

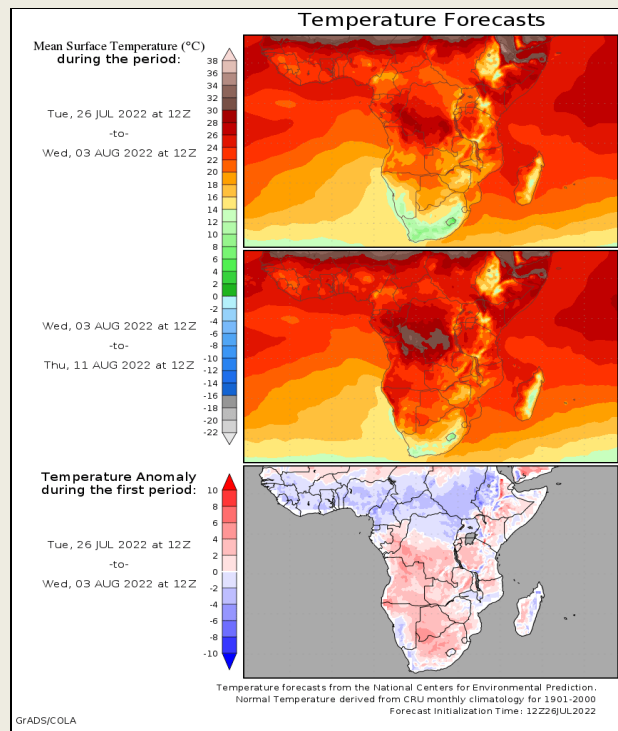
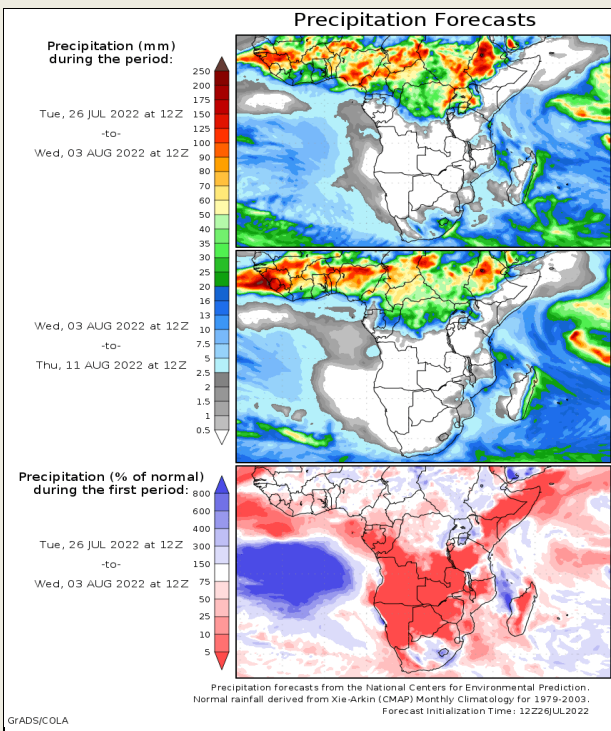
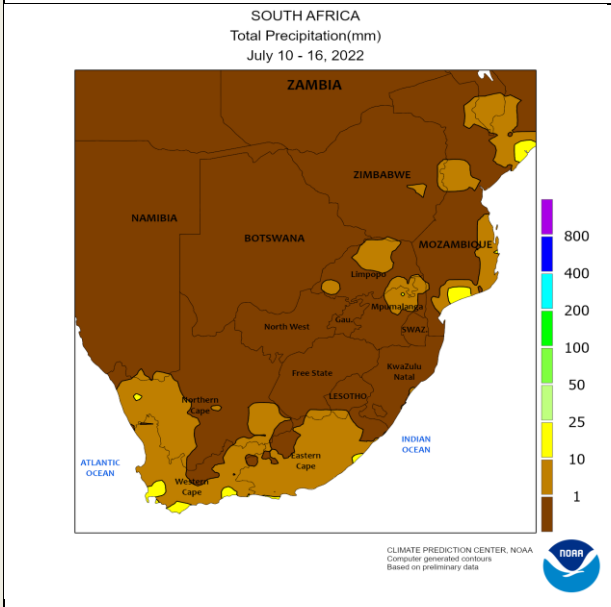
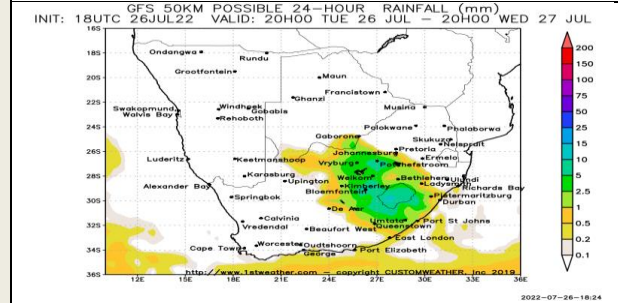
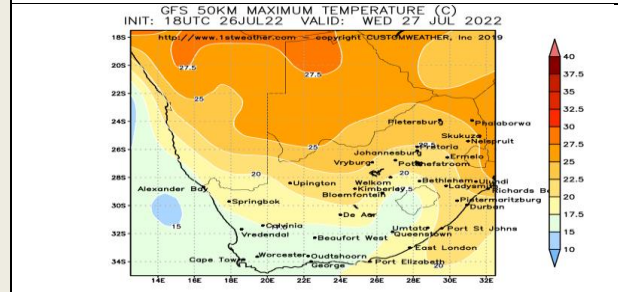
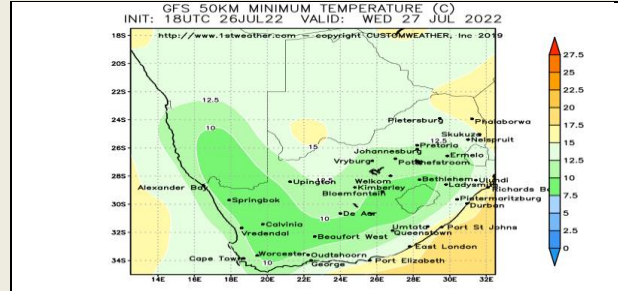


