



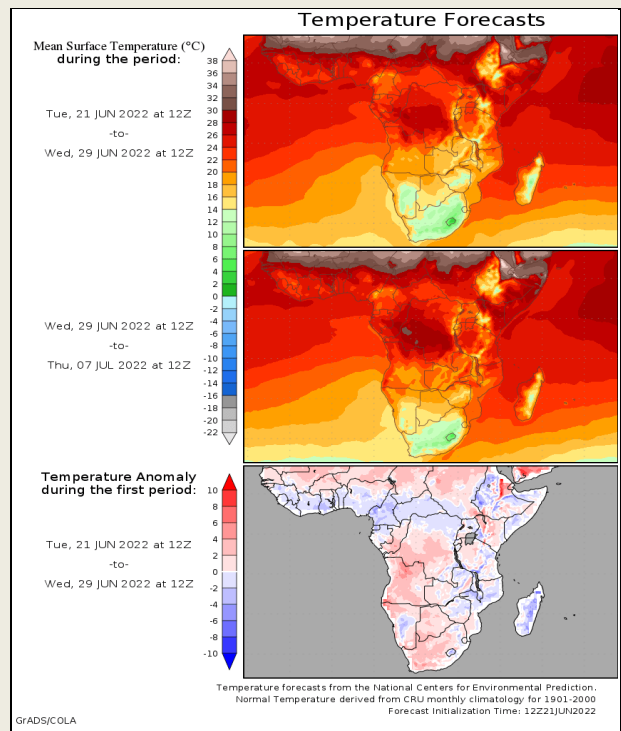
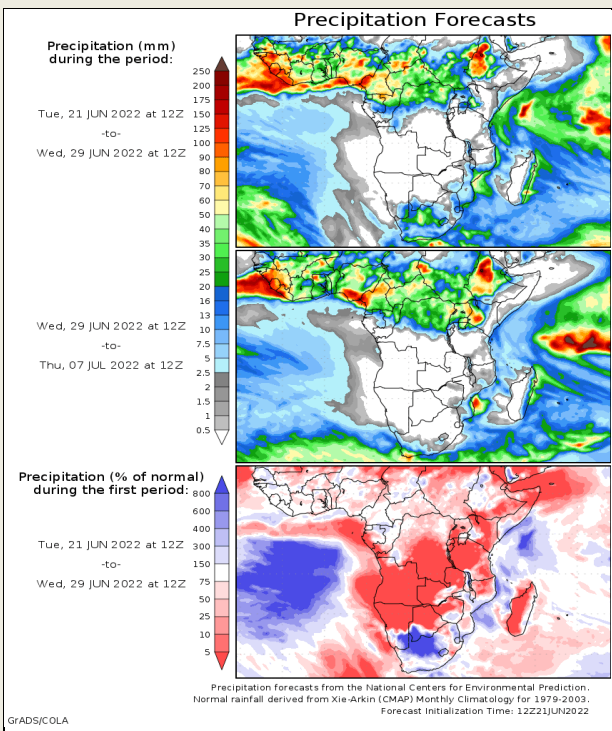
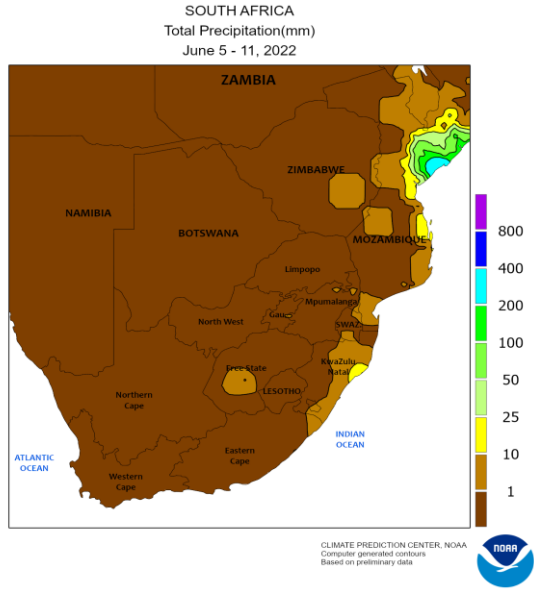
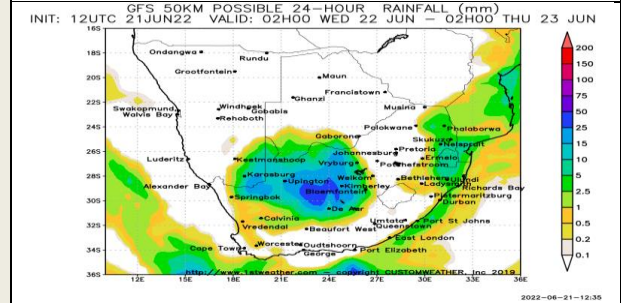
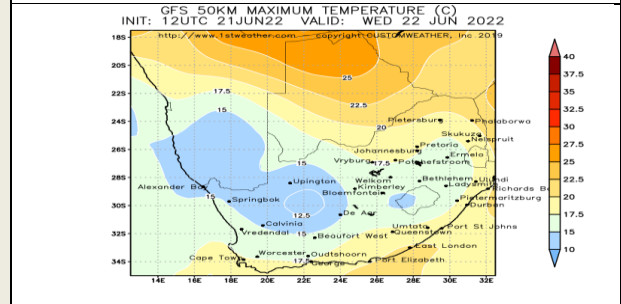
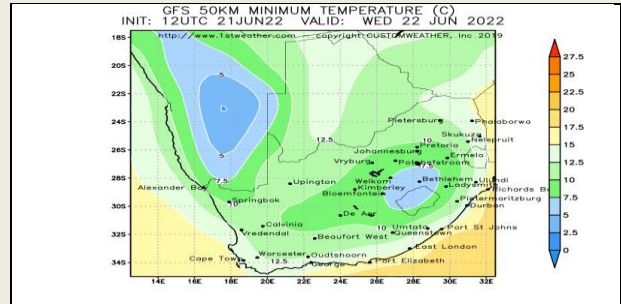
Weather Report

