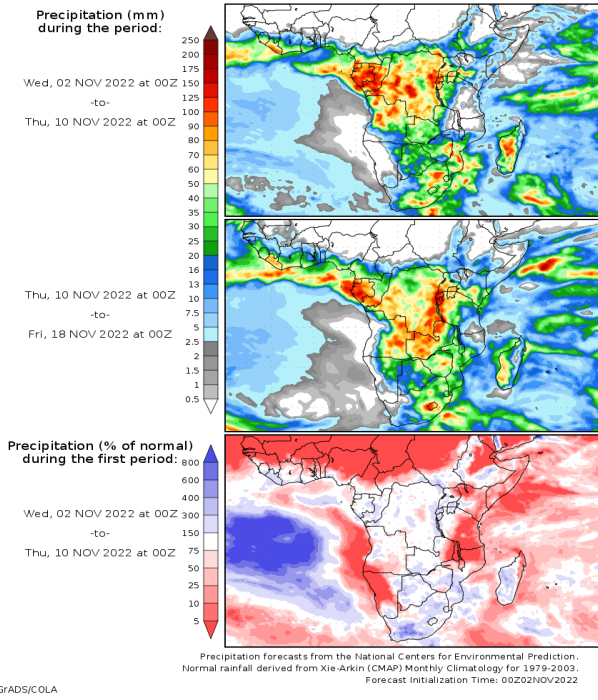
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: The wet weather bias will continue for eastern and central South Africa during the coming week. Rainfall will be enough to further bolster soil moisture in most production areas. Planting and general fieldwork may advance slowly in the wettest locations. However, establishment and development conditions for the summer crops will either improve or remain favorable. Harvesting of winter wheat may also be sluggish in Free State with minor quality declines possible. Western Cape and Northern Cape will also have opportunities for rain during the coming week. The rain may briefly slow the harvest, though most producers will have opportunities to get into the fields between rain events. No significant quality impacts are expected. Eastern and central South Africa will see several waves of rain during the coming week. Some of the most widespread and significant rain will evolve through Friday and again early next week. Moisture totals by next Tuesday morning will range from 1.50-4.00" with locally greater amounts in Mpumalanga, Free State, and North West. Western South Africa will see variable rainfall during the coming week. Moisture totals by next Tuesday morning will range from 0.75-3.00"

