South Africa - Weather


South Africa's winter wheat areas will have opportunities for light rain and Wednesday before drier weather evolves later in the coming week. The rain will be beneficial, but will generally be too light to counter evaporation. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable despite the lack of significant rain • Drier than normal conditions are slated for much of South Africa during the coming week o A disturbance will still bring light rain to portions of northern and central South Africa today and Wednesday


A few locations will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain from this event, though most locations will not receive
 enough rain to counter evaporation


- o A frontal boundary will also bring rain to Eastern Cape and Natal this weekend and early next week


 Moisture totals by next Tuesday morning will range from 0.10-0.75" with local amounts of 2.00" or

- o Periods of light rain will still be possible, most notably in the south









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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will receive multiple rounds of timely rain through Monday that should prevent excessive dryness and significant crop stress during the period while temperatures will be warm, but not hot enough in most areas to seriously stress crops. o Exceptions to favorable crop conditions are still expected from southeastern South Dakota and southwestern Minnesota to eastern Nebraska and much of western into central lowa. In Temperatures in this region will be hotter than the remainder of the Midwest during the next week and with short soil moisture already in place, the rain expected should not be great enough to do more than briefly improve crop conditions.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The two-week forecast is a little drier overall than what was advertised Monday for the Delta and the Southeast, but much of the region should still receive enough rain to maintain or improve crop conditions with some exceptions in the Delta as well as where hot and dry weather in July caused permanent crop damage.

o A close watch on the distribution of rain will be made as daily coverage of significant rainfall will be erratic and some areas will receive much more rain than others.









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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Rain will increase today and will fall regularly through Wednesday of next week from Paraguay into southern Brazil causing interruptions to fieldwork while increases in soil moisture occur in many areas. Most areas from Paraguay to Parana, Santa Catarina, and Rio Grande do Sul will receive 1.0-3.0" of rain by Wednesday of next week with some pockets of heavier rain and a few pockets of lighter rain. Little rain will fall elsewhere with some light rain in eastern Bahia. Aug. 11-16 will not be as wet in Paraguay and southern Brazil, but some showers will occur on occasion.


ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is wetter for western Argentina this weekend into the middle of next week and the rain advertised, along with some rain into Wednesday in northwestern Argentina, should induce some improvements in soil moisture as well as conditions for winter crops. o Soakings of rain are not expected, but winter wheat should respond well to the moisture and notable improvements in crop conditions could result if follow-up rain occurs soon.











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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Temperatures this week will still be above average in most of the region; though, not quite as extreme as the previous week, particularly in northern Europe. Today will be hot again in the north, but then some needed cooling will occur. Erratic shower and thunderstorm activity will occur in both northern and southern Europe; though, it will be difficult for this to counter evaporation outside of a few localized areas.

AUSTRALIA: Conditions will continue to be mostly favorable the next two weeks. Soil moisture is still good in a majority of the region. Topsoil moisture has become a little low in Queensland; however, rain in the first week of the outlook should help increase this some.









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