22 June 2022

South Africa - Weather

Western and central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week. The rain will be beneficial for aggressive winter wheat development. Any summer crop harvesting that is not yet complete may otherwise be sluggish at times. Eastern South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week. Late-season harvesting will advance swiftly. • Western and central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week

- o A strong upper-level disturbance will generate rain through Thursday with some light showers expected Friday and Saturday
- o Moisture totals by next Tuesday morning will range from 0.50-3.00" with locally greater amounts in Northern Cape and Western Cape
- o Eastern Cape, Free State, and North West will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain with local amounts of 1.50" or more in western Free State and North West
- Eastern South Africa will generally be drier biased during the coming week
- o Light rain will still occur at times, though resulting rainfall will be lost to evaporation
- South Africa will generally be drier biased June 29 – July 5



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United States of America - Weather

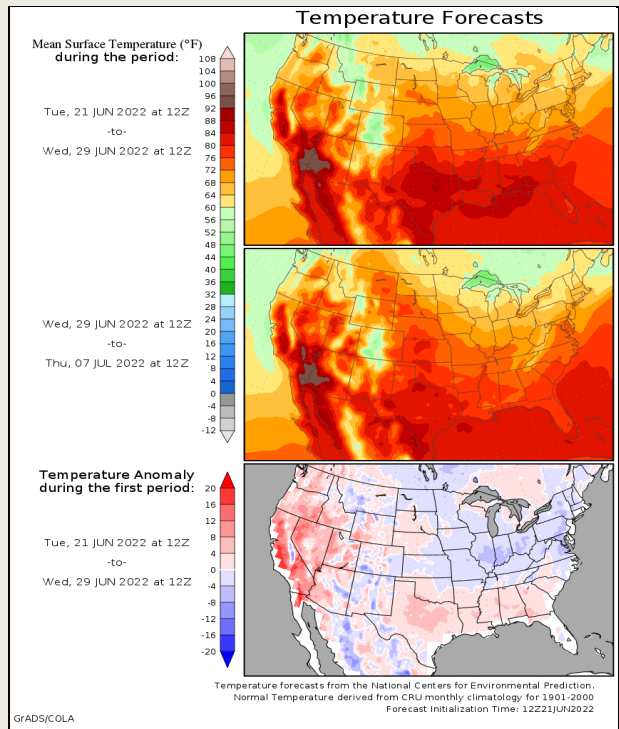
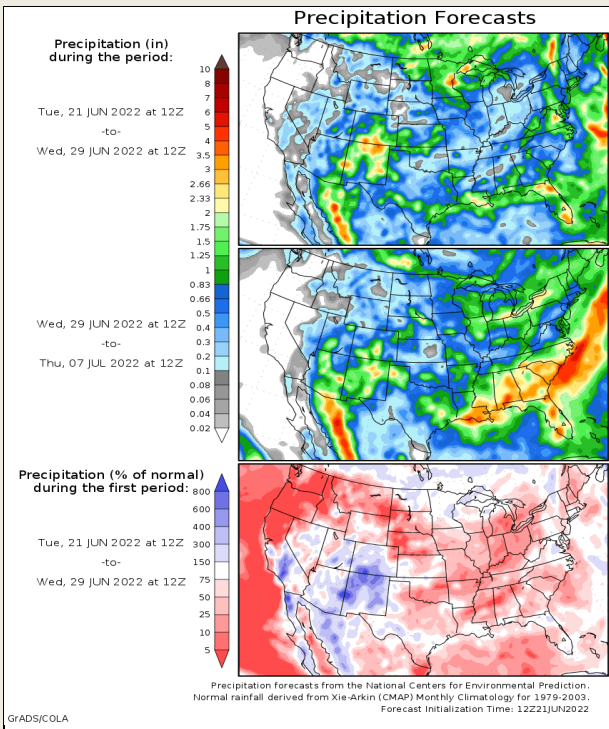
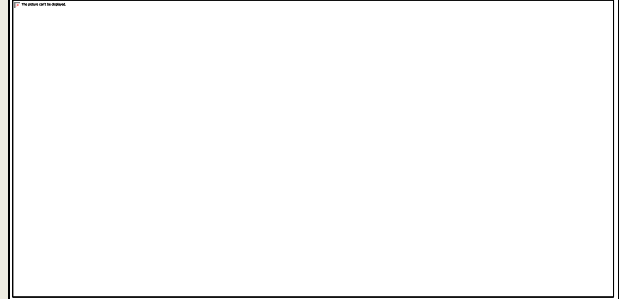
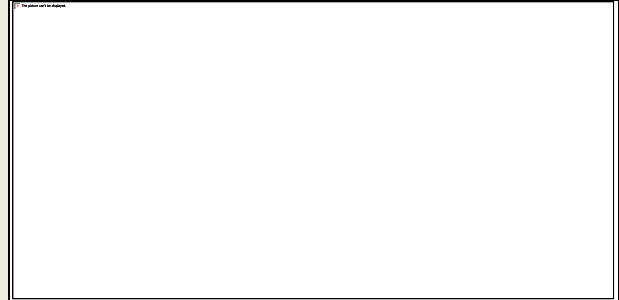
U.S. MIDWEST: Rapid drying will continue in many areas outside of the northwestern Corn Belt through Saturday as temperatures will be warm to hot and outside of a few pockets, most areas will see little to no rain of significance before a welcome period of milder temperatures occurs Sunday through next week.

o An exception will occur in northeastern Kansas and northwestern Missouri where some beneficial rain is expected later today.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta will see a restricted rainfall pattern through the next two weeks along with warm to hot temperatures for at least another week and stress to crops is likely to increase by late this month as the topsoil is already dry while subsoil moisture that is adequate today becomes depleted.

o Stress to crops will increase first in the southern Delta where soil moisture is lowest.

- The southeastern states will not see ideal conditions for crops as topsoil moisture is short and subsoil moisture is short to adequate in most areas while warm to hot temperatures are expected for at least another week along with an erratic distribution of rain during the next two weeks.

