South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: Eastern and central South Africa will see a mix of erratic rainfall and sunshine during the coming week. Many areas will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation or impact long-tern oil conditions. However, there will be plenty of moisture to maintain aggressive growth in most locations. Harvesting of winter wheat in Free State will advance swiftly around the periods of rain as well. Western Cape and Northern Cape will be dry or mostly dry during the coming week. Winter heat harvesting will continue with few disruptions. Eastern and central South Africa will see a mix of spotty rain and sunshine during the coming week



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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Light snow and some rain fell on many areas from eastern North Dakota and northeastern South Dakota to Michigan, Ohio, and eastern Kentucky Wednesday while other areas were mostly dry. Late harvesting should advance well overall during the next two weeks as precipitation will be infrequent and mostly light and some northern areas should remain cold enough this week for fieldwork to advance on frozen ground.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Much of the Delta and the Southeast were dry Wednesday and harvesting should have advanced well in many areas. The Mississippi River was below flood stage this morning and increases in water levels and improvements in conditions for barge traffic will occur through this weekend in the north and into next week in central and southern areas before water levels drop again. Most days during the next two weeks will be dry outside of rain in the Delta and the Southeast Wednesday into Friday of next week with fieldwork likely to advance well around the precipitation.









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


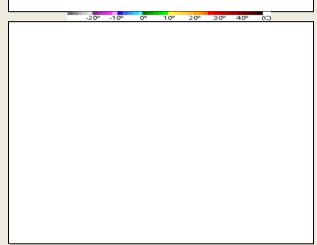
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
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
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain fell on parts of northern Brazil Wednesday including some locally heavy rain in a part of central Mato Grosso while central and southern Brazil and Paraguay were mostly dry.Rain during the next two weeks will be greatest in northeastern Brazil where additional increases in soil moisture will result while west-central into central and southern Brazil and Paraguay are dry most often and see good planting progress. Timely and nearly widespread rain Sunday into Wednesday will be important in keeping the soil moist enough to favorably support crop development from west-central into central and southern Brazil and Paraguay ARGENTINA: Rain fell from northeastern La Pampa through east-central and southern Buenos Aires Wednesday while other areas were mostly dry. Dry weather and good planting progress will be most common through the next two weeks with one round of rain Saturday into Monday not likely great to keep some crops outside of the south from becoming stressed later this month if follow-up rain does not corur son.









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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: A restricted precipitation pattern will continue today and Tuesday


o However, some heavy rain will occur with isolated to scattered rain showers and thunderstorms over southeastern Spain into central Italy and into Bosnia, Montenegro, Albania and southern Serbia and Macedonia.
Moisture totals will vary from 0.75 to 3.00 inches and locally more.

AUSTRALIA: Net drying through at least the next seven days will still be great for areas that have been struggling with too much rain in the last several weeks; however, near to below average temperatures will continue to limit evaporation rates and warming is needed for stimulation of faster drying rates and faster summer crop emergence and establishment. Light rain fell across Western Australia and in central portions of Victoria Wednesday and early today.









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
