



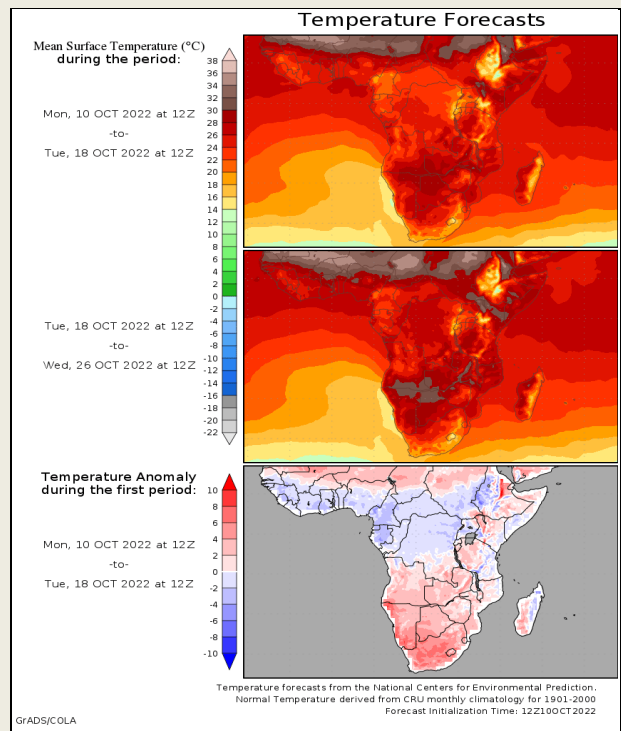
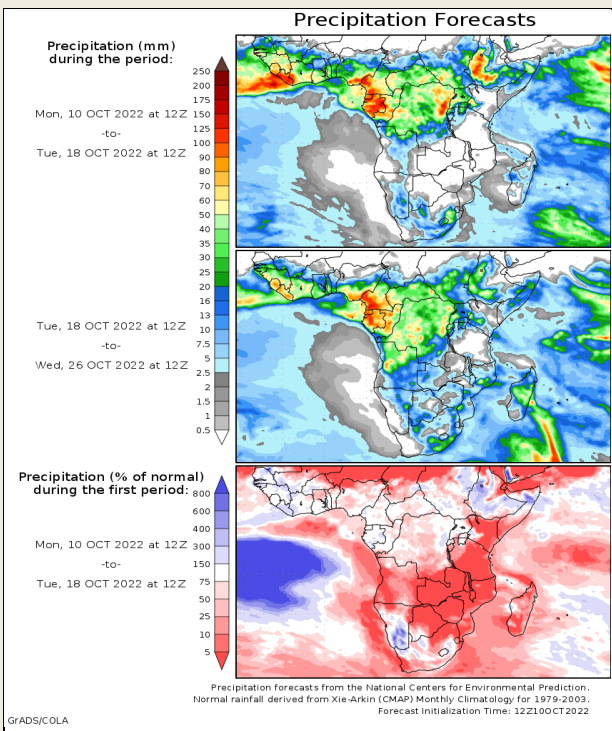
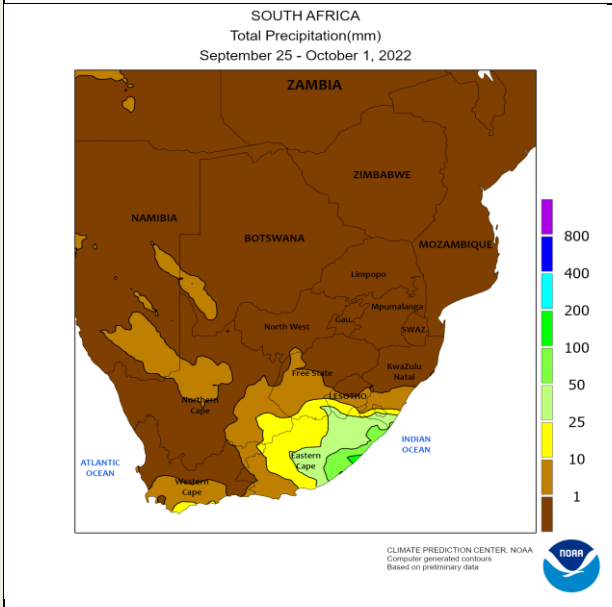
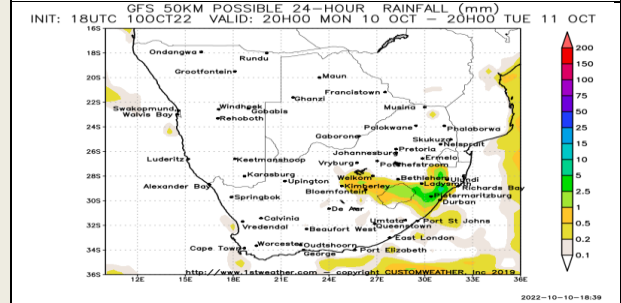
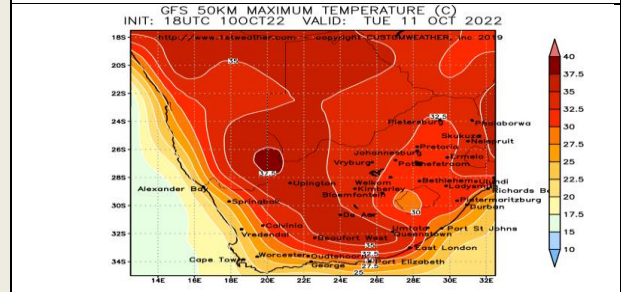
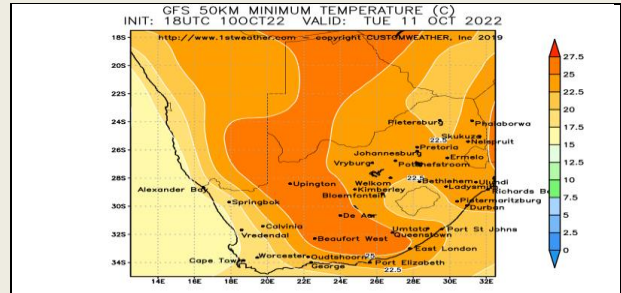
Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

