

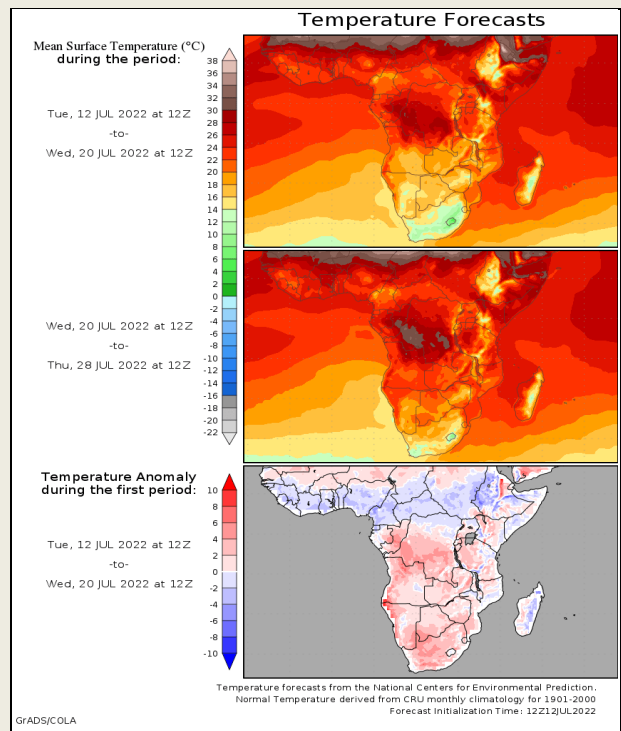
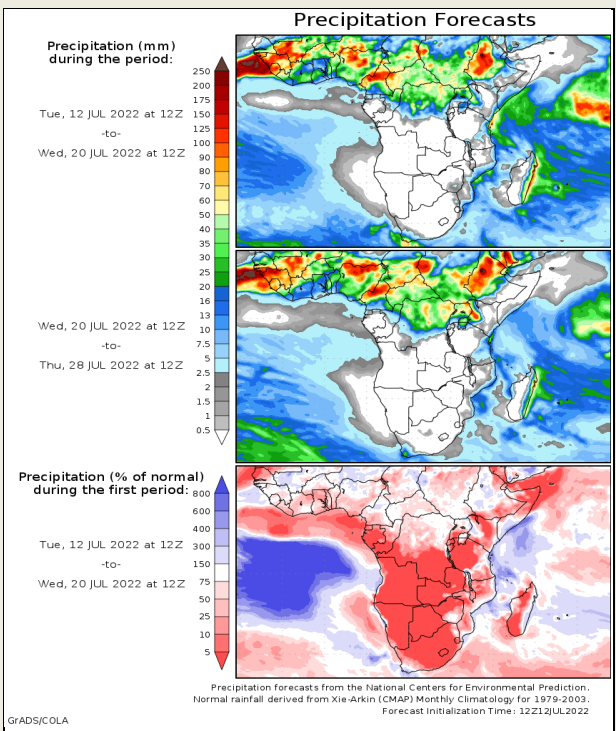
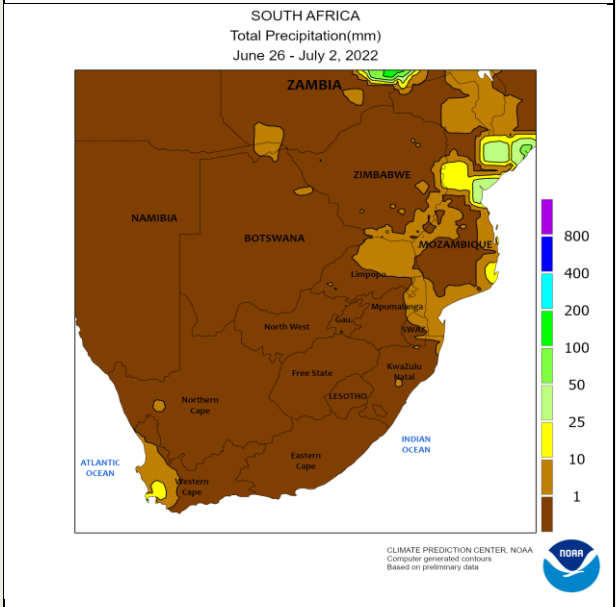
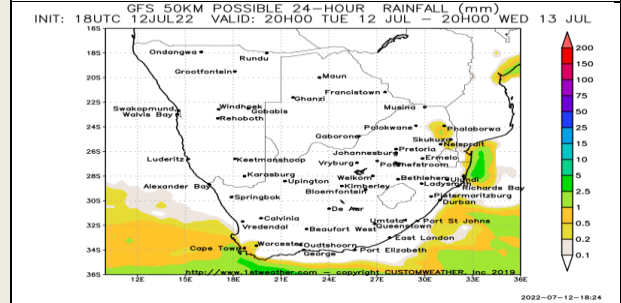
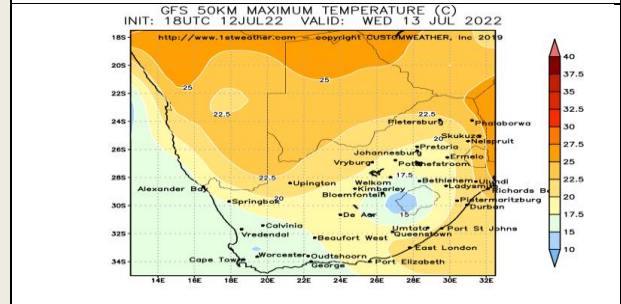
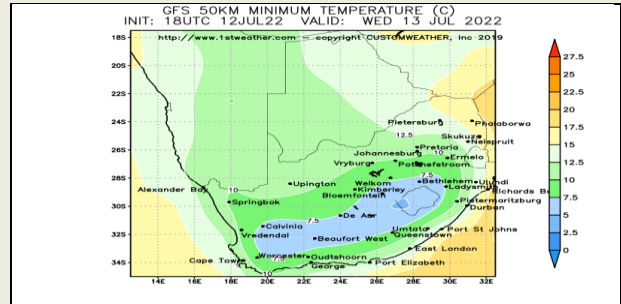