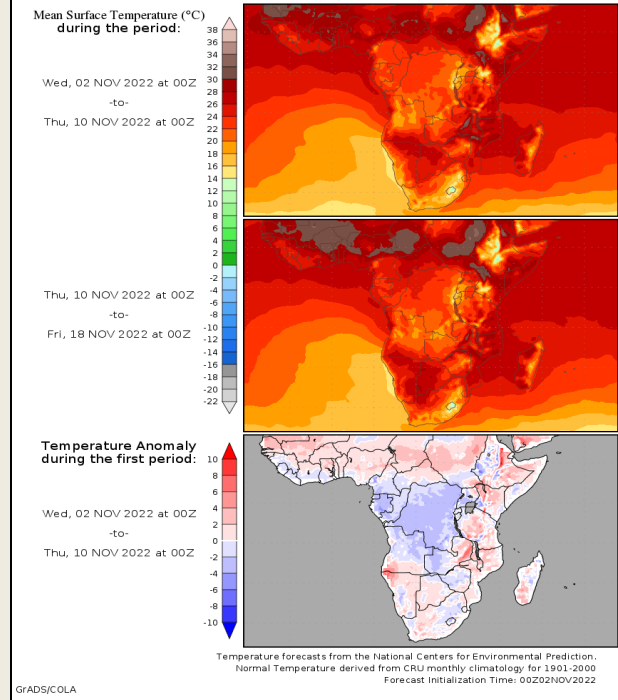

Temperature Forecasts

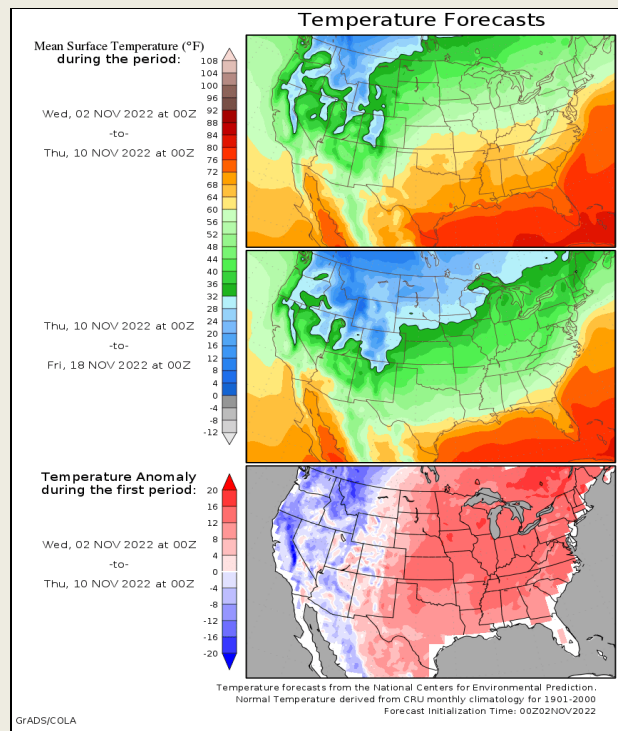
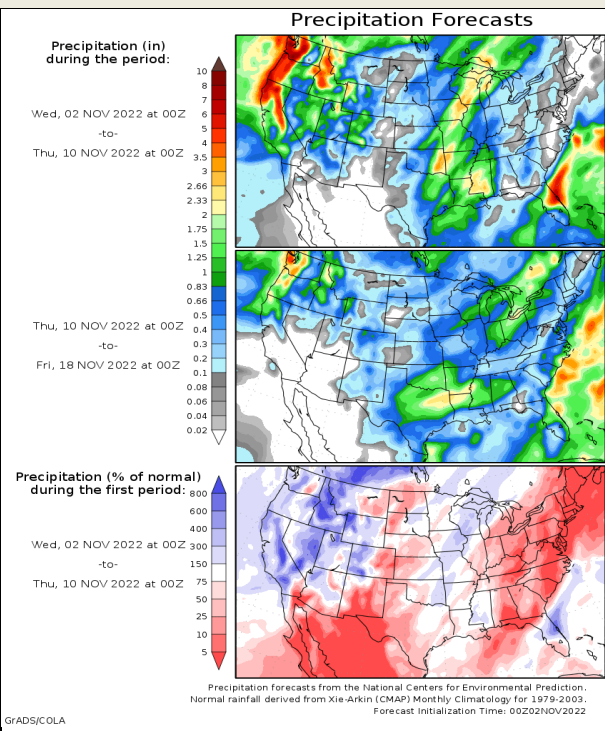
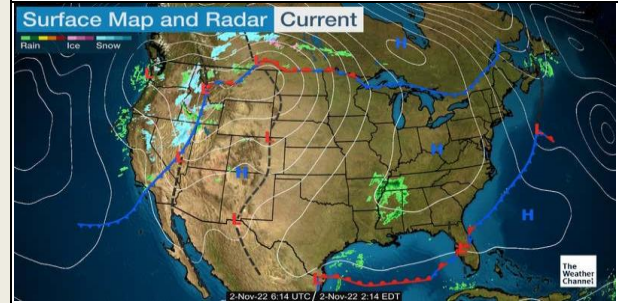
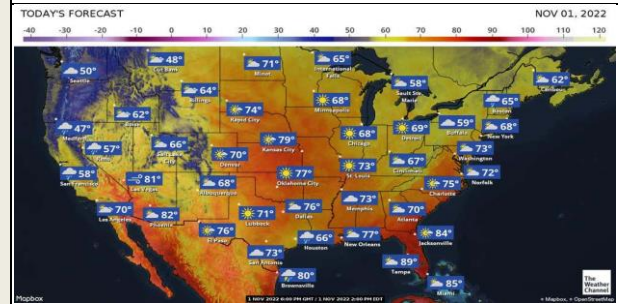
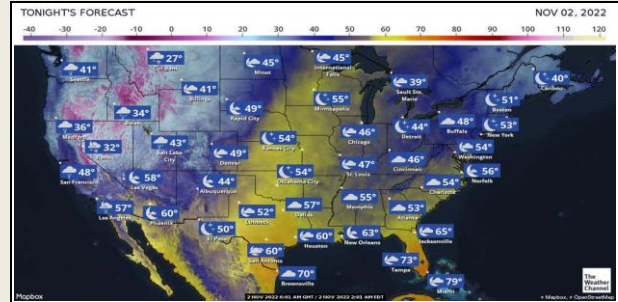


