



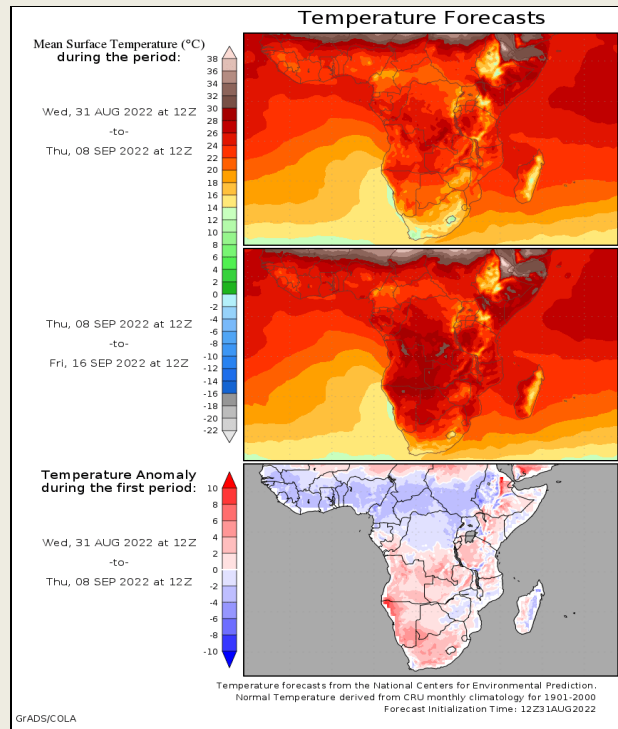
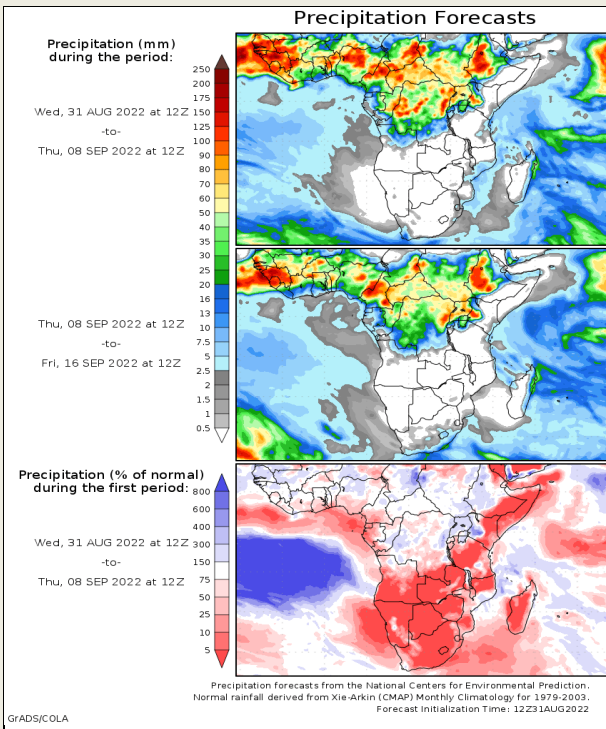
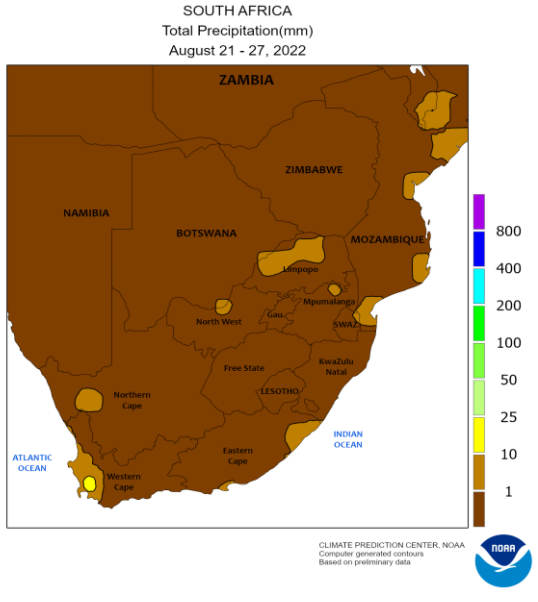
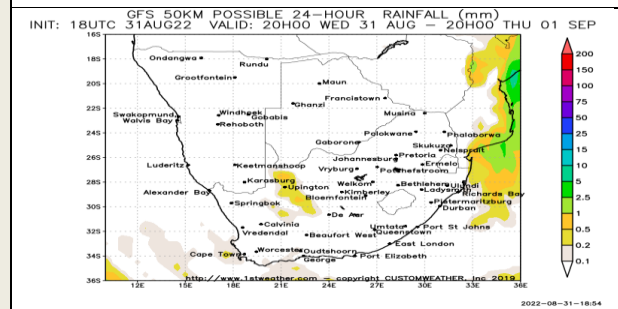
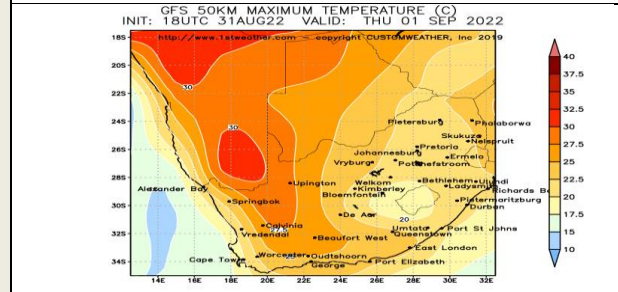
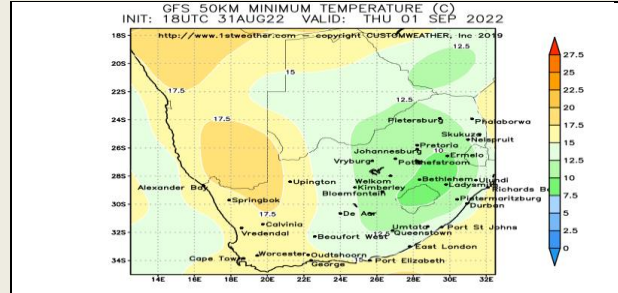
Weather Report