# **Weather Report**

# South Africa - Weather

Western and central South Africa will see periods of light and erratic rain this week. The rain will be too light to significantly impact long-term soil conditions in most locations. Winter wheat prospects will still remain favorable despite the lack of significant rain. Eastern South Africa will be mostly dry. • Western Cape into central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine this week  
o Pockets in Eastern Cape and Free State will receive 0.25-1.50" of rain by next Monday morning, though most locations will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation  
• The remaining production areas in South Africa will be mostly dry this week  
o Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation  
• The eastern half of South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine August 2 – 8  
o Western South Africa will be mostly dry

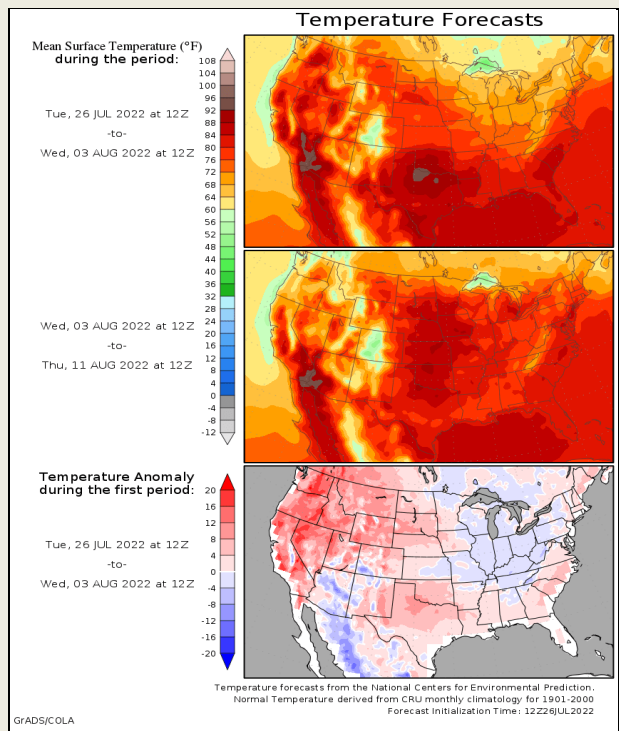
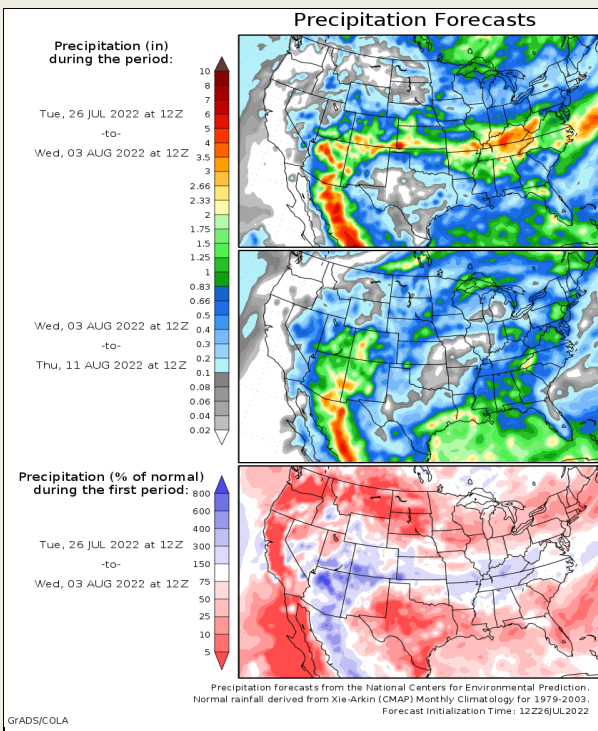
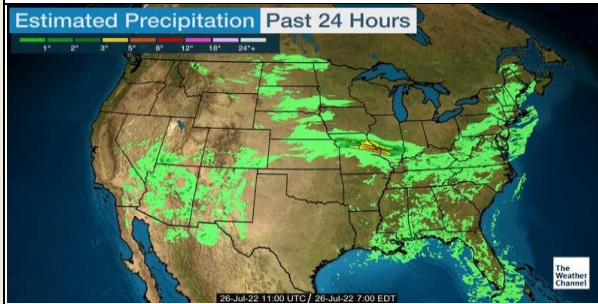
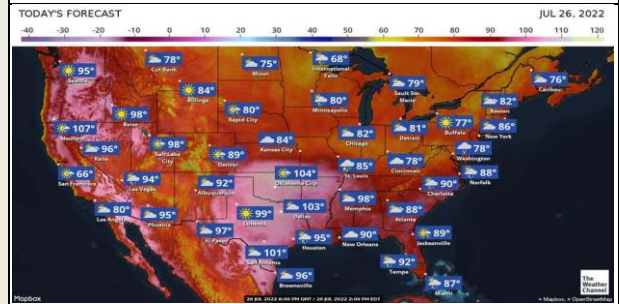
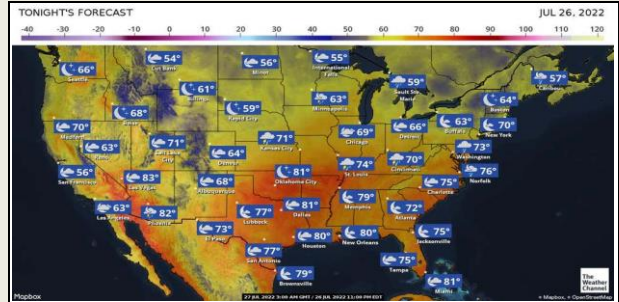


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# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** Regular rain in the lower Midwest through Thursday along with mild temperatures through this weekend across the Midwest will temporarily improve conditions for crops in the drier areas in the south while maintaining favorable conditions for crops in most other areas with exceptions detailed below. Southeastern South Dakota and southwestern Minnesota to east-central Nebraska and much of western into central Iowa missed out on significant rain during the weekend and much of this week's rain of significance will fall to the south of the region.

**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** Little to no rain and warm to hot temperatures into Thursday from the Delta to northern Alabama will lead to a further degradation of crop conditions while more favorable soil moisture and some showers will support mostly favorable crop conditions elsewhere. The northern Delta through northern Alabama will benefit from moderate to locally heavy rain Thursday through Sunday and at least temporary improvements in conditions for crops will result while most other areas benefit from lighter rain.



