

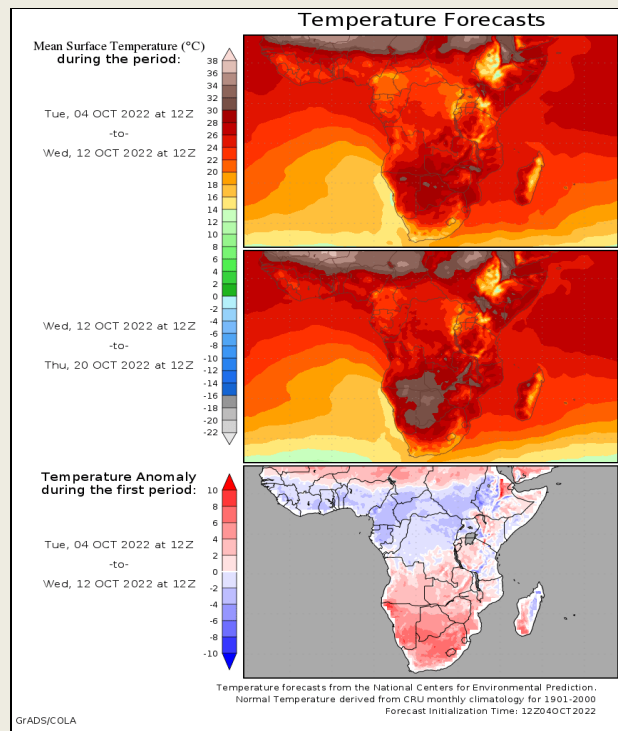
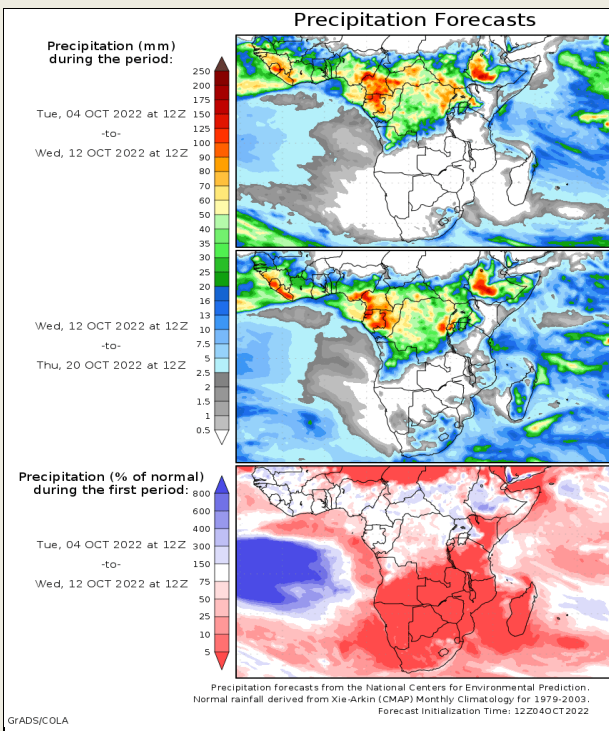
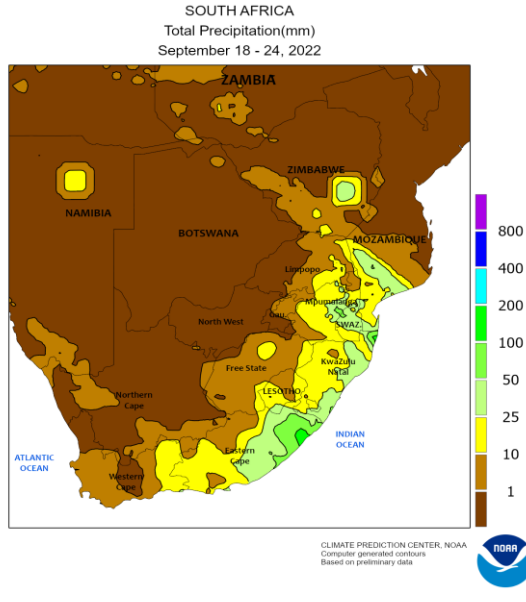
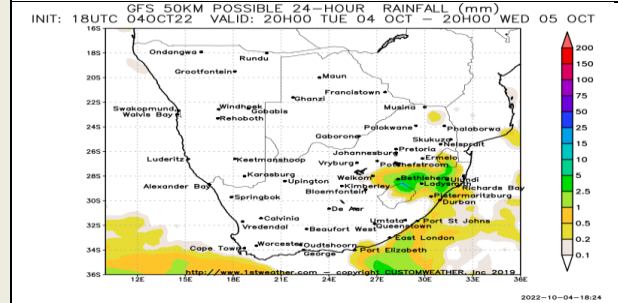
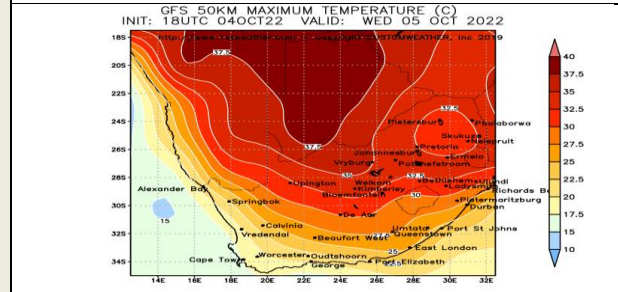
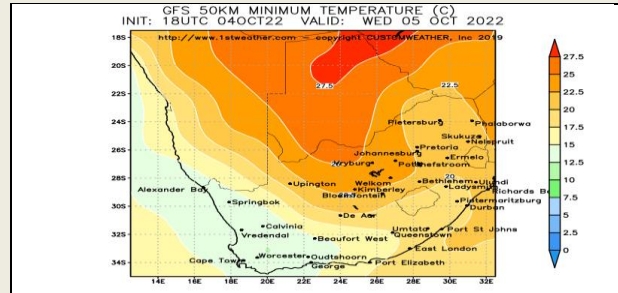