Drier than normal weather is slated for much of South Africa through the end of next week. The lack of rain will continue to promote a good environment for aggressive winter wheat harvesting. Summer crop planting will also advance with few disruptions, though a good soaking of rain will be needed to support better establishment. A large section of South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week

- o Periods of light rain will still occur in Eastern Cape, Natal, Western Cape, and neighboring areas
- o However, resulting rainfall will either be lost to evaporation or too light to impact long-term soil conditions
- Eastern South Africa will see a mix of light rain and sunshine October 15 – 21
- o The remaining locations will be drier biased



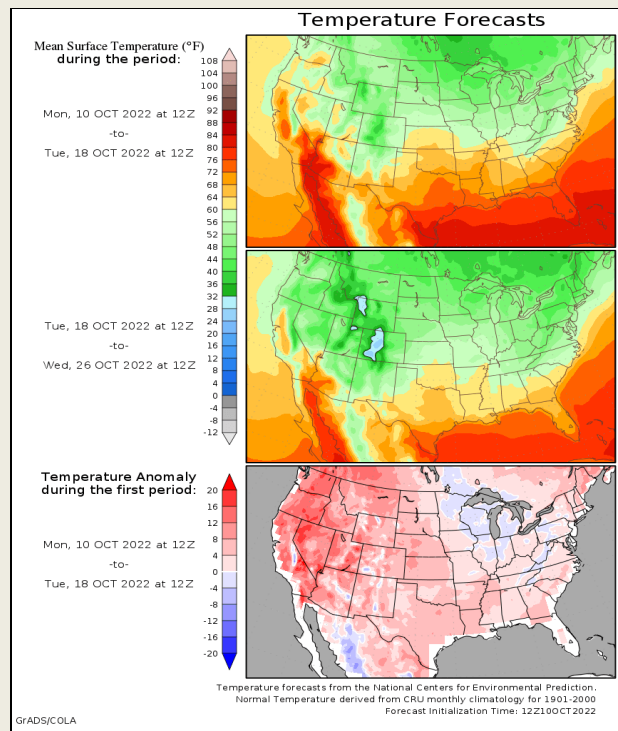
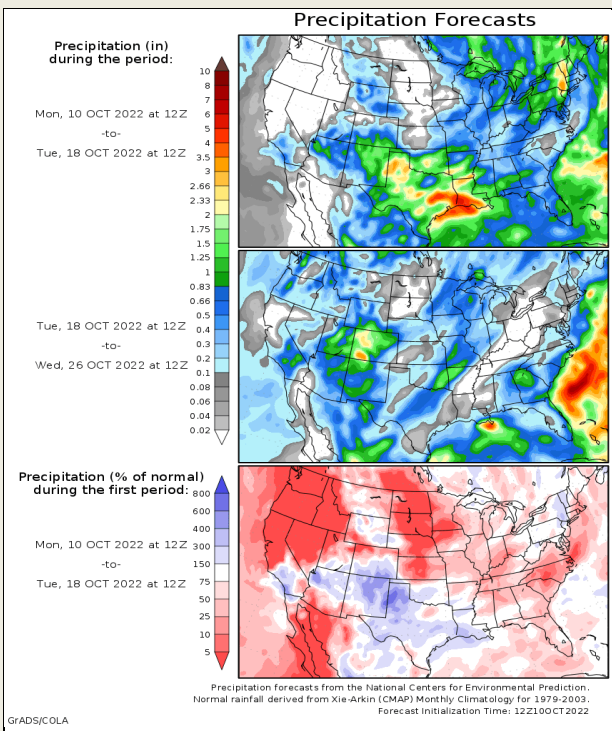
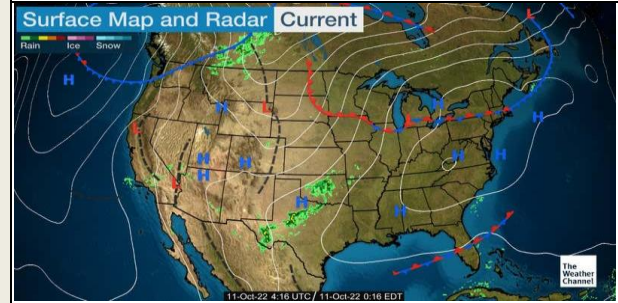
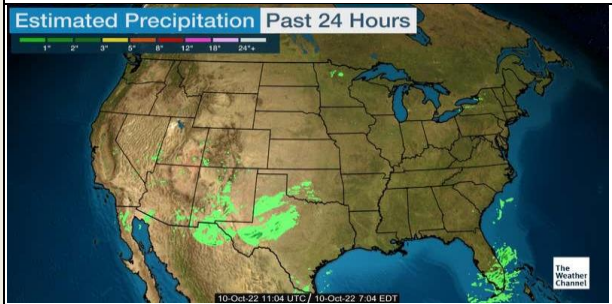
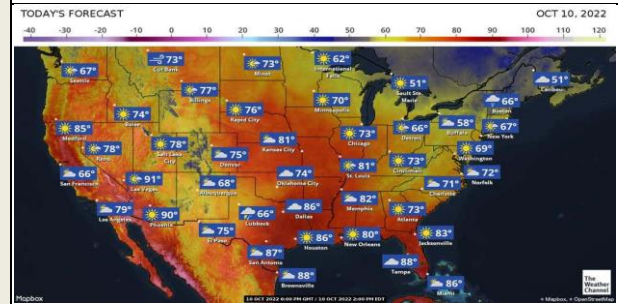
