



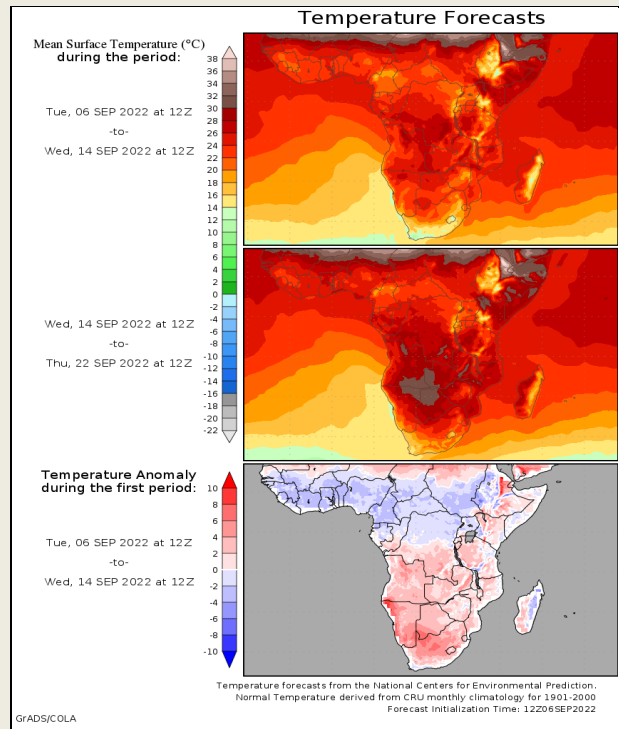
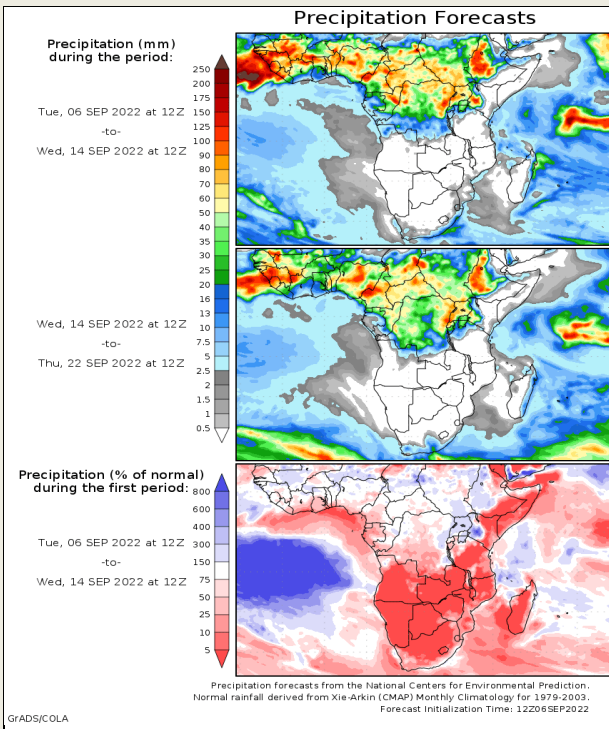
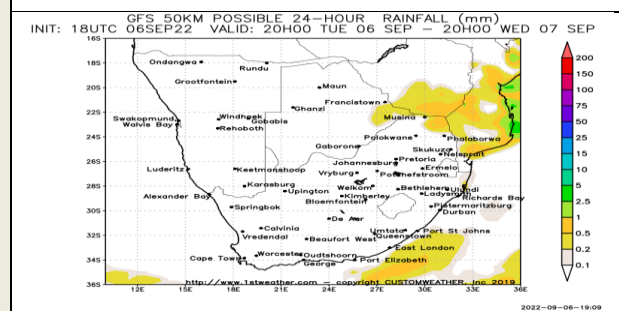
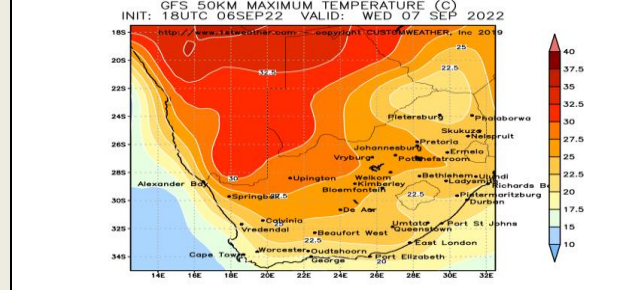
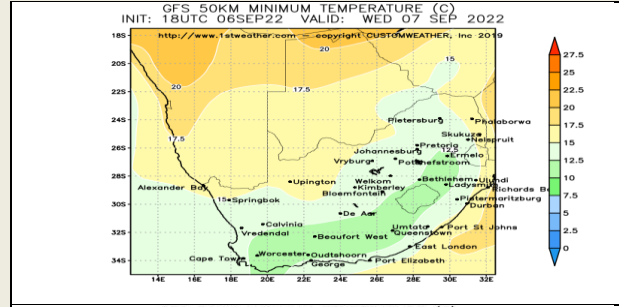
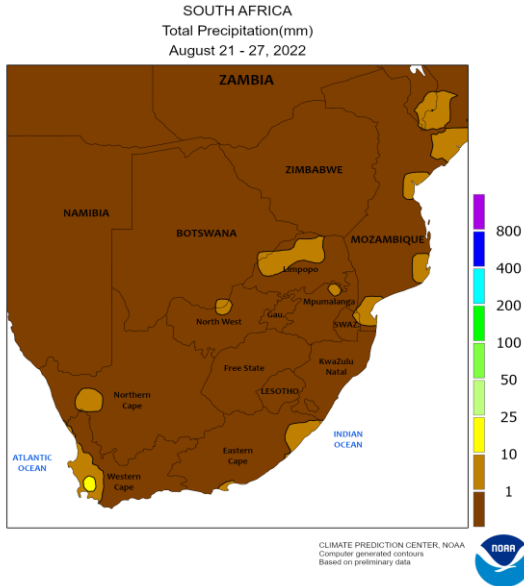
# **Weather Report**

