



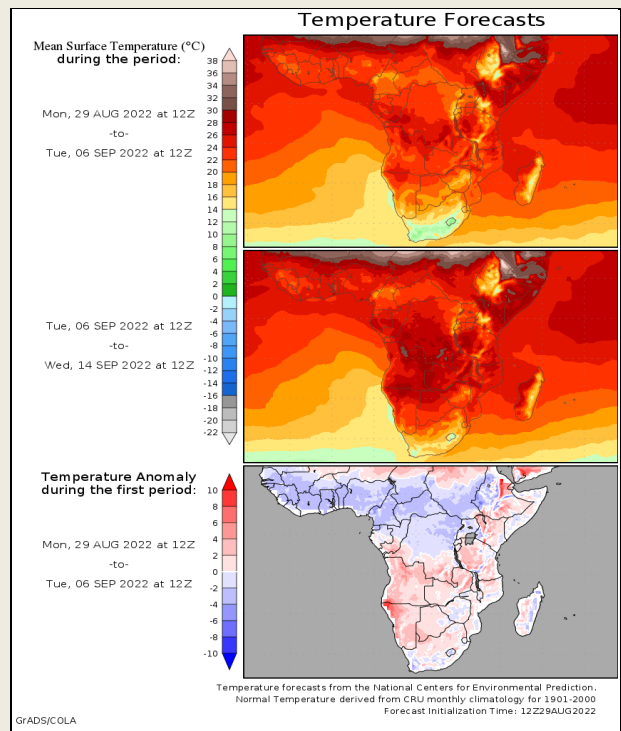
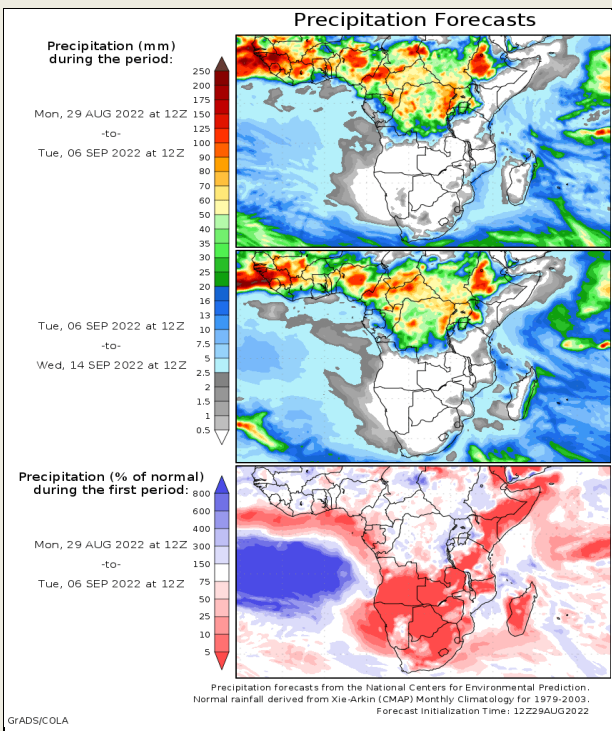
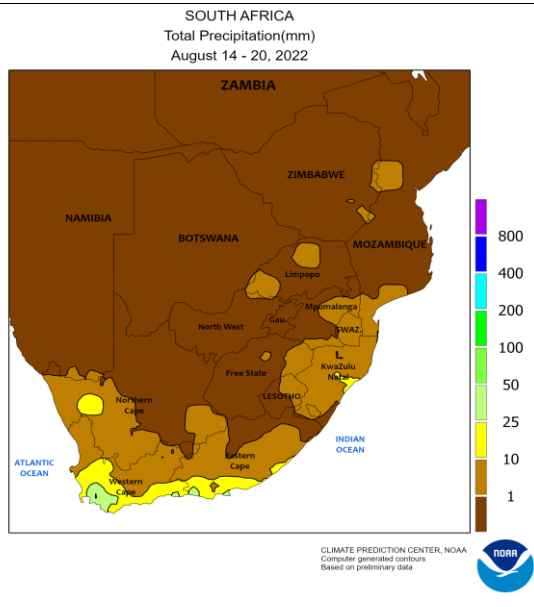
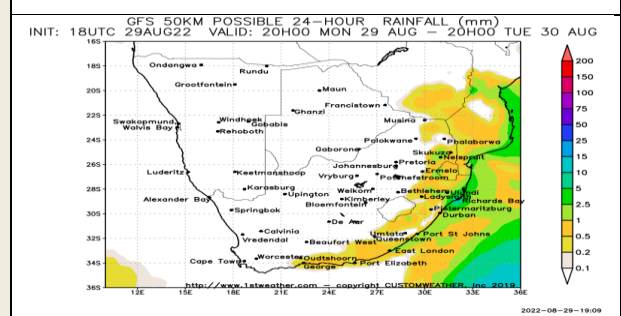
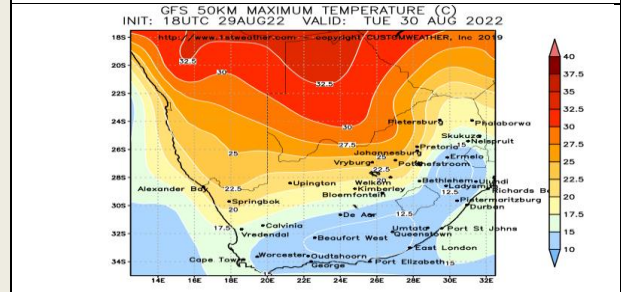
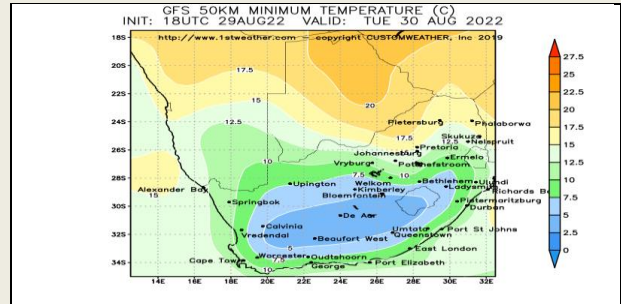
Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