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

South Africa will remain drier biased during the coming week. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable for much of Western Cape, Northern Cape, Free State, and neighboring areas despite the dryness. However, most locations would benefit from a good soaking of rain later this month or early August. • South Africa will be mostly dry during the coming week
o Any rain that does occur will generally be lost to evaporation
• Much of South Africa will remain drier biased July 20 – 26
o Western and southern South Africa will still have opportunities for light rain

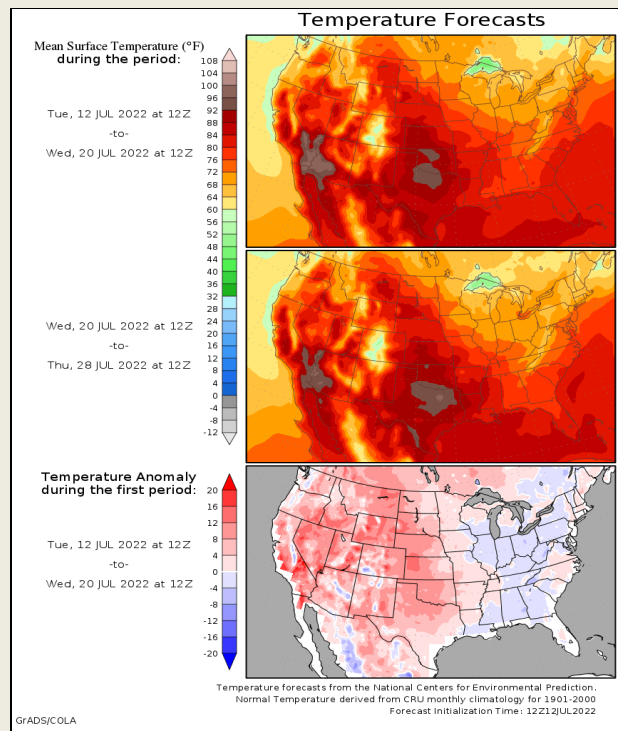
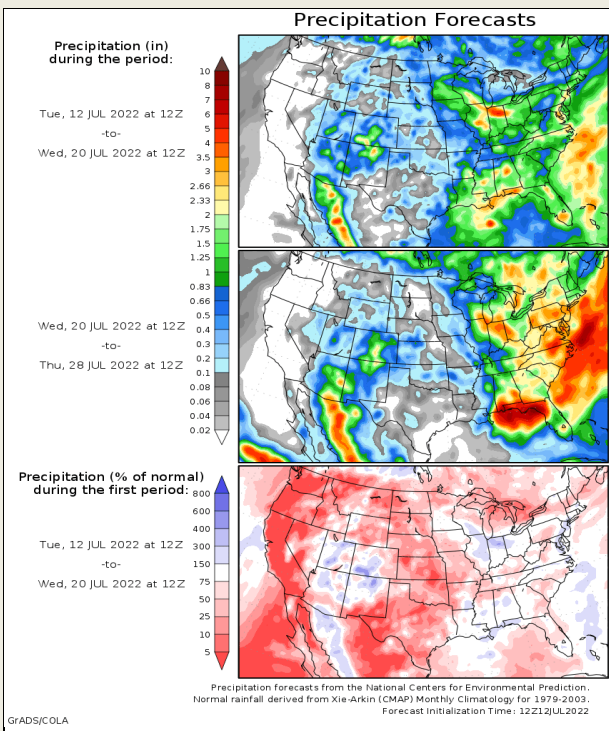
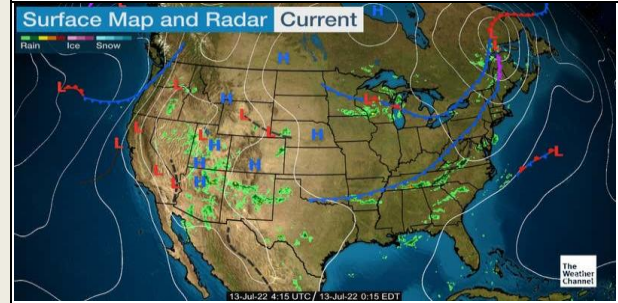
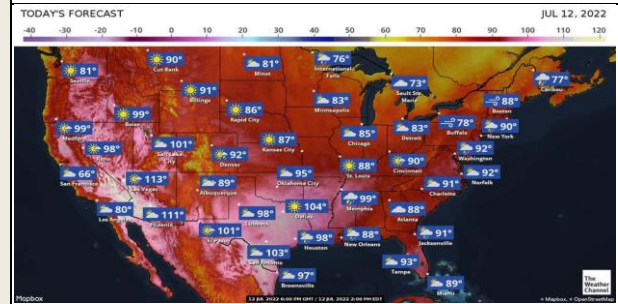
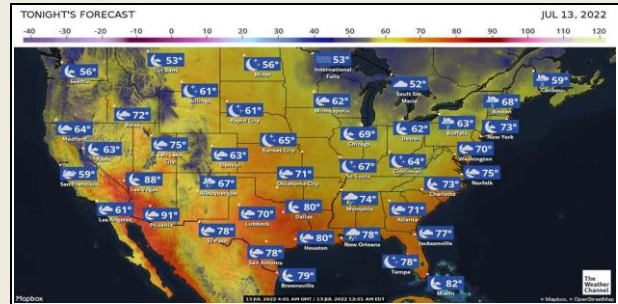


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Today's forecast is wetter for Thursday through Monday and by Monday much of the Midwest, outside of some west-central and southwestern areas, will have received rain that will be beneficial for pollinating corn while buying crops more time before stress due to a lack of soil moisture increases. Southeastern South Dakota to eastern Kansas and western into central Missouri will see a few showers, but rain will be mostly light and the moisture should quickly be lost to evaporation in the warm to hot temperatures expected Thursday through at least late next week.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The southern Delta into the Southeast will see scattered to numerous showers most days through the next two weeks with enhanced rain from a tropical disturbance Wednesday through Friday that will leave the region with enough rain to favorably support crop development. The two-week outlook for the northern Delta remains too dry to allow for favorable conditions for crops in much of the region and declines in yield potentials are likely.



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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks outside of southern Paraguay, southern Brazil, and eastern Bahia where regular rounds of rain will occur with some fieldwork likely to advance around the precipitation.