# South Africa - Weather

A large portion of South Africa's main production areas will be drier than normal during the coming week. Winter wheat prospects are still favorable for Western Cape, Northern Cape, and Free State, though a good shot of rain would still be welcome later this month. • South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week

- o However, a frontal boundary will promote rain near and along the southern coastline late this weekend and early next week
- o Portions of southern Natal and southern Eastern Cape will receive 0.25-1.50" of rain and locally greater amounts by next Tuesday morning
- o Other areas will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation
- Southern South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine September 14 – 20
- o Most other locations will be drier than normal



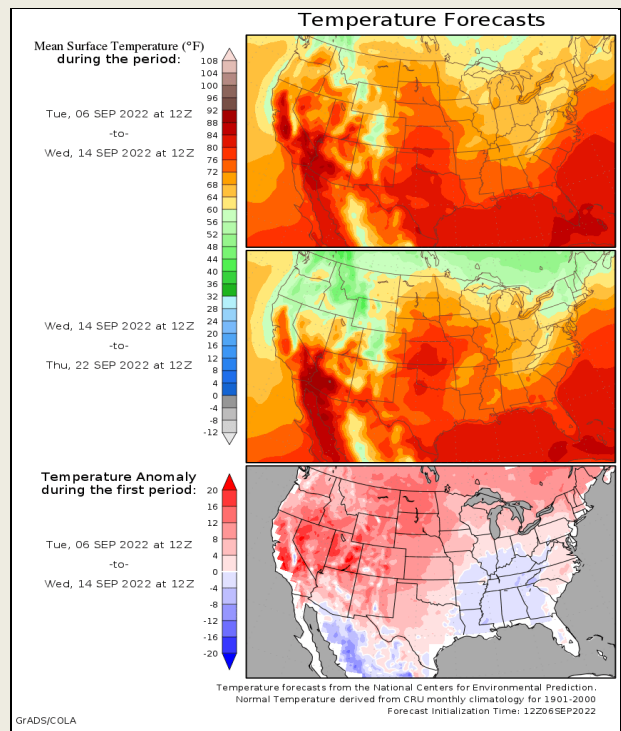
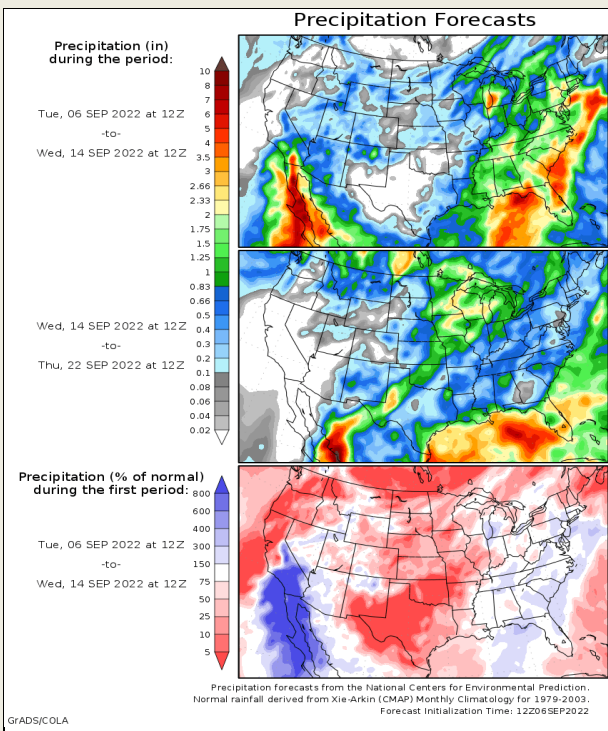