South Africa will receive little to no rain this week. The rain that does occur near the western and southern coastlines will generally be lost to evaporation. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable in Western Cape, Northern Cape, and Free State, though a good soaking of rain would be welcome later in September. South Africa will be drier biased this week

- o Periods of light rain will still occur near the western and southern coastlines, most notably today and this weekend
- o A few locations in Western Cape, Eastern Cape, and southern Natal will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain and locally greater amounts by next Monday morning
- o However, most locations will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation
- o South Africa will again be drier biased September 6 – 12
- o However, periods of light rain will be possible in western and southern South Africa

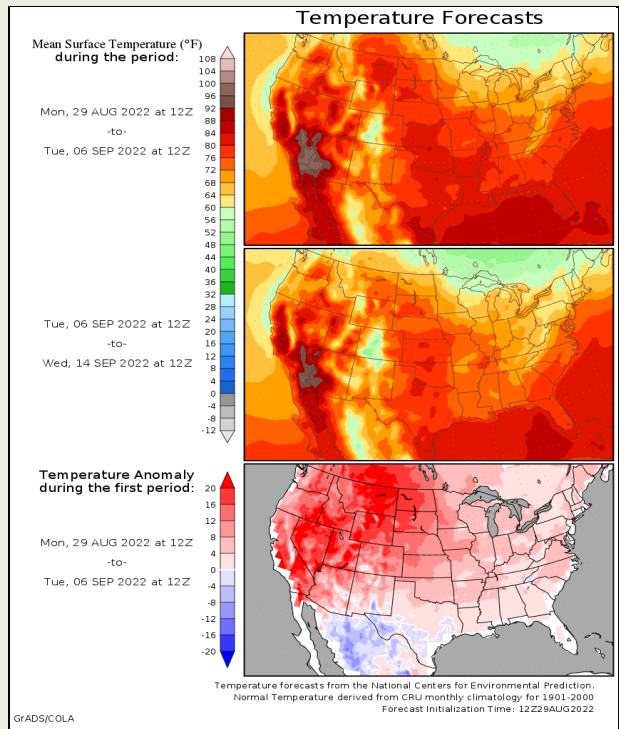
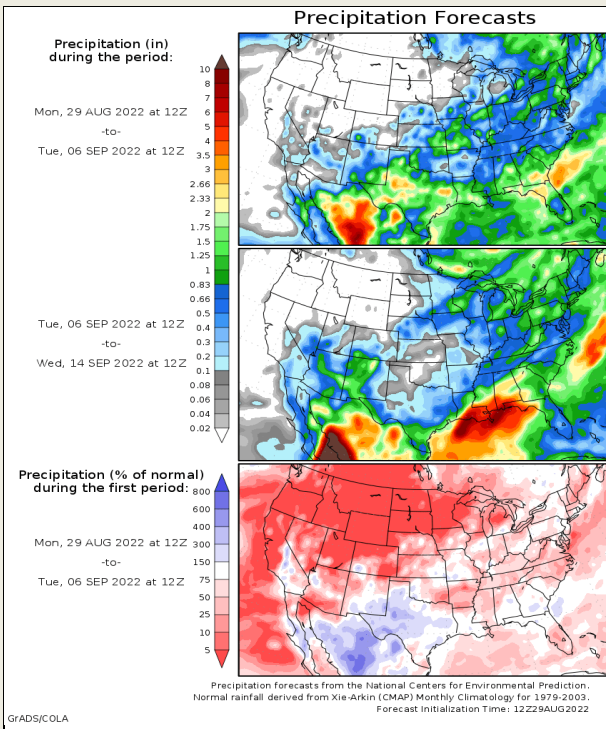
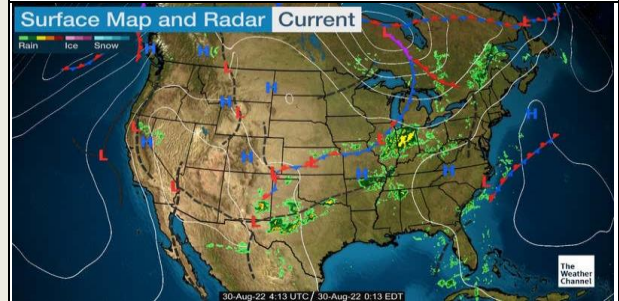
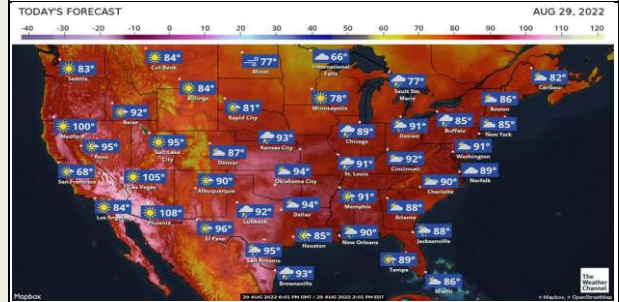
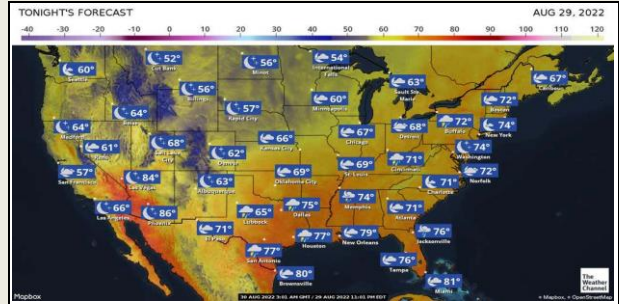
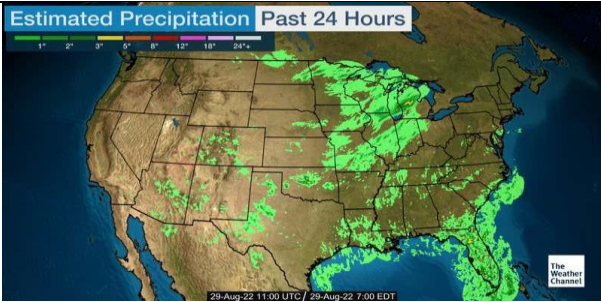


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest has adequate soil moisture in place to favorably support late crop development during the next two weeks while warm temperatures and infrequent rain will allow crop maturation to occur favorably as well. Some of the lingering dry areas in the west-central and southwestern Corn Belt likely do not have enough soil moisture to favorably support crops, but rain this late in the season would not likely have much of an impact on yields. Temperatures will be mostly warmer than normal through the middle of the next week and highs will generally be in the upper 70s and 80s with some lower 90s in west-central and southwestern areas.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta through western Alabama will see frequent rain and poor conditions for fieldwork most often through Sep. 9 and concerns over crop quality declines may increase with the wettest period expected Saturday into Tuesday of next week. Wednesday through Friday will be mostly dry and some fieldwork should advance in the drier areas. Other areas will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the next two weeks with more sunshine than rain in the Carolinas and southern Virginia where fieldwork should advance well.



