



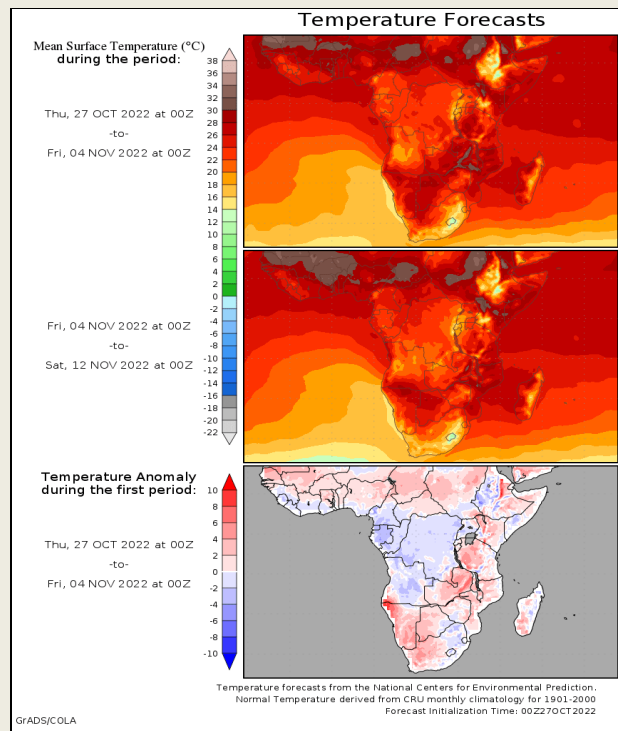
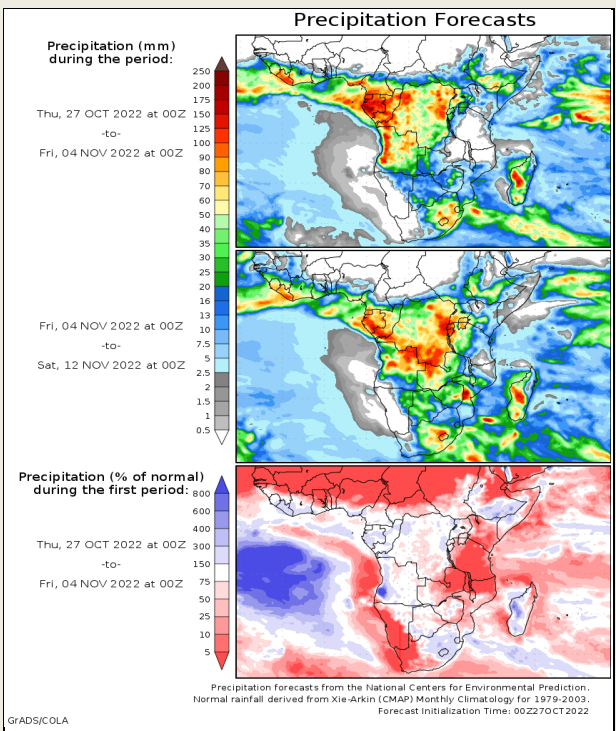
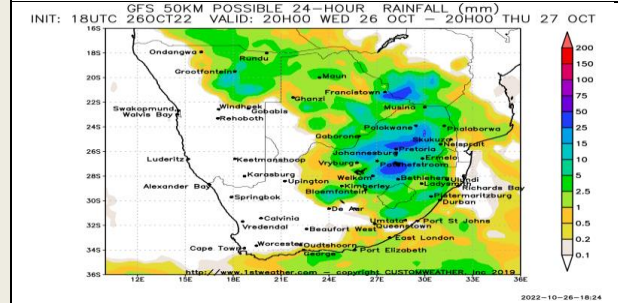
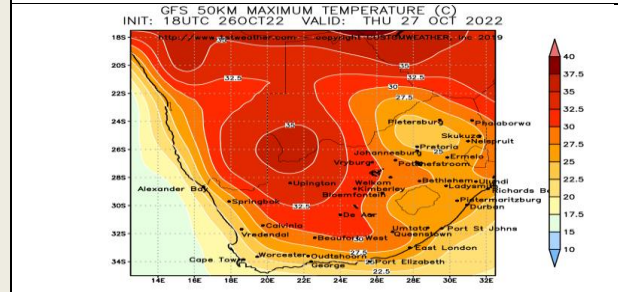
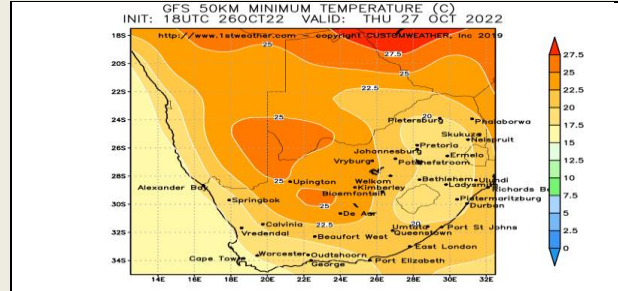
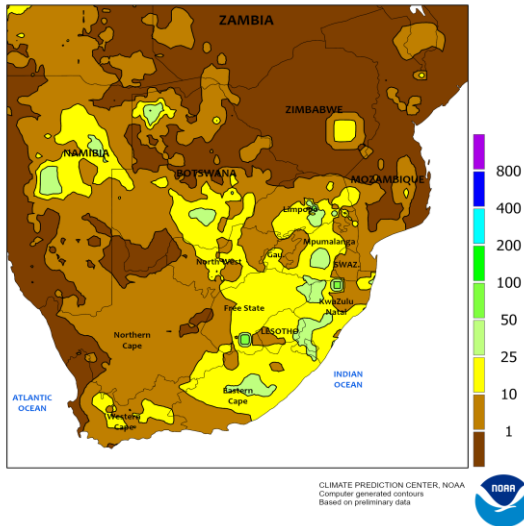
Weather Report