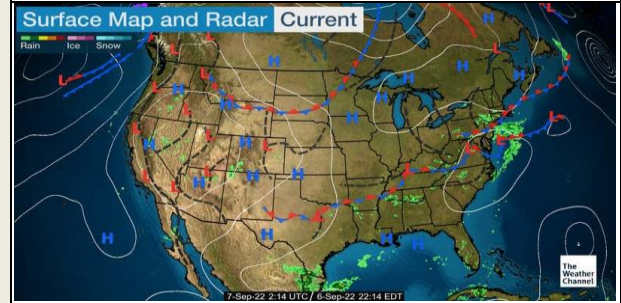
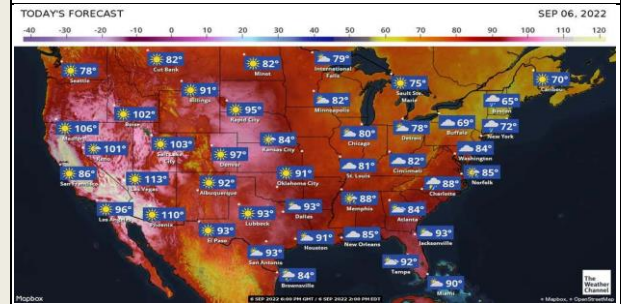
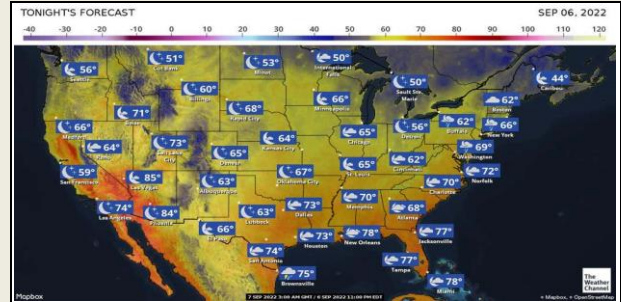
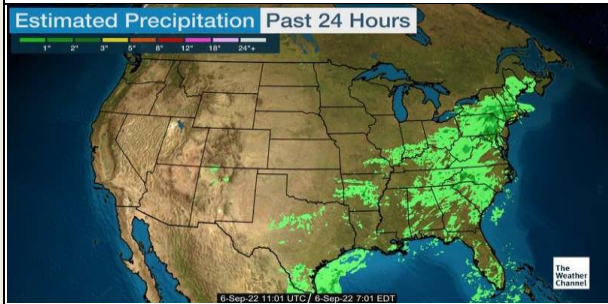
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# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** • Light showers will bring up to 0.25" of rain and locally more to parts of the region from central Indiana to Kentucky today before Wednesday into Thursday is mostly dry. Nearly widespread rain will fall Thursday night through Sunday and most areas will receive 0.30-1.20" of rain and locally more with lighter rain and some pockets of dry weather in the far northwest as well as from eastern Kansas to west-central and northwestern Illinois. Additional rain will fall Monday on many areas from Wisconsin and nearby areas to Michigan and Ohio where amounts will be up to 0.65" and locally more with some heavier rain in Wisconsin.