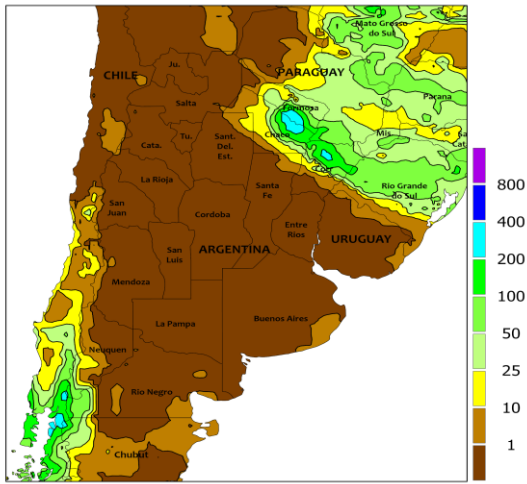


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South America - Weather

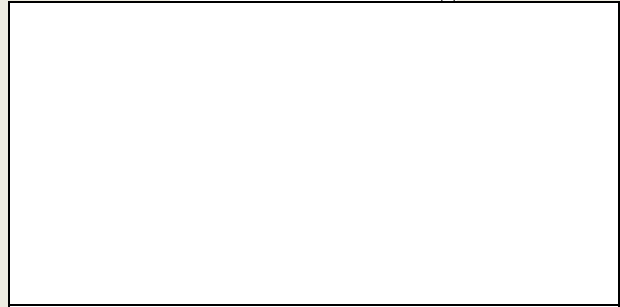
BRAZIL: Southern Paraguay and far southern Brazil will see regular rounds of rain and interruptions to fieldwork through Friday while rain is restricted elsewhere.
 o Drier weather will occur across Brazil Saturday through July 5 and fieldwork should increase in the south where a few rounds of light showers will occur.
ARGENTINA: Although daily showers will occur through the next week, fieldwork should advance well in much of the country as much of the rain will be light and not focused on any one region for an extended period of time.
 o Portions of western Argentina will see at least some rain, but the precipitation should be too light to have much of an impact on soil conditions and greater rain is needed to improve conditions for winter crops.

June 5 - 11, 2022

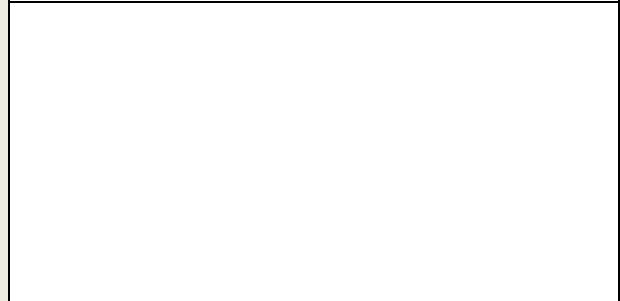

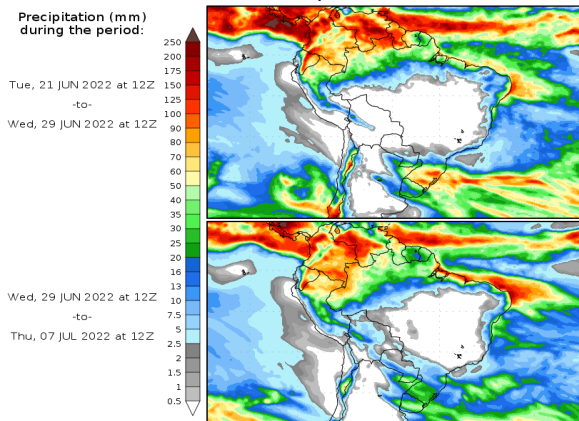

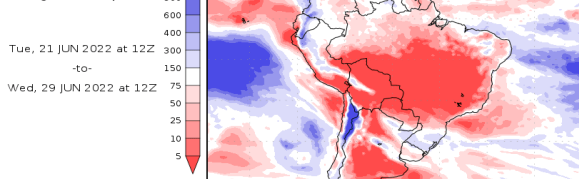


Precipitation Forecasts

Precipitation (% of normal) during the first period:

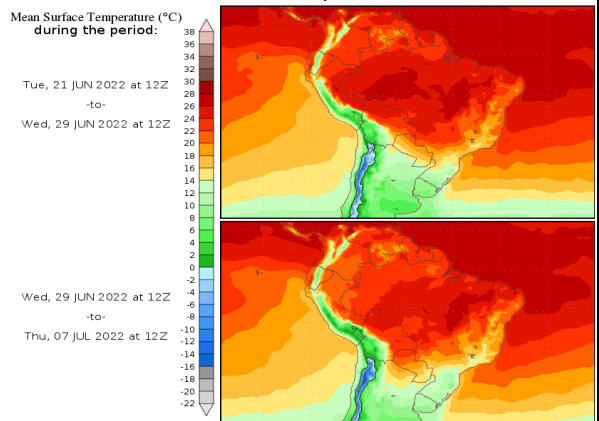

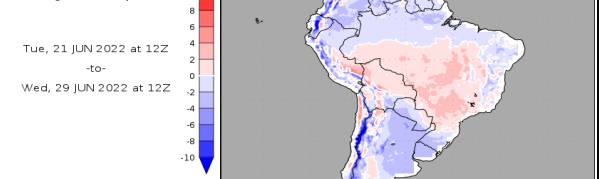
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Temperature Forecasts

