

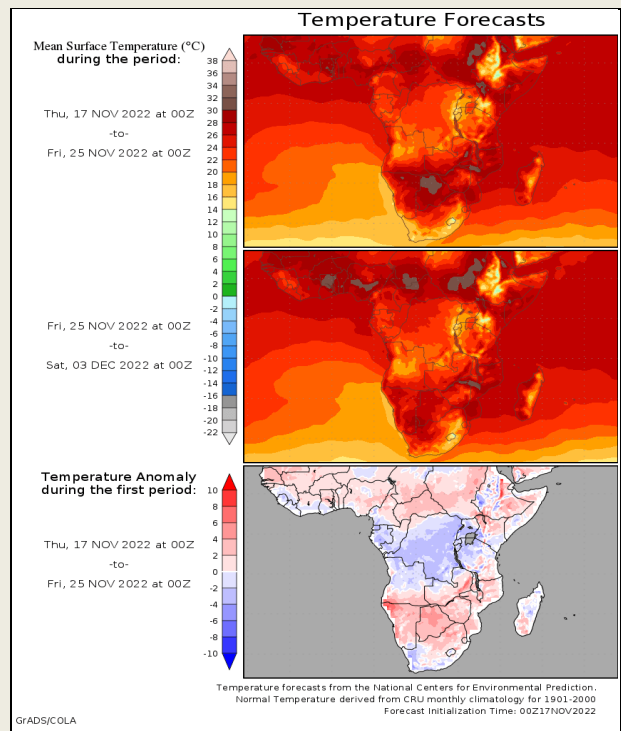
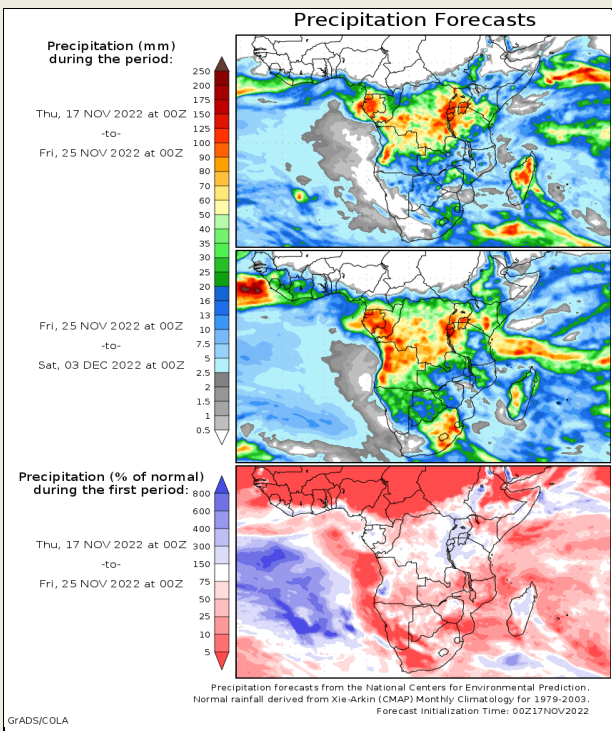
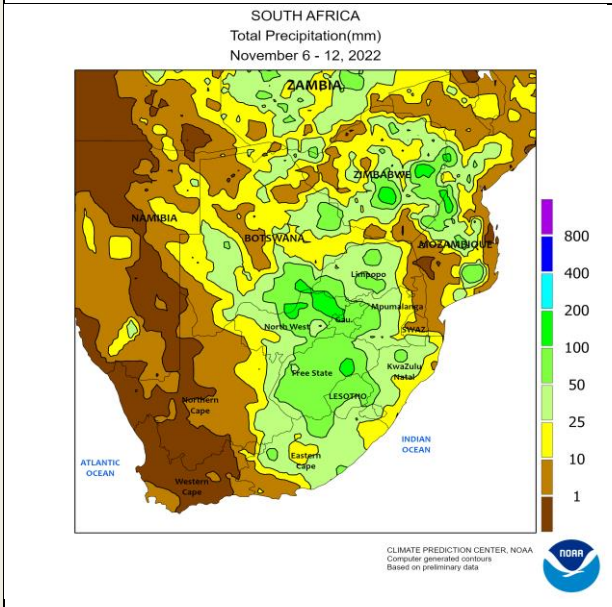
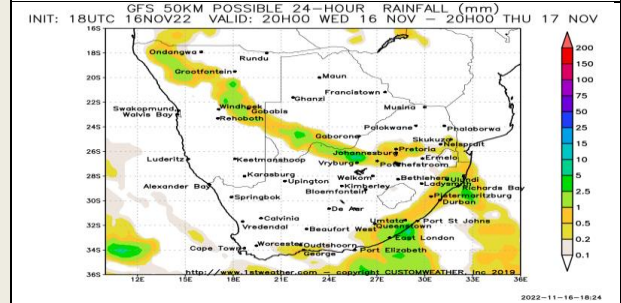
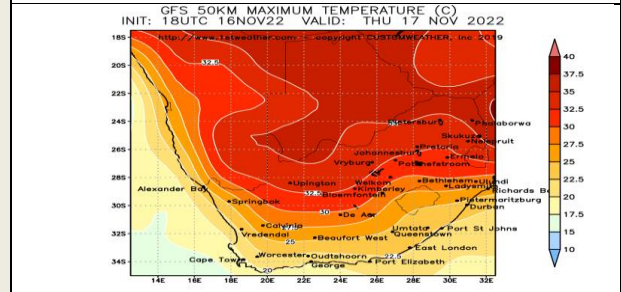
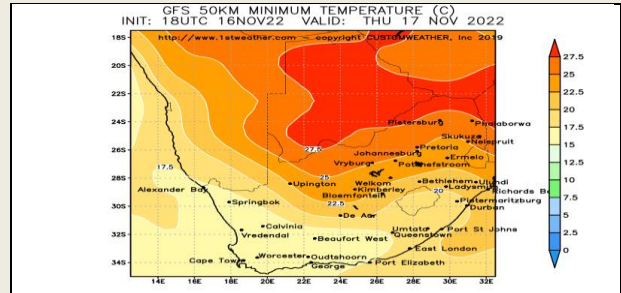