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Good harvest progress is expected overall during the next two weeks around one round of widespread precipitation Thursday evening into Saturday and a couple light precipitation events that will induce improvements in conditions for establishment of winter wheat in many areas while some relief from drought occurs in the western Corn Belt. The soil is dry enough that even where heavy rain falls in the western Corn Belt delays to fieldwork should not become extended. Temperatures will be much warmer than normal to unseasonably warm through much of the next week and highs will generally be in the 50s through the lower 70s with some cooler temperatures in the northwest and some warmer temperatures in the south.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a mostly restricted rainfall pattern through the next two week and harvesting should advance well overall around rain Saturday into Sunday from the Delta to northeastern Mississippi.

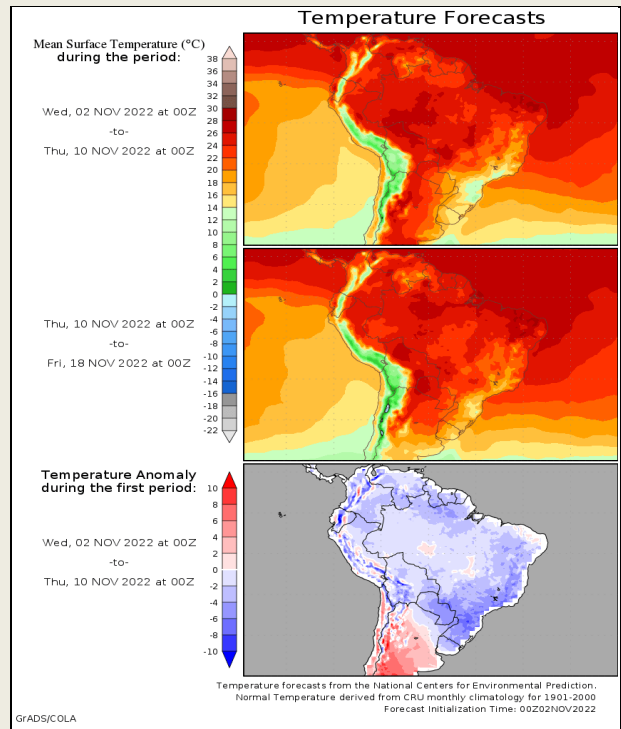
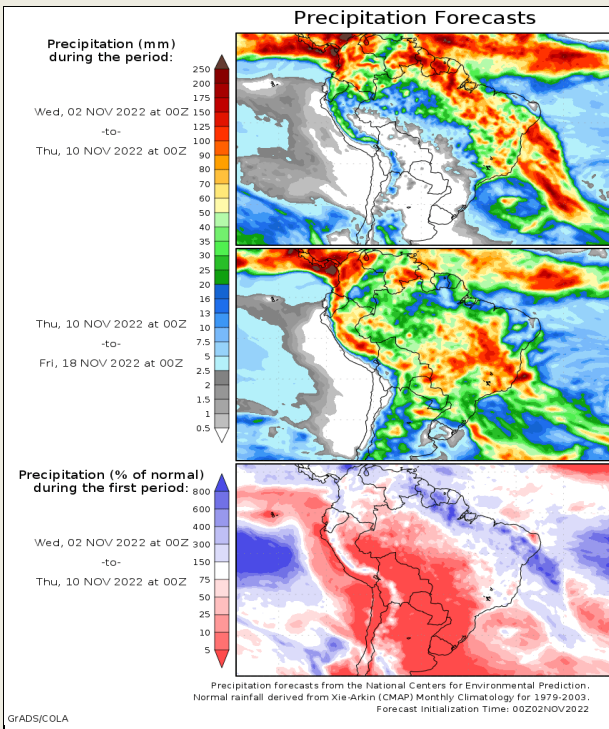
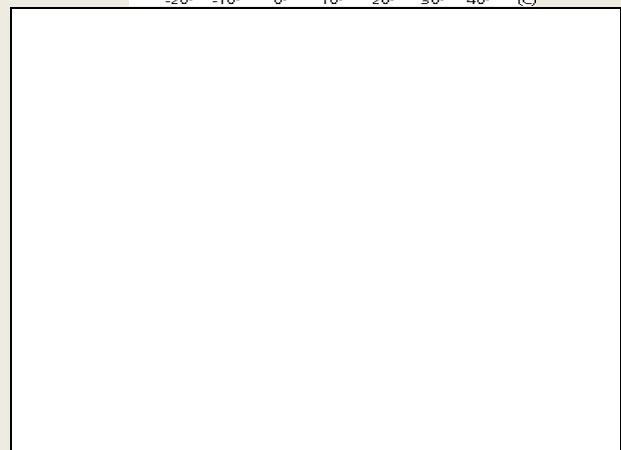
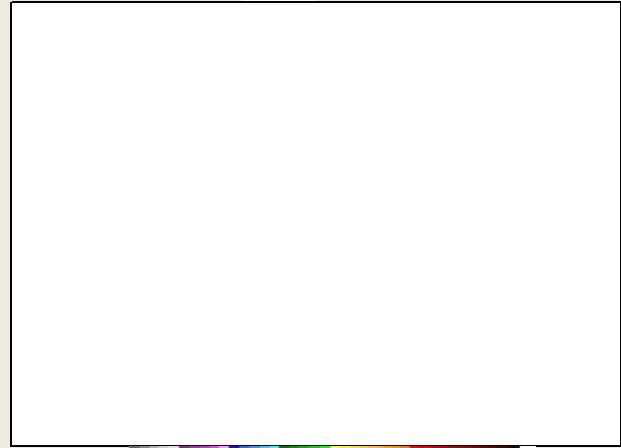


