

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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Light showers will occur daily through Sunday causing brief interruptions to fieldwork while bringing welcome moisture to winter crop areas before rain is restricted and harvesting should become aggressive Monday through at least Oct. 5 with some additional showers from Michigan to eastern Ohio into Tuesday.

o Many areas will need additional rain soon to improve conditions for winter wheat germination and establishment.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Tropical Depression Nine in the central Caribbean Sea this morning will be monitored as it moves to the west-northwest during the next several days and likely becomes a hurricane before entering the Gulf of Mexico Tuesday. The storm should impact the western Florida Peninsula Wednesday before moving to northeast and across the Peninsula and into the eastern Atlantic Ocean with the storm coming near eastern North Carolina by Thursday. Outside of any potential impacts from the tropical disturbance mentioned above, the Delta and the Southeast will see a restricted rainfall pattern and good harvest progress through much of the period.



South America - Weather

BRAZIL: An improving trend for planting and establishment of crops will continue through Thursday rom Mato Grosso. Mato Grosso do Sul, and Paraguay through Goias, southern Minas Gerais, and Sao aulo through most of southern Brazil. o All of the region will receive enough rain to at least temporarily improve soil moisture and planting should accelerate when drier weather returns Sep. 30-Oct. 7. o Greater rain will be needed in the second week of October to support establishment of crops that are planted as a result of rain during the next week. ARGENTINA: Today's forecast includes less rain for Saturday through Wednesday and although many vestern and southern areas will receive at least some precipitation, most of the rain will be too light to ave a significant impact on crops or soil conditions. Much of the country needs greater rain to improve conditions for summer crop planting and establishment.



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


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Market Report : 26 September 2022

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Topsoil moisture will further improve in the first week of the outlook, especially in Italy, northeastern Spain, and southeastern France. Western and northern France is still drier than preferred. Rain is expected in the next seven days; though, more may still be needed. Rain could be enough to cause some flooding in Italy and the northwestern Balkan Countries. AUSTRALIA: A mostly favorable mix of rain and sunshine will continue the next two weeks. Rain that occurs will still be greatest in eastern production areas; however, there will likely be enough dry time between rain events for fieldwork to advance favorably.



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
