

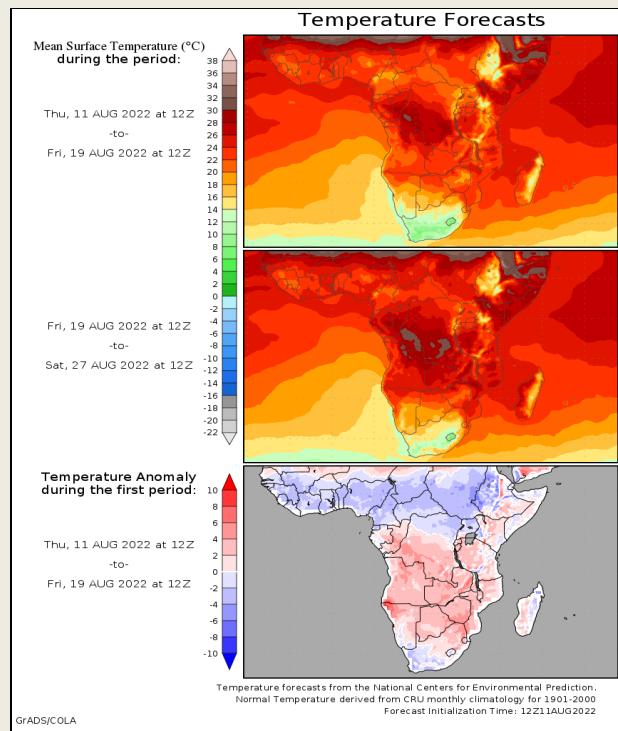
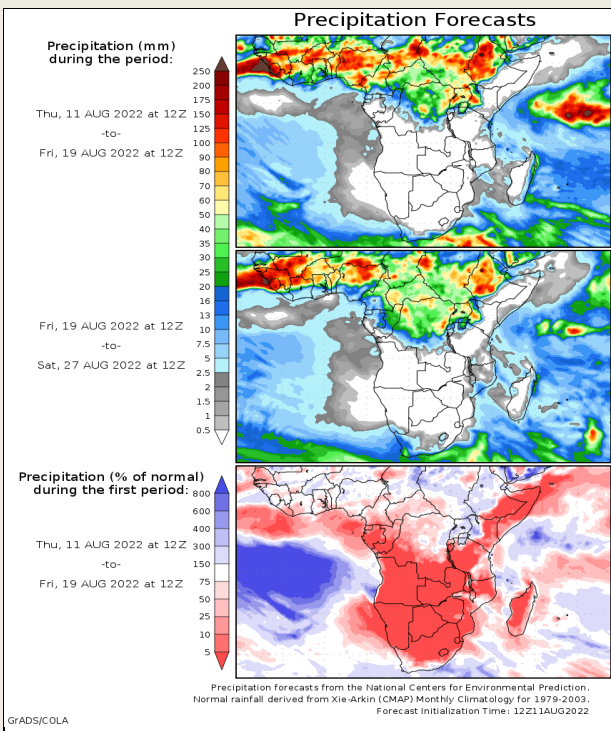
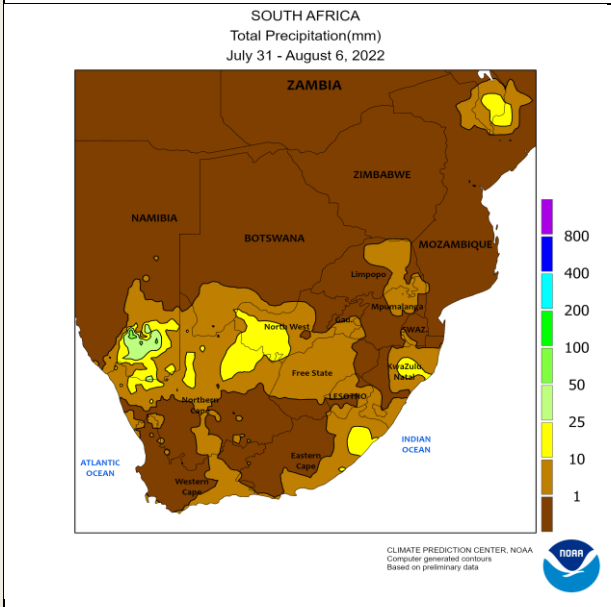
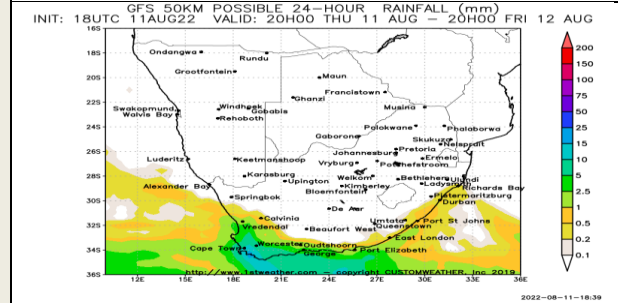
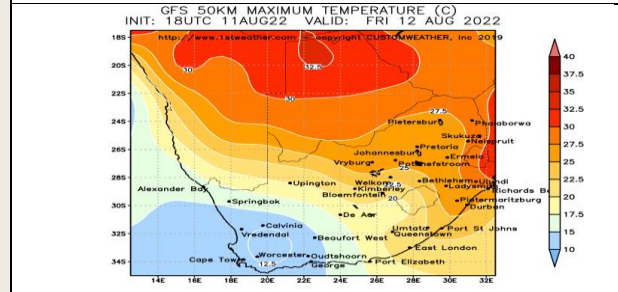
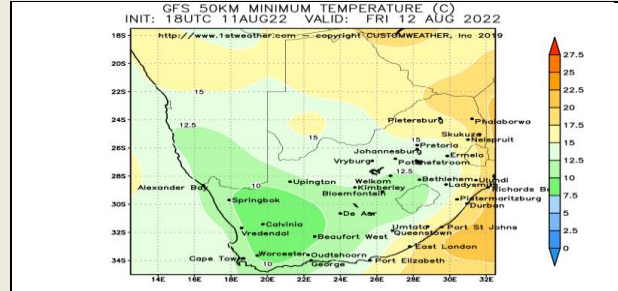


