

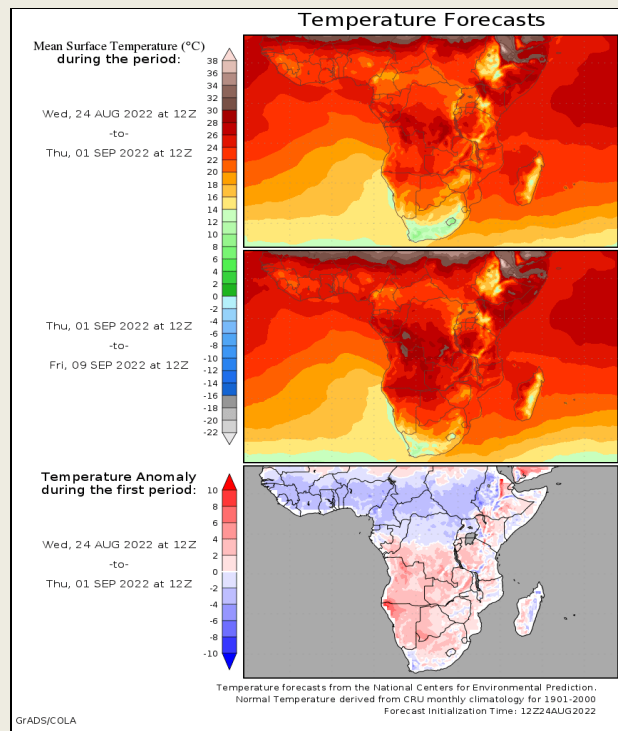
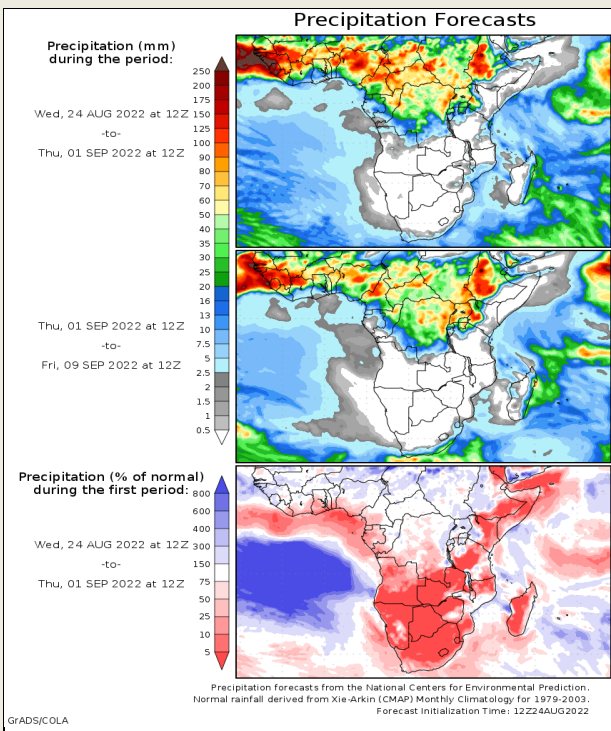
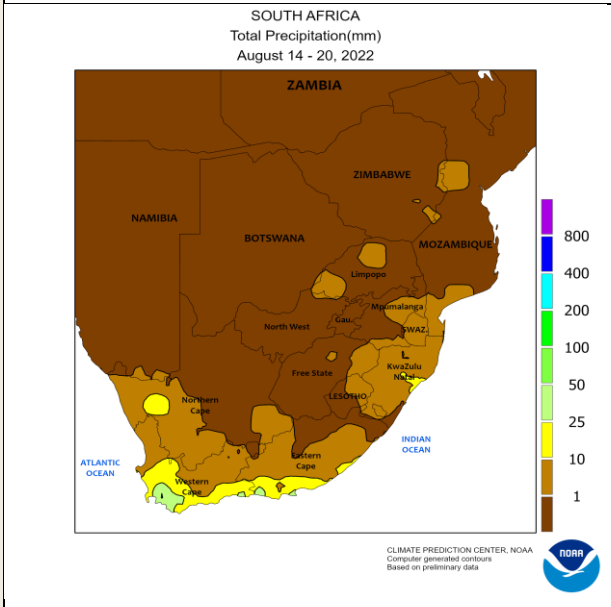
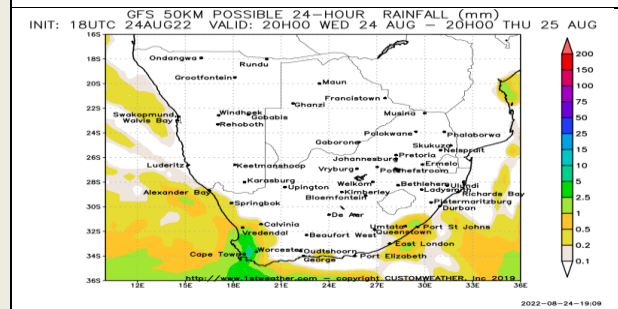
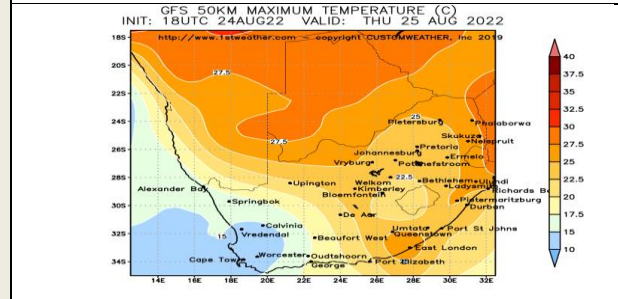
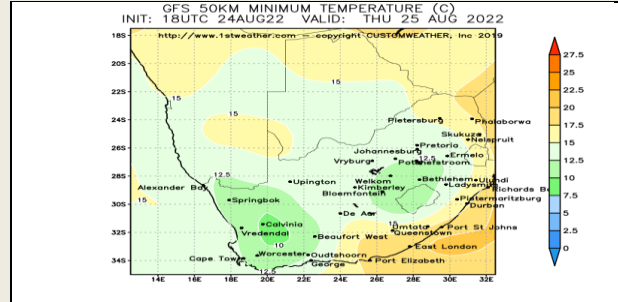