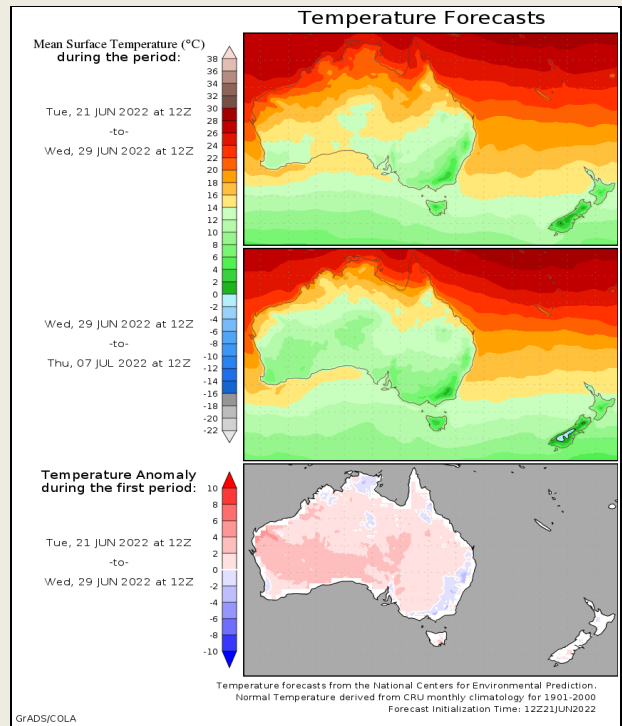
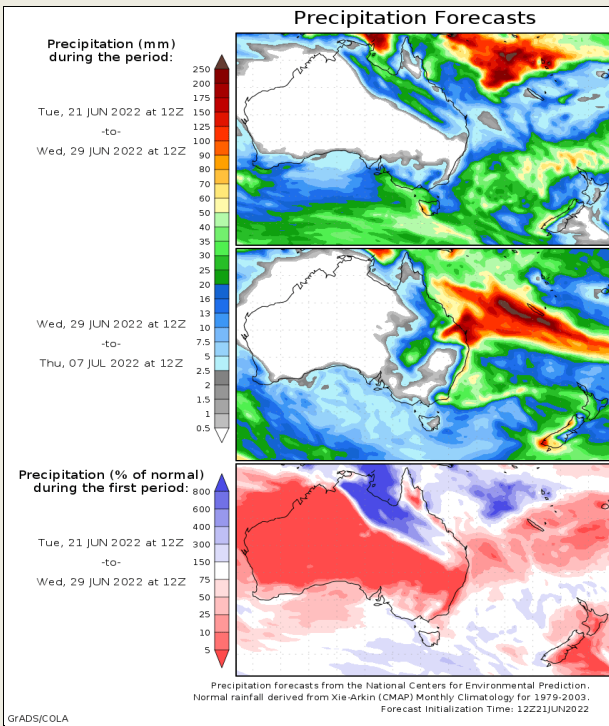
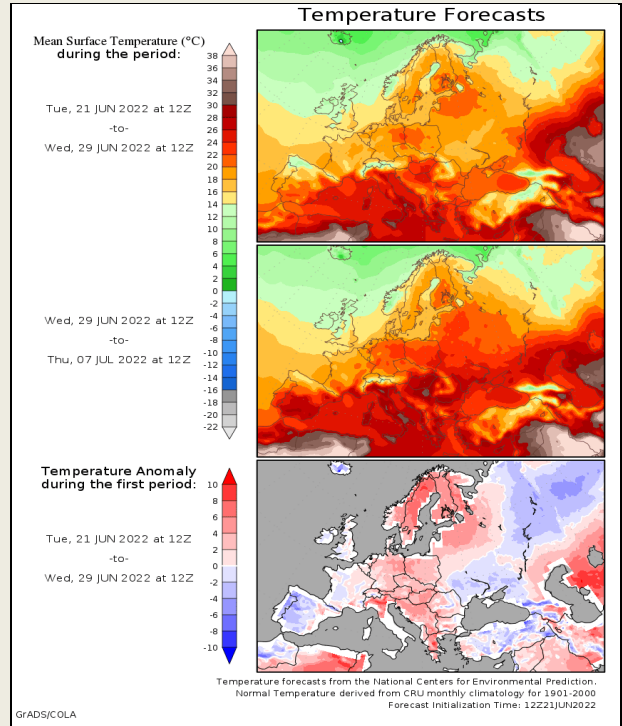
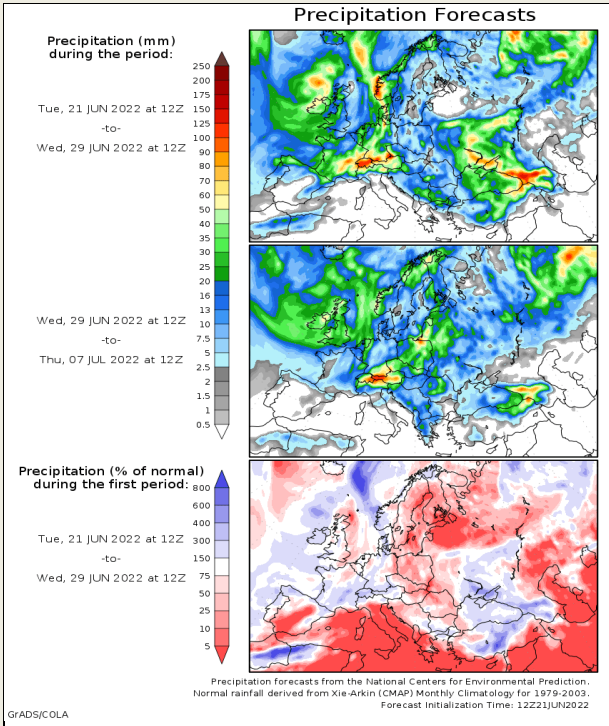
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Enough rain is still expected in the first week of the outlook for at least some rise in topsoil moisture in most areas except Portugal, Spain, and southeastern France. Some needed rain is likely in Italy after Monday. The need for greater rainfall continues to rise in southeastern France. There is also a need for more rain in Spain and Portugal; though, this part of the region does not typically get much rain this time of year.

AUSTRALIA: A mostly favorable weather pattern is expected in the first week of the outlook with shower activity in the south satisfying the needs of most crops. A close monitoring of the forecast will be warranted for a potential rain event in Queensland and northern New South Wales late Sunday into June 28. This could involve some significant rain that delays fieldwork.



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