**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** Outside of a widespread rain event Friday into Monday, the Delta and the Southeast will see infrequent enough rain during the next two weeks that fieldwork and crop maturation and harvesting should occur mostly favorable once the region dries out after that rain event.

o Northern Florida to Georgia and South Carolina will be wettest and parts of the region will receive heavy rain.



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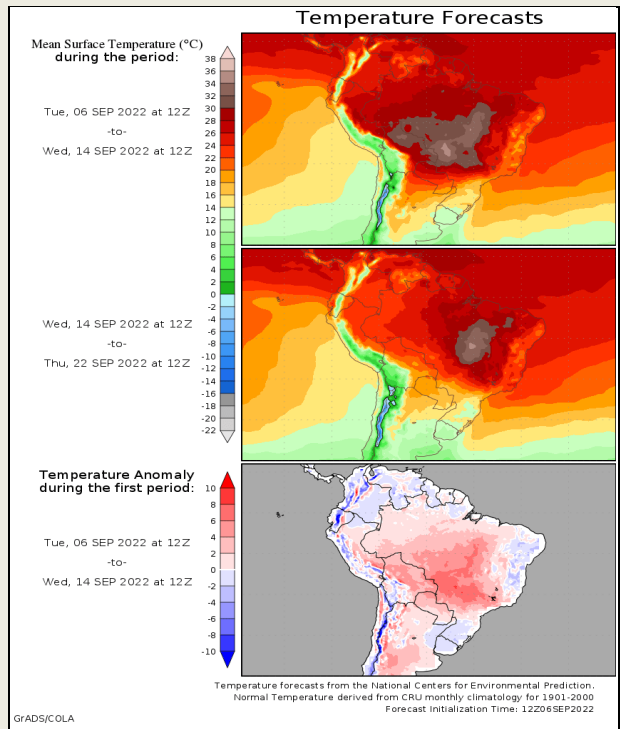
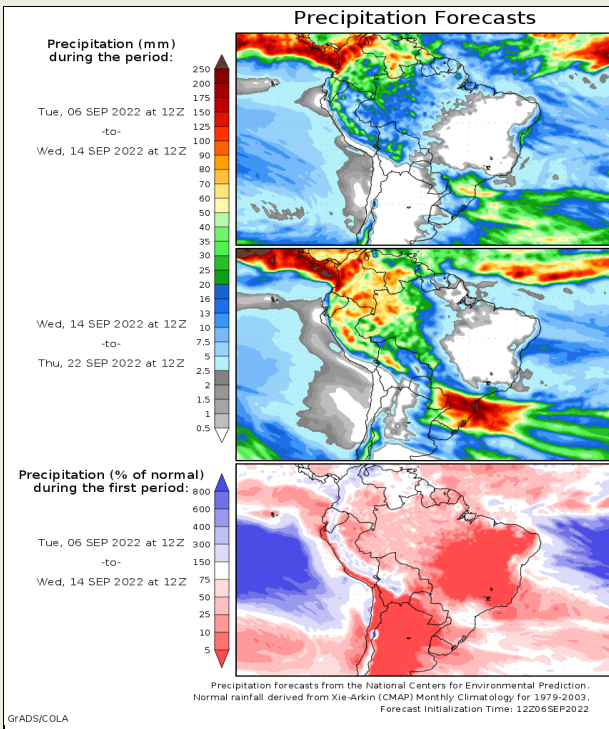
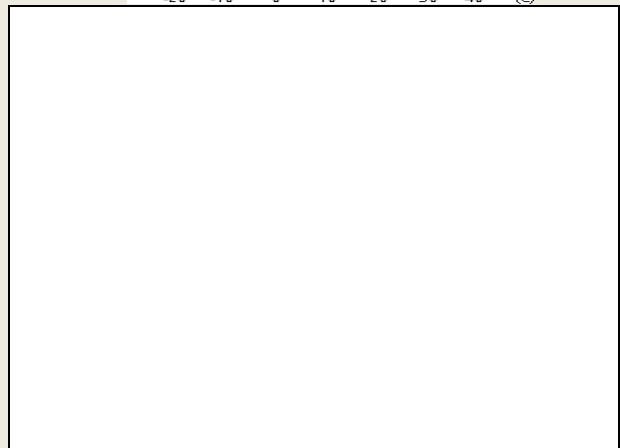
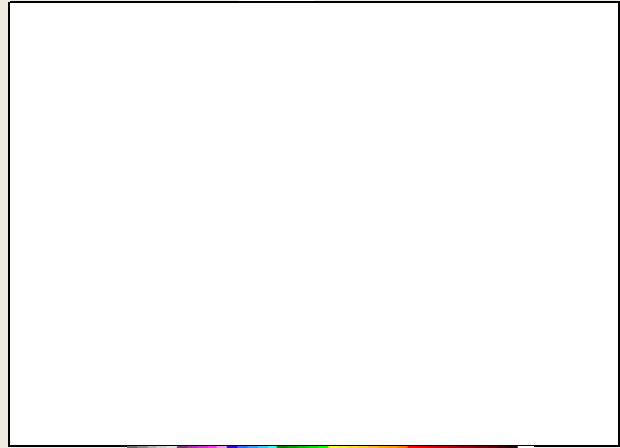
## South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks outside of central and southern Paraguay and southern Brazil that where regular rain will bring favorable moisture for summer crop planting while causing some interruptions to fieldwork.