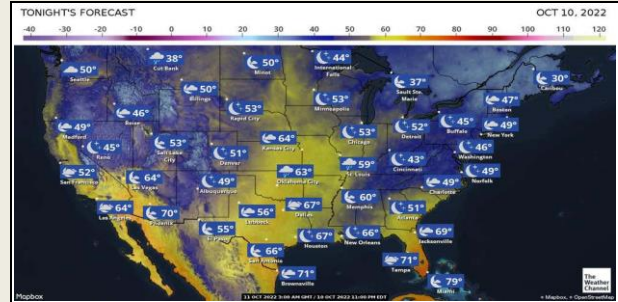

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Good harvest progress will continue through the next two weeks with rain events Tuesday into next Thursday and Oct. 15-16 likely to cause only temporary interruptions to fieldwork. Each round of rain will be important in winter wheat areas with the greatest need for rain in the southwestern Corn Belt. Temperatures today will contrast from highs in the 40s in the far northwest to the upper 70s and lower 80s in southwestern and south-central areas and by Friday highs will be in the upper 40s to the middle 60s before this weekend is warmer and warmer than usual temperatures are common Monday through Wednesday.

o Cooling will occur late next week.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see two more weeks of mostly favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting with less rain advertised for Oct. 13-14 leaving many winter crop areas from the Delta to Georgia in need of rain.