27 October 2022

South Africa - Weather

Eastern South Africa will continue to have several opportunities for rain through the middle of next week. The wet weather pattern will help bolster soil moisture across the region. Planting and establishment conditions will either improve or remain favorable. Harvesting of winter wheat may otherwise be sluggish in Free State. The wheat harvest in Northern Cape and Western Cape will otherwise advance with few disruptions. • The eastern half of South Africa will have several opportunities for rain through the middle of next week
o Rain will evolve on a near daily basis o Moisture totals by next Wednesday morning will range from 1.50-4.00" with locally greater amounts, most notably in Natal, Mpumalanga, and eastern Free State • The western half of South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week o Western sections of Free State, North West, and Eastern Cape will still see periods of rain with pockets receiving 0.25-1.00" and locally greater amounts by next Wednesday morning o Little to no rain is expected elsewhere
• Eastern South Africa will again see a mix of rain and sunshine November 3 – 9
o Western South Africa will remain drier than normal

October 16 - 22, 2022



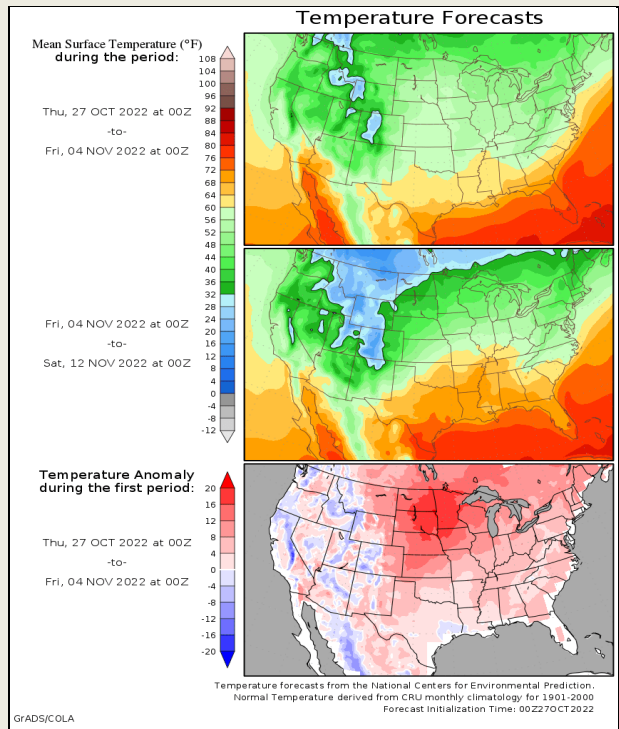