Weather Report

25 August 2022

South Africa - Weather

South Africa will remain drier biased during the coming week. The periods of light rain that evolve in the south will generally be lost to evaporation. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable in Western Cape, Northern Cape, and Free State; though a good soaking of rain would be welcome late this month into September. • South Africa will be mostly dry during the coming week
o Periods of light rain will still occur near the western and southern coastlines late Wednesday into early next week, though resulting rainfall will generally be lost to evaporation
• South Africa will again be drier biased August 31 – September 6
o However, periods of light rain will be possible, most notably in western and southern South Africa



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United States of America - Weather

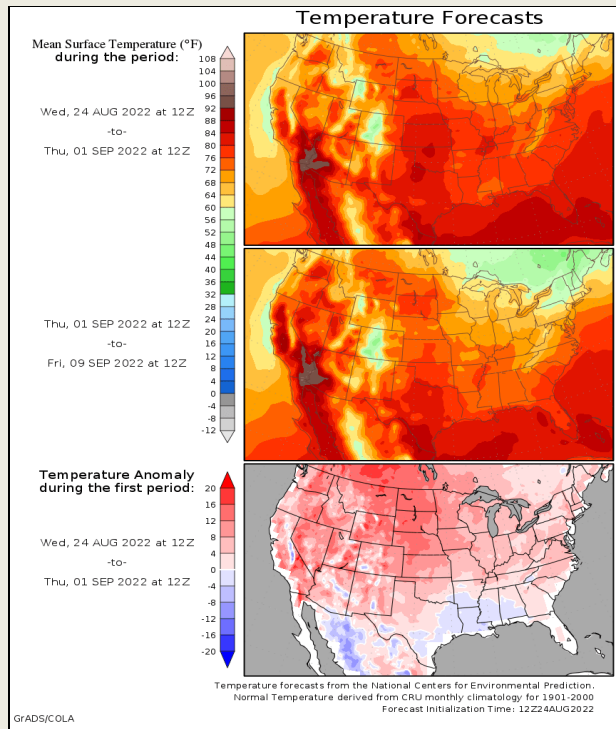
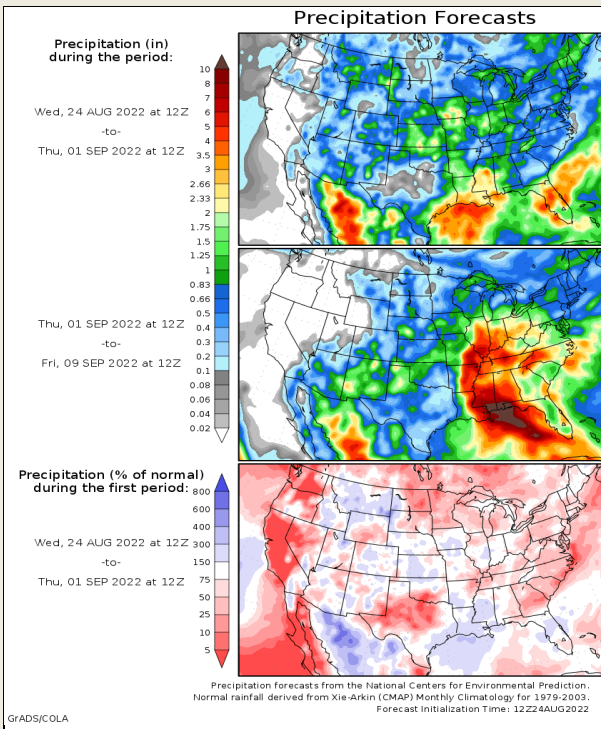
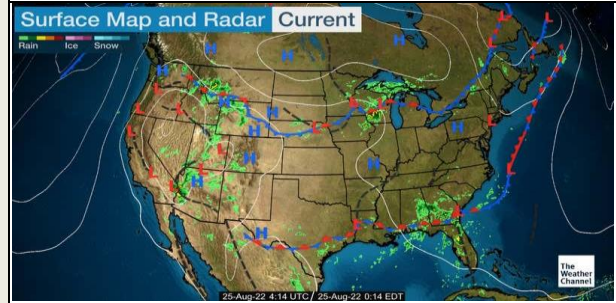
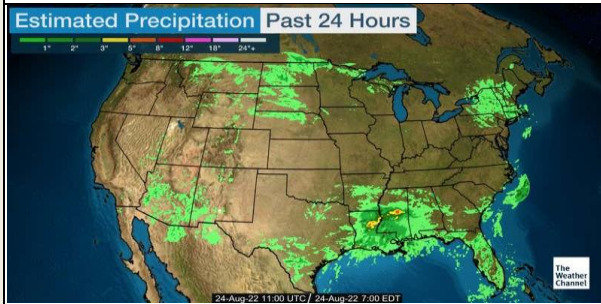
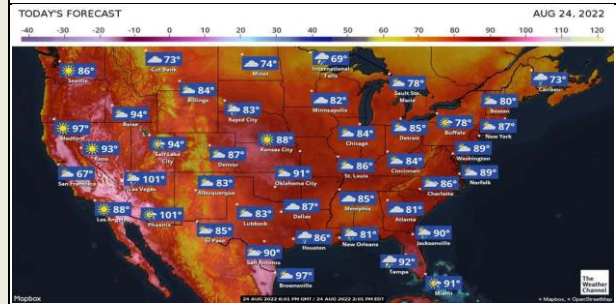
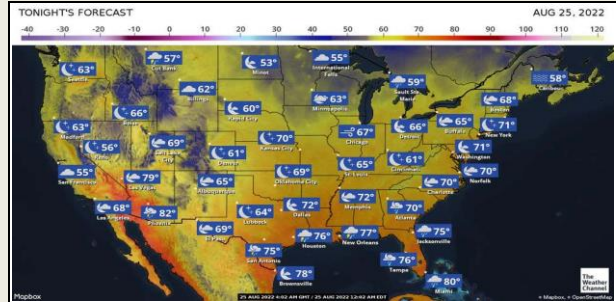
U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will continue to see favorable conditions for crops through the next two weeks with rain advertised for this weekend into next week important to crops in the driest areas from southeastern South Dakota and eastern Nebraska through western Iowa, eastern Kansas, Missouri, and southern Illinois.