01 September 2022

South Africa - Weather

Periods of light rain will continue for western and southern South Africa during the coming week. Resulting rainfall will generally be lost to evaporation, though the winter wheat in Western Cape will still welcome the moisture. The remaining production areas in South Africa will remain mostly dry. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable for Northern Cape and Free State despite the lack of rain. A good shot of precipitation will be needed later in September. • South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week

- o Periods of light rain will still occur near the western and southern coastlines, most notably this weekend and early next week
- o A few locations in Western Cape will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain and locally greater amounts by next Tuesday morning
- o However, most locations will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation
- South Africa will again be drier biased September 7 – 13
- o However, periods of light rain will be possible in western and southern South Africa

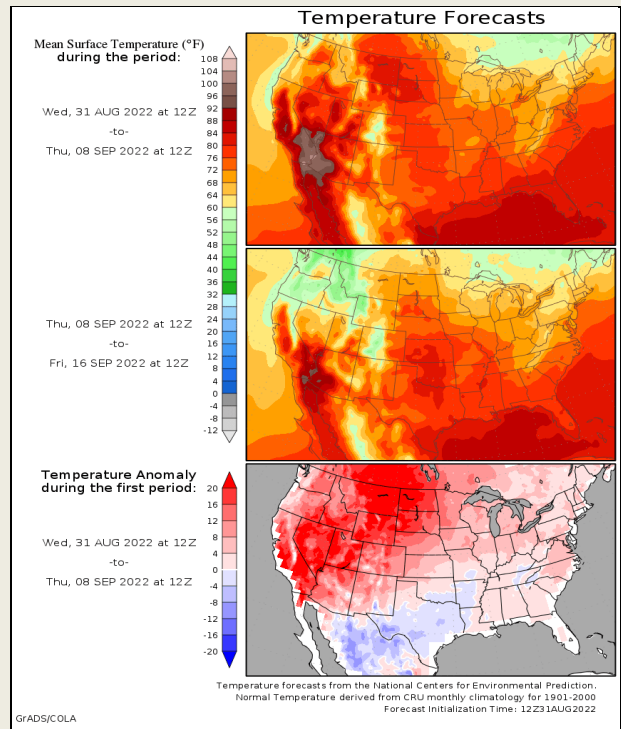
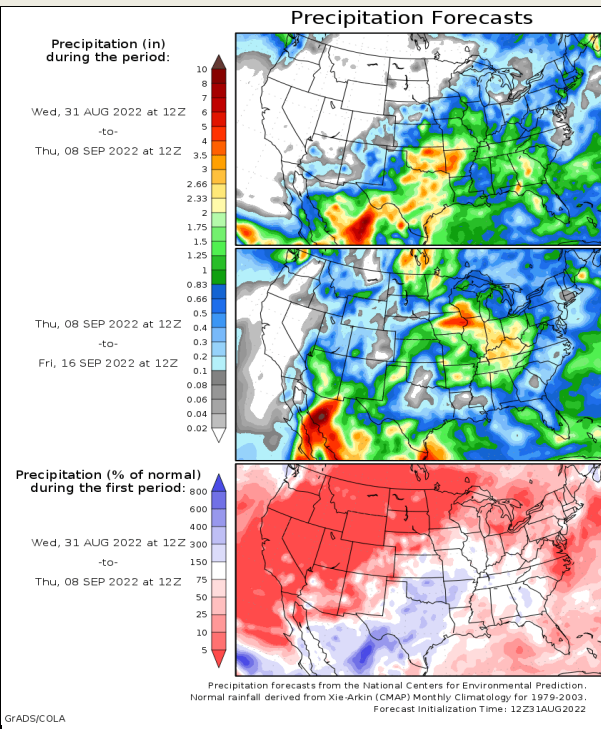
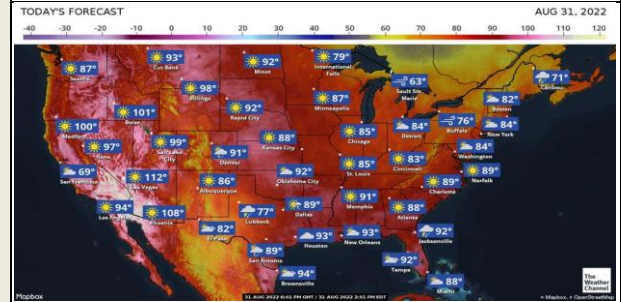