Weather Report

05 October 2022

South Africa - Weather

Drier-biased weather and some very warm temperatures will continue for much of South Africa during the coming week. The warmest weather will be in the northeast half of the nation. Winter wheat maturation and harvesting will advance swiftly. Planting of summer crops may get off to a slow start in portions of eastern and central South Africa due to the lack of rain and shortage of moisture. • A large section of South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week
o Periods of light rain will still occur in Eastern Cape, Natal, Western Cape, and neighboring areas
o However, resulting rainfall will either be lost to evaporation or too light to impact long-term soil conditions
• Eastern South Africa will see a mix of light rain and sunshine October 12 – 18
o The remaining locations will be drier biased

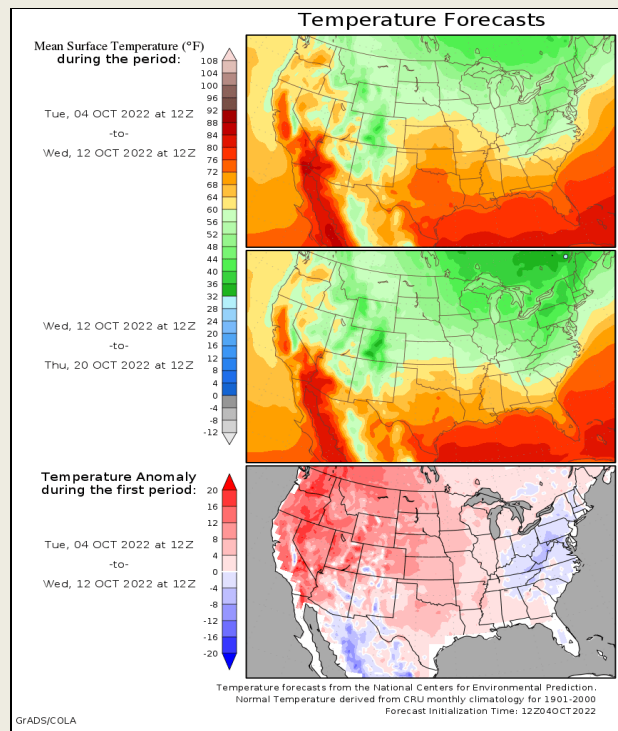
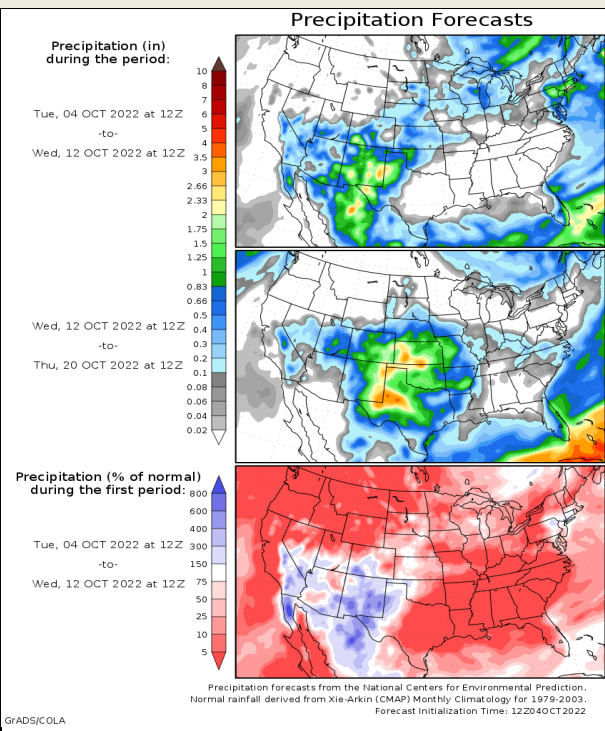
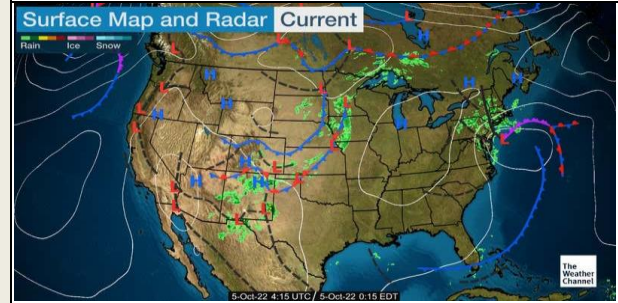