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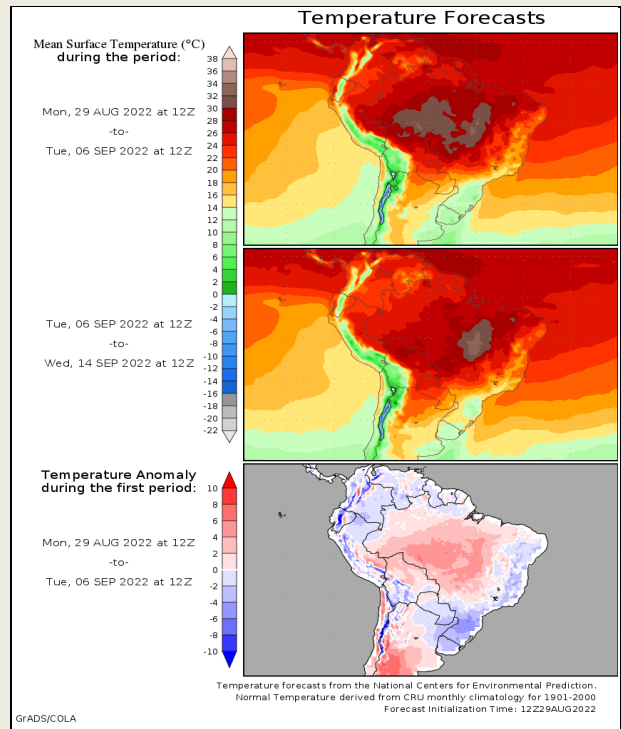
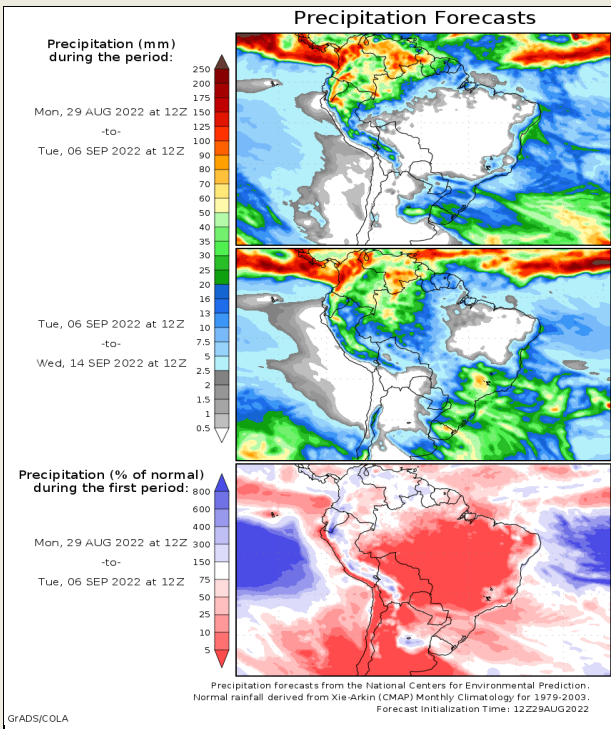
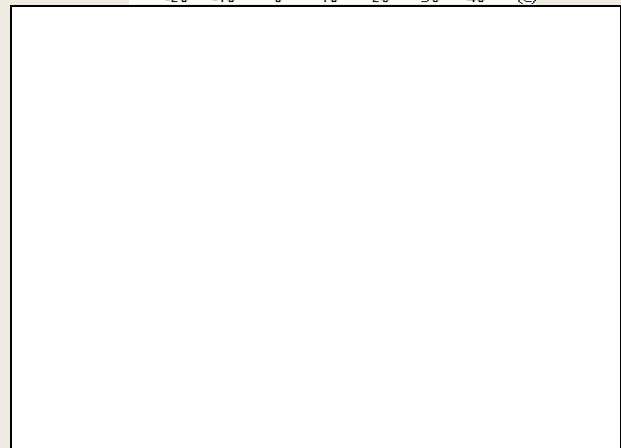
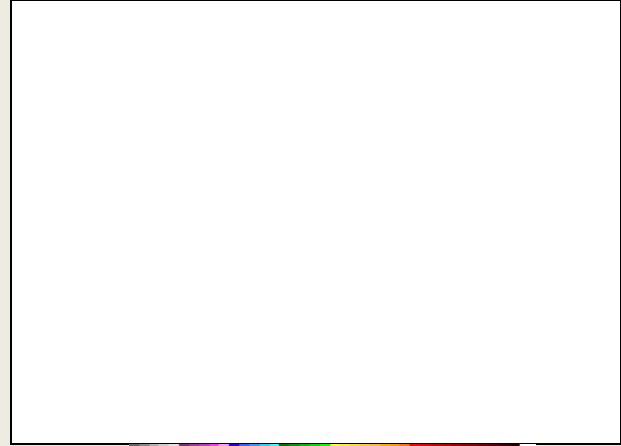
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks with occasional rounds of showers and thunderstorms in Paraguay and southern Brazil that should induce little more than temporary interruptions to fieldwork.