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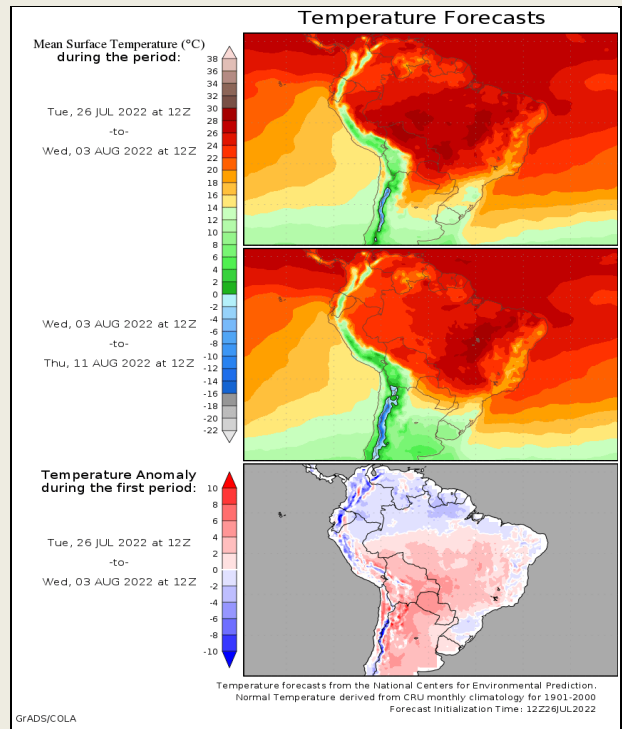
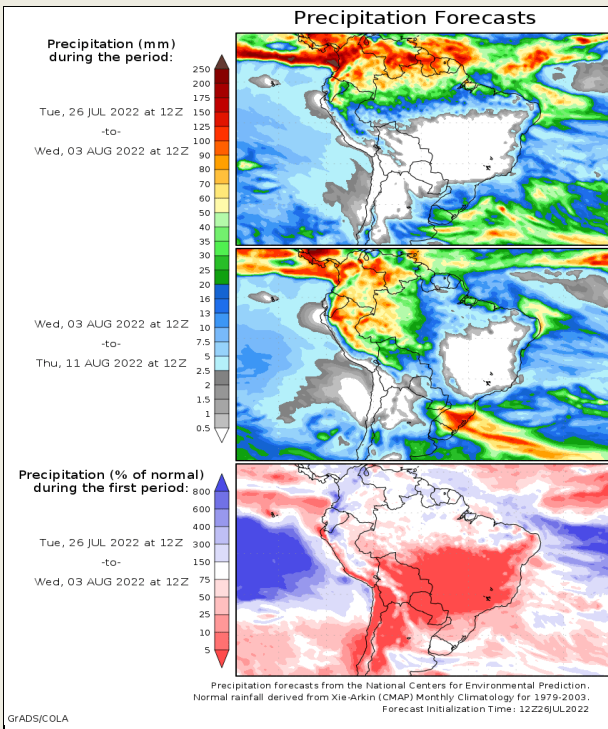
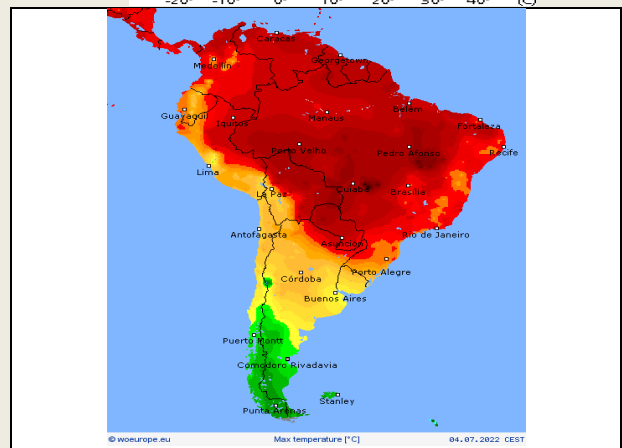
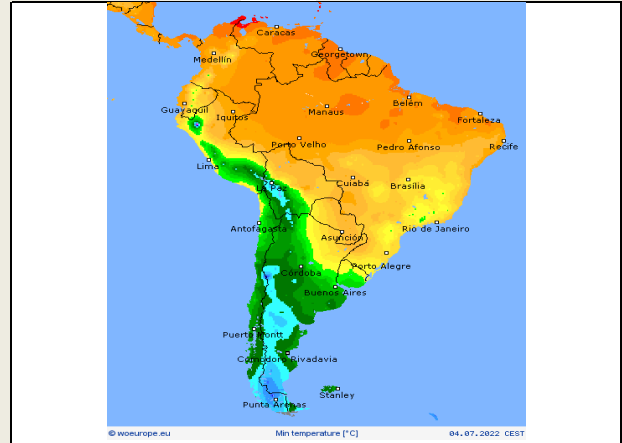
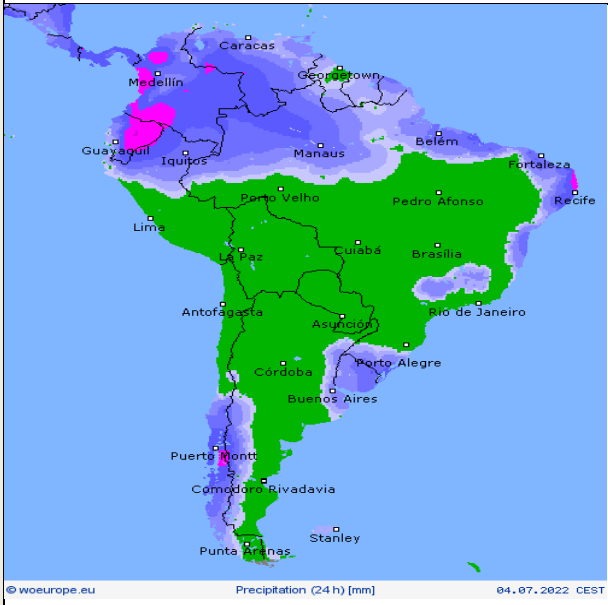
# South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks with occasional rounds of rain in southern Paraguay and southern Brazil where temporary interruptions to fieldwork will result while regular rounds of light showers occur in eastern Bahia.

