



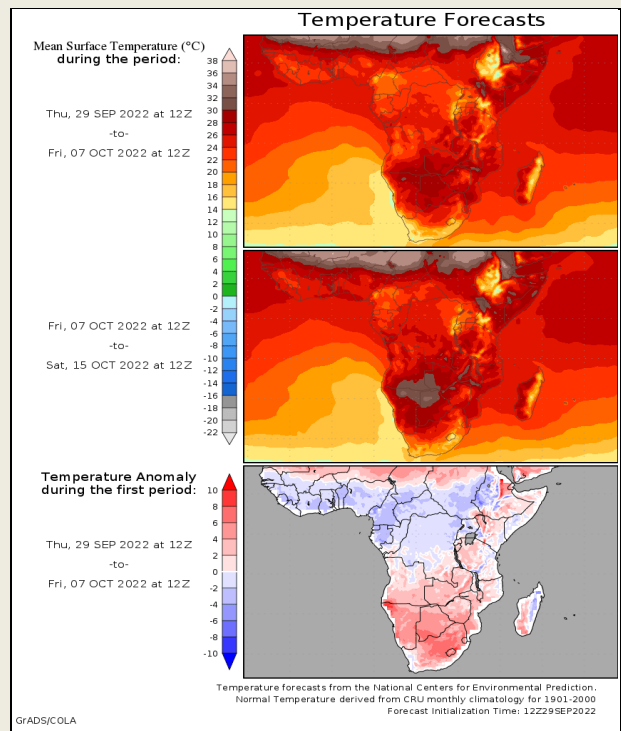
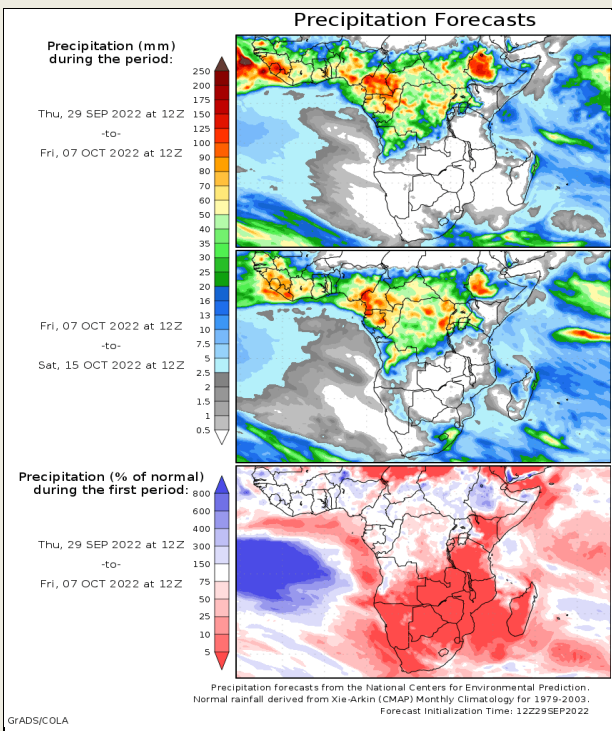
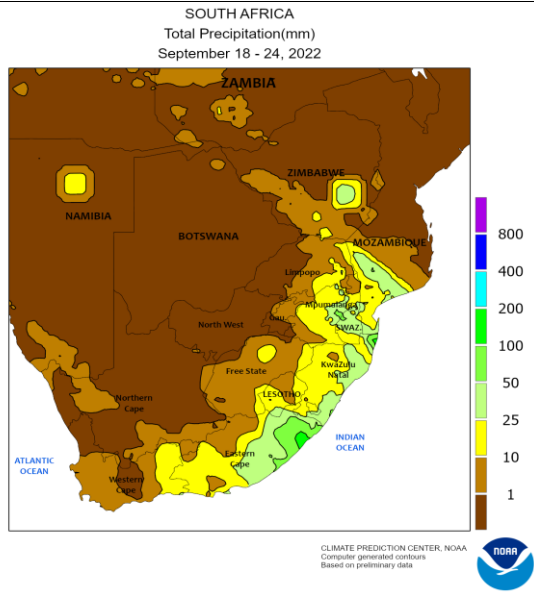
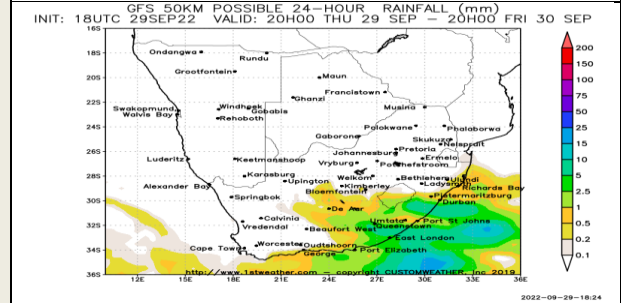
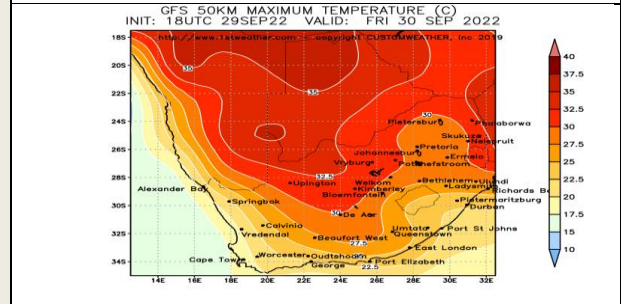
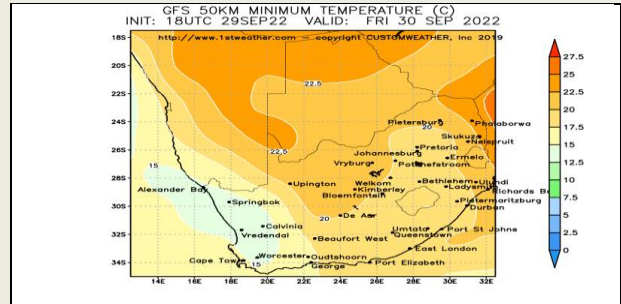
# **Weather Report**