Weather Report

12 August 2022

South Africa - Weather

Western Cape and Eastern Cape will see periods of rain during the coming week. The rain will be beneficial for Western Cape's winter wheat areas despite most locations not receiving enough rain to significantly improve the moisture profile. The remaining locations in South Africa will be mostly dry during the coming week. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable in Western Cape, Free State, and neighboring areas despite the lack of rain. • Drier than normal conditions will persist for much of South Africa during the coming week o Light rain will still be scattered across portions of Western Cape, Eastern Cape, Natal, and neighboring areas as a frontal boundary advances over the region Thursday into this weekend
 ☒ A few isolated showers will also be possible in these areas next week
 o Southwestern Western Cape will receive 0.75-2.00" of rain and locally greater amounts by next Thursday morning
 • Rainfall in most other locations will be too light to counter evaporation
 • South Africa will remain drier biased August 19 – 25
 o Periods of light rain will still be possible in southern South Africa

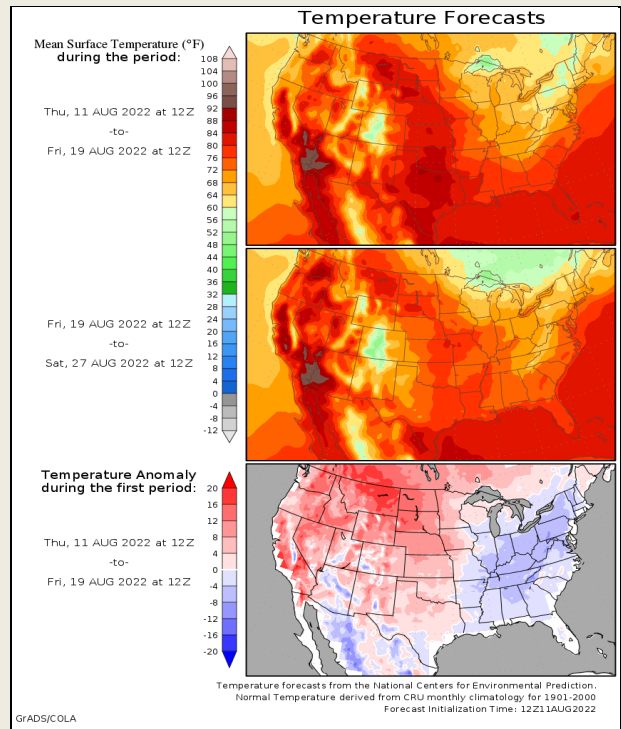
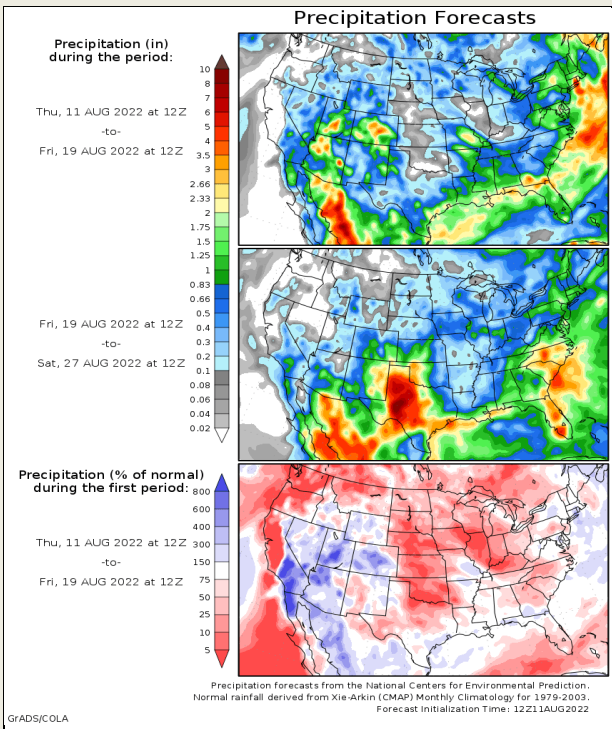
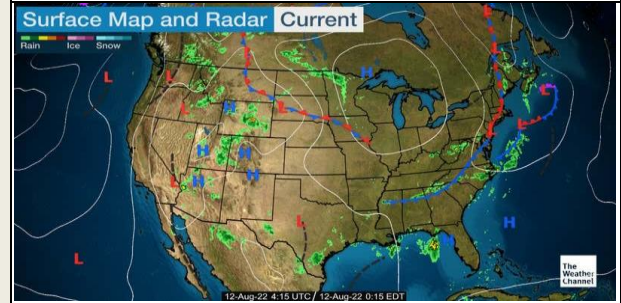
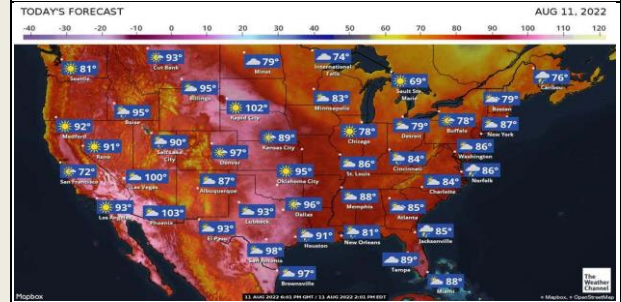