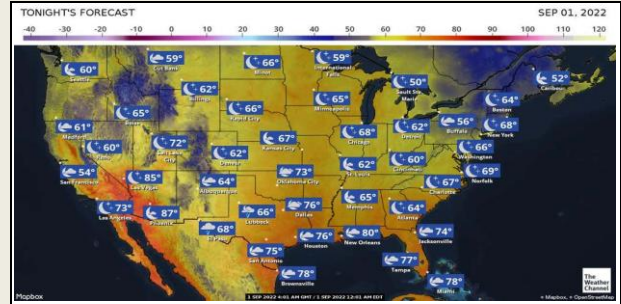
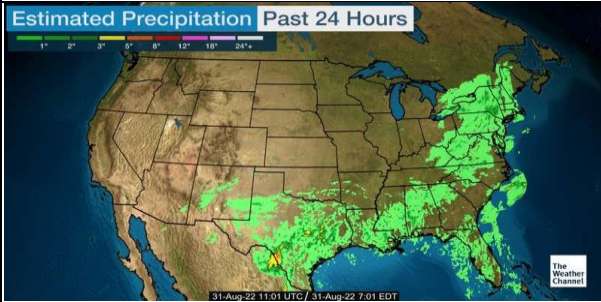


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: • Much of the Midwest has adequate soil moisture in place to favorably support late crop development during the next two weeks while warm temperatures and infrequent rain will allow crop maturation to occur favorably as well.
 o Some of the lingering dry areas in the west-central and southwestern Corn Belt likely do not have enough soil moisture to favorably support crops, but rain this late in the season would not likely have much of an impact on yields. Temperatures will be mostly warmer than normal through the middle of the next week and highs will generally be in the upper 70s and 80s with some lower 90s in the west and south.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The central and southern Delta through Alabama and northern Georgia will see frequent rain and poor conditions for fieldwork most often through Monday and concerns over crop quality declines may increase with the wettest period expected Friday into Monday.
 o This region will be mostly dry Wednesday through Friday and some fieldwork should advance in the drier areas.