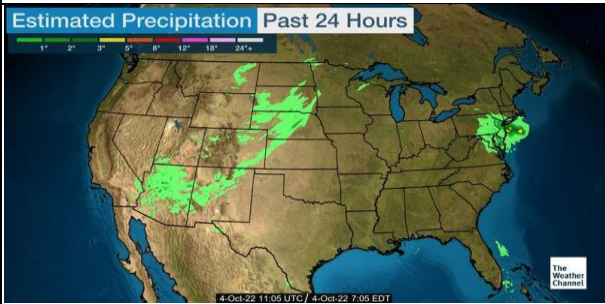
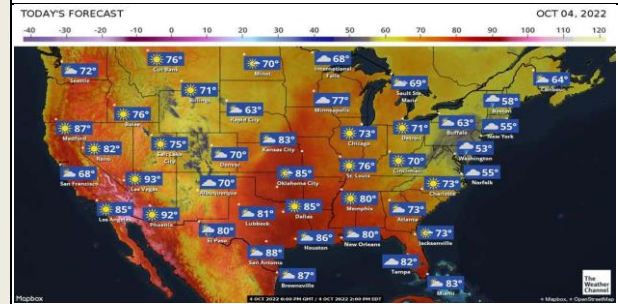
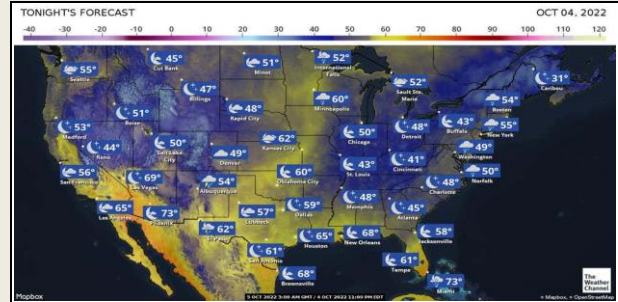
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Two more weeks of mostly favorable harvest weather will occur with one round of organized rain Oct. 11-13 and a few showers on occasion that will favor the northwestern Corn Belt through the Great Lakes region.

o Rain Oct. 11-13 will be important in winter wheat areas with the greatest need for rain in the southwestern Corn Belt.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see two more weeks of mostly favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting with some additional drying time needed before fieldwork can resume in parts of the Carolinas and Virginia while today's forecast is wetter than what was advertised Monday for Oct. 13-14.

o Rain should return to a large part of the Delta and the Southeast Oct. 13-14 and the resulting interruptions to fieldwork should be brief while the moisture will be beneficial for winter crops.

