



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
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
#### South Africa - Weather

A frontal boundary will bring rain to portions of western and central South Africa late Sunday into the first part of next week. Rainfall will be greatest in Western Cape, where winter wheat prospects will remain favorable. Northern Cape, Free State, and neighboring winter wheat areas will receive little to no rain, though the environment will remain mostly good for the wheat as well. A shot of rain may be needed late this month or early July to maintain favorable wheat prospects in Northern Cape and Free State. In the meantime, harvesting of the summer crops will advance swiftly. • Eastern and central South Africa will be mostly dry during the coming week o However, a disturbance and frontal boundary will bring rain to Eastern Cape, southern fringes of Natal, and neighboring areas early next week B Moisture totals by next Thursday morning will range from 0.25-1.00" with local amounts of 2.00" or more near and along the Eastern Cape coastline o Any rain that occurs elsewhere will be lost to evaporation • Western South Africa will be mostly dry through Sunday afternoon o A frontal boundary will then bring rain to the region late Sunday into Tuesday o Moisture totals by next Thursday morning will range from 0.75-4.00" in western Sections of Western Cape o Other areas will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain









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#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: Crops will see at least two more weeks of favorable soil conditions with another week of regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms that will keep the soil favorably moist with some of the drier areas from eastern Nebraska to Wisconsin seeing increases in soil moisture by early next week. Rain is not likely to fall frequently enough to prevent late planting from taking place between rounds of precipitation.


3 The far northwestern Corn Belt will have good opportunities for planting as little rain of significance will fall through Friday before showers increase this weekend.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see more sunshine than rain during the next two weeks and many areas will dry down overall allowing for good planting progress while raising the need for greater rain later this month.

All areas will receive at least some rain that will prevent most locations from becoming excessively

dry during the next two weeks with greater rain needed soon across the region.





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



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
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#### **South America - Weather**

BRAZIL: Western into south-central and the southeastern corner of Mato Grosso will receive rain today nto Friday and some Safrinha corn should benefit from the moisture while most of the rain will come oo late to have a significant impact on yield potentials. Central to the remainder of eastern Mato Grosso into Goias will miss much of the rain. o Mato Grosso do Sul to Sao Paulo and northern Parana will also receive rain into Friday and developing crops will benefit from the moisture. ARGENTINA: Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks and fieldwork will dvance well around light showers that infrequently develop in small parts of the country. o Greater rain is needed in the drier areas of western Argentina to improve conditions for winter o Rain will fall on parts of central and eastern Argentina Wednesday into next Thursday. 
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
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
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
## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Enough rain is still expected in the first week of the outlook for at least some rise in topsoil moisture in most areas except Portugal, Spain, and southeastern France. Some needed rain is likely in Italy after Monday. The need for greater rainfall continues to rise in southeastern France. There is also a need for more rain in Spain and Portugal; though, this part of the region does not typically get much rain this time of year. AUSTRALIA: Conditions will still be favorable for crops and fieldwork through the next seven days. Any rain will be mostly limited to production areas of Western Australia, which will be timely and needed. Dryness in the east will benefit fieldwork advancement.









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