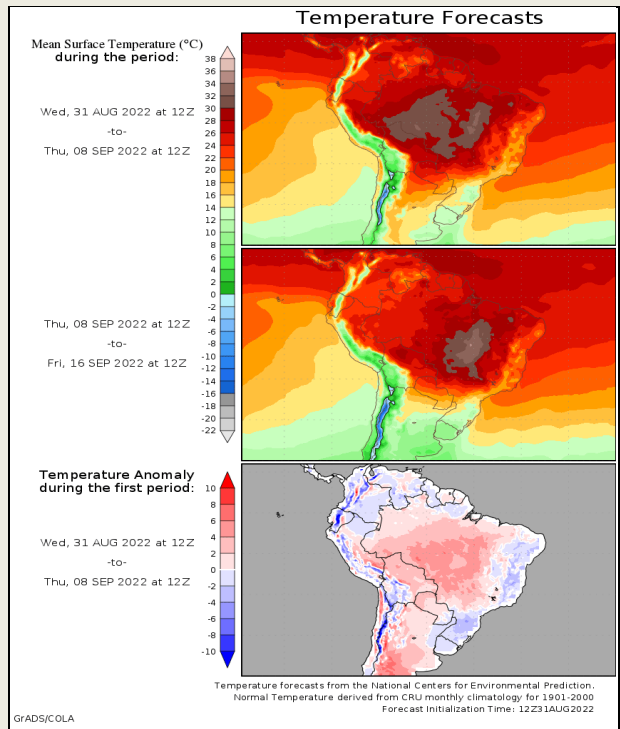
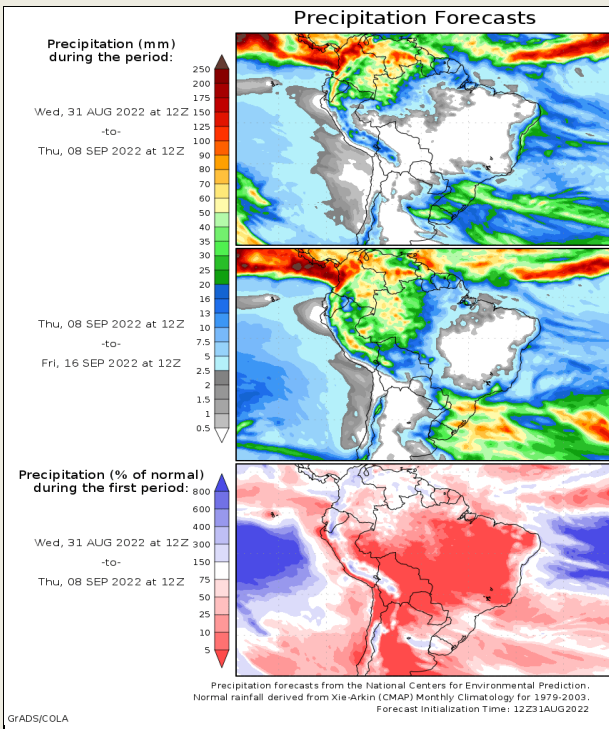
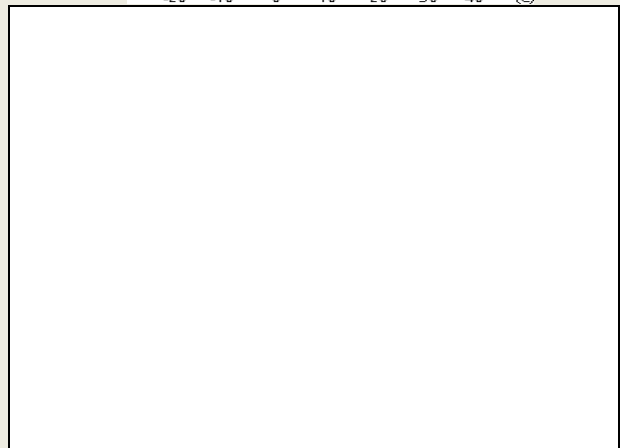
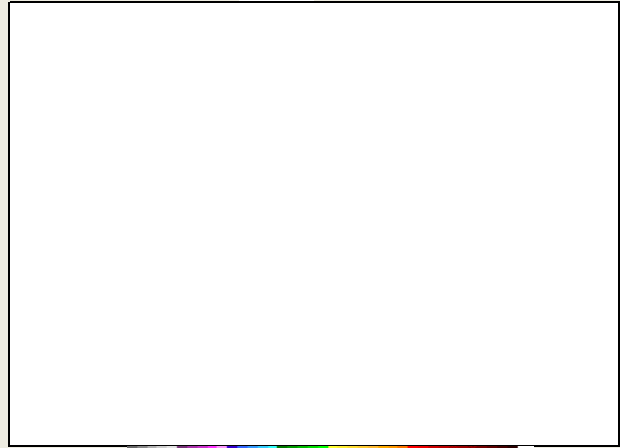