- o Parts of northeastern Brazil will see light showers on occasion as well.

ARGENTINA: Little rain is expected through the next two weeks in western Argentina where winter crops are in need of rain while rain will be infrequent elsewhere with central and portions of eastern Argentina seeing rain Wednesday into Thursday.

- o Rain Wednesday into Thursday will be greatest from central and northern Santa Fe to Entre Rios and Corrientes where totals will be 0.30-1.20" and locally more with lighter rain in nearby areas and little rain elsewhere.
- o Another round of rain may occur Sep. 8-10 with southern and eastern areas wettest and confidence for this event low.

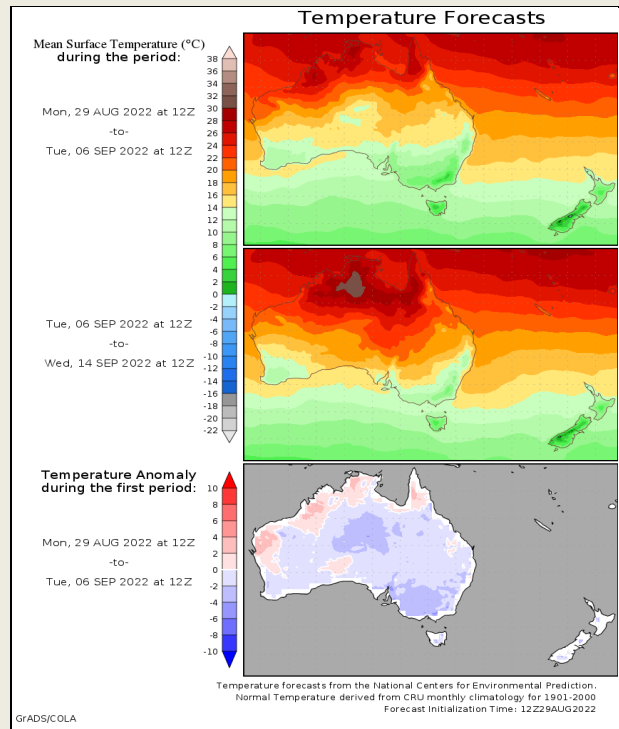
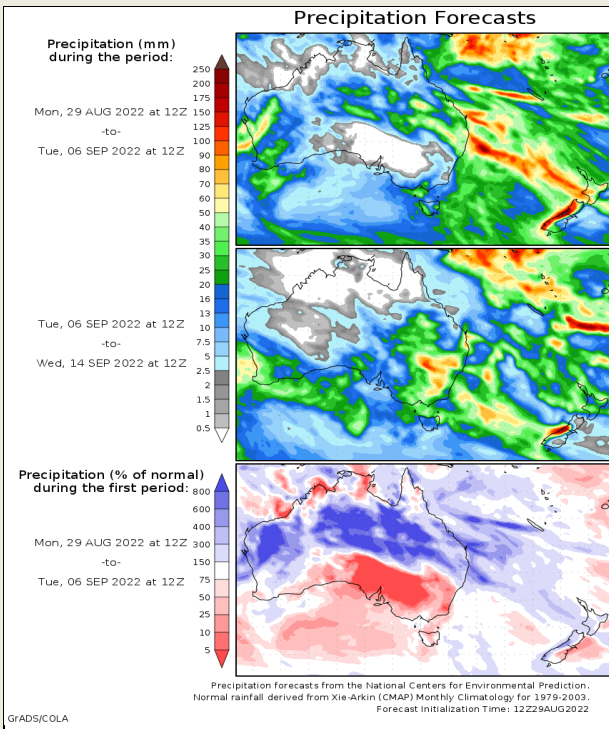
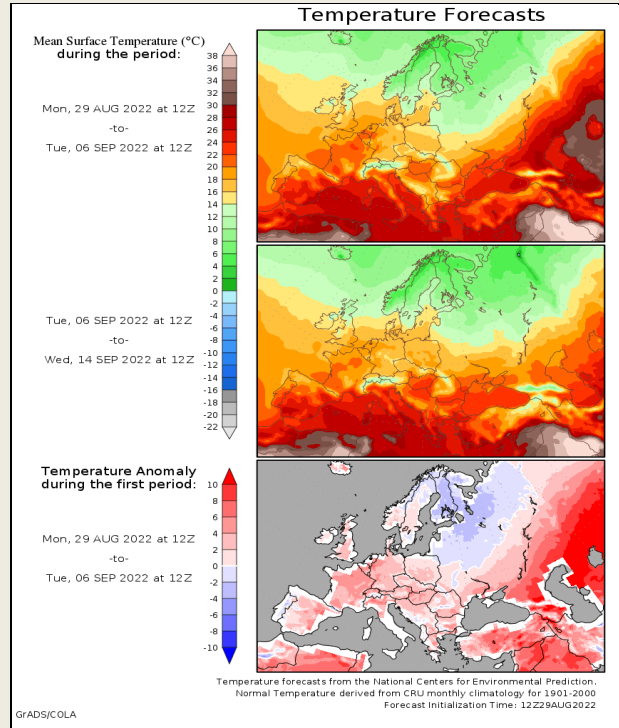
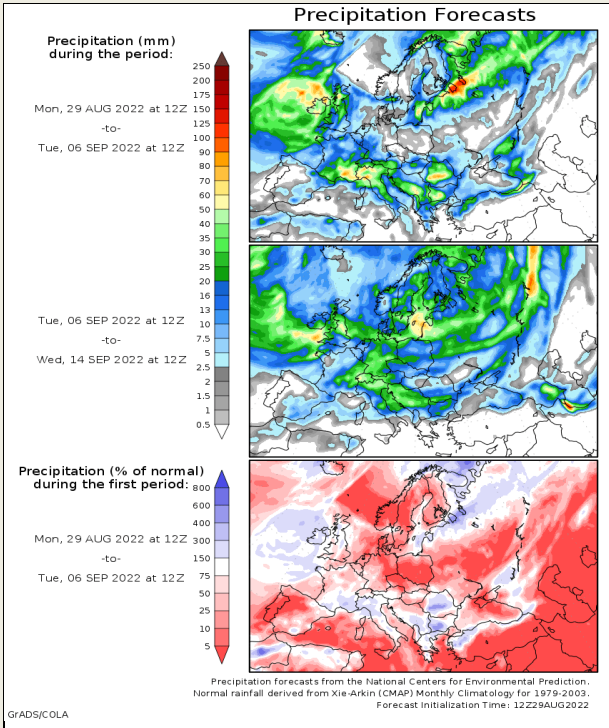


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Pockets of meaningful rainfall are still expected in the next seven days. Much of this rain will occur in southern production areas from northeastern Spain through Italy and into the western Balkan Countries where some additional topsoil moisture improvement is likely as a result. Unusually warm temperatures with high evaporation rates continues to be an issue helping to worsen the areas of dryness in the region and temperatures are expected to be above average most often the next two weeks.

AUSTRALIA: Favorable conditions will continue in most of the region the next two weeks. In the first week of the outlook, more timely rainfall is expected in Queensland which will raise topsoil moisture. Southeastern production areas in and near Victoria will receive a needed break from the rain. Western Australia will receive some timely rain starting Friday.



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