# **Weather Report**

# South Africa - Weather

**SOUTH AFRICA:** Eastern and central South Africa will continue to see alternating periods of rain and sunshine during the coming week. Many areas will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation, most notably Limpopo, North West, and neighboring areas. However, crop development conditions will remain favorable. Late-season planting and general fieldwork will advance swiftly between the rain events. Winter wheat harvesting in Free State will also continue between rain events. Western South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week. The lack of rain will promote a good environment for aggressive winter wheat harvesting. Eastern and central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week o Light rain will occasionally be scattered across these areas through Saturday before drier weather evolves Sunday and Monday o Moisture totals by next Tuesday morning will range from 0.25-2.00" with locally greater amounts in Natal o Drier pockets are also expected in Free State, North West, and Limpopo • Western South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week o Periods of erratic rain will still occur, though most locations will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation



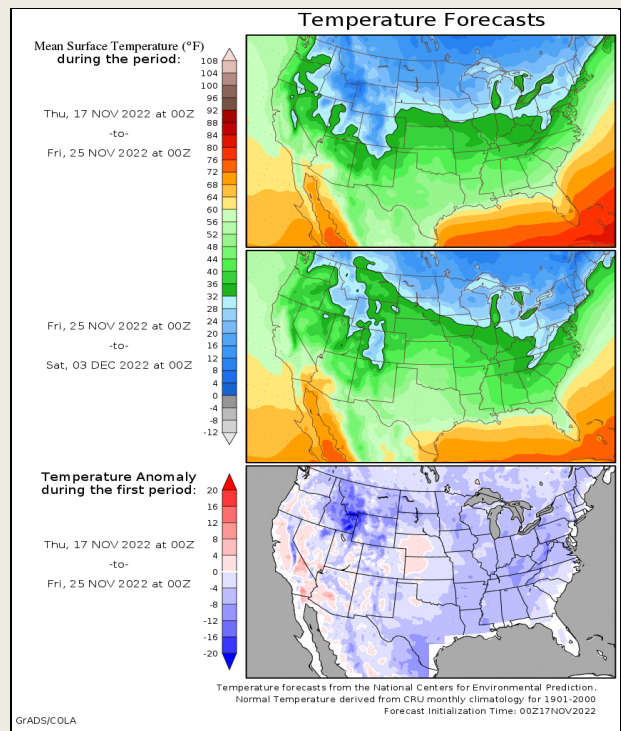
