
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
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
South Africa - Weather


SOUTH AFRICA: Eastern and central South Africa will see several waves of rain this week. The frequent rainfall will continue to bolster soil moisture in the main summer crop production areas. Planting may advance slowly during the wettest periods, though most producers will have opportunities to get into the fields between rain events. Establishment and early-season development conditions will remain favorable.

Frequent rainfall in Free State, Western Cape, and portions of Northern Cape may slow winter wheat harvesting at times this week. Minor quality declines will be possible in the wettest locations of Free State as well. • Eastern and central South Africa will see several waves of rain this week o Some of the most widespread and significant rain will evolve Tuesday into Friday o Moisture totals by next Monday morning will range from 1.50-4.00" with locally greater amounts in Natal, Mpumalanga, and eastern Free State • Western South Africa will see variable rainfall this week o Western Cape and portions of southern and eastern Northern Cape will see a mix of rain and sunshine
Moisture totals by next Monday morning will range from 0.75-4.00" o Other areas in Northern Cape will only have a few opportunities for light rain










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
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
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
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Good harvest progress is expected overall during the next two weeks around one round of widespread precipitation Thursday evening into Sunday that will induce improvements in conditions for establishment of winter wheat in many areas while some relief from drought occurs in the western Corn Belt. The soil is dry enough that event where heavy rain falls in the southwestern Corn Belt delays to fieldwork should not become extended. Temperatures will be much warmer than normal to unseasonably warm through much of the next week and highs will generally be in the 50s through the lower 70s with some cooler temperatures in the northwest and some warmer temperatures in the south. Cooling will occur during the early to middle part of next week. U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a mostly restricted rainfall pattern through the next two week and harvesting should advance well overall with some rain today from Georgia to North Carolina and southern Virginia and some rain Saturday evening into Sunday from the Delta to northeastern Mississippi.









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



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
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
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: The two-week outlook is mostly favorable for planting and development of summer crops as much of Brazil and Paraguay will see a mix of rain and sunshine that should allow for good harvest progress of winter wheat as well while the driest areas in northeastern Brazil benefit from significant rain this week. A close watch will be made on the rainfall distribution Nov. 8-14 from Mato Grosso to Paraguay to Rio Grande do Sul as rain through next Monday in the region will be light and infrequent and many areas will be in need of rain to keep the soil moist enough to favorably support crops. ARGENTINA: A drier weather pattern will occur during the next two weeks and planting should advance swiftly while the one round of rain advertised for Nov. 8-10 will be important in preventing the soil from becoming too dry. Another round of frost and freezes will occur Tuesday morning and similar to what occurred this morning, some newly planted crops as well as some winter wheat may be damaged by the cold while much of the country's summer crops have not been planted or will not be emerged when the cold arrives.









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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: A restricted precipitation pattern will continue today and Tuesday


o However, some heavy rain will occur with isolated to scattered rain showers and thunderstorms over southeastern Spain into central Italy and into Bosnia, Montenegro, Albania and southern Serbia and Macedonia. Moisture totals will vary from 0.75 to 3.00 inches and locally more.

AUSTRALIA: Rain fell in most of the nation during the weekend and those areas that missed rain in Queensland were expecting it today. The moisture has left all crop areas in the nation either favorably moisture of excessively wet. Net drying is expected over the coming week after rain ends tonight and Tuesday. The drier conditions will help improve crop and field working conditions throughout the east where it has been too wet. Patches of soft frost occurred in Western Australia this morning, but the ewas no negative impact on crops. Cool conditions will shift to South Australia for Tuesday morning, but no crop damaging cold is expected.









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
