
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
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#### South Africa - Weather


South Africa will generally see a mix of rain and sunshine through the middle of next week. Rain may slow late-season harvesting, though producers will have opportunities to get into the fields between rain events. The precipitation will otherwise continue to support good winter wheat growth. Western and central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week


- o Two-upper level disturbances will generate erratic rainfall through Saturday before drier weather evolves later this weekend and early next week
- Moisture totals by next Wednesday morning will range from 0.50-3.00" with locally greater amounts in Northern Cape and Western Cape
- ☐ Eastern Cape, Free State, and North West will receive 0.25-1.50" of rain with local amounts of 2.00'
- Eastern South Africa will see a mix of light rain and sunshine through the middle of next week
- o Moisture totals by next Wednesday morning will range from 0.10-0.75"
- South Africa will generally be drier biased June 30 July 6

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#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: Rapid drying will continue in many areas outside of the northwestern Corn Belt through Saturday as temperatures will be warm to hot and outside of a few pockets, most areas will see little to no rain of significance before a welcome period of milder temperatures occurs Sunday through next week.


O An exception will occur in northeastern Kansas and northwestern Missouri where some beneficial rain is expected later today.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The two-week outlook is a little wetter for the Delta than advertised Tuesday and starting Sunday the region will see isolated to scattered showers most days through July 6 while the Southeast sees isolated to scattered showers most days through July 6 while the Southeast sees isolated to scattered showers most days through the next two weeks.

O The resulting rain will be beneficial and will slow drying rates, but temperatures will be hot enough that much of the moisture will quickly be lost to evaporation and large parts of the Delta and the Southeast will be drier in two weeks than they are today.

O Stress to crops is likely to increase as topsoil moisture is already short and the marginal to adequate subsoil moisture is depleted.





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#### **South America - Weather**

BRAZIL: Southern Paraguay and far southern Brazil will see regular rounds of rain and interruptions to fieldwork through Friday while rain is restricted elsewhere.


O Drier weather will occur across Brazil Saturday through July 5 and fieldwork should increase in the south where a few rounds of light showers will occur.


ARGENTINA: Fieldwork should advance well in much of the country through the next two weeks with brief interruptions to fieldwork likely to result from light showers expected into Monday.
O Portions of western Argentina will see at least some rain, but the precipitation should be too light to have much of an impact on soil conditions and greater rain is needed to improve conditions for winter crops.



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
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
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
# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Significant rain in much of France, Germany, and Austria in the first week of the outlook will greatly increase topsoil moisture which will reduce crop stress. The rain is needed in much of this area; however, too much could occur leading to localized flooding. Dryness will continue in much of Italy, central and southern Spain, and in the eastern Balkan Countries. Crop moisture stress will continue in the lower Danube River Basin because of dryness and there may eventually be some expansion of dryness to include a larger part of eastern Europe – at least for a little while.

AUSTRALIA: mostly favorable weather pattern is expected in the first week of the outlook with shower activity in the south satisfying the needs of most crops in the south. A close monitoring of the forecast will still be warranted for a potential rain event in Queensland and northern New South Wales next week. Confidence in the significance of this event is a little low, but it has the potential to cause some fieldwork delays.









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