o Parts of Mato Grosso will see showers Sep. 15-20. Rain in Mato Grosso during the next two weeks should not have more than brief impacts on soil moisture as much of the precipitation will be and the moisture will quickly be lost to evaporation in the warm to hot temperatures expected.

**ARGENTINA:** A restricted rainfall pattern will be in place through the next two weeks leaving many areas, especially in the west, in need of rain to improve soil moisture for the summer crop planting season.

o Isolated to scattered and mostly light showers will occur in eastern Argentina Thursday with pats of central and eastern Argentina seeing showers Sep. 15-16.

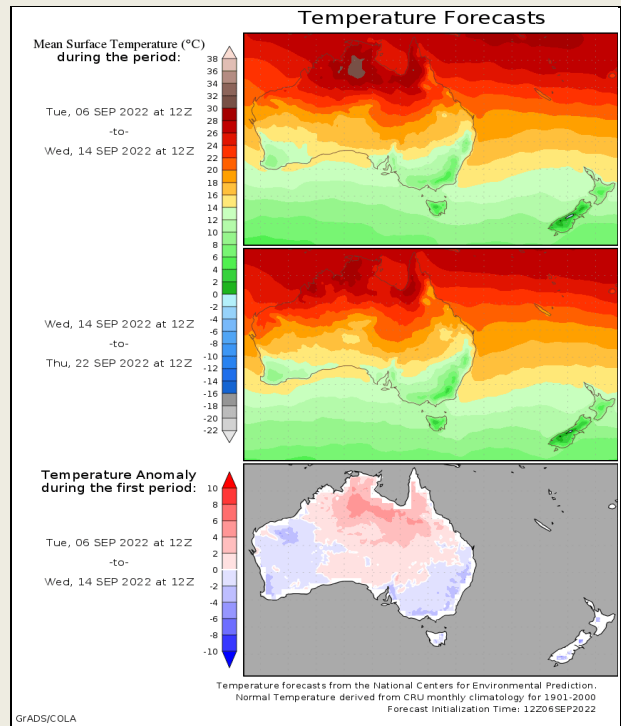
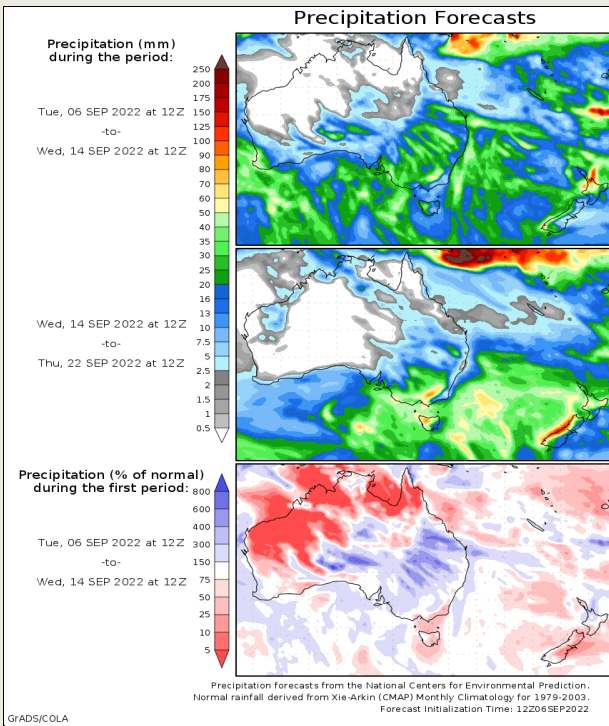
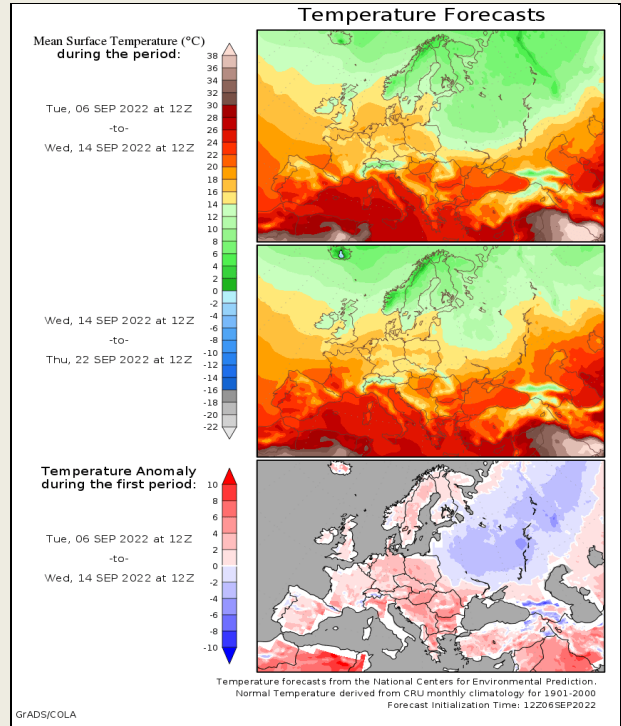
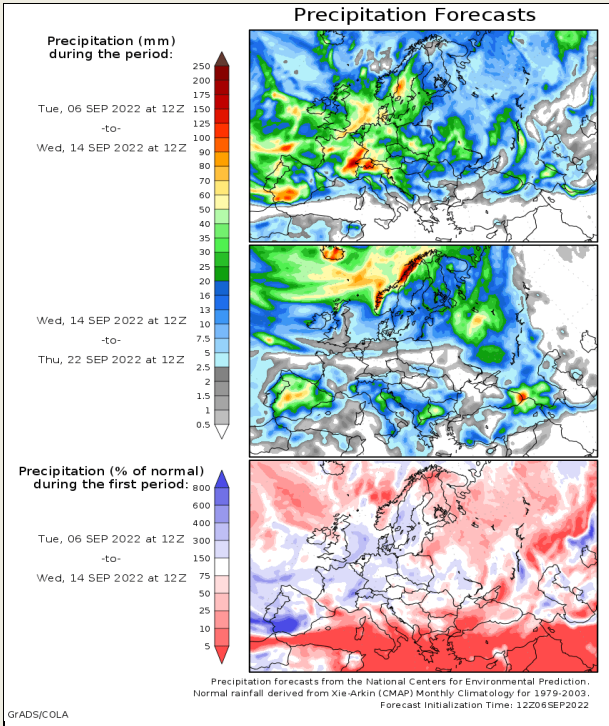


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## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

**EUROPE:** Enough rain is expected in the next seven days for an increase in topsoil moisture in much of central and northern Europe. Net drying is likely from Portugal and Spain through most of Italy and the Balkan Countries. Temperatures will have a near to above average bias and the environment will be generally less harsh compared to earlier in the summer, but still an issue for pockets of the region. Fieldwork will advance between areas of rain.

**AUSTRALIA:** Rain will be enough in the first seven days of the outlook to restore topsoil moisture to favorable levels in Queensland; though, the rain may be a little too frequent and cause fieldwork delays. Rain in South Australia and Western Australia will be a bit lighter and more supportive of greater fieldwork advancement. The frequency of rain could decrease some in the second week of the outlook.



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