A lack of heat for at least the next ten days along with adequate to favorable soil moisture and multiple rounds of rain in much of the Corn Belt should keep soil conditions favorable in much of the region.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Heavy rain and some flooding will occur into Thursday from the central and southern Delta to the southern half of Mississippi while lighter rain will fall on surrounding areas into central Georgia. Some low-lying crops may be damaged by flooding while the moisture will induce largely beneficial increases in soil moisture.

- Scattered showers in the Delta and the Southeast Friday through Sep. 2 will keep conditions too wet for fieldwork in parts of the region that sees heavy rain into Thursday while fieldwork should advance around the precipitation elsewhere.

- Sep. 3-6 should be drier and conditions for fieldwork will improve.



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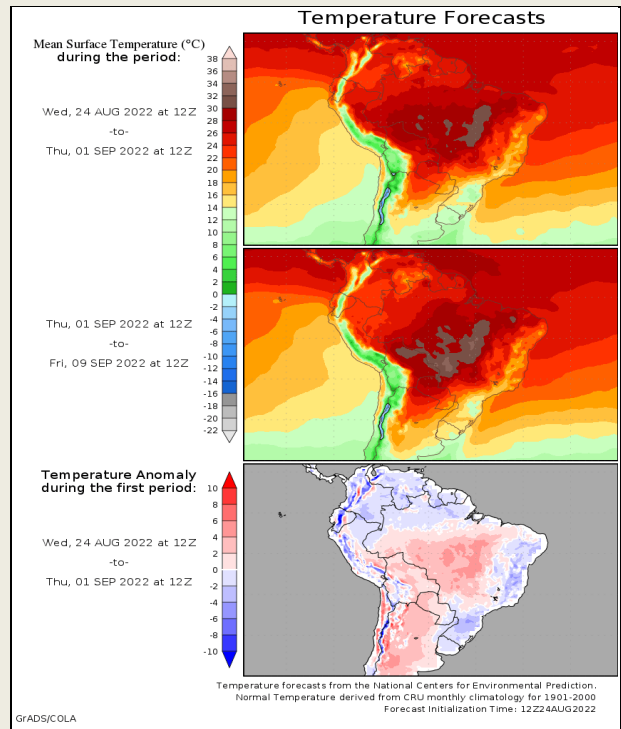
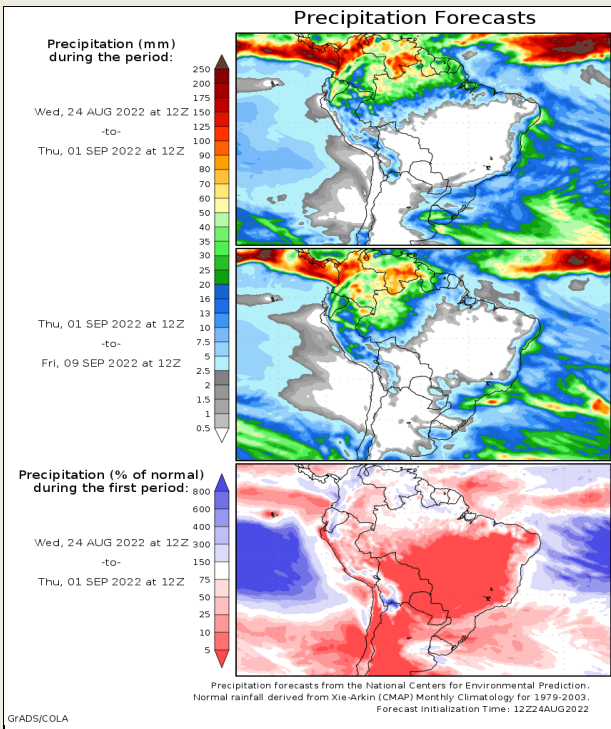
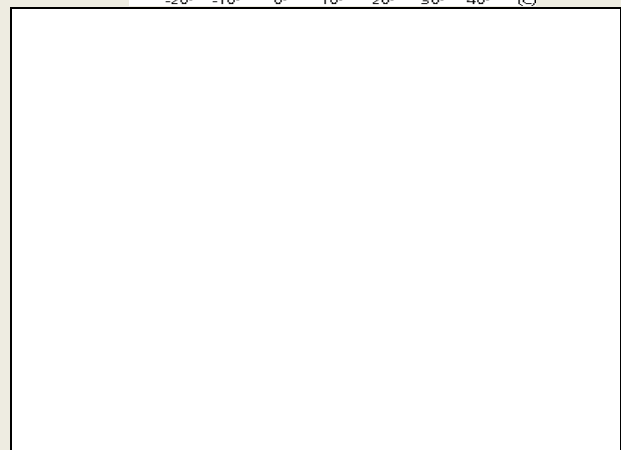
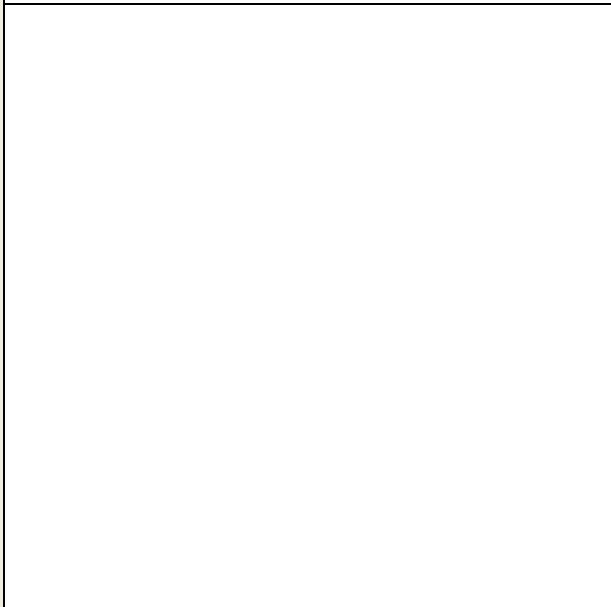
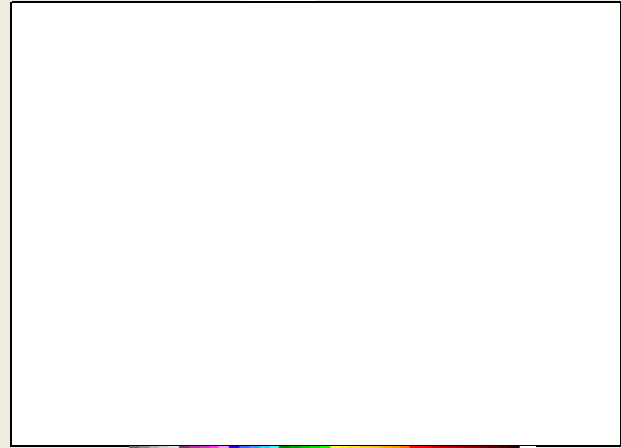
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks and fieldwork should advance well overall with some temporary interruptions to fieldwork resulting from occasional rounds of showers and thunderstorms in Paraguay and southern Brazil.