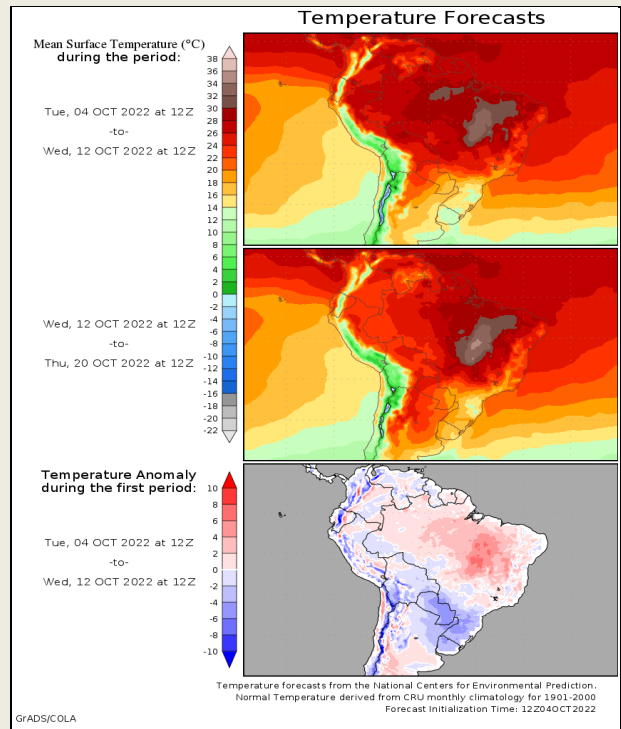
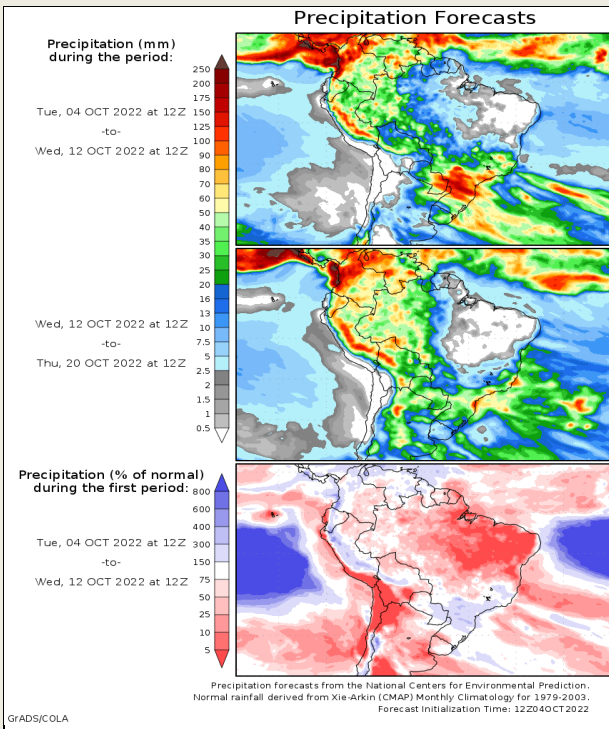
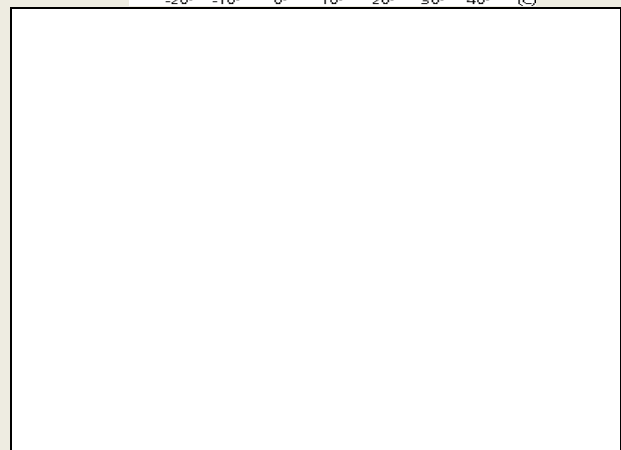
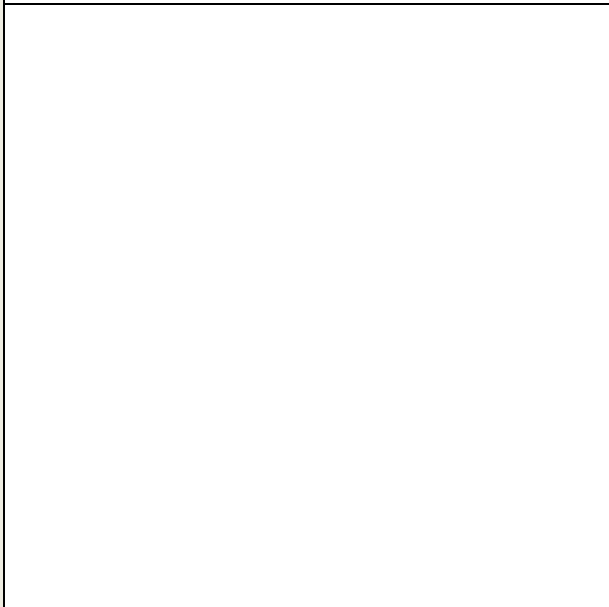
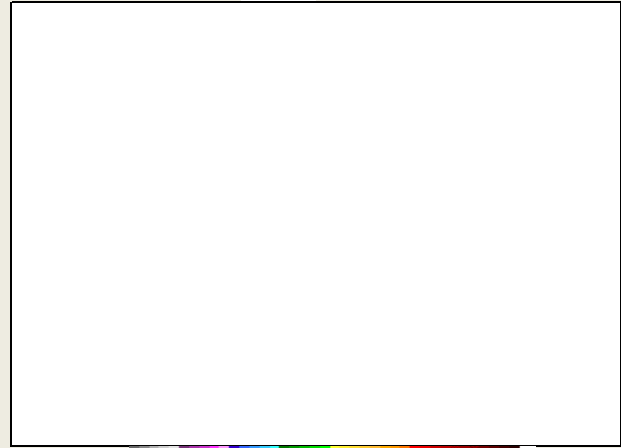