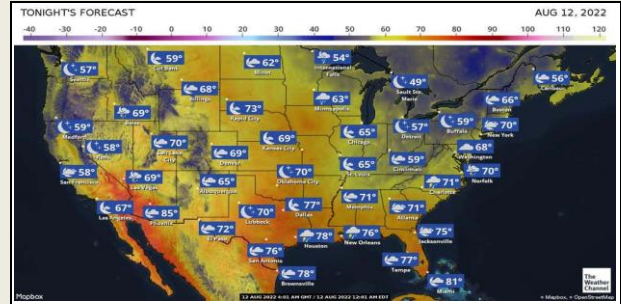
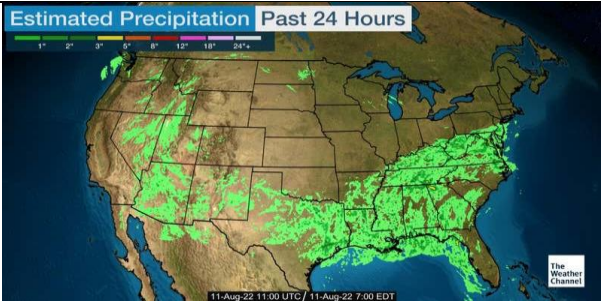


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: A drier-biased weather pattern will occur through the next two weeks, but adequate to favorable soil moisture in much of the Midwest along with mild temperatures in much of the region through at least the next ten days should keep crop conditions favorable and yield potentials high with some notable exceptions detailed below. Much of the Midwest will receive at least some rain during the next two weeks that will buy crops more time before rain is needed to prevent significant increases in crop stress, but much of the region will dry down overall and many areas will need greater rain later this month to keep production potentials high.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Outside of the northern Delta, additional rain will fall on much of the region by Friday leaving nearly all of the Delta and the Southeast with improved to favorable crop conditions with some exceptions where hot and dry weather in July caused permanent crop damage. A drier-biased weather pattern will occur Saturday through Aug. 25 and stress to crops may eventually increase in pockets that miss out on significant rain this week while most areas will have enough soil moisture to prevent serious crop stress.