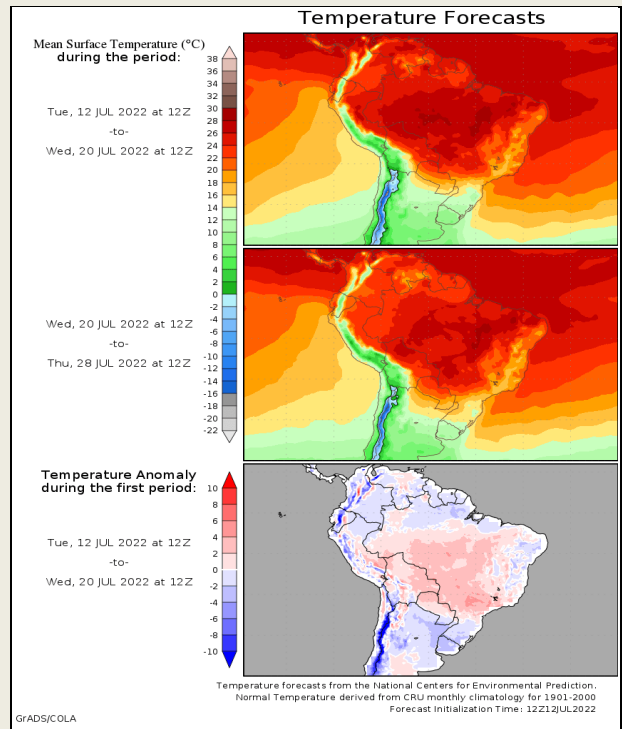
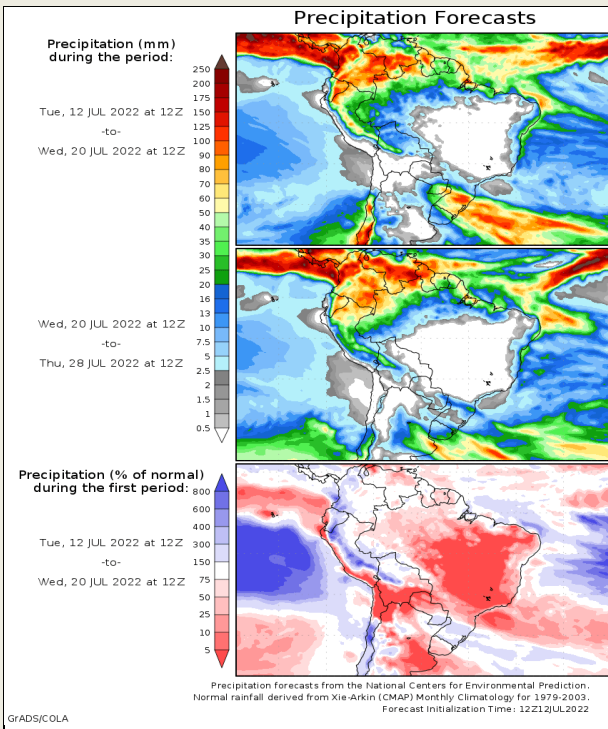
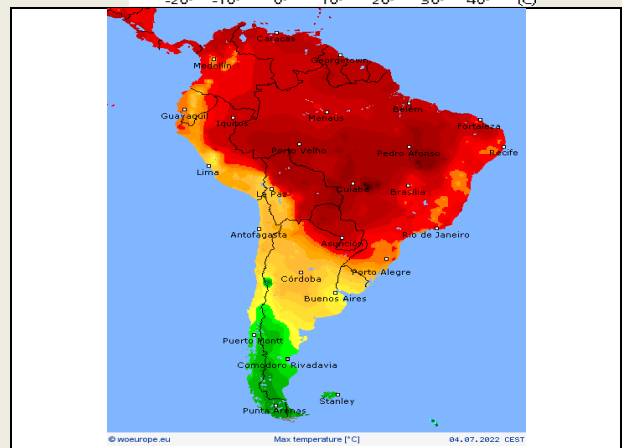
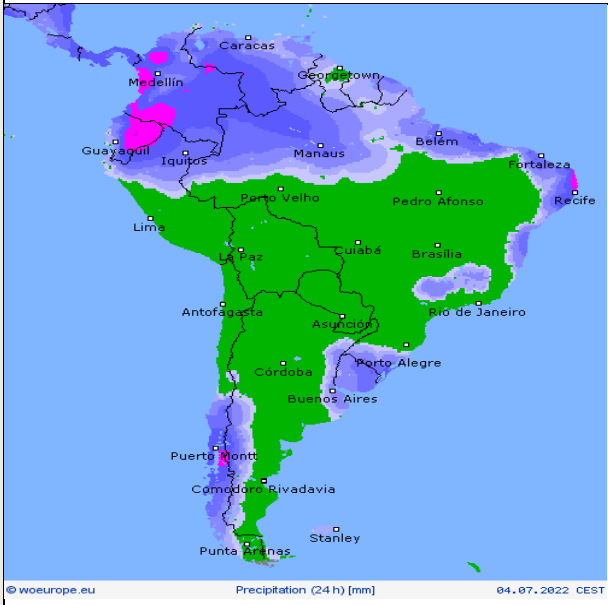
o Today through Saturday will be wettest and many areas from southern Paraguay to southern Parana, Santa Catarina, and Rio Grande do Sul will receive 0.50-2.0" of rain and locally more with lighter rain extending into parts of Mato Grosso do Sul and northern Parana.

