
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
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
#### South Africa - Weather


SOUTH AFRICA: Eastern and central South Africa will continue to have several opportunities for rain hrough the end of next week. Rainfall will be enough to bolster or keep soil moisture at adequate evels. The environment will remain favorable for aggressive establishment and development. Winter wheat harvesting may also be sluggish in Free State. Western South Africa will remain drier biased through the end of next week. Harvesting of winter wheat will advance swiftly. • Eastern and central south Africa will see several waves of rain during the coming week o The most widespread and significant rain will evolve through the end of the weekend with some light showers continuing next


- o Moisture totals by next Friday morning will range from 1.00-4.00" with locally greater amounts
- Western South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week
- Any rain that does occur will generally be lost to evaporation
- Eastern and central South Africa will again see a mix of rain and sunshine November 19 25











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#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a few rounds of rain during the next two weeks that should not be great enough to prevent fieldwork from advancing between rounds of rain or to aise serious concerns over cotton quality declines.


The moisture will be beneficial for winter crops.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Late harvesting should advance well overall during the next two weeks as the soil should not have become wet enough in most areas to prevent fieldwork from resuming soon with some exceptions from eastern Kentucky to central and eastern Ohio where significant rain is xpected today and a little drying time will be needed before fieldwork can resume.


o Temperatures during the next week will likely be cold enough to in the far northwestern Corn Belt to

llow fieldwork to advance on frozen soil.









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



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
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
#### South America - Weather

BRAZIL: A few more rounds of timely rain during the next ten days will induce further improvements in soil moisture and conditions for planting and crop development across the driest areas in western and northern Brazil while breaks between rounds of rain should allow for fieldwork to advance. Or Rain will be greatest from northwestern to eastern Minas Gerais where some flooding may result. ARGENTINA: Two rounds of rain during the next ten days will induce notable improvements in conditions for planting and establishment of summer crops in much of the country while the soil should be dry enough in most areas that planting advances well between rounds of precipitation. Or Rain is not likely to be heavy enough to induce a lasting increase in soil moisture and additional rain will be needed soon to maintain improvement in soil and crop conditions that result from the coming rain.









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
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
# **Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather**


EUROPE: A restricted precipitation pattern will continue today and Tuesday


o However, some heavy rain will occur with isolated to scattered rain showers and thunderstorms over southeastern Spain into central Italy and into Bosnia, Montenegro, Albania and southern Serbia and Macedonia.
Moisture totals will vary from 0.75 to 3.00 inches and locally more.

AUSTRALIA: Shower and thunderstorm activity in the first week of the outlook will still be greatest in southeastern production areas where soil moisture is greatest. The rain is still expected to lead to additional fieldwork delays and possibly some flooding. Seasonably warm temperatures today through Saturday will continue to be good for faster drying rates and improved planting conditions; though, cooler weather is expected again in the first half of next week.









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