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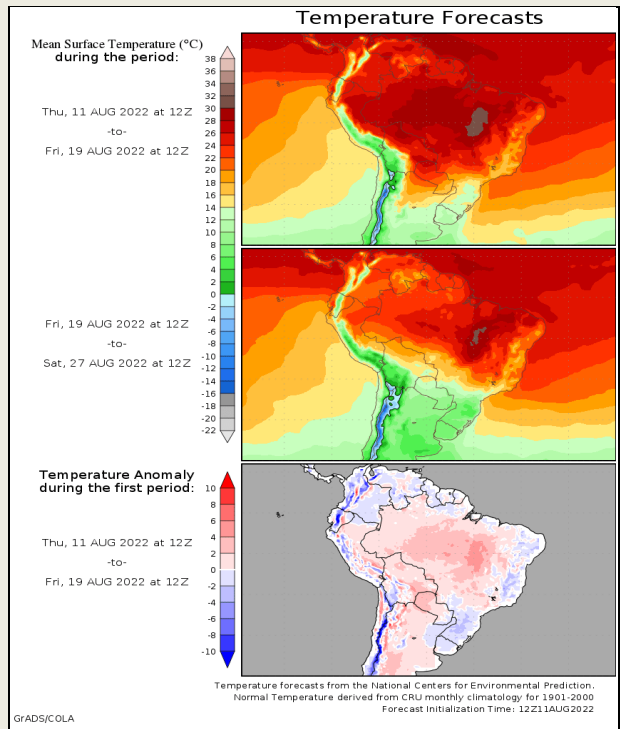
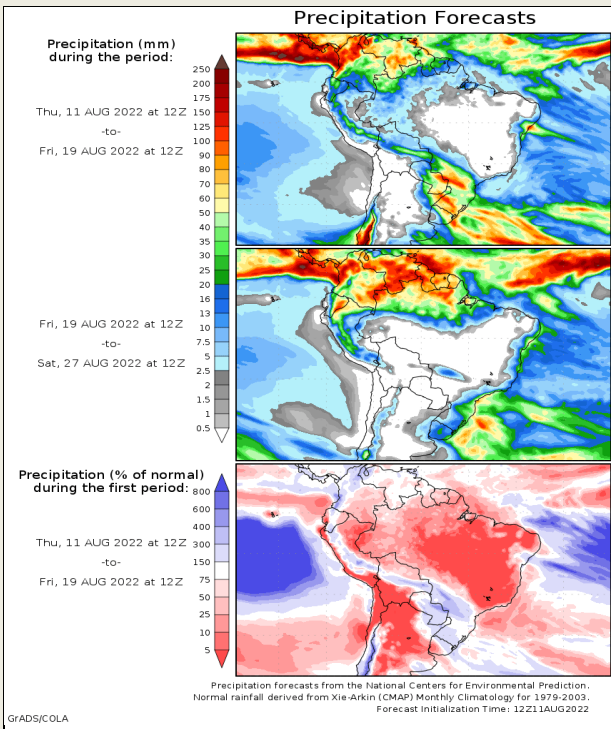
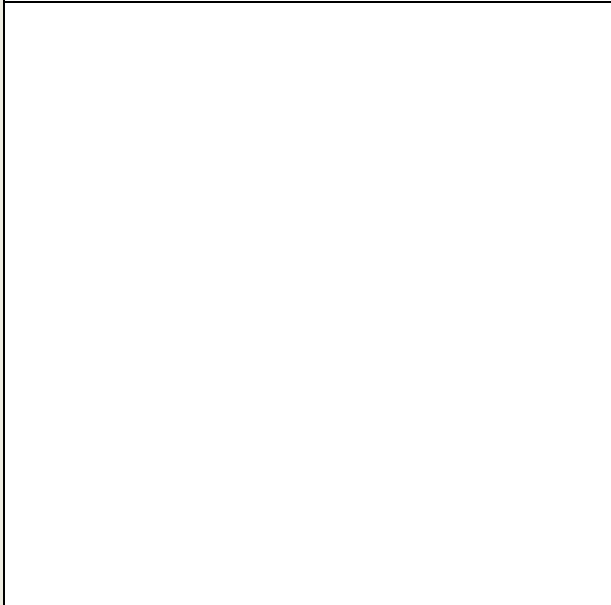
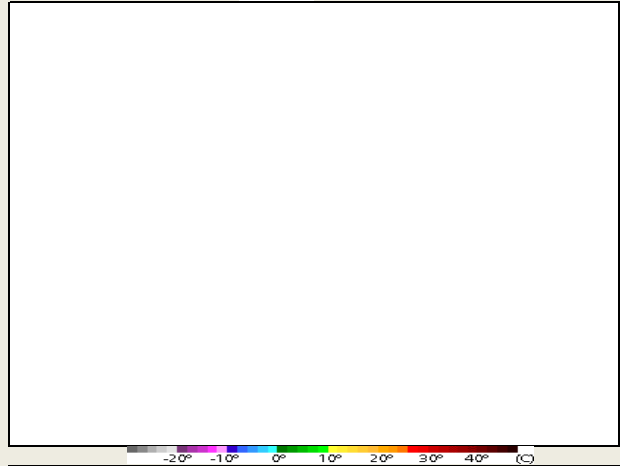
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Little rain is expected through Saturday allowing for fieldwork to resume in many areas before another period of showers and thunderstorms occur Sunday into next week.

