
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
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
South Africa - Weather


Eastern South Africa will continue to see several waves of rain during the coming week. The rain will gradually bolster soil moisture and support a better environment for planting and establishment of th ummer crops. Winter wheat harvesting may be sluggish in the wettest areas of Free State. The wheat harvest in Northern Cape and Western Cape will otherwise advance with few disruptions. • The astern half of South Africa will have several opportunities for rain during the coming week o Erratic rainfall will evolve on a near daily basis o Moisture totals by next Thursday morning will range from 0.75-4.00" with locally greater amounts in Natal and Mpumalanga

- Portions of Limpopo and North West will also only receive 0.25-0.75" of rain
- The western half of South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week
- o Western sections of Free State and North West into eastern Northern Cape will receive 0.25-0.75" of
- o Little to no rain is slated for the remaining locations
- Eastern South Africa will again see a mix of rain and sunshine October 28 November 3 o Western South Africa will remain drier than normal









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United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Two rounds of organized precipitation during the next two weeks will interrupt fieldwork with the soil dry enough and most of the precipitation not likely to be heavy enough to cause more than brief interruptions.


o Winter wheat areas will benefit from the moisture, but a close watch will be made on the westcentral and southwestern Corn Belt where precipitation will likely be minimal and wheat will be left in need of greater rain to improve conditions for establishment.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast should see good harvest progress through the next two weeks as only one round of well-organized rain is expected with that event occurring Monday night into Wednesday when the moisture will be beneficial for winter crops.


Northeastern North Carolina and southeastern Virginia should see rain this weekend

o Some computer forecast models are advertising another round of rain Oct. 27-29, but this event is likely exaggerated by these models and drier weather appears likely with a close watch on the period warranted as confidence is low.









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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Much of southern Brazil and Paraguay will receive additional rain into Friday slowing fieldwork while Paraguay to Parana may become wet enough to raise concerns over winter wheat quality declines before drier weather Friday through Nov. 3 allows for quick improvements in conditions for fieldwork.


o The western half of Mato Grosso will also see rain that will be good for summer crops while causing ome interruptions to fieldwork.


ARGENTINA: Additional rain into Saturday morning and Monday into Wednesday will leave much of the country with improvements in conditions for planting and germination of summer crops before drier weather Oct. 27-Nov. 3 allows fieldwork to quickly increase.











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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Rain in the next seven days will still be greatest in northwestern production areas where some fieldwork delays will be possible as a result. Needed, significant rainfall is expected in Portugal and parts of Spain which will raise the topsoil moisture. Conditions will likely be driest from Italy through the Balkan Countries and the need for more rain in this part of the region will increase more.

AUSTRALIA: A wet weather pattern will continue the next two weeks in all key production areas except Western Australia where there will be drier conditions. The rain will be greatest in Victoria, New South Wales, and Queensland which will lead to more fieldwork delays, concerns of wet weather disease, and also more areas of flooding.









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