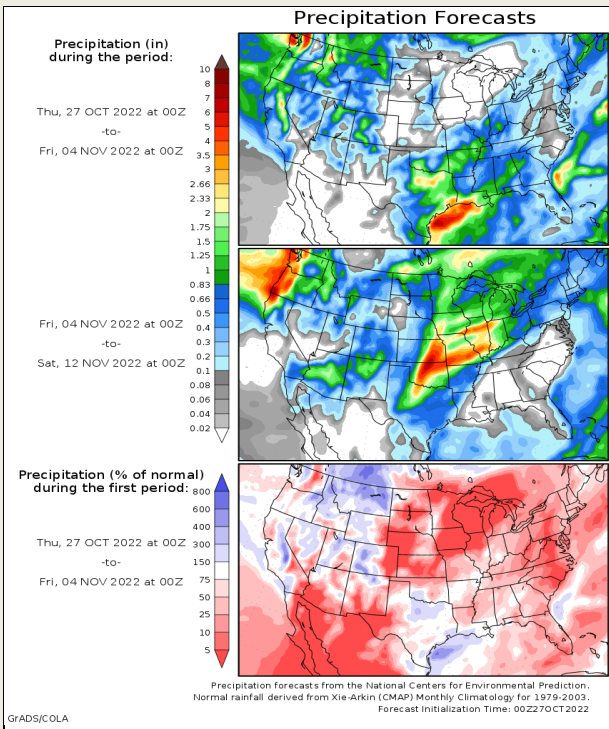
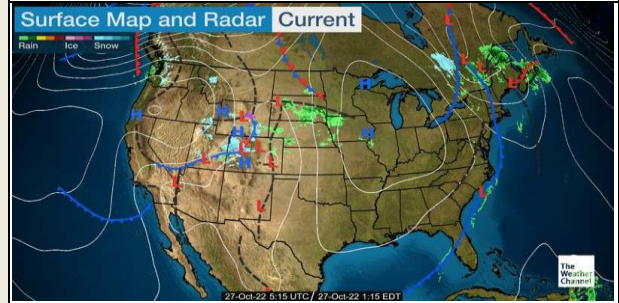
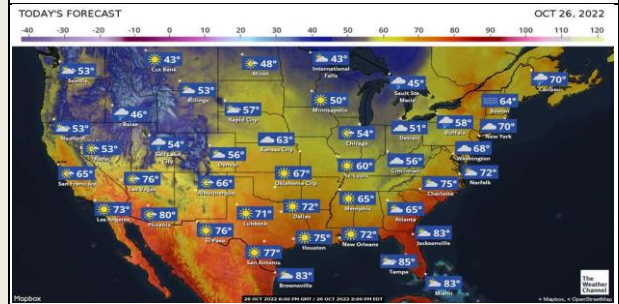
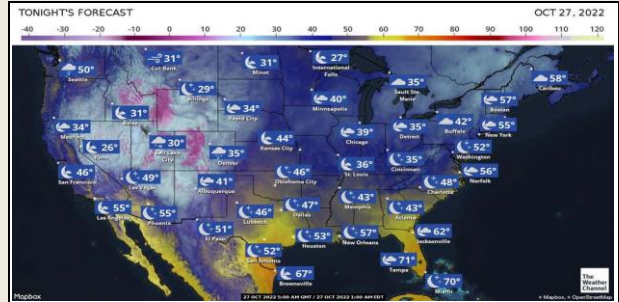
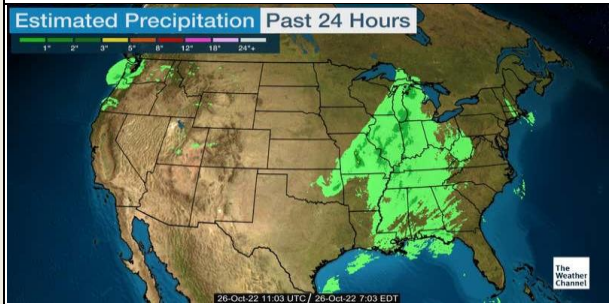
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see a few rounds of rain during the next two weeks that will interrupt harvesting while inducing additional improvements in conditions for establishment of winter wheat. The soil is dry enough in much of the region that harvesting should advance between rounds of rain. High temperatures today will contrast from the upper 40s to the lower 60s in most of the western Corn Belt to the 70s from Kentucky to Ohio and Michigan before highs Wednesday into Monday are in the 50s through the middle 60s most often with some warming in the lower Midwest Tuesday into Wednesday of next week.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Good harvest progress is expected overall through the next two weeks in the Delta and the Southeast where the few rounds of rain expected should not soak the soil enough to prevent fieldwork from advancing before and after each round of precipitation while the moisture will benefit winter crops.

o Southeastern Georgia to southern Virginia will receive the least rain.