## **30 September 2022**

# South Africa - Weather

South Africa will remain drier biased through the middle of next week. Southern South Africa will still see periods of light rain while little to no rain falls elsewhere. Winter wheat maturation and early-season harvesting will advance swiftly in western and central South Africa. Early-season planting of the summer crops may otherwise advance slowly in eastern and central South Africa. • A large section of South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week

- o Periods of light rain will still occur in southern South Africa today into Saturday
- o Pockets in Eastern Cape and southern Natal will receive 0.25-1.50" of rain by next Wednesday morning
- o Any rain that occurs elsewhere will be lost to evaporation
- Eastern and southern South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine October 6 – 12
- o Western South Africa will remain drier than normal



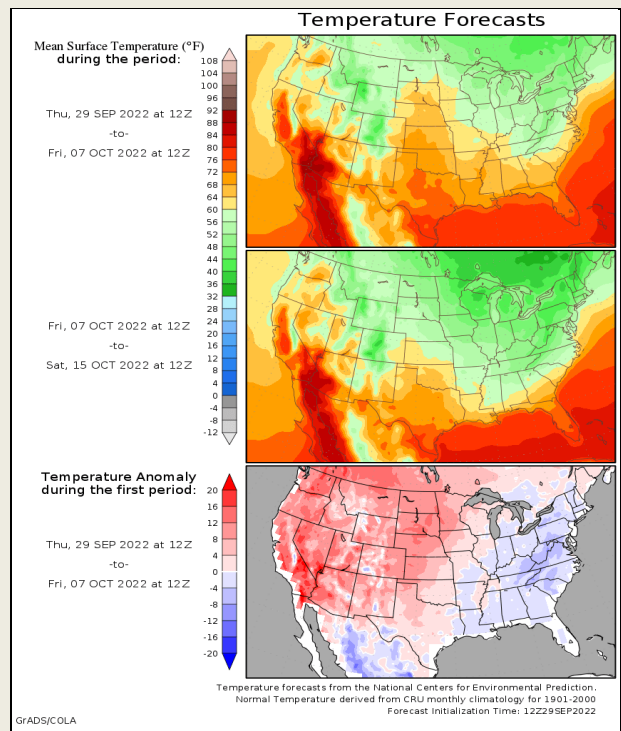
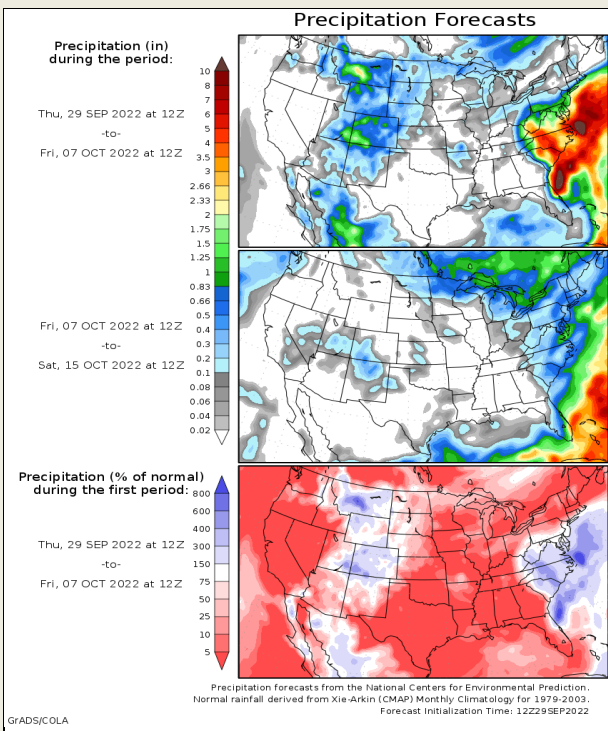
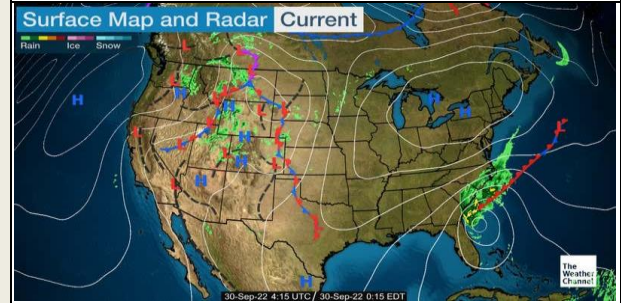
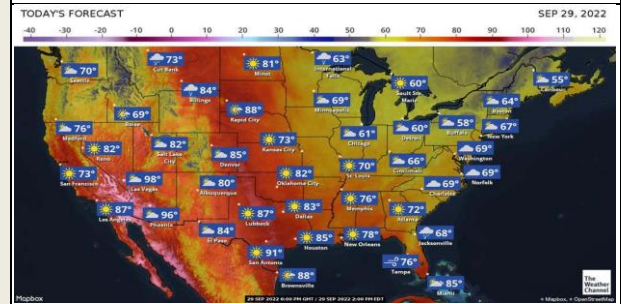
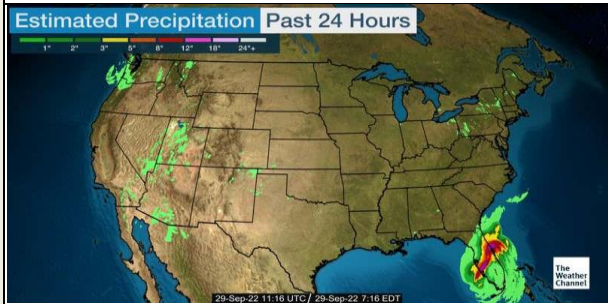
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# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** Rain will be infrequent and mostly light through the next two weeks allowing for crop maturation and harvesting to occur favorably with exceptions Saturday into Monday from eastern Kentucky to southern Ohio where the remnants of Hurricane Ian bring rain to the region. Little rain is expected before and after the rain event and interruptions to fieldwork should be temporary. Confidence for Ian's forecast track and the resulting rain is still low.

**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** Hurricane Ian's track has been shifted to the east since Tuesday and cotton areas in southwestern Georgia will miss much of the rain and should be spared from damage while heavy rain and some flooding will occur from the northeastern Florida Peninsula to north-central and eastern Georgia to southern Virginia.

o Ian will make landfall on the southwestern Florida Peninsula this afternoon before weakening and slowly moving to the northeast and into the Atlantic Ocean followed by a turn to the north and then north-northwest into southeastern Georgia or southern South Carolina Friday.



