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
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
South Africa - Weather


South Africa will generally be drier biased during the coming week. Winter wheat prospects in western and central South Africa will remain good despite the lack of rain, though these locations would benefit from a good shot of rain later this month. • Drier than normal conditions are slated for much of South Africa during the coming week


o However, a frontal boundary will generate rain near and along the southern coastline this weekend and early next week

- o Any rain that does occur will be too light to significantly impact long-term soil conditions
- South Africa will remain drier biased August 12 18
- o Periods of light rain will still be possible, most notably in the south









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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will receive multiple rounds of timely rain through Monday that should prevent excessive dryness and significant crop stress during the period while temperatures will be warm, but not hot enough in most areas to seriously stress crops. o Exceptions to favorable crop conditions are still expected from southeastern South Dakota and southwestern Minnesota to eastern Nebraska and much of western into central lowa. ® Temperatures in this region will be hotter than the remainder of the Midwest during the next week and with short soil moisture already in place, the rain expected should not be great enough to do more than briefly improve crop conditions.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Much of the Delta and the Southeast should receive enough rain during the next week to maintain or improve crop conditions with some exceptions where hot and dry weather in July caused permanent crop damage. A drier-biased weather pattern will occur Aug. 12-18 and stress to crops may increase in pockets that miss out on significant rain during the next week while most areas will have enough soil moisture to prevent serious crop stress.









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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain will fall regularly through Wednesday from Paraguay into southern Brazil causing interruptions to fieldwork while increases in soil moisture occur in many areas.


o Most areas from Paraguay to Parana, Santa Catarina, and Rio Grande do Sul will receive 1.0-3.0" of rain and locally more by Wednesday with some pockets of heavier rain and a few pockets of lighter rain


ARGENTINA: Another round of rain Saturday through Tuesday will improve conditions for winter wheat in some of the driest areas in west-central and southwestern


Argentina while Santiago del Estero misses much of the rain and the soil there will remain too dry to favorably support winter crops.


o Soakings of rain are not expected, but winter wheat should respond well to the moisture and notable improvements in crop conditions could result if follow-up rain occurs soon.











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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Limited rainfall through at least the next ten days with temperatures that are often above to well above average will keep moisture stress high in a majority of the region. Livestock stress will continue as well due to the heat and dryness. Much of the rain that occurs is not expected to counter evaporation. Northeastern production areas will still be coolest relative to normal and will continue to have the best soil moisture relative to the remainder of Europe.

AUSTRALIA: Conditions will continue to be mostly favorable the next two weeks. Soil moisture is still good in a majority of the region. Topsoil moisture has become a little low in Queensland; however, rain in the first week of the outlook should help increase this some.









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