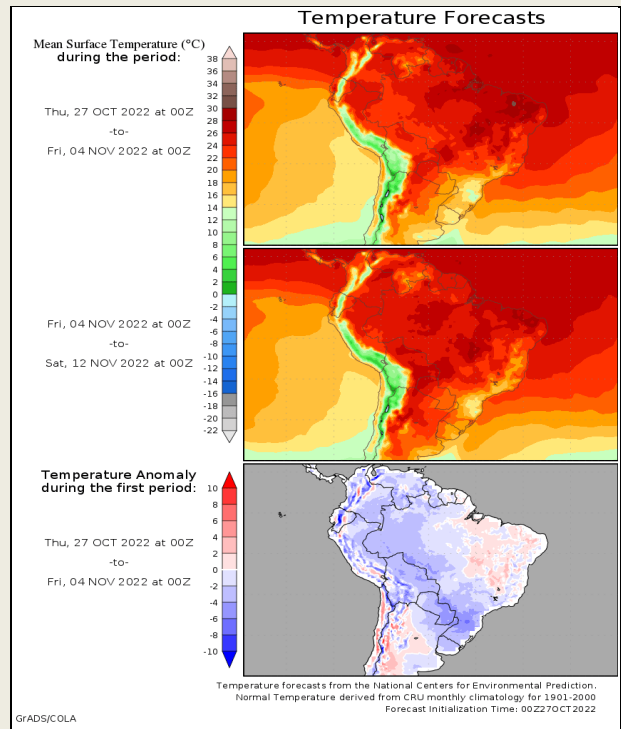
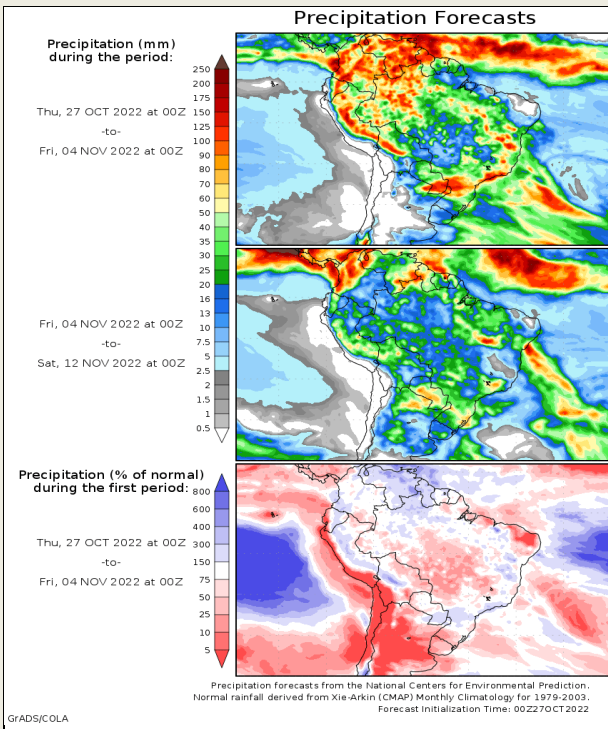
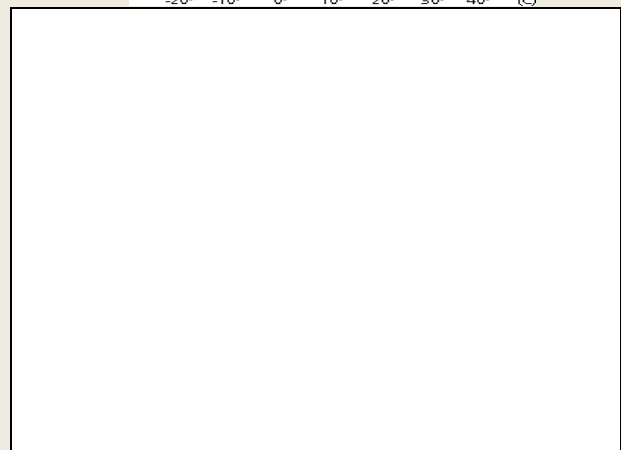
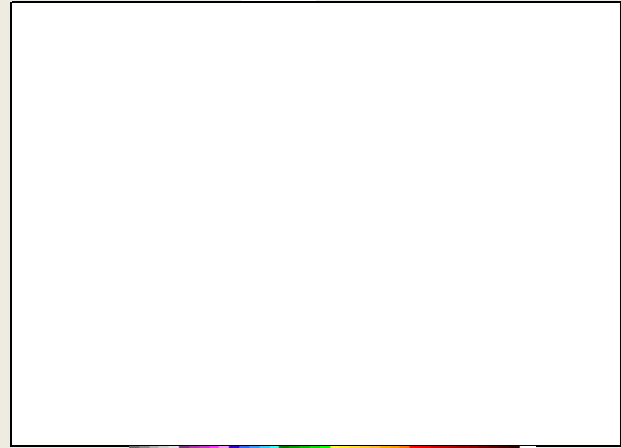


