

# Weather Report 18 August 2022




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
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
#### South Africa - Weather


Western Cape and neighboring areas in Eastern Cape and Northern Cape will see periods of erratic rain in the coming days as a frontal boundary advances over the region. Rainfall will be too light to significantly improve the moisture profile, though winter wheat prospects will remain good in Wester Cape. The remaining winter wheat areas in Northern Cape and Free State will remain mostly dry. Wheat prospects are still favorable despite the lack of rain. • A frontal boundary will bring rain to Western Cape, Eastern Cape, and immediate neighboring areas today into Friday o Dry weather will evolve this weekend and early next week

- o Moisture totals by next Tuesday morning will range from 0.25-1.50" with local amounts of 2.00" or more in southern Western Cape
- The remaining locations in South Africa will be dry or mostly dry during the coming week o Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation
- South Africa will generally be drier biased August 24 30
- o However, periods of light rain will be possible in western and southern South Africa









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
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
#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will continue to see favorable conditions for crops through the next two weeks while the driest areas from southeastern South Dakota and eastern Nebraska through western and southern Iowa and Missouri will benefit from additional and important rain today and Aug. 25-27. Nearly all of the Midwest will see multiple rounds of rain during the next two weeks along with a lack of heat for at least ten days while soil moisture in place today is adequate to favorable in most areas. The driest areas from eastern Nebraska and southeastern South Dakota to Missouri should have received enough rain by tonight to induce improvements in crop conditions and laterplanted crops should see notable improvements in yield potentials.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms will impact the Delta and the Southeast during the next two weeks and the driest areas will benefit from the precipitation and should see improvements in yield potentials while conditions for most other crops will remain favorable.









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
#### **South America - Weather**


BRAZIL: Rain will increase today into Thursday and will fall heavily in some areas from central Paragua' and west-central Mato Grosso do Sul to Parana and Santa Catarina where the increases in soil moisture that result will be good for the summer crop planting season while lighter rain falls on the remainder of southern Brazil.


o Drier weather Friday through Aug. 29 should allow fieldwork to increase in southern Brazil and Paraguay.


ARGENTINA: A restricted rainfall pattern will occur during most of the next two weeks and the drier areas in northwestern Argentina will be left in need of rain to improve conditions for winter crops while the remainder of western Argentina will soon dry out again and will need rain to maintain any improvements in crop conditions that resulted from recent rain.

o Showers will occur into Wednesday with the resulting rain mostly light and favoring eastern Argentina.









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
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
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
## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Enough rain is still expected in the next seven days to provide some needed relief to the region. Some significant rain will fall in central areas and may lead to localized flooding, although the greatest rain may be in and near the Alps. Many areas will continue to be drier-biased resulting in an ongoing need for more generalized significant rain. Temperatures will also be trending cooler temporarily into the weekend. Concern remains for a drier botter nature neturing in the second week of the outlook though

AUSTRALIA: Mostly favorable conditions will continue in the first week of the outlook; though, some drier weather may still be needed in southwestern Western Australia where rainfall could be enough to cause some fieldwork delays. Some of the greatest rain will occur in this part of the region; however, drier weather is expected after Wednesday. New South Wales and especially Queensland will be drier in the first week compared to last week.









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