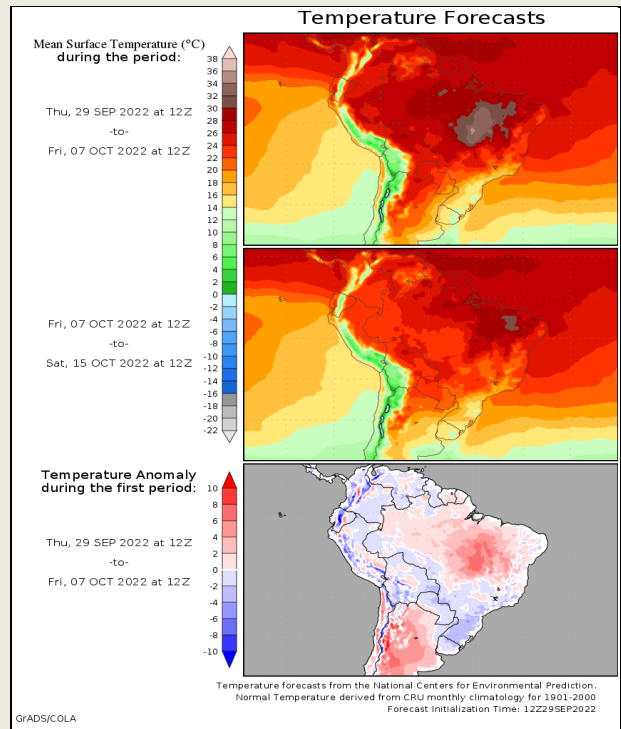
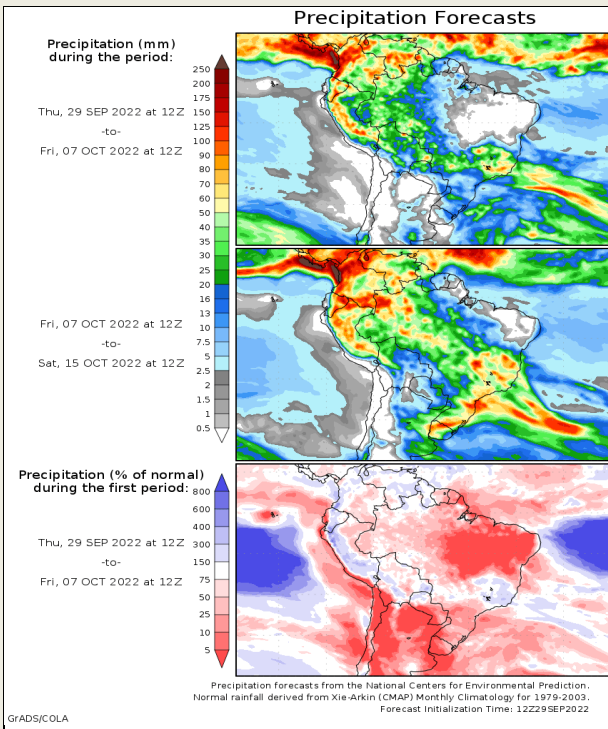
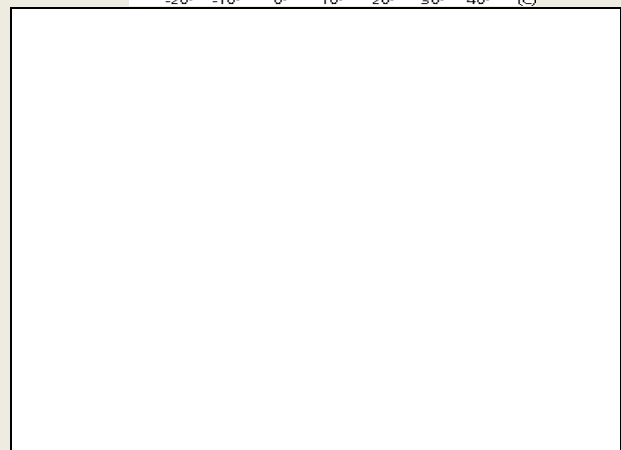
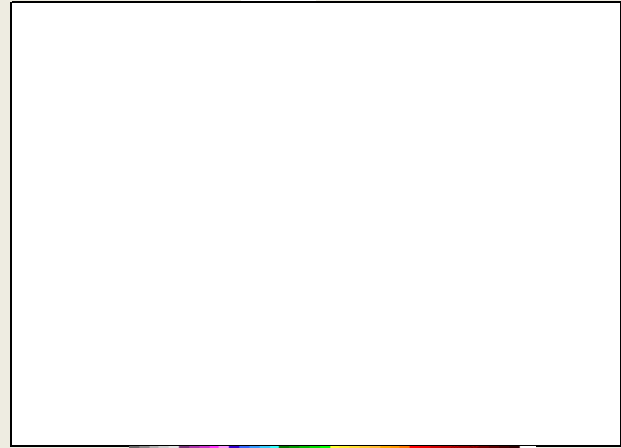
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## South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Much of Brazil and Paraguay will see a good mix of rain and sunshine and favorable conditions for planting and establishment of summer crops through the next two weeks. Exceptions will occur from eastern Mato Grosso into a large part of Goias where little rain is expected through Saturday before showers increase in Goias Sunday into Monday with eastern Mato Grosso seeing rain starting Tuesday.