o Rain will be greatest in the south today, Thursday into next Friday, and Aug. 1-3.

**ARGENTINA:** Dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork will occur through much of the next two weeks with a few rounds of showers and thunderstorms that will favor southern and eastern areas. Western Argentina will remain in need of rain to improve conditions for winter wheat. Some of the drier areas in central and southern Cordoba will benefit from light rain Sunday into Wednesday with improvements in soil and winter crop conditions likely temporary. Parts of northern Santa Fe to southern Corrientes will receive up to 0.75" of rain and locally more today. Rain will increase in the south Sunday and will spread into eastern areas Monday into Wednesday.

o La Pampa into Buenos Aires will be wettest and will receive 0.30-1.30" of rain and locally more with lighter rain in the remainder of eastern Argentina and in portions of central and southern Cordoba and San Luis.

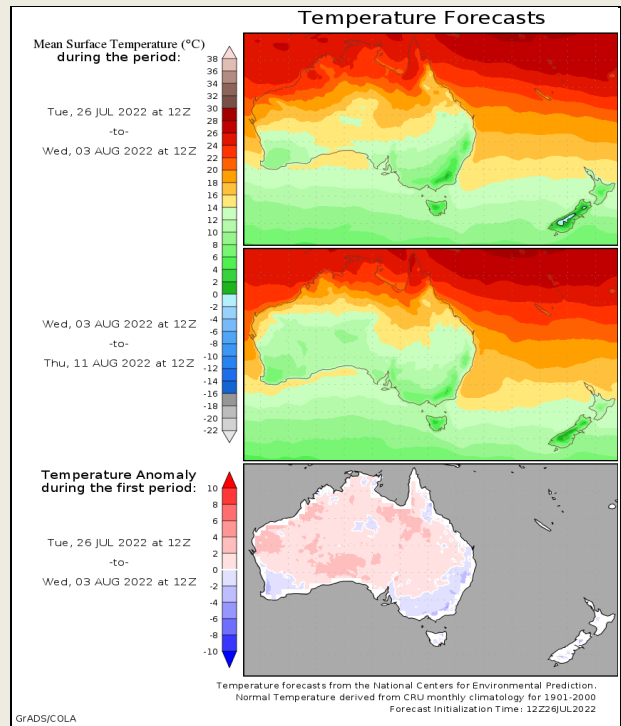
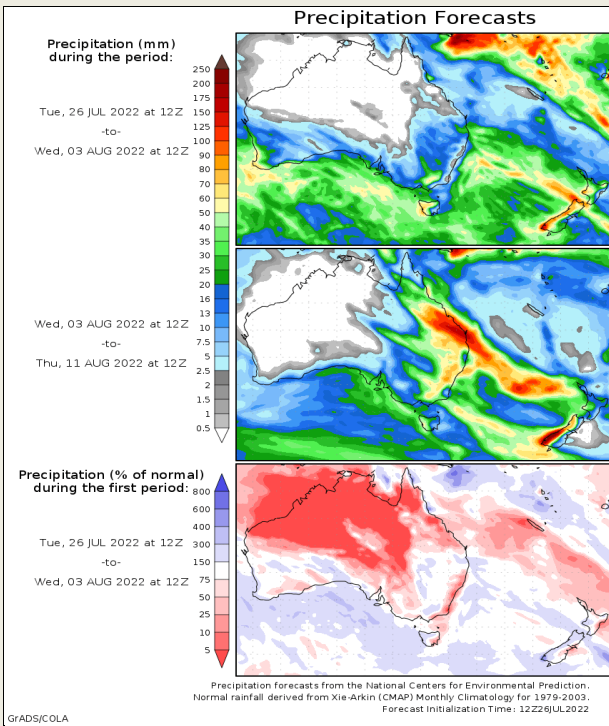