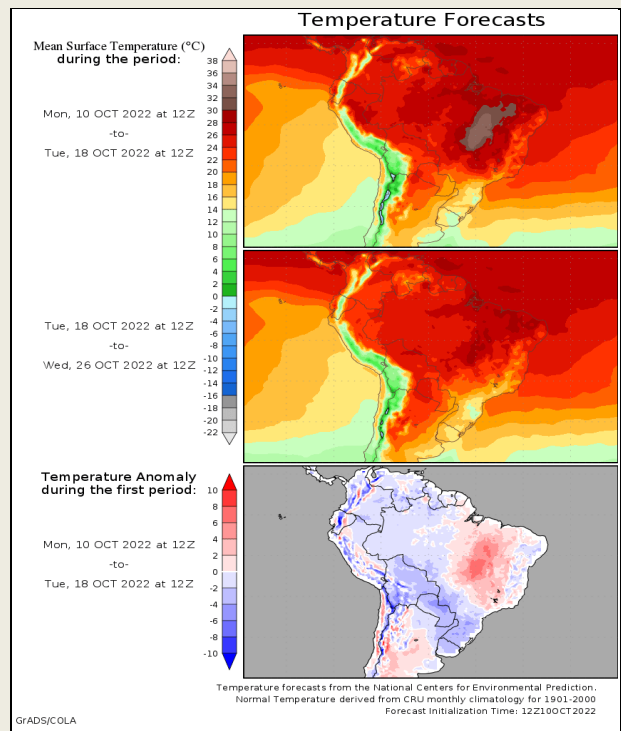
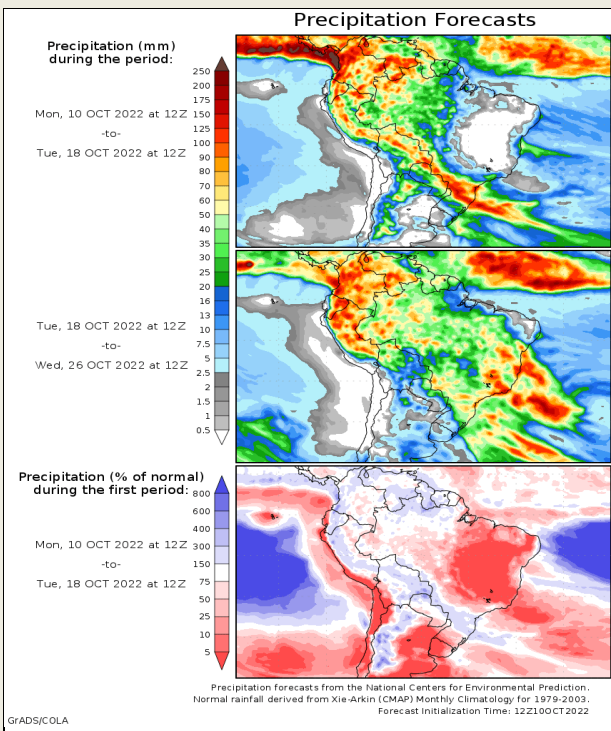
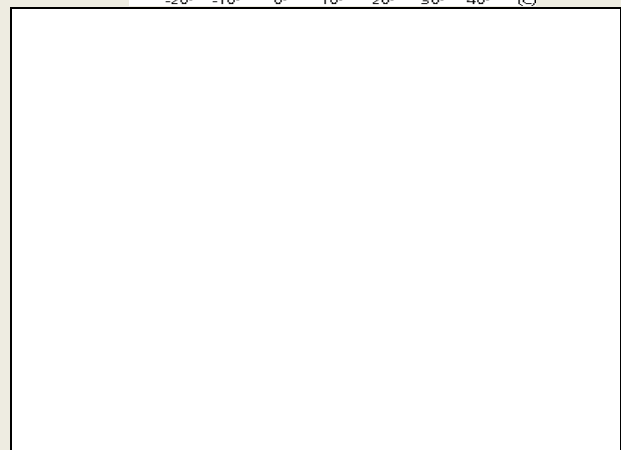
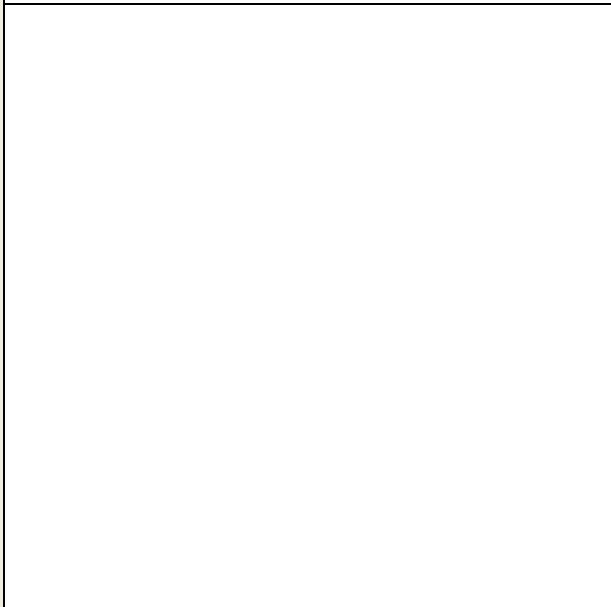
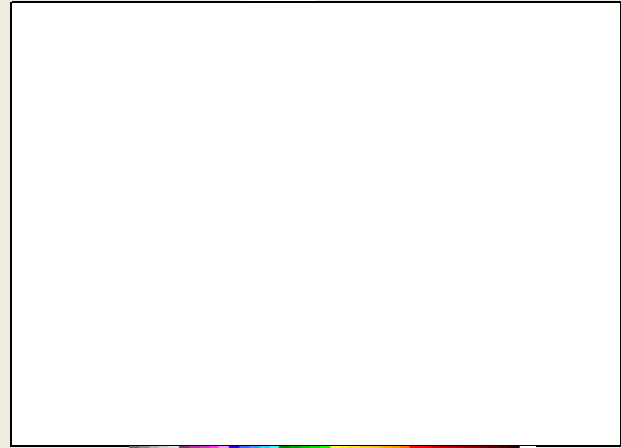
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Much of Brazil and Paraguay will see a good mix of rain and sunshine and favorable conditions for planting and establishment of summer crops through the next two weeks. Exceptions will occur from northern Goiás into northern Minas Gerais and Bahia where little rain is expected while northeastern Mato Grosso will see little rain through Friday before rain increases Saturday through Tuesday.