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks with occasional rounds of showers and thunderstorms in Paraguay and southern Brazil that should induce little more than temporary interruptions to fieldwork.
 o Parts of northeastern Brazil will see light showers on occasion as well.

ARGENTINA: Little rain is expected through the next two weeks in western Argentina where winter crops are in need of rain while rain will be infrequent elsewhere with central and portions of eastern Argentina seeing rain Wednesday into Thursday.
 o Rain Wednesday into Thursday will be greatest from central and northern Santa Fe to Entre Rios and Corrientes where totals will be 0.30-1.20" and locally more with lighter rain in nearby areas and little rain elsewhere.
 o Another round of rain may occur Sep. 8-10 with southern and eastern areas wettest and confidence for this event low.

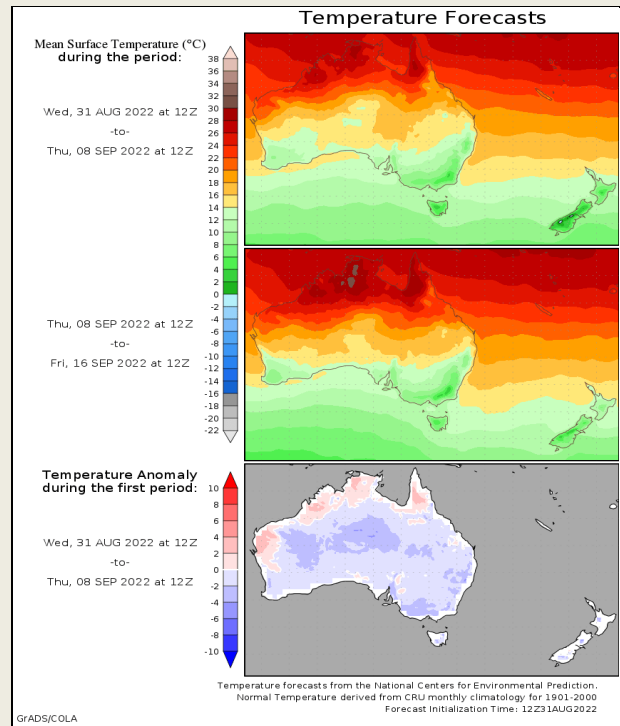
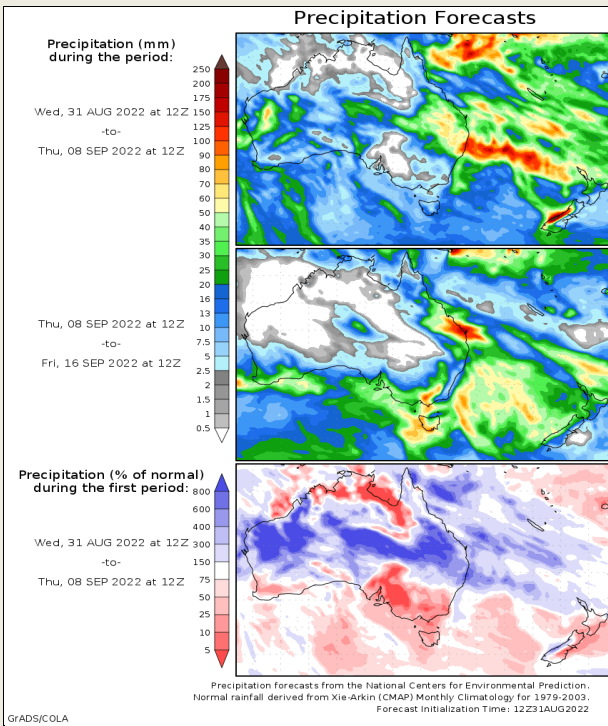
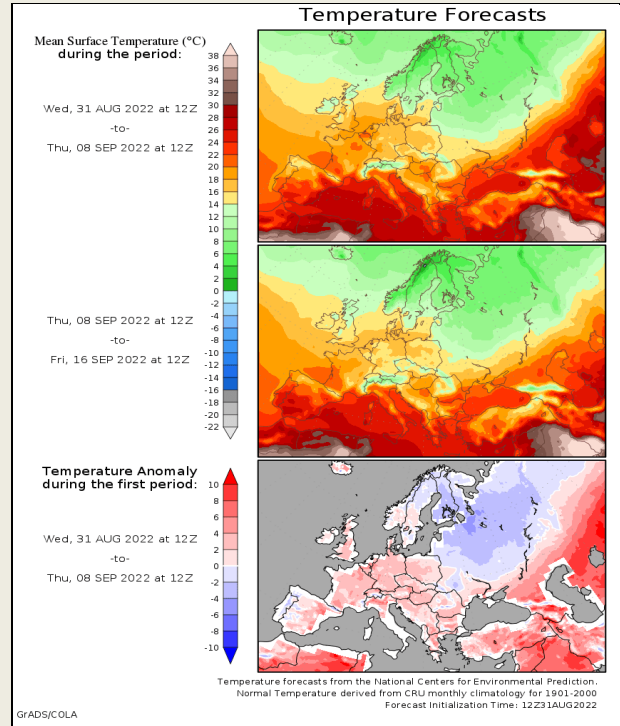