- o Parts of northeastern Brazil will see light showers on occasion as well.

ARGENTINA: Two rounds of organized rain will occur during the next two week with southern, central, and eastern Argentina wettest leaving western Argentina in need of rain to improve conditions for winter crops.

- o Light rain will fall on parts of northeastern Argentina today with a few showers in central Argentina Wednesday.
- o Rain will increase Thursday through Saturday when central and southern Santa Fe to Entre Rios is wettest and sees totals of 0.50-1.75" and locally more.
- o Lighter rain will surround the region and extend into Corrientes while little rain falls elsewhere.
- o Showers and thunderstorms will return Sep. 1-2 when southern and eastern Argentina is wettest.

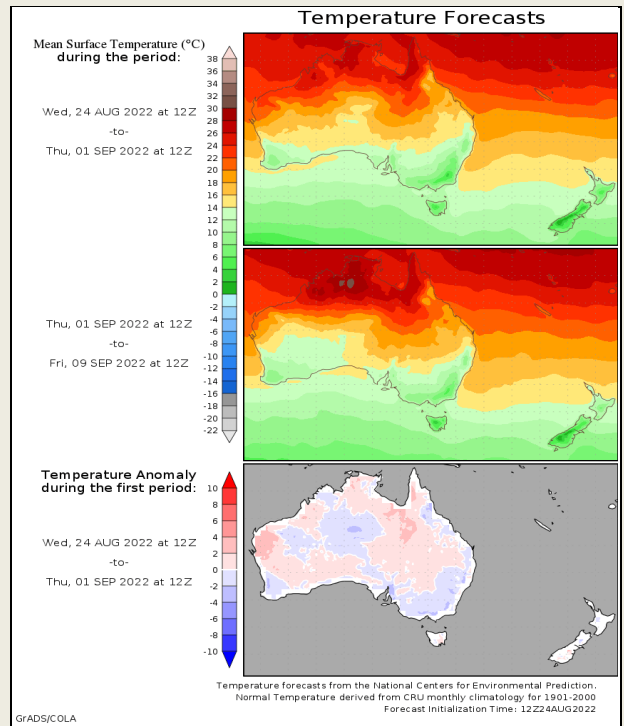
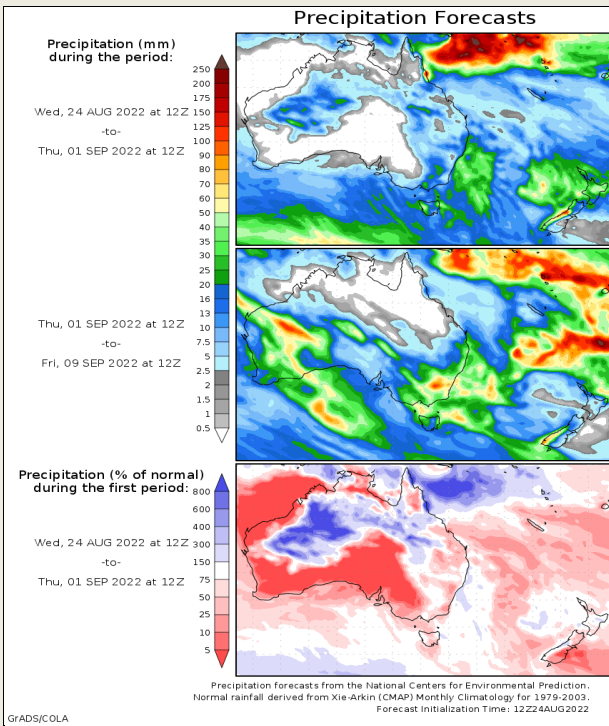
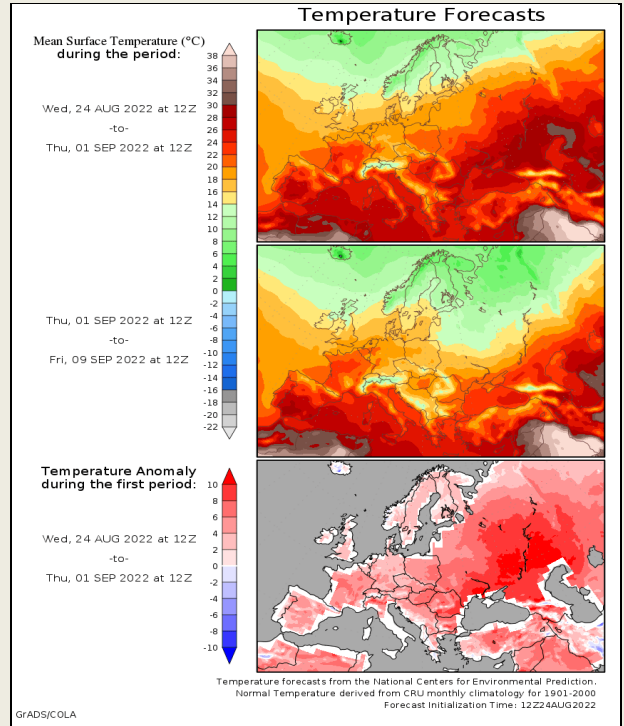
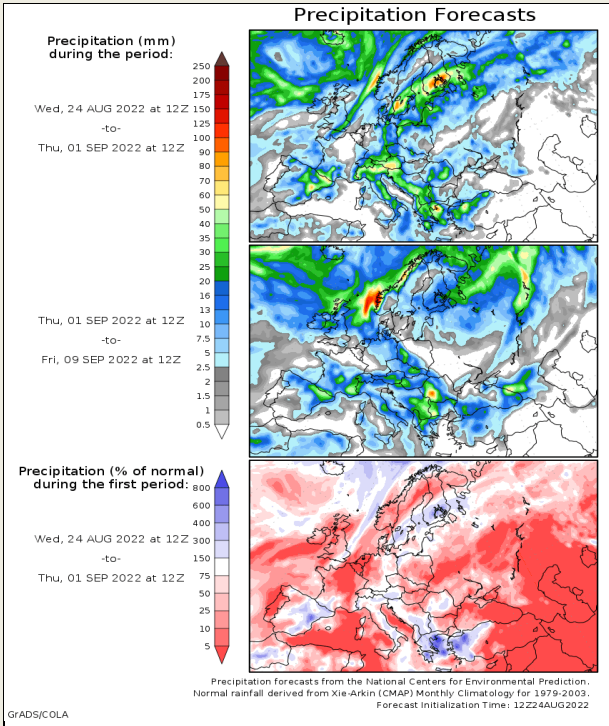


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Concerns of dryness remain for the next two weeks even though there will be portions of the region that receive some needed relief in the first seven days of the outlook. A trough of low pressure is slowly advancing across the region and will cause some significant rainfall into the middle of next week in Italy, areas near the Alps, portions of the Balkan Countries, and Poland. This will be enough rain to increase topsoil moisture and possibly cause some localized flooding. Areas to the west and northwest will have net drying. Drier conditions in the second week of the outlook with well above average temperatures will then likely remove any improvement that occurs in the first week and further stress crops in the dry areas of the west.

AUSTRALIA: Favorable conditions are still expected the next two weeks with alternating periods of rain showers and sunshine. Rain in the first week of the outlook will be greatest in southeastern areas such as Victoria, New South Wales, and possibly South Australia.



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