- o Rain Sunday into next week will fall heavily in some areas from central Paraguay to Parana where the increases in soil moisture that result will be good for the summer crop planting season. Drier weather Aug. 20-25 should allow fieldwork to increase in southern Brazil and southern Paraguay.

ARGENTINA: A drier weather pattern will occur during the next two weeks and the drier areas in northwestern Argentina will be left of greater rain to improve conditions for winter crops while the remainder of western Argentina will soon dry out again and will need rain soon to maintain any improvements in crop conditions that resulted from recent rain.

- o Showers will occur today and again Sunday into Thursday of next week with the resulting rain mostly light and favoring eastern Argentina.

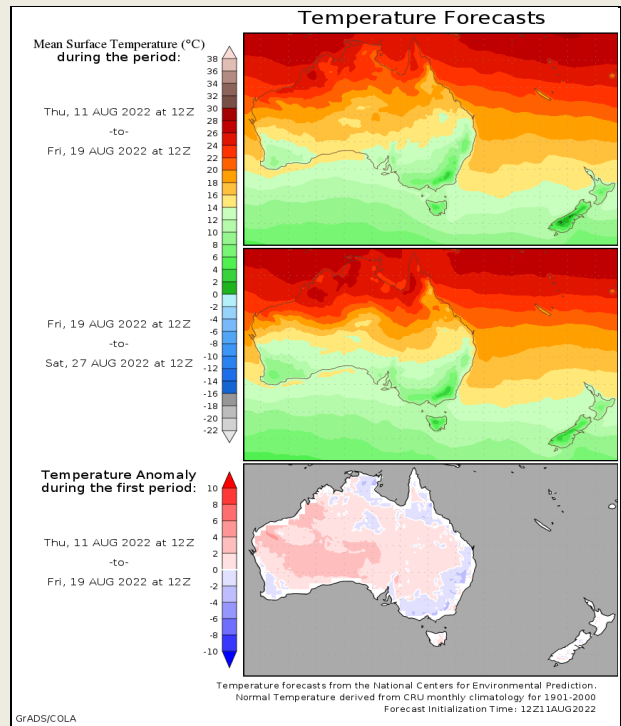
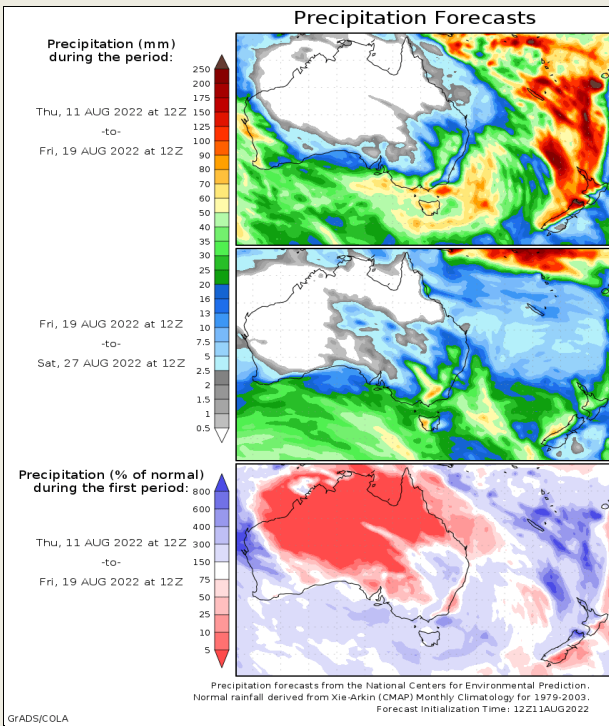