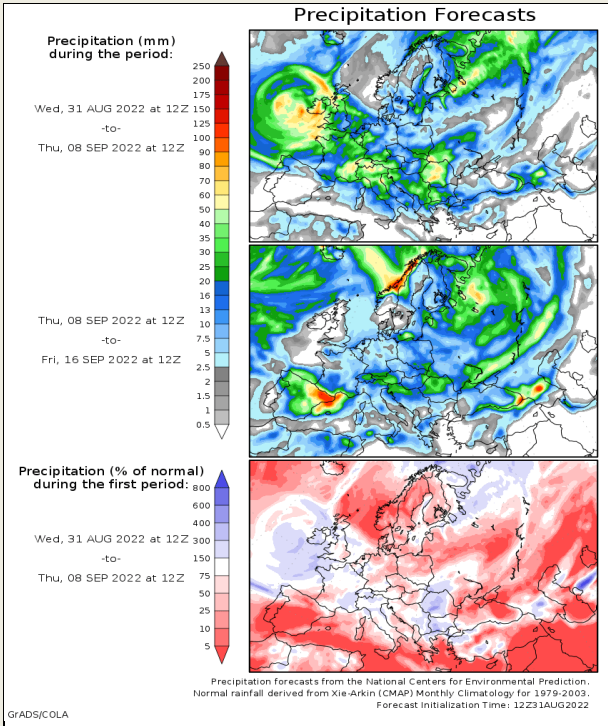


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Meaningful rainfall in southeastern France, northern Italy, and the Balkan Countries in the next seven days will bring more needed relief from dryness. Northwestern France will receive some rain, which will be better than none; however, much more will be needed. An above average temperature bias will likely continue into Sep. 8 before greater cooling occurs. The greatest rain for western and northern France and the U.K. is expected this weekend and especially next week.

AUSTRALIA: Favorable conditions will continue in most of the region the next two weeks. In the first week of the outlook, more timely rainfall is expected in Queensland which will raise topsoil moisture. Southeastern production areas in and near Victoria will receive a needed break from the rain. Western Australia will receive some timely rain starting Friday.



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