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Much of Brazil and Paraguay will see a good mix of rain and sunshine and favorable conditions for planting and establishment of summer crops through the next two weeks. Exceptions will occur from northeastern Mato Grosso to northern Goias into northern Minas Gerais and Bahia where little rain is expected with today's forecast drier than what was advertised Monday for Oct. 12-18. Rain will fall frequently enough in parts of Paraguay and southern Brazil to slow planting at times, but the focus of rain should shift often enough to prevent extended delays to fieldwork.

ARGENTINA: Much of Argentina will receive at least some rain Tuesday into Thursday and improvements in conditions for planting and establishment of crops should result, but outside some northern areas, much of the rain will not be great enough to induce a lasting increase in soil moisture. Follow-up rain will be needed soon to prevent the soil from quickly drying out again and little additional rain is expected through the next two weeks outside of some light showers in the south and north Friday into Saturday.

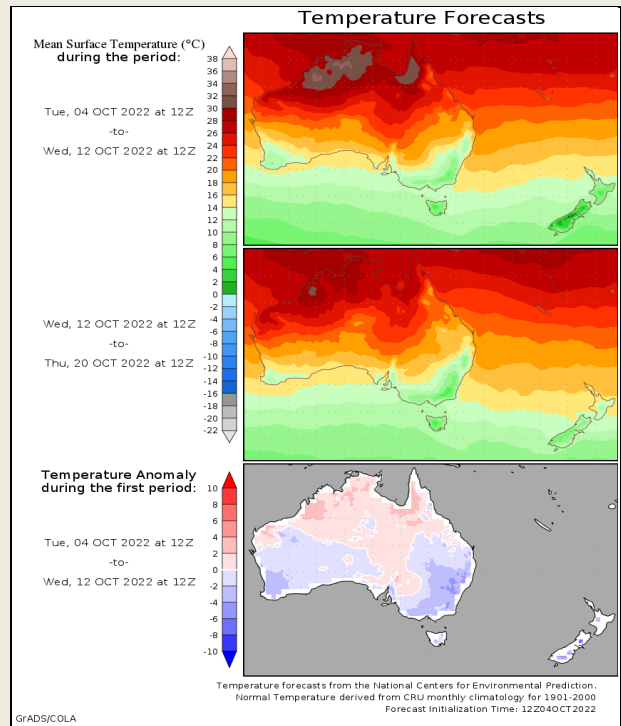
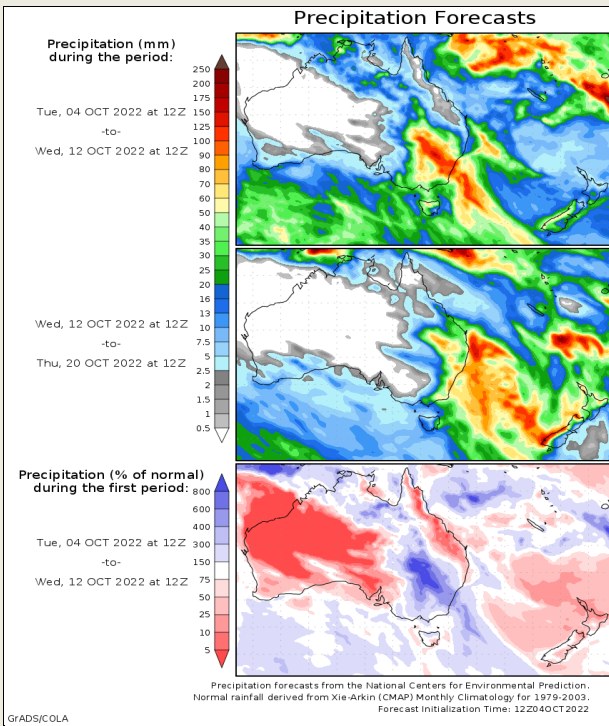
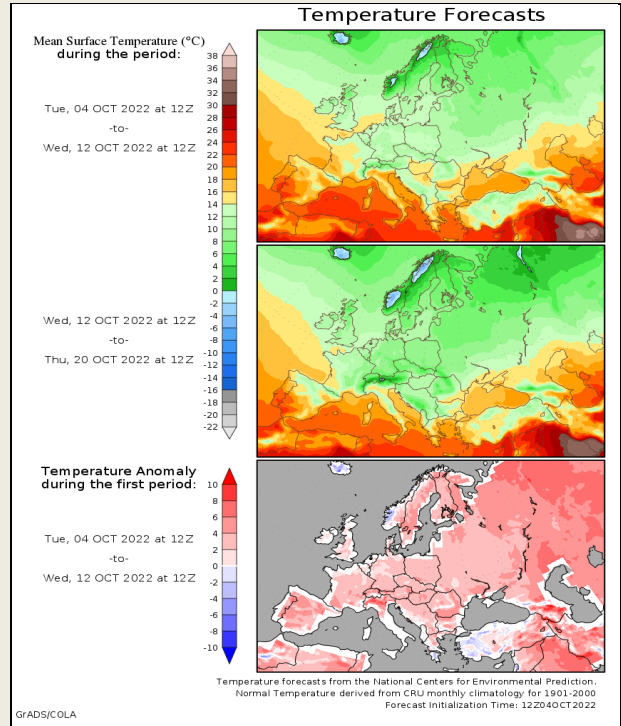
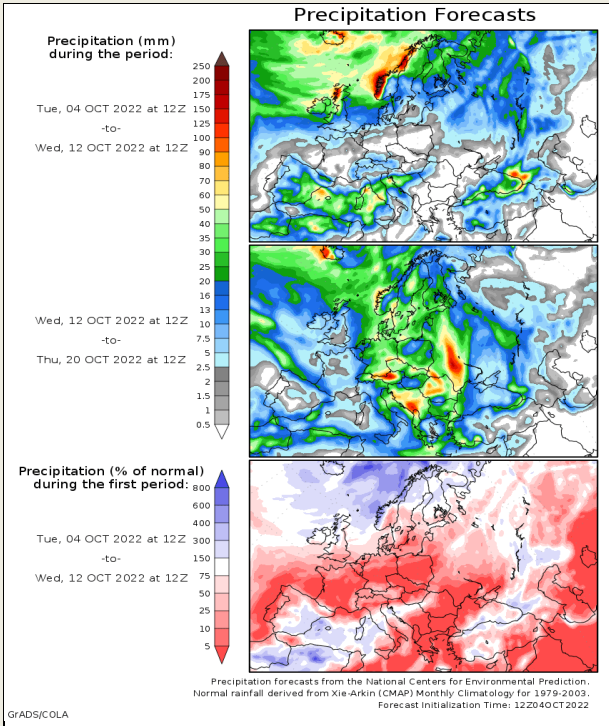

EUROPE: A lack of much rain in the first week of the outlook will be beneficial for greater fieldwork and harvest progress of summer crops. Planting will advance favorably with the moisture that is in the ground from recent rainfall.

AUSTRALIA: Significant rain will occur in the first week of the outlook in much of New South Wales and Victoria into southwestern Queensland. The rain will be enough to cause flooding and raise concern over wet weather disease. Crop quality declines are likely and fieldwork delays are expected. Elsewhere in the Australia, rain will be lighter and more favorable.