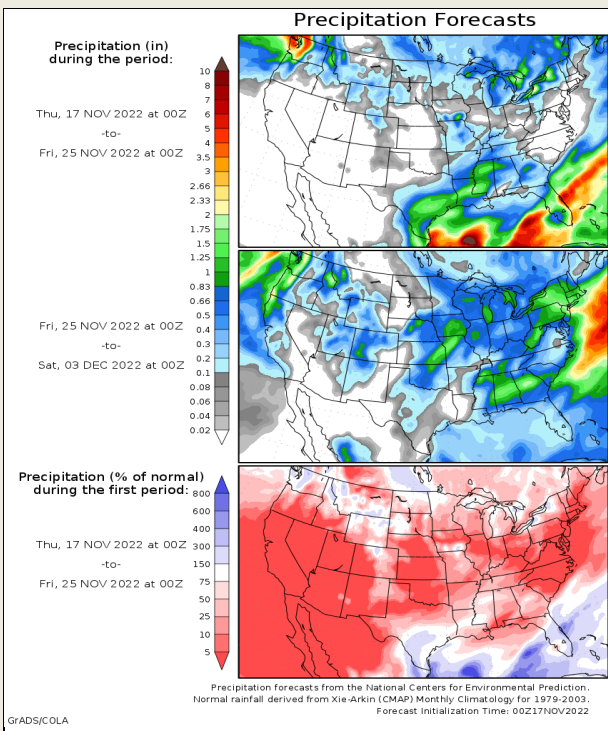
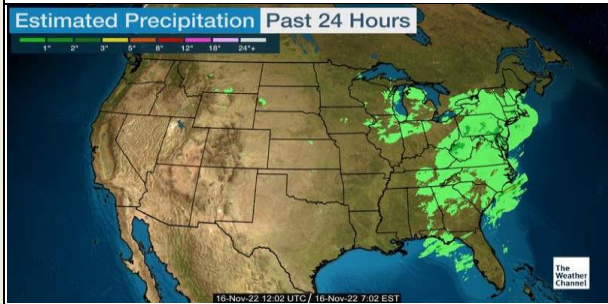
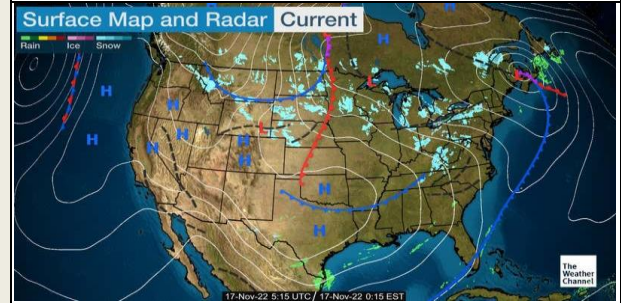
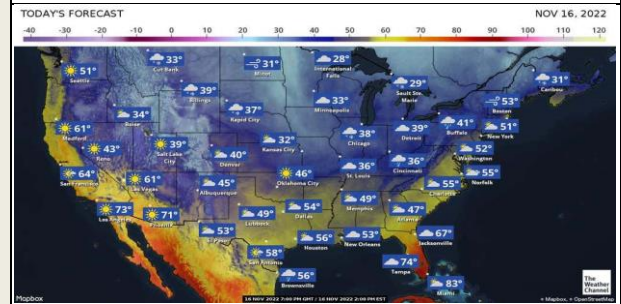
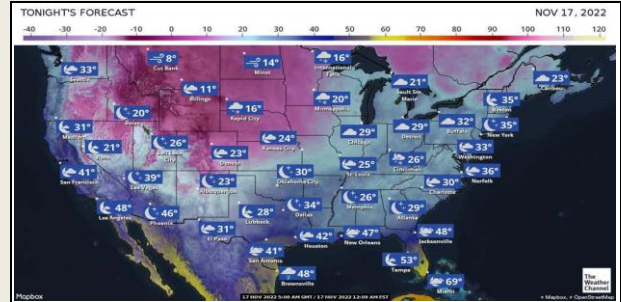

# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** Late harvesting should advance well overall during the next two weeks as precipitation will be infrequent and mostly light and some northern areas should remain cold enough this week for fieldwork to advance on frozen ground. Temperatures will be mostly well below normal through Sunday with Friday and Saturday coldest when highs are in the middle teens to the middle 30s most often. The early to middle part of next week will be warmer and many areas warmer than normal by the middle of the week.

**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** Most days during the next two weeks will be dry outside of additional rain today in the Southeast and rain in the Delta and the Southeast Nov. 23-25 and fieldwork should advance well around the precipitation.

o The moisture will be beneficial for winter crops.