o Rio Grande do Sul will be wettest and will see totals of 1.0-2.50" and locally more.

ARGENTINA: Dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork will occur through much of the next two weeks with a few rounds of showers and thunderstorms that will favor eastern areas.

o Western Argentina will remain in need of rain to improve conditions for winter wheat.

o Rain will increase Thursday into Saturday when a few showers occur in the west with most of the significant rain confined to Entre Rios and Corrientes where totals will be 0.15-0.90" and locally more.

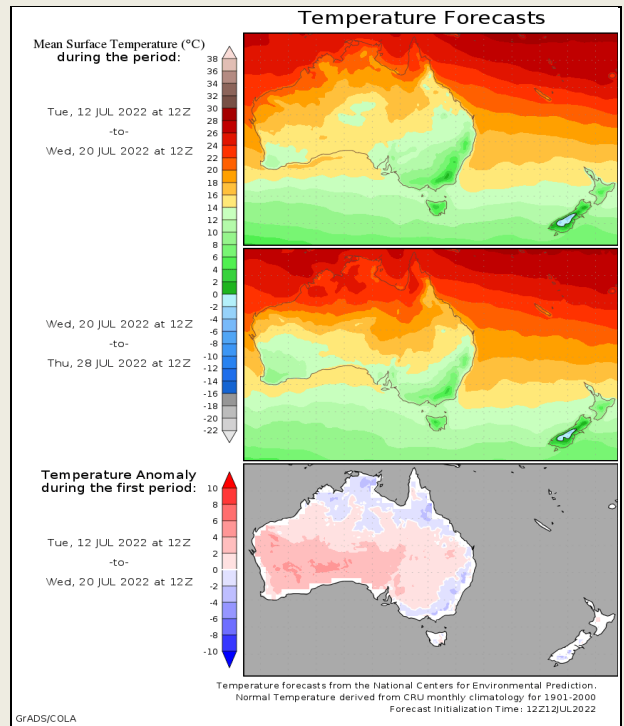
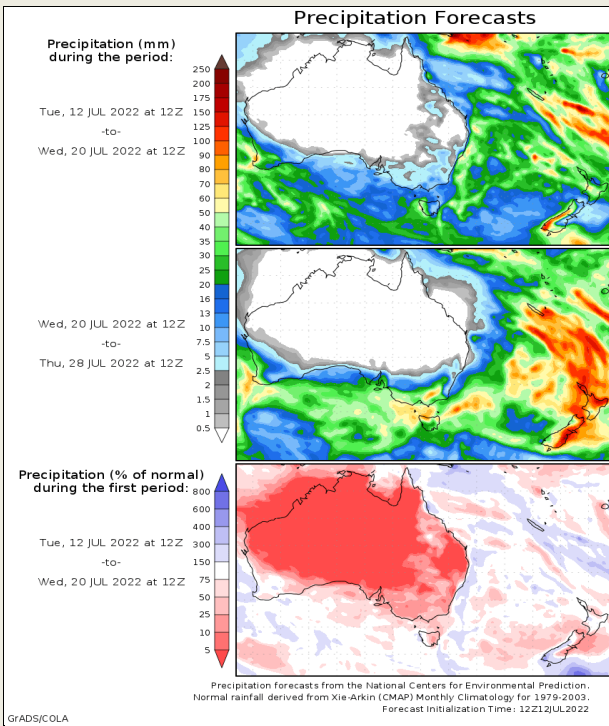
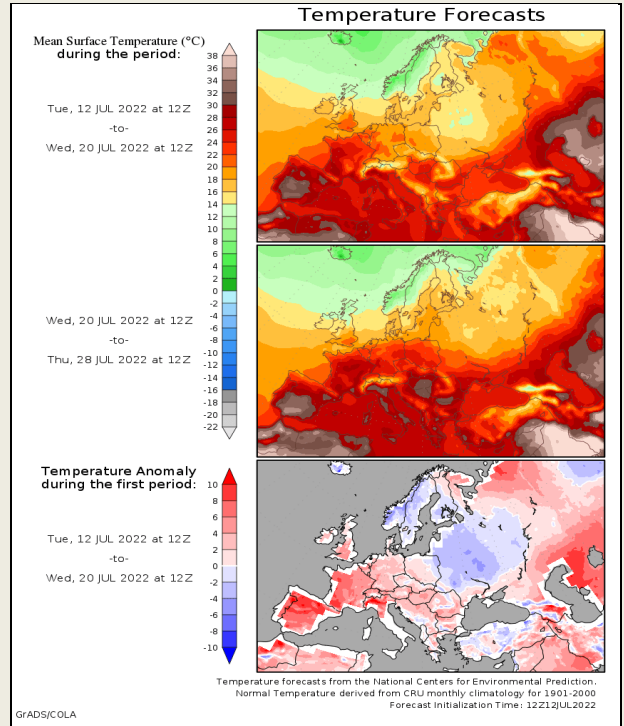
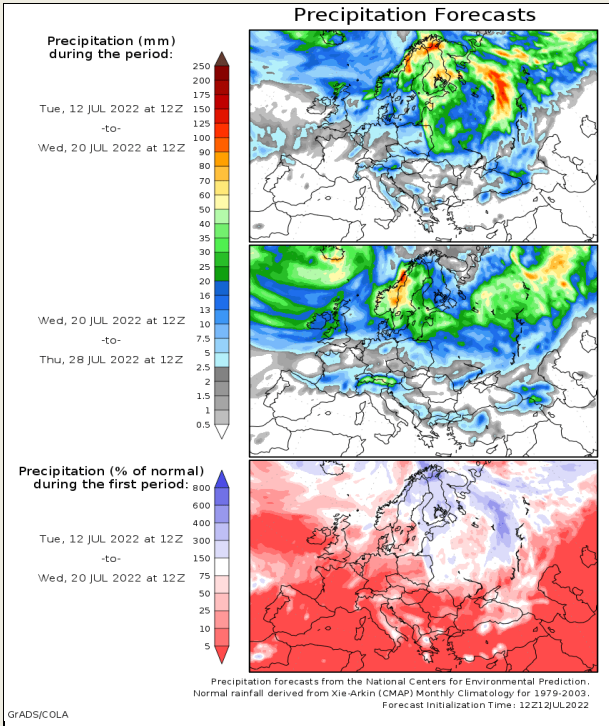


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Dryness will continue to become more of an issue through the next ten days to two weeks. Very little rain is expected in the first week of the outlook with almost the entire region being dry. Shower activity will likely increase some in the second week; though, net drying will continue in many areas. As the region dries down, the heat will build more significantly and southwestern areas in particular will be quite hot by early next week. Rising crop and livestock stress are concerns.

AUSTRALIA: Conditions will continue to be mostly favorable the next seven days. Shower activity in the south will be enough to satisfy the needs of most crops. Western production areas of Queensland could use some greater rainfall. The weather conditions are still likely to continue to support crops later in the winter as they become semi-dormant.



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