**ARGENTINA:** Two rounds of rain during the next two weeks will induce beneficial increases in soil moisture in some western, northeastern, and southern parts of the country, but most areas that receive rain are dry enough that much more rain will be needed to induce the significant increases in soil moisture that will be needed to favorably support planting and establishment of summer crops.

- o Most areas from central into north-central and east-central Argentina will miss out on significant rain during the next two weeks.
- o Rain will fall today on many areas from northern San Luis and west-central Cordoba to Santiago del Estero where totals will be up to 0.30".

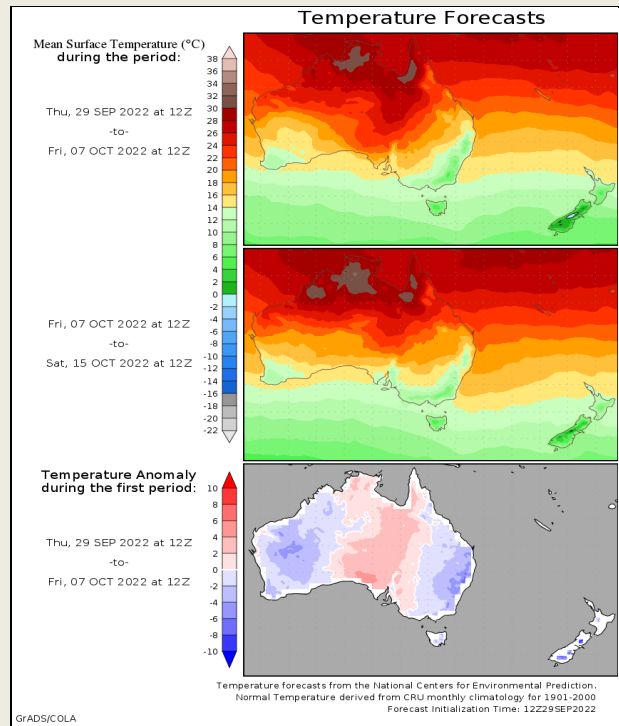
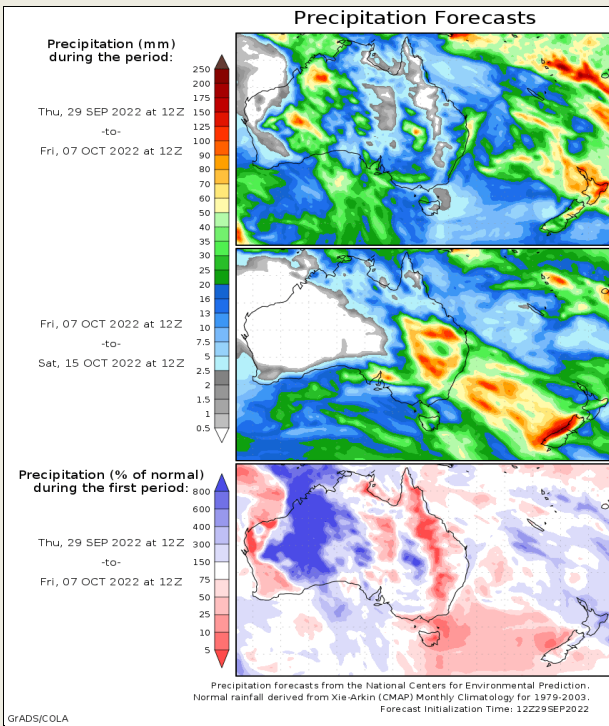
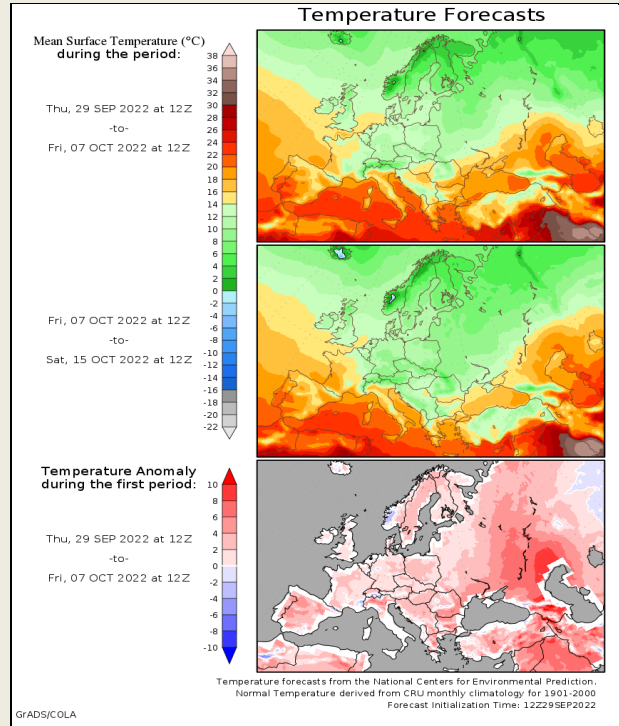
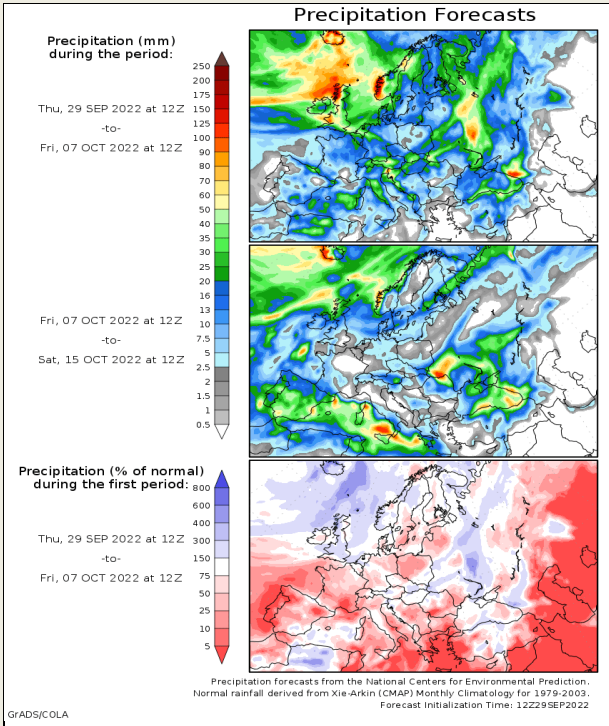


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# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

**EUROPE:** More areas of significant rain will occur in the next seven days with Portugal and Spain being the driest and Italy, the western Balkan Countries and areas near the Alps wettest. Some flooding may occur. More rain in France and the U.K. will be welcome for further improving soil moisture. • Daily rain and some thunderstorms will occur through Sunday • Total moisture will vary from 0.40 to 2.35 inches in around 75% of the region • Some local amounts of more than 3.50 inches likely in Italy and the western Balkan Countries • Frequent rain shower activity is expected in the second week, Oct. 3 – 10  
• Less rain is likely compared to the first week

**AUSTRALIA:** A mostly favorable mix of rain and sunshine will continue the next seven days. Some southeastern areas are still a little wetter than preferred and warmer temperatures will be needed. A particularly large surge of unusually cool temperatures in the second week of the outlook will not be helpful for drying in the southeast. The surge of cool could cause late season frost in the south and possibly some pockets of a freeze.



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