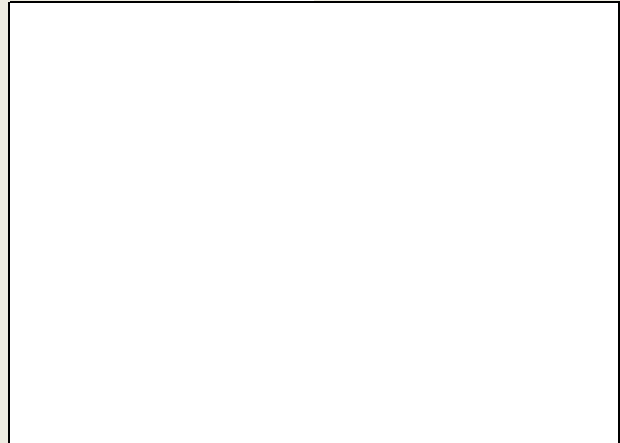

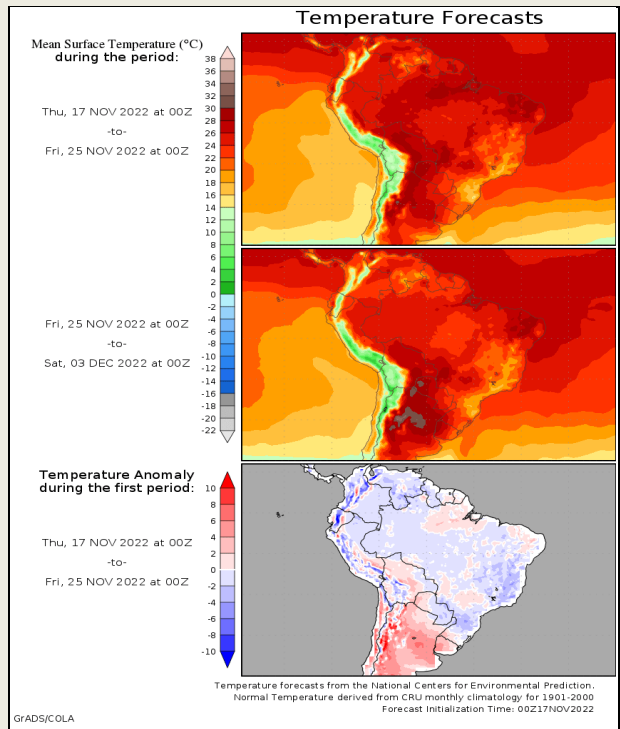
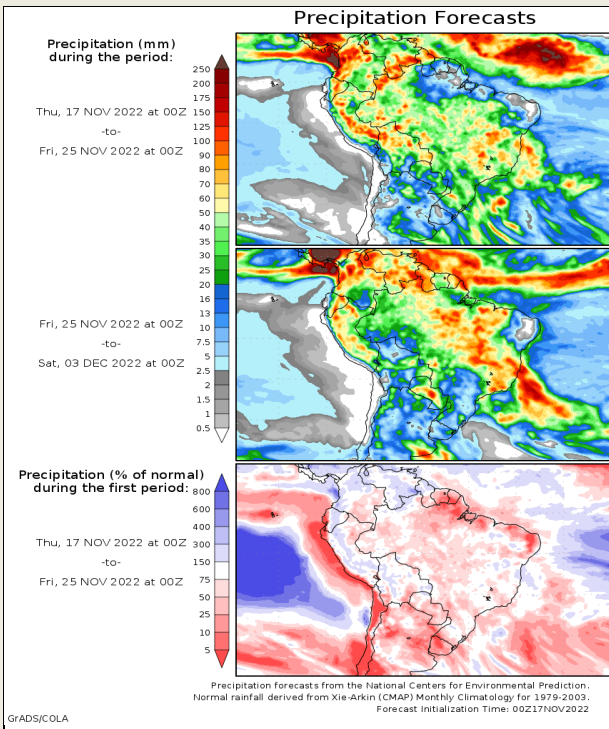
## South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Rain during the next two weeks will be greatest in northeastern Brazil where notable increases in soil moisture will result while west-central into central and southern Brazil and Paraguay are dry most often and see good planting progress with timely rain Sunday into Wednesday of next week important in keeping the soil moist enough to support crop development. Southern Mato Grosso through Sao Paulo southward to Paraguay and Rio Grande do Sul will see little rain outside of Sunday into Wednesday of next week and a close watch will be made on that rain event.

**ARGENTINA:** Today will be mostly dry before scattered showers occur in the south Wednesday into Friday. Most areas from San Luis to La Pampa and western into central and southern Buenos Aires will receive at least some rain Wednesday into Friday with amounts up to 0.50" and locally more common and some greater totals in central and southern Buenos Aires. Rain will return to much of the country Saturday into Sunday and most areas will receive up to 0.75" and locally more with some 0.75-1.50" amounts and locally more in central and southern Buenos Aires. Dry weather will be most common Monday through Nov. 29 with some light showers on occasion.

## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: A restricted precipitation pattern will continue today and Tuesday.

o However, some heavy rain will occur with isolated to scattered rain showers and thunderstorms over southeastern Spain into central Italy and into Bosnia, Montenegro, Albania and southern Serbia and Macedonia. Moisture totals will vary from 0.75 to 3.00 inches and locally more.

AUSTRALIA: Net drying across most of the region in the next seven days will still be great for fieldwork advancement and for letting the topsoil dry some, particularly in New South Wales. More rain is expected late this week and into the weekend, though in Victoria. Temperatures will be near to below average which will have some limit on the evaporation rates; however, conditions will be generally favorable. Warming is needed to stimulate faster drying rates and to induce faster summer crop emergence and establishment.
