spring planting delays are expected in those areas that have become a little too wet. AUSTRALIA: Shower and thunderstorm activity in key eastern crop areas through the first seven days of the outlook will be enough to prevent stress in late season unirrigated summer crop fields; however, there may be

AUSTRALIA: Shower and thunderstorm activity in key eastern crop areas through the first seven days of the outlook will be enough to prevent stress in late season unirrigated summer crop fields; however, there may be some localized cotton quality decline where the heaviest rain occurs. Most of the cotton crop should not be negatively impacted. Meaningful rain will also occur across much of Victoria which will give a beneficial rise in topsoil moisture for autumn planting that usually begins in late April and May.



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