o Rain will fall frequently enough in parts of southern Brazil to slow planting at times, but the focus of rain should shift often enough to prevent extended delays to fieldwork.

ARGENTINA: A drier weather pattern will resume today and much of the moisture from Wednesday's rain will soon be lost to evaporation leaving nearly all of the country in need of rain to improve conditions for planting and establishment of summer crops.

o Totally dry weather is not expected and some southern, eastern, and northern areas will receive light rain into Saturday with a low-confidence rain event possible in central and northern areas Oct. 15-16.

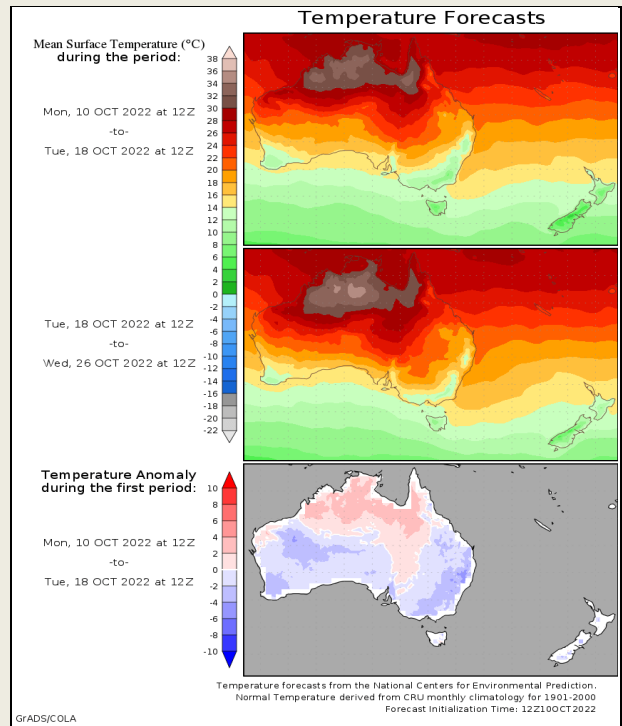
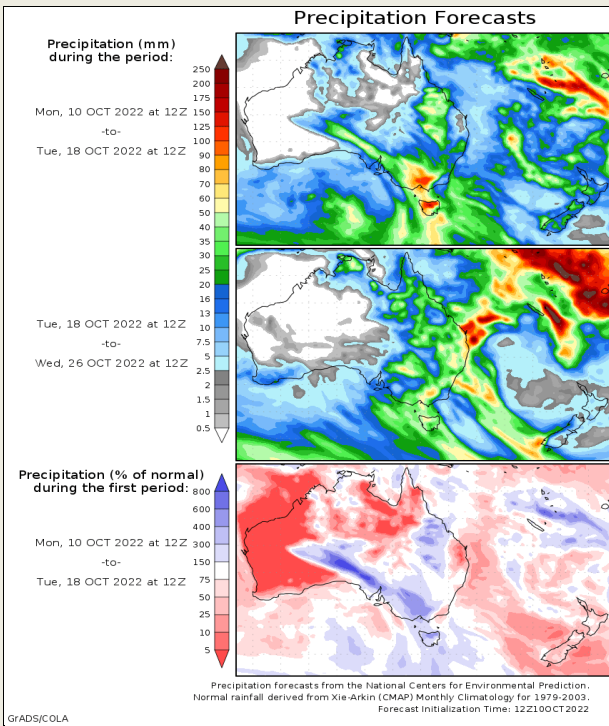
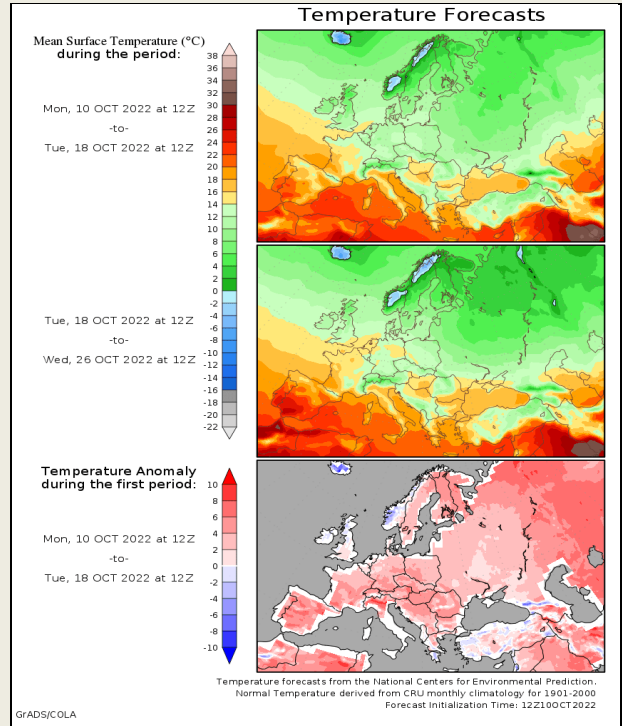