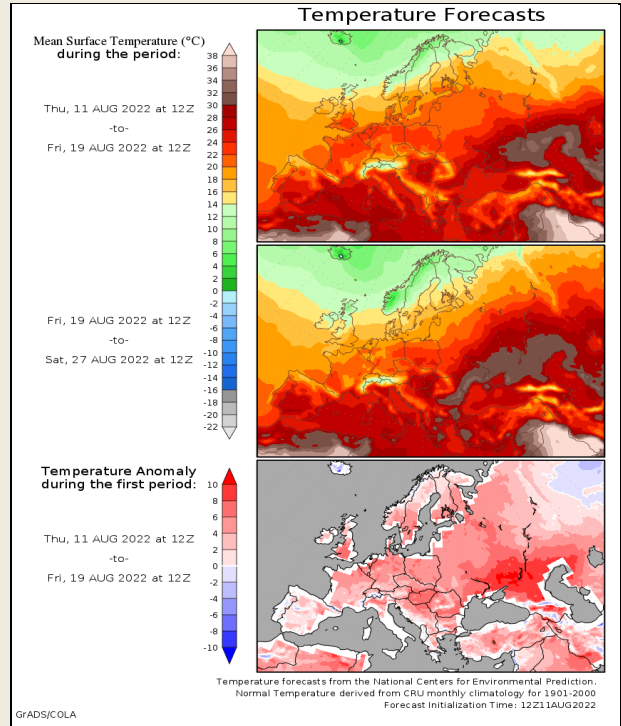
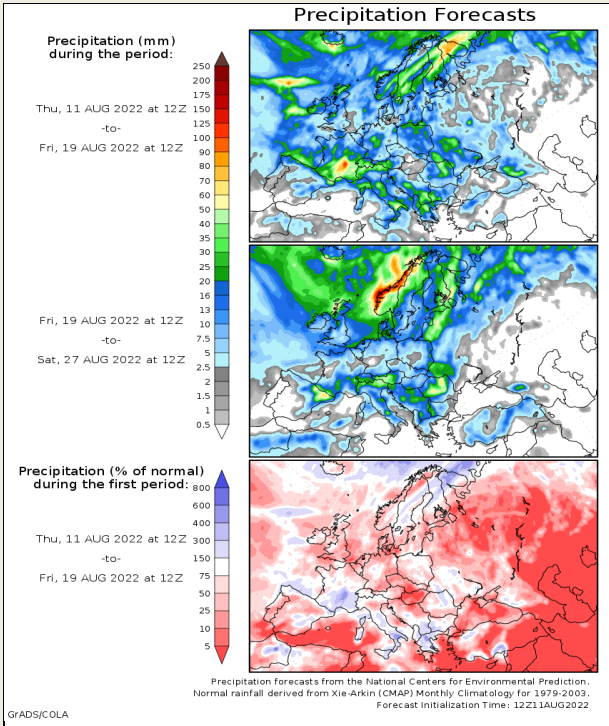


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Drought continues quite serious for large parts of Europe especially in France, the United Kingdom and parts of Germany. Some scattered showers and thunderstorms will evolve next week that may induce some localized areas of improved topsoil, but much more rain will be needed to change the status of drought or alter summer crop production potential. Temperatures will be above to well above average and this will keep evaporation rates high. Cooler and wetter conditions continue to be needed.

AUSTRALIA: Favorable conditions will still continue the next two weeks. Enough rain will occur to satisfy the needs of most crops and enough dry time between rain events is expected for favorable fieldwork advancement.



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