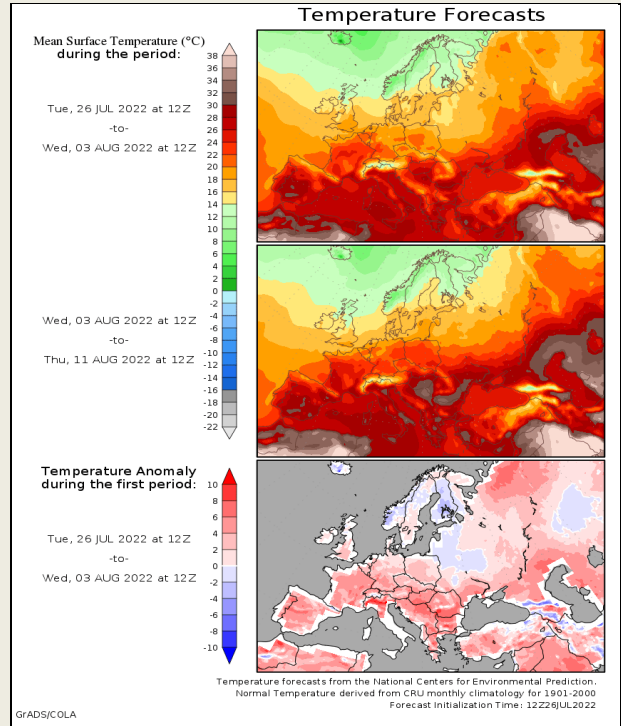
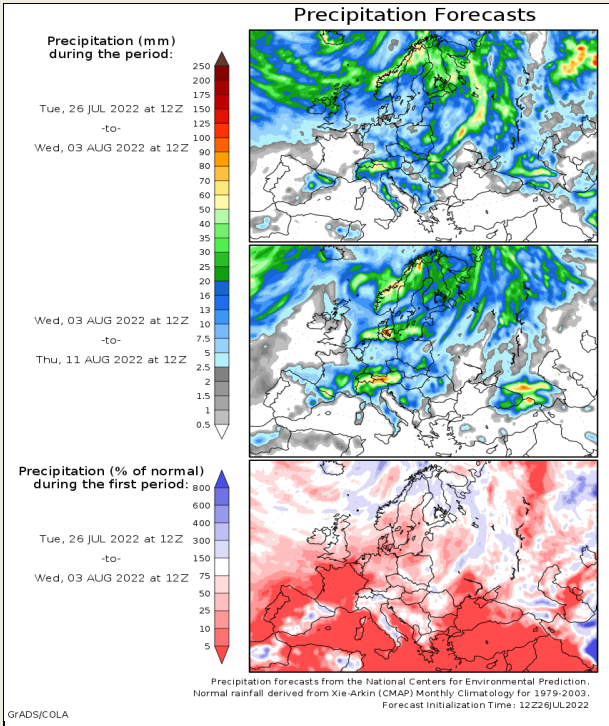


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## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

**EUROPE:** Temperatures this week will still be above average in most of the region; though, not quite as extreme as the previous week, particularly in northern Europe. Today will be hot again in the north, but then some needed cooling will occur. Erratic shower and thunderstorm activity will occur in both northern and southern Europe; though, it will be difficult for this to counter evaporation outside of a few localized areas.

**AUSTRALIA:** Wheat, barley and canola are expected to be well established prior to spring this year. Soil moisture has recently increased from Queensland into eastern New South Wales benefiting wheat, barley and canola areas that had been a little dry previously. Now, the only drier biased areas in the nation area in minor crop areas of South Australia where some showers may evolve briefly in the coming week.



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