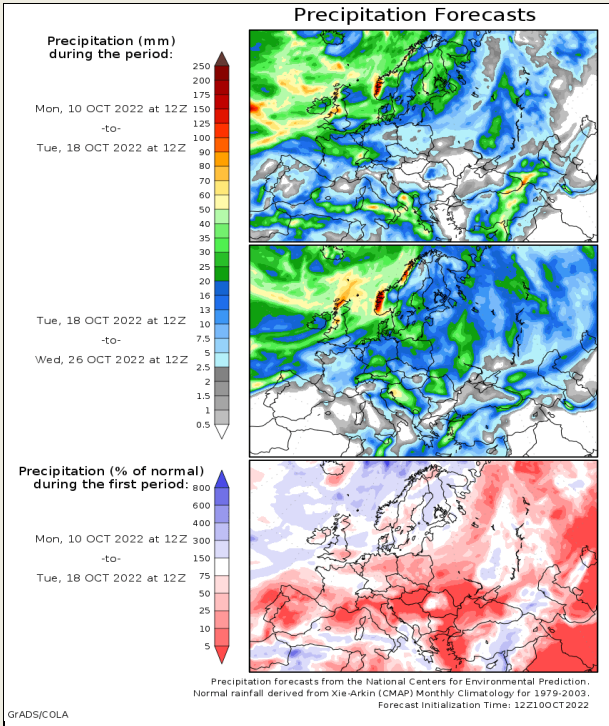

EUROPE: A lack of much rain in the first week of the outlook will still be beneficial for greater fieldwork and harvest progress of summer crops. Planting will continue to advance favorably with the moisture that is in the ground from recent rainfall. A few localized areas of Spain and Italy may receive a more meaningful amount of rain.

AUSTRALIA: Rounds of significant rain in New South Wales, Victoria, and southern Queensland through Saturday will lead to areas of flooding and raise concern over wet weather disease. Crop quality declines are still likely and fieldwork delays are expected. Elsewhere in Australia, rainfall in the first week of the outlook will be lighter and more favorable.