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Much of Brazil and Paraguay will see a good mix of rain and sunshine through the next two weeks that will maintain or improve conditions for summer crop planting and establishment while the focus of rain should shift often enough to allow fieldwork to advance between rounds of precipitation. A close watch will be made on the rainfall distribution starting Sunday as parts of southern Mato Grosso, central Goias to central to northern Minas Gerais, and central and eastern Rio Grande do Sul will see little rain through Saturday.

ARGENTINA: Additional rounds of rain into Wednesday and Saturday into Sunday will leave much of the country with improvements in conditions for planting and germination of summer crops before drier weather Monday-Nov. 8 allows fieldwork to quickly increase. o Santiago del Estero and some nearby areas will miss much of this week's rain and will remain in need of rain to improve conditions for planting. The drier weather expected to begin Monday will cause the soil to quickly dry out again and much of the country will need rain soon to ensure crops become well-established.

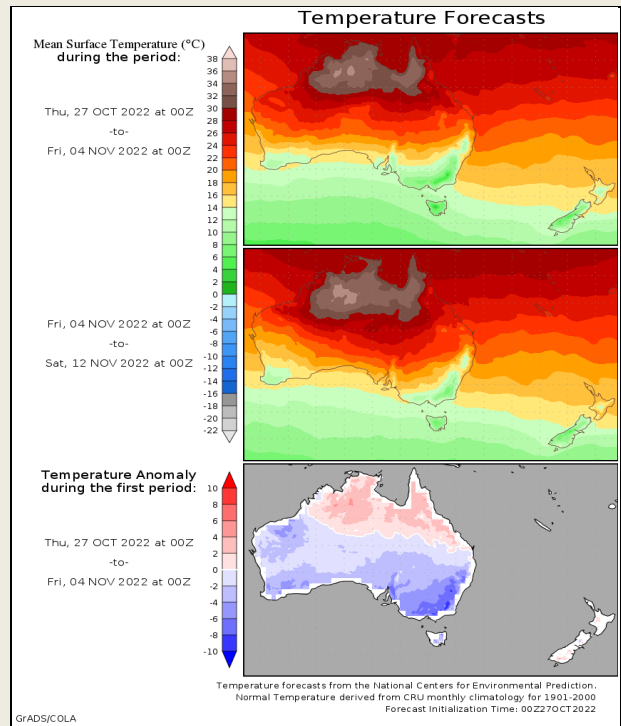
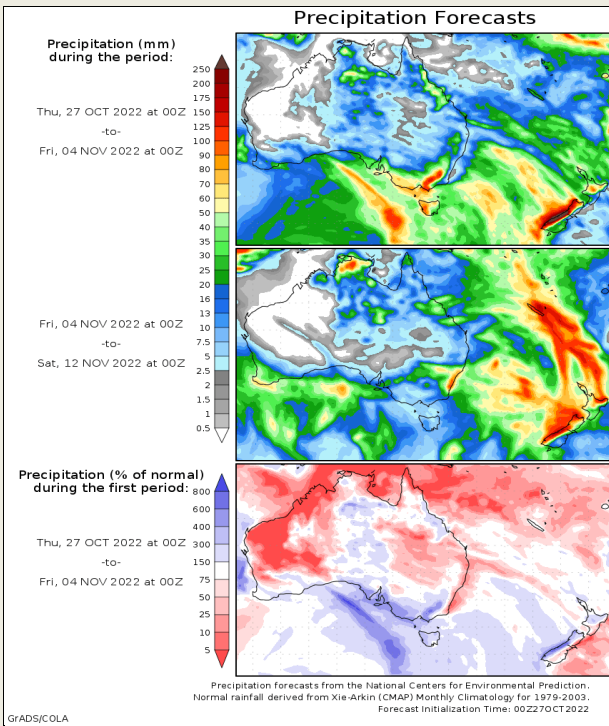
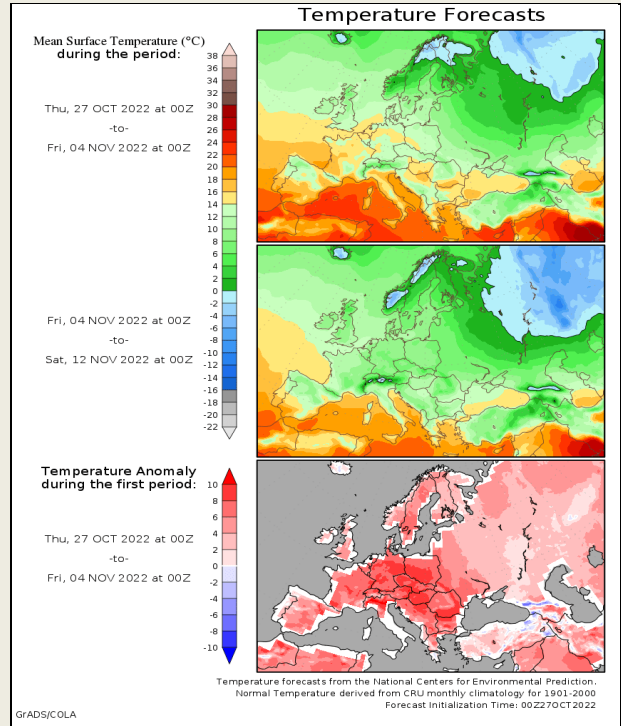
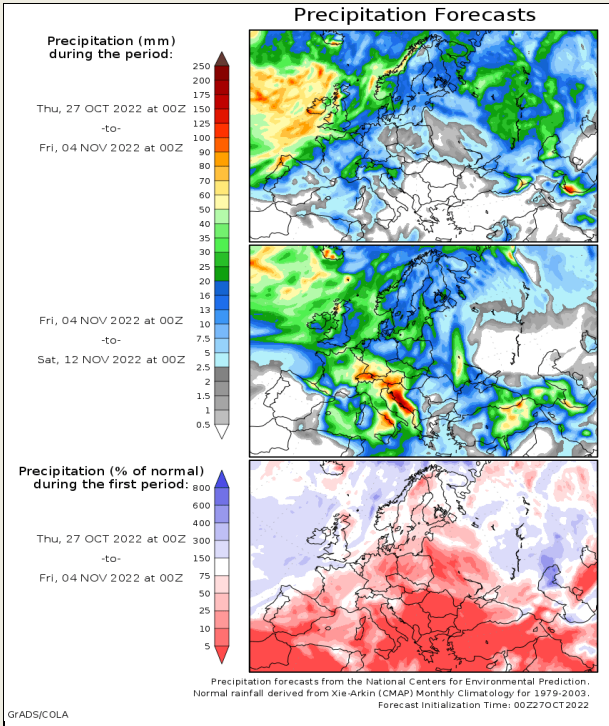


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Rain in the next seven days will still be greatest in northwestern production areas where some fieldwork delays will be possible as a result. Needed, significant rainfall is expected in Portugal and parts of Spain which will raise the topsoil moisture. Conditions will likely be driest from Italy through the Balkan Countries and the need for more rain in this part of the region will increase more.

AUSTRALIA: Conditions in the first week of the outlook will be an improvement over the previous week; however, some areas will continue to be wetter than preferred, especially in the far southeast part of the region. Temperatures will be seasonably warm in eastern production areas which will help with drying between areas of rain. Temperatures in the second week will be unusually cool; though, less rain is also expected.



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