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: The two-week outlook remains mostly favorable for planting and development of summer crops as much of Brazil and Paraguay will see a mix of rain and sunshine that should allow for good harvest progress of winter wheat as well while the driest areas in northeastern Brazil benefit from significant rain this week. Temperatures will be chilly again Wednesday and additional frost and a few light freezes should occur in far southern Brazil with most crops not likely to be seriously harmed by the cold, but there could be some damage to corn in Rio Grande do Sul and central and southeastern Santa Catarina.

ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is wetter for Nov. 11-12 than what was advertised Monday, but overall planting should advance well during the next two weeks before and after rain expected Nov. 8-12 while the moisture will be important in keeping the soil moist enough to support crops.
o The period of wetter weather Nov. 8-12 is not likely to result in enough rain to soak the soil in many areas and rain will be needed again soon in many locations.



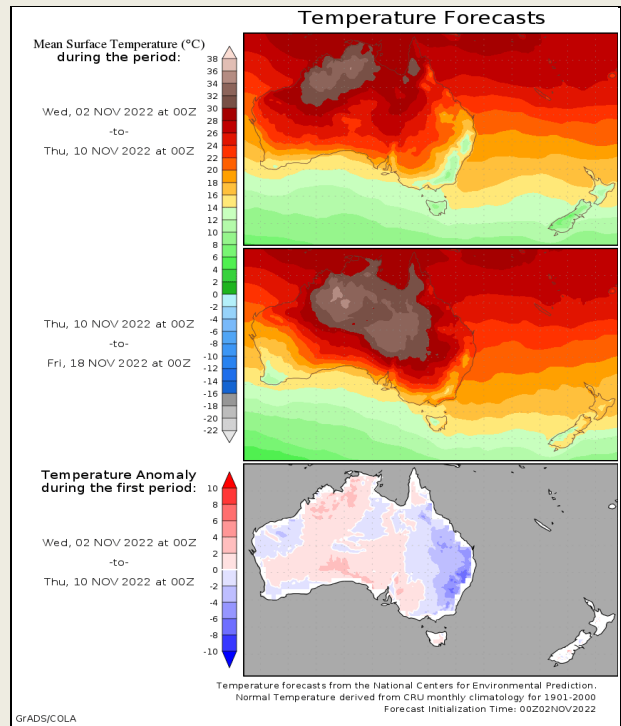
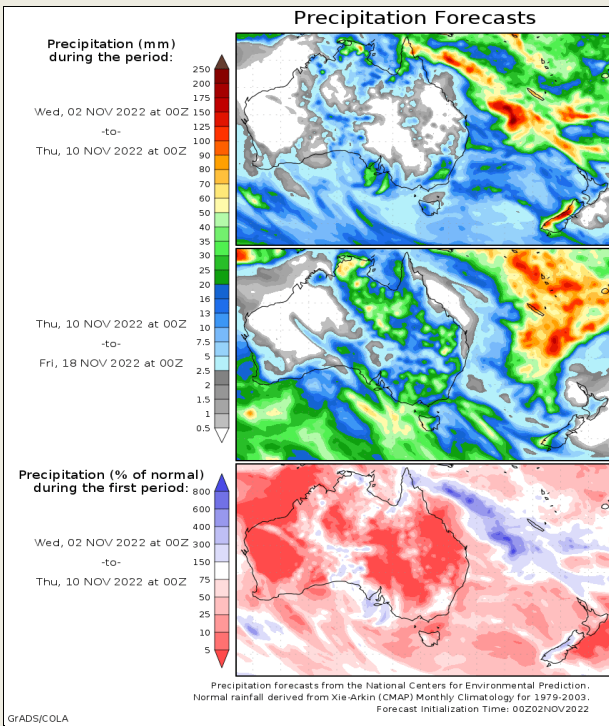
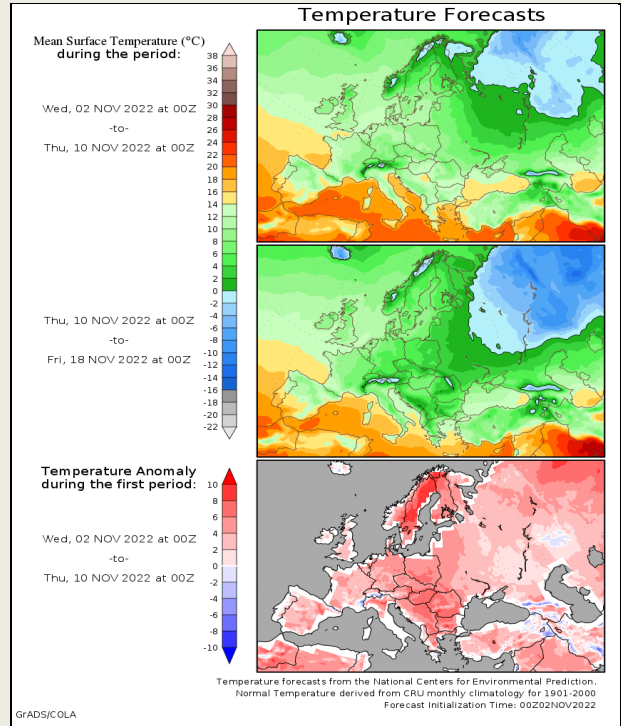
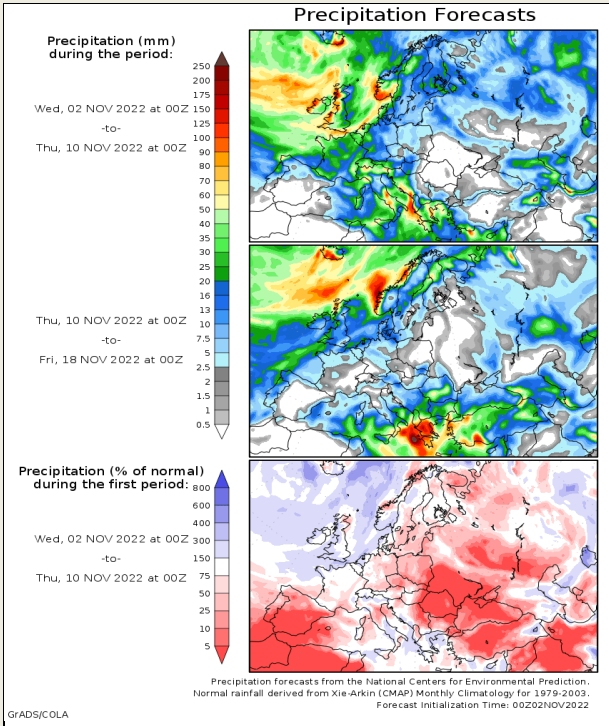
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: A restricted precipitation pattern will continue today and Tuesday.

o However, some heavy rain will occur with isolated to scattered rain showers and thunderstorms over southeastern Spain into central Italy and into Bosnia, Montenegro, Albania and southern Serbia and Macedonia. Moisture totals will vary from 0.75 to 3.00 inches and locally more.

AUSTRALIA: Net drying is expected across most of the region in the next seven days which will be beneficial for improving crop and field working conditions. Some rain will occur; however, it will be a favorable amount with not enough to delay fieldwork. Temperatures will also be trending warmer.



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
